



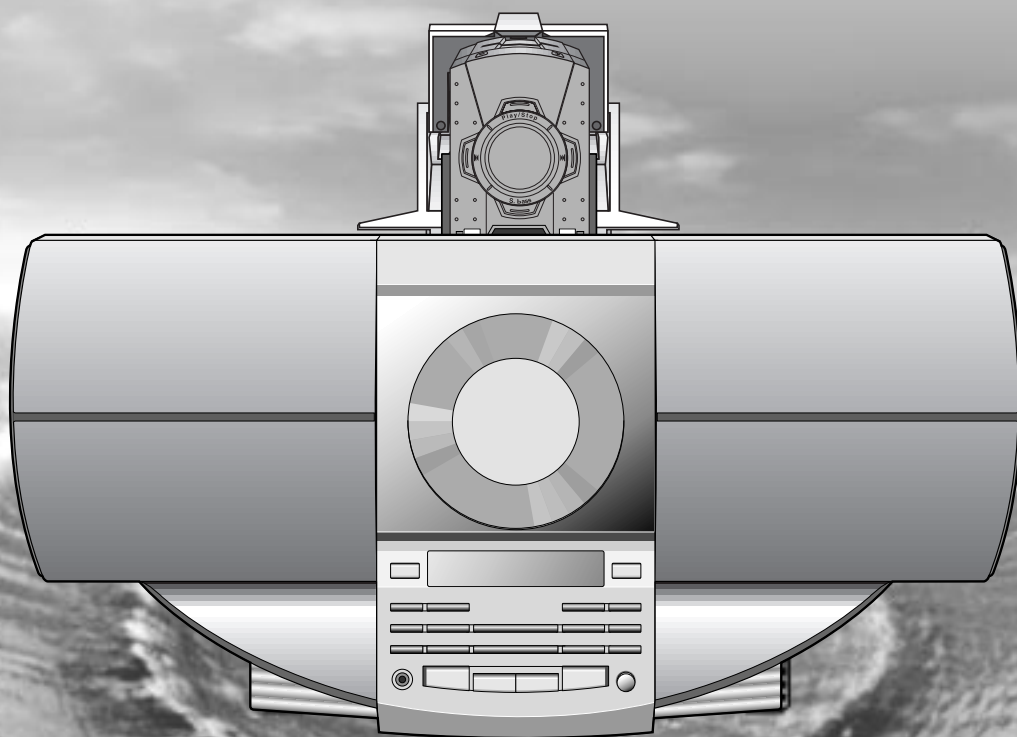

Wiring the Main Power Supply Plug (UK Only)

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The main lead on this equipment is supplied with a moulded plug incorporating a fuse. The value of the fuse is indicated on the pin face of the plug and if it requires replacing, a fuse approved to BS1362 of the same rating must be used.

Never use the plug with the fuse cover removed. If the cover is detachable and a replacement is required, it must be of the same colour as the fuse fitted in the plug. Replacement covers are available from your dealer. If the fitted plug is not suitable for the power points in your house or the cable is not long enough to reach a power point, you should obtain a suitable safety approved extension lead or consult your dealer for assistance. However, if there is no alternative to cutting off the plug, remove the fuse and then safely dispose of the plug. Do not connect the plug to a main socket as there is a risk of shock hazard from the bared flexible cord. Never attempt to insert bare wires directly into a main socket. A plug and fuse must be used at all times.

The wires in the main lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:-

BLUE = NEUTRAL BROWN = LIVE

As these colours may not correspond to the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:-

The wire coloured BLUE must be connected to the terminal marked with the letter N or coloured BLUE or BLACK. The wire coloured BROWN must be connected to the terminal marked with the letter L or coloured BROWN or RED.

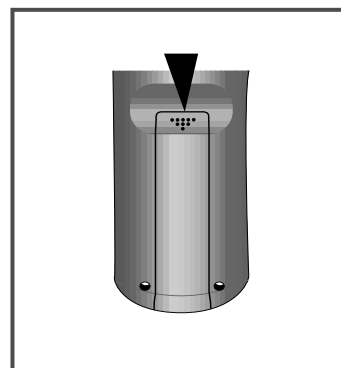
Inserting Remote Control Batteries

Insert or replace remote control batteries when you:

- ◆ Purchase the Wingo(CD Radio Player).
- ◆ Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly

☞ When replacing the batteries, use a new set of batteries and never mix alkaline and manganese batteries.

