Quick Guide to Using Your Nokia Card phone with Outlook 98

SETTING UP YOUR OUTLOOK 98 TO READ INTERNET E-MAIL

1. Check that you have made a Dial-Up Networking connection for use with your Nokia phone (My Computer – Dialup Networking)

- 2. Now that the Internet connection's properties are set correctly you are ready to go on-line.
- 3. You now need to add a new service for use with your Dial-Up connection in Outlook 98.
- 4. Start Outlook 98.
- Go to Tools Services... and click Add... to add a new service. Choose Internet E-mail from the list and click OK (Figure 2).

6. You must now fill in the Mail Account Properties (Figure 3).

- 7. After you have filled in all the fields click **Apply** and **OK**; after that you get a message that asks you to Exit and Log Off from Outlook. Just click **OK** and choose **File Exit and Log Off**.
- 8. Restart Outlook 98. If it asks you whether to **Connect / Work Offline / Help** you can choose either connect or Work Offline.
- 9. Now go to **Tools Remote mail Connect...**Choose the information service you just created by clicking on the check box next to it and click **Next** >.
- 10. Now choose either **Retrieve and send all new mail** or **Do only the following Retrieve new message headers**... (Figure 4).

NOTE: Choose **Retrieve and send**... if you have written messages offline and/or to retrieve all your messages. Choose **Do only the following – Retrieve new**... in order to get only the message headers out of which you can choose the messages you wish to read (this option is a lot faster because it only downloads the headers not the message itself).

- 11. Now click Finish and after that you will be prompted to go on-line.
- 12. Check that you have your cellular phone connected to your PC in order to be able to get connected.
- 13. After a short moment Outlook will retrieve new messages/headers.
