


System requirements

Your computer system must meet the following specifications:

- Windows 2000, SE, ME, XP, Vista, 7, Mac OS X
- Pentium Class or faster Processor
- 64MB RAM
- 30MB of free hard disk space
- USB Port

Supported file formats: MP3, WMA, WAV

Slide out the USB plug and connect the player to the computer's USB port.




Charge the battery between 3-5 hours. Do not charge for more than 8 hours.

Micro SD card

The player supports Micro SD cards (not included), which allow you to add up to 8GB additional memory to the MP3 Player.

To insert the Micro SD card:

1. Insert the Micro SD card into the card slot with the metal contacts facing up towards the front of the player and gently push it in until it clicks. Do not apply excessive force, as this may damage the player and Micro SD card.



- 2. To view files on the Micro SD card, press the [M] button while in the music mode to enter "Music menu 2" and use the [⋈] or [⋈] button to select "Card folder".
- 3. To remove the Micro SD card, gently push it in until it pops out.

Using the player

Power on/off


- To turn on the player, make sure the [ON/OFF] switch is in the "ON" position and press and HOLD the [► II] button until the display lights up.
- To turn off the player, press and HOLD the [► I] button until the display shuts off, or slide the [ON/OFF] switch to the "OFF" position (shutting the player this way is quicker but the last changes in the settings, or last played song will not be saved).

Navigating the main menu

After turning on the player, the main menu appears.


[₩ №] scroll through the main menu [M] makes a selection

Music

To play music, select "music" from the main menu and press the [M] button to enter the music mode.


[M] press to access music menus 1 & 2

Press and HOLD the [I◄◄] or [▶▶I] button to fast rewind or fast forward while playing a song.




Music menu 1

While music is playing, press the [M] button to access menu 1

- Random / Normal (music playback order)
- Exit



Menu control



Music menu 2

While music is paused, press the [M] button to access menu 2.


Select from the following options:

- Local folder (search for music files on the player)
- Card folder (only appears when a Micro SD card is inserted in the player}
- Delete file (delete the current file)
- Delete all
- Exit



To browse the music files on the player, select "Local folder" or "Card folder" and use the [₩ №] buttons to scroll through the music files on the player. Select a song and press the [M] button, and press [►II] to begin playback.

To listen to the radio, select "radio" from the main menu and press the [M] button to enter the radio mode.



Storing radio stations

Manually


- 1) Use the [M] or [M] button to manually search for a
- 2) Press the **[M]** button and select "Save" from the radio mode menu and press the [M] button once again.
- 3) Use the [►] button to scroll through the stored stations.

Auto scanning

- 1) Press the **[M]** button and select "Auto Search" from the radio mode menu and press the [M] button once again, the player will search and save the strongest stations in vour area.
- 2) Use the [► I] button to scroll through the stored stations.

Deleting stored stations

- 1) Press the **[M]** button and select "Delete" or "Delete all" from the radio mode menu and press the [M] button once again.
- 2) The selected station or all stations will be deleted from the player.



Recording radio


- 1) Press the [M] button and select "Record" from the radio mode menu and press the [M] button once again.
- 2) Press the [> I] button to begin or pause recording.
- 3) Press the [] button to save the recording. 4) The recorded file may be played back from "memos" from the main menu.

To record voice memos, select "record" from the main menu and press the [M] button to enter the recording mode.

Press the [| I] button to start recording.

To pause recording, press the [►I] button again.

To save the recording and exit to the main menu, press the [-] button.



To play back recorded voice memos, select "memos" from the main menu and press the [M] button to enter the voice memos mode.






Press [M] to access the memos menu where you can view and delete voice memo files from the player.

In the settings menu you can customize various player settings such as power usage, language, display settings and more.

Select "settings" from the main menu and press the [M] button to enter the settings mode.

Use the [I◄◄] or [▶▶I] button to choose the setting you want to customize, and press the [M] button to make selections.



Adjust the "Backlight Time" and "Power off" options to extend and optimize battery performance.