- 1 Place your thumb on the position marked ▼ on the battery compartment cover (rear of the remote control) and push the cover in the direction of the arrow.
- 2 Insert two AAA, LR03 or equivalent batteries, taking care to respect the polarities:
 - ◆ + on the battery against + on the remote control
 - ◆ - on the battery against - on the remote control
- 3 Replace the cover by sliding it back until it clicks into position.

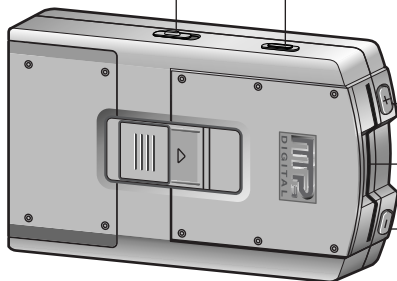

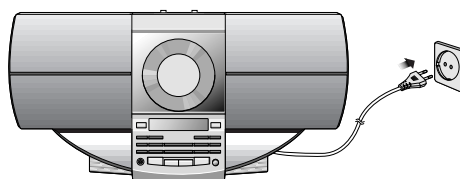
WHEN TO RECHARGE BATTERIES USING WINGO

1 Insert the rechargeable battery.

- Open the battery compartment lid.
- Insert battery with correct polarity and close the lid as illustrated.

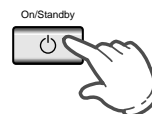


2 Plug the power cord into a wall outlet.



3 Press the On/Standby Button.


- Charge Indication Lamp will light up.
- Charging time is about 100 minutes when the battery is completely discharged.
- When charging is completed, the Charge Indication Lamp turns off. (After recharging, the green light disappears. In about 30 minutes, you may take out the battery.)



- To prevent electric shock, do not disassemble the battery recharger.
- When you require service for the battery charger, contact the nearest SAMSUNG Electronics dealer or Service Center.

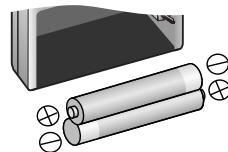
- ☞ While enjoying a CD or radio broadcast through the speakers, rechargeable batteries in the Charger or MP3 Player are charged.

Recharging with Batteries in MP3 Player Charge Compartment

 (Charging time is subject to change depending on MP3 Player specifications.)

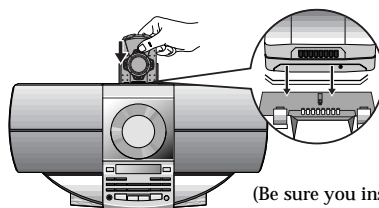
1 Insert the rechargeable battery into the Battery Compartment of MP3 Player.

- The (+) Polarity of the battery must be outward as illustrated.



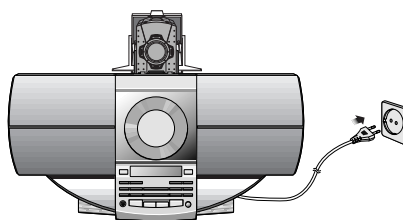
2 Insert MP3 Player into the charger of WINGO.

- When inserting, make sure the front of MP3 Player faces you to prevent MP3 Player from being reversely inserted.



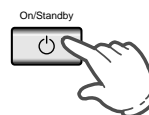

4 Press the On/Standby Button.

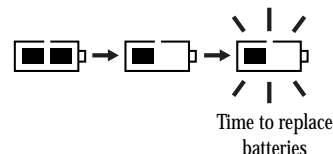

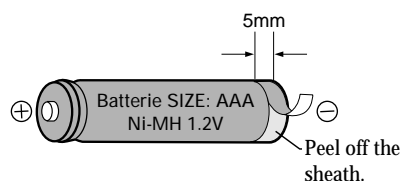

- When batteries are discharged, the unit does not operate properly; therefore, when the battery replacement indicator lamp on the LCD flashes, replace the batteries with new ones. (For rechargeable batteries, be sure to charge them.)
- If discharged batteries are left inside the Set for a long period of time, battery service life becomes shorter; therefore recharge them or replace them with new ones.



- If you use privately purchased batteries, stripe off the sheath from the new batteries.

- Peel off the sheath on the negative pole side from the new batteries by 5 mm using a knife before charging them.

