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CHILD SAFETY

It makes a difference how and where you use your flat panel display

As you enjoy your new product, keep these safety tips in mind

The issue

The home theater entertainment experience is a growing trend, and larger TVs are popular purchases. However, TVs are not always supported on the proper stands or installed according to the manufacturer's recommendations. We and the consumer electronics industry are committed to making home entertainment enjoyable and safe.

TVs that are inappropriately placed on dressers, bookcases, shelves, desks, speakers, chests, or carts may fall over and cause injury.

Tune into safety

- One size of TV stand does not fit all. Use only a TV stand rated for the weight of your TV.
- Carefully read and understand all enclosed instructions for proper use of this product.
- Don't let children climb on or play with entertainment system furniture and TVs.
- Don't place TVs on furniture that can easily be used as steps, such as a chest of drawers.
- Remember that children can become excited while watching a program, especially on a "larger-than-life" TV. Make sure that you place or install the TV where it cannot be pushed, pulled over, or knocked down.
- Make sure that you route all cords and cables so that they cannot be pulled or grabbed by curious children.

Wall mounting

If you decide to wall mount your TV, always:

- Use only a wall mount rated for the weight of your TV and that has been recommended by this TV manufacturer, listed in this manual, or otherwise listed by an independent laboratory as suitable for your TV. One size of wall mount does not fit all.
- Follow all instructions supplied by the TV and wall mount manufacturers.
- If you have any doubts about your ability to safely wall mount your TV, get help from a professional installer.
- Make sure that the wall where you are mounting the TV is appropriate. Some wall mounts are not designed to be mounted to walls backed with steel studs or cinder blocks. If you are unsure, ask a professional installer.



• TVs can be heavy. At least two people are required for safe wall mount installation.



Important safety instructions



CAUTION RISK OF ELECTRIC SHOCK DO NOT OPEN



This symbol indicates that dangerous voltage constituting a risk of electric shock is present within your TV. This label is located on the back of your TV.



This symbol indicates that there are important operating and maintenance instructions in the literature accompanying your TV.

- 1 Read these instructions.
- **2** Keep these instructions.
- 3 Heed all warnings.
- 4 Follow all instructions.
- 5 Do not use this apparatus near water.
- 6 Clean only with dry cloth.
- 7 Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- 8 Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- **9** Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
- **10** Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.
- 11 Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- **12** Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over.



- **13** Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
- 14 Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.
- **15** The *mains plug* is the disconnecting device. The plug must remain readily operable.
- 16 The apparatus with grounding-type plug is a class I apparatus. Class I apparatus need to be connected to earth ground wire to prevent possible electric shock. Make sure that you connect the class I apparatus to a mains socket outlet with a protective earthing connection.
- **17** Remote control batteries should not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire, or the like.

18 The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing, and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

Warnings

Electric shock hazard

To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not remove any cover or expose the device to rain or moisture. No user-serviceable parts are inside. Refer servicing to qualified service technicians.

Lightning

For added protection for your device receiver during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the power outlet and disconnect any antenna or cable system. This helps prevent property damage and personal injury from lightning and power line surges.

Power lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

Handling the LCD panel

- Your TV's screen is made of glass. Do not drop your TV or hit, jolt, or press hard against the LCD panel. If the screen breaks, be careful of broken glass.
- If the LCD panel is broken, make absolutely sure that you do not touch the liquid in the panel. This may cause skin inflammation.
- If the liquid gets in your mouth, immediately gargle, rinse, and consult with your doctor. Also, if the liquid gets in your eyes or touches your skin, consult with your doctor after rinsing for at least 15 minutes or longer in clean water.

Replacement parts

When replacement parts are required, make sure that the service technician uses replacement parts specified by the manufacturer that have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, personal injury, or other hazards.

Safety check

After completing any service or repair to this device, ask the service technician to perform routine safety checks to determine that your TV is in correct operating condition.

Power source

Operate your TV only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home, consult an electrician or your local power company.