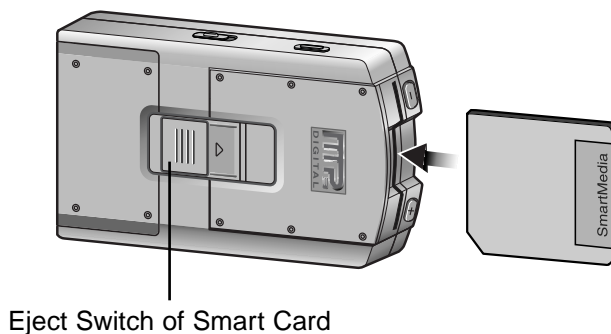

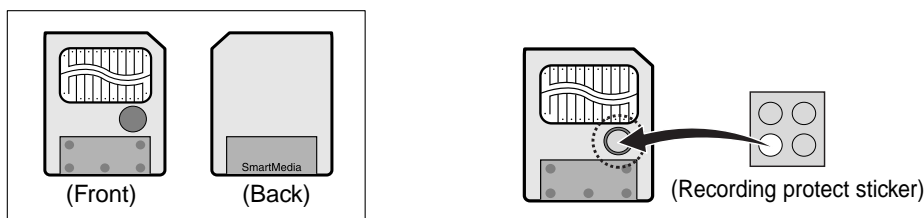

- To keep a music file input not to be erased, attach the memory erasing protection sticker to the memory protection tab.



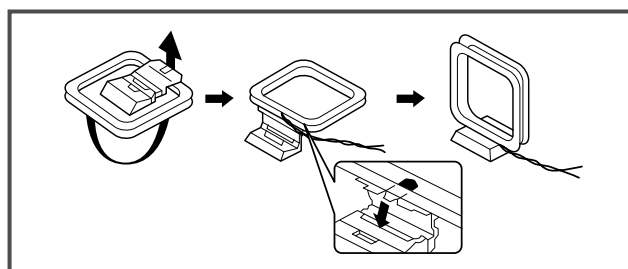
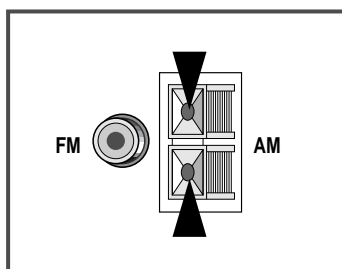
- Be cautious to protect Smart Card from magnet, humidity, shock, etc.
- Be sure to power off when Smart Card is inserted into or out of MP3 player. Or otherwise the music file stored in it may be damaged.
- Smart Card 16MB and 32MB only are available in this product.

Connecting the AM Aerial

The AM aerial (for long and medium waves) can be:

- Placed on a stable surface
- Fixed to the wall (you must first remove the base)

- 1** To connect a wire, push the terminal tab downwards and hold it in position.
- 2** Insert the wire, up to the plastic sheathing, in the hole.
- 3** Release the tab

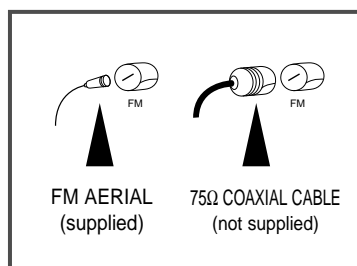
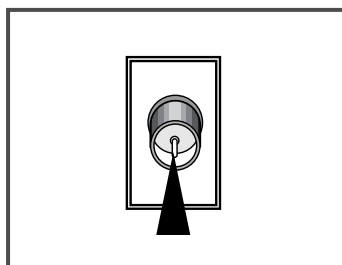


Connecting the FM Aerial

How to connect a COAXIAL TYPE aerial.

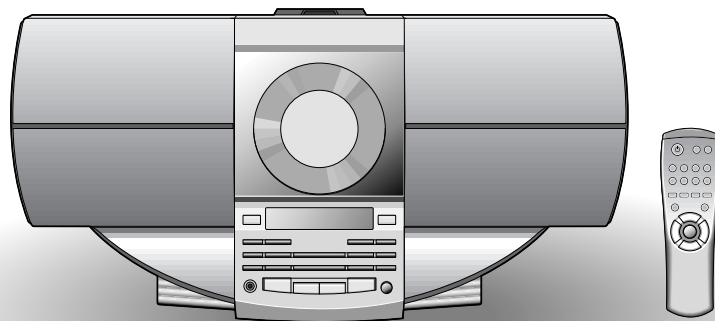
- Connect a 75Ω antenna to the FM antenna terminal.
- Plug the connector on the FM aerial supplied into the coaxial socket (75Ω) marked FM on the rear of the system.
- Follow the instructions given on Page Win-8 to tune into a radio station, and determine the best position for the aerial.
- If reception is poor, you may need to install an outdoor aerial.

To do so, connect an outdoor FM aerial to the FM socket on the rear of the system using a 75Ω coaxial cable (not supplied).



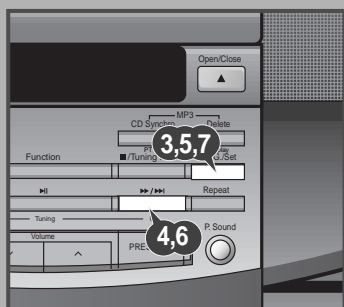
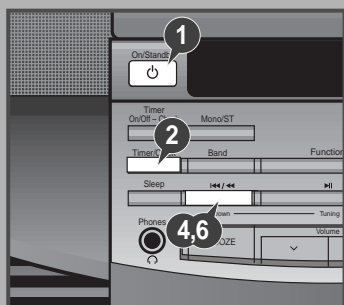

Setting the Clock

GB



Your system is equipped with a clock which allows you to turn your system on and off automatically. You should set the clock:

- ◆ When you purchase the audio system
 - ◆ After a power failure
 - ◆ After unplugging the unit
- ☞ ◆ Remember to reset the time when the clock changes from winter to summer time and vice versa.
- ◆ For each step, you have a few seconds to set the required options. If you exceed this time, you must start again.

1 Switch the system on by pressing **On/Standby**.

2 Press **Timer/Clock** twice.
Result: **CLOCK** is displayed.

3 Press **Prog./Set**.
Result: The hour flashes.

5 When the correct hour is displayed, press **Prog./Set**.
Result: The minutes flash.

7 When the correct time is displayed, press **Prog./Set**.
Result: The clock starts and is displayed, even when the system is in standby mode.

➤ You can display the time, even when you are using another function, by pressing **Timer/Clock** once.

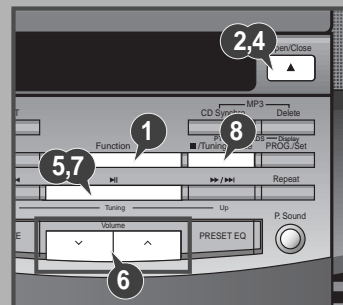
Listening to a Compact Disc

When you have loaded a compact disc into the player, you can begin playback.

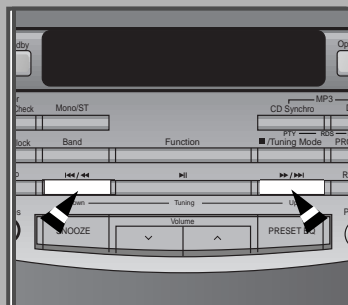
➤ Always treat your compact discs with care; refer, if necessary, to the section entitled “**Precautions When Using Compact Discs**” on page Win-17.

- 1 Select the CD function by pressing **Function** on the front panel.
- 2 Press the **Open/Close** button.
Result: The CD Player opens.
- 3 Place your disc in the compartment, with the label on the disc facing upwards. CD Player
- 4 Close the CD Player by pressing the **Open/Close** button.
- 5 Press **Play/Pause** (▶||) to start playing the disc.
Result: The display indicates the selected track and elapsed playing time.
- 6 Adjust the **volume** as required by:
 - ♦ Pressing the **Volume** ^ and v buttons.
- 7 To pause during playback, press **Play/Pause** (▶||).
- Press **Play/Pause** (▶||) again to continue playing the disc.
- 8 Press **Stop** (■) when you have finished.

➤ ♦ If you press Play/Pause (▶||) when no disc is loaded, the “**NO DISC**” indication is displayed.



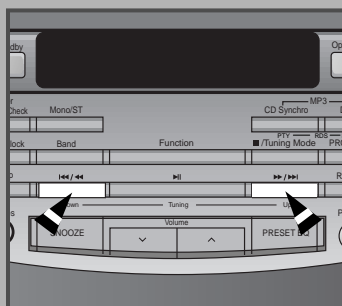
Selecting a Track



You can select the track you wish to listen to, either when the compact disc player is stopped or when a disc is playing.

Searching for a Specific Music Passage on a CD



When listening to a compact disc, you can quickly search for a specific music passage on a track.