Cautions

Damage requiring service

Unplug this TV from the power outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

- When the power supply cord or plug is damaged or frayed.
- If liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into your TV.
- If your TV has been exposed to rain or water.
- If your TV does not operate normally by following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions because incorrect adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore your TV to its normal operation.
- If your TV has been dropped or damaged in any way.
- When your TV exhibits a distinct change in performance.

Attachments

Use only attachments recommended by Dynex.

Outdoor antenna grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to your TV, make sure that the antenna or cable system is grounded to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70, provides information with respect to correct grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of the antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

Note to CATV system installer

Article 820 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 40 provides guidance for correct grounding. Specifically, it states that the cable ground must be connected to the grounding system of the building as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

Condensation

Moisture will form on the TV if the TV is brought from cool surroundings into a warm room or if the temperature of the room rises suddenly. When this happens, the TV's performance may be impaired. To prevent this, let the TV stand in its new surroundings for about an hour before switching it on, or make sure that the room temperature rises gradually. Condensation may also form during the summer if the TV is exposed to the breeze from an air conditioner. In such cases, change the location of the TV.

Mobile telephone warning

To avoid interference with your TV picture and sound, operating problems, or even damage, keep your cordless and cellular telephones away from the TV.

End of life directives

Your TV contains tin-lead solder and a fluorescent lamp containing a small amount of mercury. Disposal of these materials may be regulated for environmental reasons. Your TV also contains material that can be

recycled and reused. For disposal or recycling information, contact your local authorities or the Electronic Industries Alliance at www.eia.org to find a recycler in your area.

Non-active pixels

The LCD panel contains almost 3 million thin film transistors, which provide exceptionally sharp video quality. Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed blue, green, or red point. These non-active pixels do not adversely affect the performance of your TV, and are not considered defects.

Installing the stand

To install the stand:

1 Position the base stand with the Front label positioned facing the LCD screen.



- 2 Push the TV onto the base until the clips snap into place.
- 3 Secure the base to the TV with four (4) ST4x8 screws.



Removing the stand

If you intend to mount your TV on a wall or other vertical surface, you must remove the stand.

Warning: Before attempting removal of the stand, unplug the AC power cord.

Cautions:

- Read these instructions thoroughly before attempting this installation.
- Make sure that you handle your TV very carefully when attempting removal of the stand. If you are not sure of your ability to do this, or to use the tools necessary to complete this job, refer to a professional installer or service personnel. The manufacturer is not responsible for any damages or injuries that occur due to mishandling or improper assembly.
- When using a table or bench as an aid to assembly, make sure that you place the TV on a soft cushion or covering to prevent accidental scratching or damage to your TV's finish.
- The speaker is not intended to support the weight of your TV. Do not move or handle your TV by the speaker. This can cause damage to your TV that is not covered by the manufacturer's warranty.

Removing the stand

To remove the stand from the stand column:

- 1 Lay your TV face down on a table or bench. Make sure that you put down a soft cushion or cloth so that your TV is not scratched.
- 2 Adjust the stand so that the angle between the stand and the TV is 90°.
- **3** Remove the two (2) M4 screws that secure your TV to the stand, then pull the stand off the TV.

Back

Installing a wall-mount bracket

If you want to attach the TV to a wall-mount bracket (not provided), you should first remove the stand.

To attach your TV to a wall-mount bracket:

- **Warning**: These servicing instructions are for use by qualified service personnel only. To reduce the risk of hazards, do not perform any servicing other than that contained in the operating instructions unless you are qualified to do so.
- Secure the wall-mount bracket to the back of your TV using the four M4 screws provided with the bracket.

Using the remote control

Installing remote control batteries

To install remote control batteries:

- **1** Open the battery compartment cover by pressing the release button.
- 2 Insert two AA batteries into the battery compartment. Make sure that the + and symbols on the batteries match the + and symbols in the battery compartment.



3 Replace the cover.

Notes:

Do not mix different types of batteries.

Do not mix old and new batteries.

Remove batteries when they no longer have a charge. Chemicals may leak into the battery compartment. Battery chemicals can cause a rash. If chemicals leak, clean the battery compartment with a cloth.