Repeat Function

You can repeat:

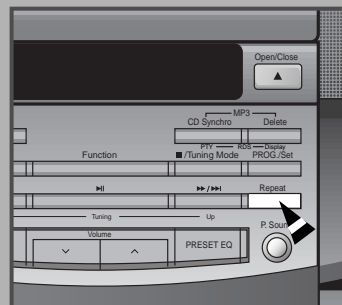

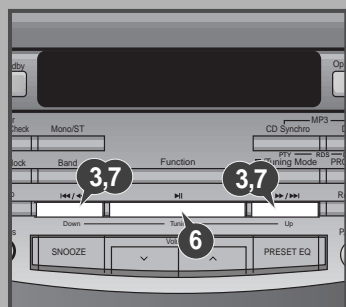
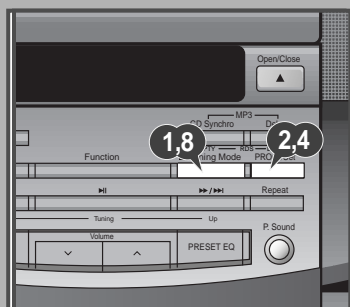

Programming the Order of Playback

You can decide:

- ◆ The order in which you listen to the tracks on the discs loaded
 - ◆ Which tracks you do not wish to listen to
- ◆ You can programme up to 24 tracks.
- ◆ You must stop the compact disc player before selecting the tracks.
 - ◆ This feature can be combined with the Repeat function.

1 If the CD function is selected, stop the player by pressing **Stop** (■).

2 Press **Prog./Set**.

Result: The following indications are displayed:

P01 --

(P01 = Programme No., -- = Track No. on the disc)

3 Select the required track by pressing:

- ◆ ◀◀ to move back through the tracks
- ◆ ▶▶ to move forward through the tracks

4 Press **Prog./Set** to confirm your selection.

Result: The selection is stored and P02 -- is displayed.

5 To select other tracks, repeat Steps 3 to 4.

6 Press **Play/Pause** (▶▶) to listen to the track selection in the order programmed.

Checking or Changing Programmed Tracks

You can check or change your selection of tracks at any time.

1 Press **Stop** (■) once if you have started listening to the selection.

2 Press **Prog./Set**.

Result: The following indications appear:

P04 --

➤ (P04=Program NO., -- = Track No. on the disc)

If you have already programmed 24 tracks, C is displayed instead of P when you press **Prog./Set**.

3 Press **Prog./Set** again.

Result: The following indications are displayed :

C01 --

➤ (C=Check, 01=Program NO., -- = Track NO. on the disc)

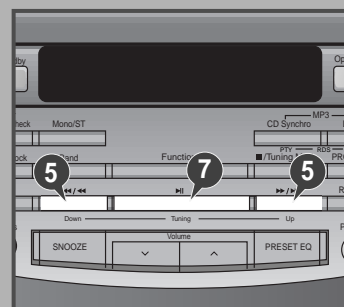
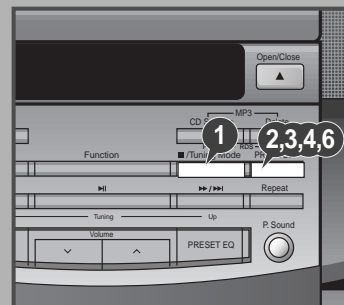

With this unit, you can record CD tracks directly into MP3.

Making MP3 files from a other CD tracks

To stop Recording

♦ Press the **■/Tuning Mode** Button during Recording.

➤ ♦ If Smart Card memory is filled up during CD Synchro, "SMC FULL" is displayed on Wingo Display and CD recording is no longer in the process.

♦ In this case, delete music file before using.

♦ If the electricity is cut off by power failure or accident source plug extraction during CD Synchro, or MP3 player is pulled out of Wingo body without recording stopped, the music file stored in Smart Card may be damaged. In this case, be sure to format Smart Card and re-record it.

When to delete files

1. Select the MP3 track in MP3 Player unit.

2. Press the **Delete** Button for over 1 second.

 - ◆ Pressing **◀** or **▶** on the front panel
 - ◆ To scroll through the frequencies faster when searching manually, hold down the **◀** or **▶** buttons.
 - ◆ The automatic search procedure may stop on a frequency that does not correspond to a radio station. If this happens, use the manual search mode.
- 6 Adjust the volume by:
 - ◆ Pressing the **Volume** **^** or **v** buttons.
- 7 Select the stereo or mono mode by pressing **Mono/ST**.
- 8 If you do not want to store the radio station found, revert to Step 4 and search for another station.
 Otherwise:
 - a Press **Prog./Set**.
 - b Press **◀** and **▶** to assign a programme number between 1 and 15.
 - c Press **Prog./Set** to store the radio station.
- 9 To store any other radio frequencies required, repeat Steps 3 to 8.



- The PROGRAM function can be used to assign a new station to an existing programme number.

Selecting a Stored Station



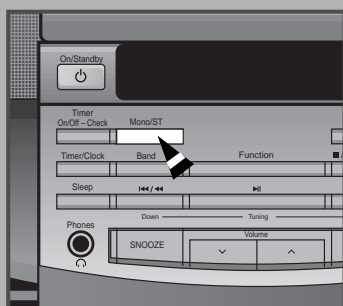
You can listen to a stored radio station as follows:

- 1 Switch the system on by pressing **On/Standby**.
- 2 Select the TUNER function by pressing **Function** on the front panel.
- 3 Select the required frequency band by pressing **Band** on the front panel.
- 4 Select the radio station as follows.

➤ Press **Tuning Mode** again to exit the stored station selection function.

Improving Radio Reception



You can improve the quality of radio reception by:

- ◆ Rotating the **FM** or **AM(MW)** aerial
 - ◆ Testing the positions of the **FM** and **AM(MW)** aerials before fixing them permanently
- If reception from a specific **FM** radio station is poor, press **Mono/St** to switch from stereo mode to mono. The quality of the sound will be improved.

About RDS broadcasting

This unit has the RDS (Radio Data System) function, which enables for the various information such as broadcasting station, radio text, time and 30 types of programs (News, Rock, Classic, etc.) to be received from the FM RDS station together with normal radio signal.

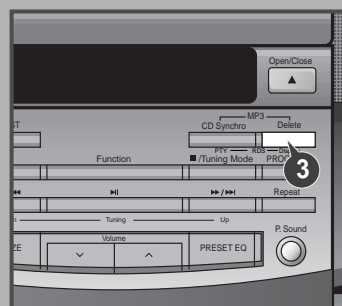
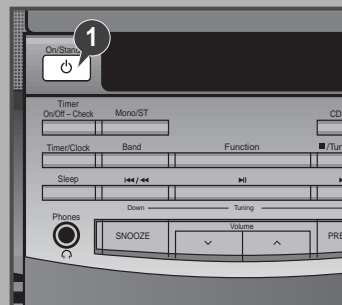
- 1 Press the **On/Standby** button.
- 2 Receive the **FM** radio.
 - ♦ See the radio receiving method on the page Win-8.
 - ♦ FM and frequency are shown on the display
 - ♦ If the received station transmit the RDS information, 'RDS' appears automatically on the display.
- 3 Press the **RDS Display** button to select the desired RDS mode.
 - ♦ Whenever the button is pressed, RDS mode changes as follows.

➡ PS NAME ➡ RT ➡ CT ➡ Current FM frequency

☞ ♦ The RDS function is available only on **FM** broadcasts.

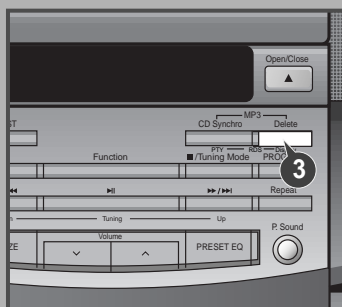
➤ Description on RDS function

1. **PTY** (Program Type) : Displays the type of programme currently being broadcast
 2. **PS NAME** (Program Service Name) : Indicates the name of broadcasting station and is decodes (if any) composed of 8 characters.
 3. **RT** (Radio Text) : The text broadcast by a station and composed of maximum 64 characters.
 4. **CT** (Clock Time) : Decodes the real time clock from the FM frequency.
- Some stations may not transmit PTY, RT or CT information therefore this may not be displayed in all cases.
5. **TP** (Traffic Program) : Indicates that the turned station is capable of transmitting traffic broadcasts.
 6. **TA** (Traffic Announcement) : When this symbol flashes it shows that the traffic announcement is in progress.
 7. **EON** (Enhanced Other Networks Information) : Offers the RDS information on other networks.



About RDS DISPLAY function

About "PS NAME" MODE

- Displays the name of broadcasting station.

Press the **RDS Display** button to select the PS NAME.