Remove the batteries if you do not intend to use the remote control for an extended amount of time.

Do not dispose of batteries in a fire. Dispose of them as hazardous waste.

Aiming the remote control

To use the remote control:

• Point the remote control towards the remote sensor on the front of your TV. The remote control's range is about 26 ft. (8 m).



Notes:

Do not expose the remote control to shock or liquids.

Do not use the remote control in an area with high humidity.

Do not place the remote control in direct sunlight.

- Do not place objects, such as furniture, between the remote control and the remote sensor.
- The remote control may not work if direct sunlight or bright light shines on the remote sensor. Either move your TV or change the angle at which you use the remote control.

Programming a universal remote control to work with your TV

You can operate your TV with a new or existing universal remote control.

To program a universal remote control:

1 Find the code for your universal remote control by identifying its model (or your set-top box's remote control manufacturer and model) on the charts below, then make note of the numbered code below it. You will use the numbered code to program your remote control to work with your TV.

Tips:

- The brand name is often visible on the front of the universal remote control, and the model number is often visible on the back.
- If your universal remote control isn't listed on the chart, refer to your universal remote control's instructions and try codes for the brands Orion, Emerson, Memorex, Sansui, Sylvania, or Zenith. You may need to try several codes before finding a match.
- 2 Follow your universal remote control's instructions to enter the code you found in Step 1.

Tips:

- If your universal remote control has a code search feature, run a code search to identify a code that matches your TV. See your universal remote control's instructions for details.
- If your universal remote control has a "Learn" feature, you can manually program it using your TV remote to "teach" the commands one at a time. See your universal remote control's instructions for details
- 3 If all else fails, you must use a different universal remote control that can operate both your set-top box and your TV. Five such remotes are listed on the chart, but many other compatible models are available in the market.

Making connections

Cautions:

Check the terminals for position and type before making any connections.

- Loose connections can result in image or color problems. Make sure that all connections are tight and secure.
- The external audio/video equipment shown in these illustrations may be different from your equipment. If you have questions, refer to the user manual that came with your equipment.

Always turn the power off when connecting external equipment.

Connecting the power

To connect the power:

• Plug the AC cord into an AC power outlet.

Notes:

Your TV should only be operated from the power source indicated on the label.

Always unplug the AC power cord from the AC power outlet when you will not be using your TV for an extended period of time.

Connecting an antenna or cable TV

To connect an antenna, cable TV, or satellite TV box:

1 Connect one end of a 75 ohm cable (not included) to the **RF OUT** jack on the antenna or on the cable or satellite TV box.



2 Connect the other end of the cable to the **ANT/CABLE IN** jack on the back of your TV.

Notes:

Use a 75 ohm cable to eliminate interference and noise from radio waves.

Do not bundle the 75 ohm cable with the power cord or other cables.

- If the antenna is not installed correctly, contact qualified service personnel to correct the problem.
- To improve picture quality in a poor signal area, purchase and install a signal amplifier.

Connecting a cable TV or satellite box

If you subscribe to a cable TV service from a local provider you can watch cable TV programming. The TV cannot display TV programming unless a TV tuner device or cable TV converter box is connected to the TV. For further information regarding cable TV service, contact your local cable TV service provider(s).

To connect to a cable TV or satellite TV box:

- 1 Connect the incoming cable from the satellite wall jack to the **SATELLITE IN** jack on the satellite box.
- 2 Depending on the jacks available on the satellite TV receiver (set top box), connect a cable from the outgoing jacks on the satellite box to the corresponding jacks on the back of your TV. The connection can be to the HDMI, component video, S-Video, or AV jack.
- 3 If you use a component video, S-Video, or AV cable, connect audio cables to the corresponding jacks on the back of your TV and on the staellite box.
- 4 Turn on your TV, then press INPUT to select VIDEO mode for the type of connection you use.