- ◆ "PS NAME" appears on the display.
- ◆ If the PS information is being received, the PS name (BBC, AFO, NDR, etc.) is shown on the display.
- ◆ If the PS information isn't received, the original FM frequency is shown.

- ☞ Even though no **RDS Display** button is pressed, the reception of PS information ensures the PS name is displayed.

About 'RT' MODE

- Displays the character transmitted from the broadcasting station.

Press the **RDS Display** button to select the RT MODE.

- ◆ "RT" appears on the display.
- ◆ If the RT information is being received, the received information is shown on the display.
- ◆ If the RT information isn't received, the "NO RT" is shown. On the display.

About CT(Clock Time)

- Sets the time of the RDS clock.

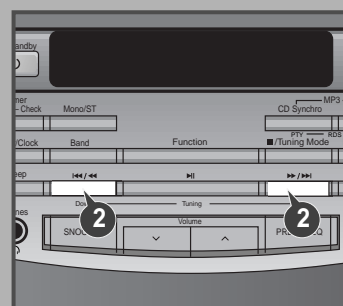
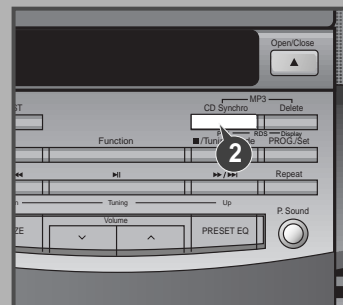
To select the CT time, set the **RDS Display** button to CT MODE.

- ☞ ◆ The CT information will take up to 2 minutes to be decoded therefore the clock isn't displayed immediately.
- ◆ If there is no available CT information, "NO CT" is displayed.
- The CT RDS clock does not update the system clock.

PTY (Program Type) indication and PTY-SEARCH function (Continue)

- ◆ The PTY information is composed of an identification symbol, which helps the FM radio to recognize the program type of each **FM** station.
- ◆ The 30 PTY modes are shown in the display by pressing the **PTY** button.

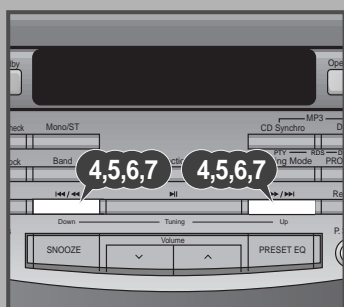
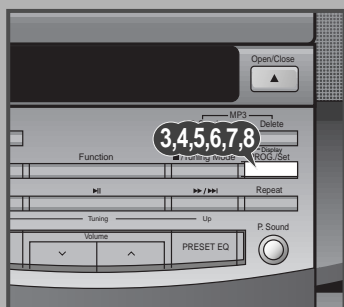
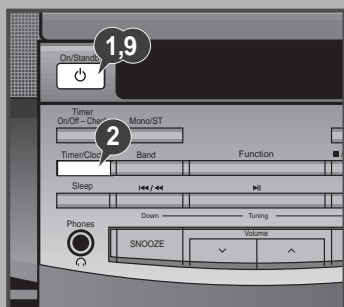


About PTY-SEARCH

- 1 Tuned to an **FM** station broadcasting a PTY MODE.
 - ◆ See the **FM** receiving method on the page Win-8.
 - ◆ If the received station is transmitting the RDS information, "RDS" lights up.
 - 2 Press the **PTY** button.
 - ◆ The PTY MODE(NEWS, AFFARIS, etc) appears on the display.
 - ◆ Press the **◀** or **▶** button to select the desired PTY MODE.
- ◆ If the station is transmitting no PTY information, 'NO PTY' shows on the display.
- ◆ When the PTY MODE is selected(The PTY MODE is shown in the display), press the PTY KEY once again to convert into PTY-SEARCH MODE and auto-search the station sequentially.
- ◆ If a station is found broadcasting required PTY MODE then the search stops and the stop is selected.
- ☛ ◆ If the PTY MODE isn't found it is returned to the original station frequency at beginning the PTY SEARCH and auto-search and PTY SEARCH are suspended.

Timer Function

GB



The timer enables you to switch the system on or off at specific times.
Example: You wish to wake up to music every morning.

- If you no longer want the system to be switched on or off automatically, you must cancel the timer.
- ✦ Before setting the timer, check that the current time is correct.