5 Select the channel you want with the remote control for the cable box.



Connecting a VCR

To connect a VCR (option 1):

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the VCR is turned off.
- 2 Connect a 75 ohm RF wire to the **ANT OUT** jack on your VCR and to the **ANT/CABLE IN** jack on your TV (1), then switch the output of the VCR to 3 or 4 and tune your TV to the same channel.

To connect a VCR (option 2):

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the VCR is turned off.
- 2 Connect an AV cable to the **AV VIDEO OUT** jack on the VCR.



3 Connect the other end of the cable to the **VIDEO IN** jack on the back of your TV.

For a better picture, you can connect an S-Video cable to the **S-VIDEO Out** jack on the VCR and to the **S-VIDEO IN** jack on your TV.

- 4 Connect an audio cable to the **AV AUDIO OUT** jacks on the VCR.
- 5 Connect the other end of the cable to the **AUDIO IN L** and **R** jacks on the back of your TV.

To play from the VCR (option 2):

- Turn on your TV, then press INPUT to select Composite or S-Video input mode.
- 2 Turn on the VCR, insert a videotape, then press **PLAY** on the VCR.

Connecting a camcorder or game

Tip: Some game consoles have an HDMI connector, which can be used for a better picture.

To connect a camcorder or game:

- Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the camcorder or game is turned off.
- 2 Connect an AV cable to the AV OUT VIDEO, AUDIO-L, and AUDIO-R jacks on the camcorder or game.



3 Connect the other end of the cable to the **VIDEO IN**, **AUDIO-L**, and **AUDIO-R** jacks on the back of your TV.

To play from a camcorder or game:

- 1 Turn on your TV, then press **INPUT** to select Composite mode.
- 2 Turn on the camcorder or game, and set it to the correct output mode. See the camcorder's or game's user guides for more information.

Connecting an HDMI device

To connect an HDMI device:

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the HDMI device is turned off.
- 2 Connect an HDMI cable to the **HDMI OUT** jack on the HDMI device.



3 Connect the other end of the cable to the **HDMI** jack on the back of your TV.

To play from the HDMI device:

- **1** Turn on your TV, then press **INPUT** select **HDMI**.
- 2 Turn on the HDMI device, and set it to the correct output mode. See the HDMI device's user guide for more information.
 - **Note:** If the external device has DVI output only, use a DVI-to-HDMI adapter to connect to the **HDMI** jack, then connect an audio cable to the **PC AUDIO IN** jack.

Connecting a component video device

To connect a component video device:

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the component video device is turned off.
- 2 Connect a component video cable to the **COMPONENT OUT** jacks on the component video device.



- **3** Connect the other end of the component video cable to the **COMPONENT IN** jacks on the back of your TV.
- 4 Connect an audio cable to the **AUDIO OUT** jacks (L/R) on the component device.
- 5 Connect the other end of the audio cable to the COMPONENT AUDIO-R and AUDIO-L jacks on the back of your TV.

To play from a component device:

- 1 Turn on your TV, then press **INPUT** to select **Component**.
- 2 Turn on the component video device and set it to the correct output mode. See the component video device's user guide for more information.

Connecting a computer

Tip: Some computers have an HDMI connector, which can be used for a better picture.

To connect a computer:

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the computer is turned off.
- 2 Connect a VGA cable (not provided) to the VGA jack on the computer, then connect the other end of the cable to the VGA IN jack on the back of your TV.

Note: The VGA cable should be a 15-pin D-Sub (analog RGB) cable.



3 Connect an audio cable to the **AUDIO OUT** jack on the computer, then connect the other end of the cable to the **PC AUDIO IN** jack on the back of your TV.

Note: The audio cable should have a stereo mini plug.

To play video from a computer:

- 1 Turn on your TV, then press **INPUT** to select **VGA**.
- 2 Turn on the computer, then check the image on your TV. There may be noise associated with the resolution, vertical pattern, contrast, or brightness in VGA mode. If noise is present, change the PC mode to another resolution, change the refresh rate to another rate, or adjust the brightness and contrast on the menu until the picture is clear. If the refresh rate of the PC graphic card can not be changed, change the PC graphic card.