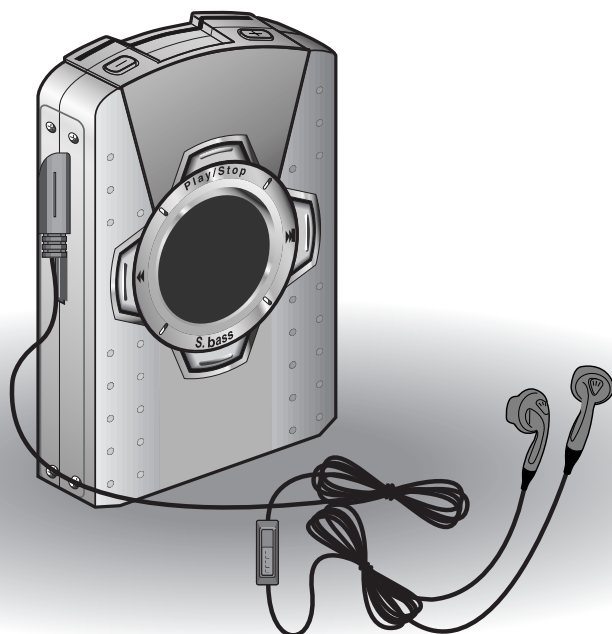
Precautions When Using Compact Discs

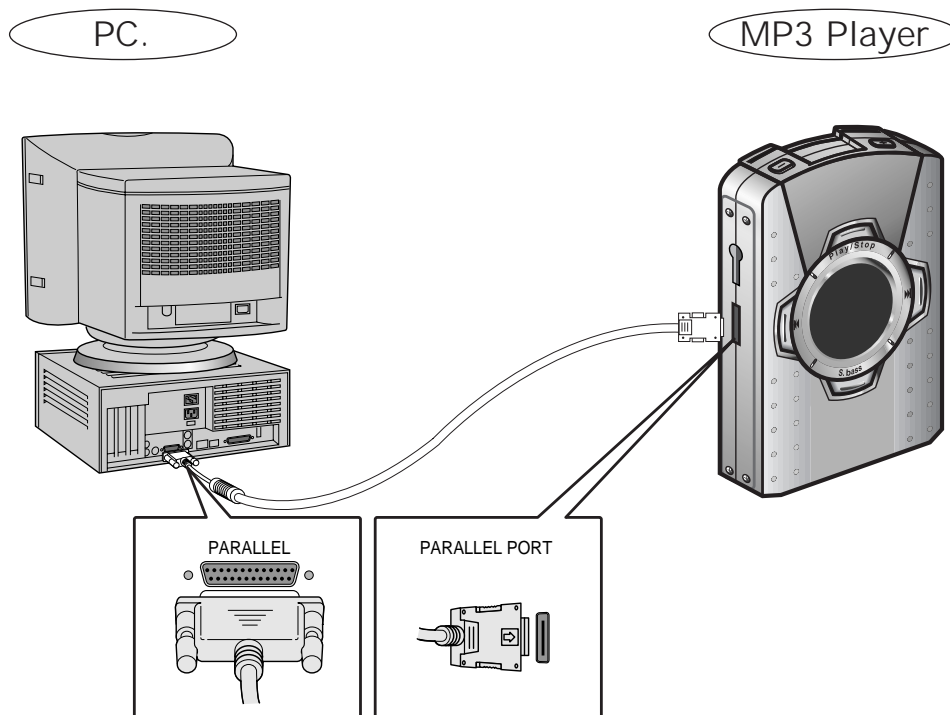

Connecting to a PC

Taking the steps shown below will prepare your Wingo for downloading MP3 files.

- **Connect the MP3 Player to a PC using a parallel cable.**



- • To download an MP3 file to your MP3 Player, the parallel port should be available on your computer.
- If a printer is connected to the parallel port of your PC, disconnect it temporarily to connect your MP3 Player.

In order to download MP3 files to MP3 Player, you should install programs contained on the CD-ROM supplied for your PC.

- This program may not be installed normally depending upon the type of your PC if MS EXPLORER version 4.01 or higher has not been installed, so install it by the supplied CD-ROM disc and via Internet.

1 Load the supplied software CD into the CD-ROM drive of your PC and click on the "NEXT" Button.

- The MP3 Player setup program will start automatically.
- If the setup does not start automatically, find the "setup.exe" file using the File Finder, then double click on it to execute the program.
- To install in another directory, use the Browse Button to select.



2 Check the icon of program path and then press the "NEXT" Button.

- An icon will be created automatically.