 - VGA
 - HDMI
 - Press ENTER/VOL+ to confirm.
- 4 Select the TV signal source for your TV and auto scan for channels.
 - Press MENU, then press VOL+/VOL- to highlight CHANNELS.
 - Press ENTER/VOL+. The Channels menu opens.



 Press CH+/CH- to highlight Auto Channels Search, then press ENTER/VOL+ The Auto Channels Search sub-menu opens.

Turning your TV on or off

To turn your TV on or off (standby mode):

- 1 Plug the power cord into an AC power outlet.
- 2 Press 🙂 (power). Your TV turns on.
- 3 Press 🕁 again to turn off your TV. When you turn off your TV, it goes into standby mode.

Warning: When your TV is in standby mode, it is still receiving power. To completely disconnect power, unplug the power cord.

Note: If your TV does not receive an input signal for several minutes, it automatically goes into standby mode.

Navigating the menus



Selecting a channel

To select a channel:

- Press CH+ or CH- to go to the next or previous channel on the memorized channel list.
- Press the number buttons to enter the analog or digital (main) channel number you want, then wait for the channel to change, or press **ENTER** to change the channel immediately.
 - To select a digital sub-channel, press the number buttons to select the main digital channel, then press the dot (.) button to select the sub-channel. Wait for the channel to change, or press **ENTER** to change the channel immediately.

Note: Button presses must be within three seconds of each other.

- Press RECALL to go to the last channel viewed.
- Press CH.LIST to display a list of memorized channels, press CH+ or CH- select the channel you want from the list, then press ENTER/VOL+ to go to that channel.
- Press FAVORITE to display a list of your saved favorite channels, press CH+ or CH- to select the channel you want from the list, then press ENTER/VOL+ to go to that channel.
 - **Note:** If either list has more than one page, press **CH**+ or **CH** to scroll through the pages.

Digital sub-channels

A digital TV signal transmits more data than an analog signal. This increase in data provides a better picture and sound with less static and interference. The increased data capacity also lets broadcasters fit several channels into the same bandwidth as an analog signal. Broadcasters may use these sub-channels to transmit a variety of information, such as weather forecasts, foreign languages, and commercials. A digital sub-channel is indicated by the main channel number, followed by a dot, then the sub-channel number. For example, 5.1 indicates sub-channel 1 of main channel 5.

Adjusting the volume

To adjust the volume:

- Press VOL+ or VOL- to increase or decrease the volume.
- Press MUTE to temporarily turn off all sound (except the headphones). Press MUTE again to restore the sound.

Adjusting basic settings

To adjust basic settings:

Press MENU. The on-screen menu opens with the *Picture* menu displayed.

 - **Closed Caption**—Lets you turn closed captioning on or off. Also lets you set closed caption options.
 - Time—Lets you set the clock and the sleep timer.
 - Menu Settings—Lets you set menu language and menu transparency.
 - Input Label—Lets you label a device connected to your TV's input jacks.
 - Computer Settings—Lets you adjust picture settings to optimize a computer display.
- 4 Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

Displaying additional information

To display additional information:

- Press INFO to show an information banner. The information banner shows current program information such as channel number, video input source, and resolution.
 - Digital mode information—Displays channel number, station name, channel label (if preset), broadcast program name, TV rating, signal type, audio information, resolution, current time, and current program start and end times.
 - Analog mode information—Displays channel number, channel label (if preset), signal type, and audio information.
- Press GUIDE to display EPG OSD of the channel, including program name. channel number, program description, channel label, TV rating, digital closed caption, and program show time.



Adjusting the picture

Adjusting the TV picture

To adjust the picture:

1 Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the *Picture* menu displayed, then press **ENTER/CH**-. The *Picture* menu opens.



- 2 Press CH+ or CH- to highlight an option, then press ENTER/VOL+ to enter the sub-menu. You can select:
 - Mode—Selects the picture mode Vivid, Standard, Energy Savings, Theater, Sports, or Custom. You can also press PICTURE on the remote control to select the picture mode.
 - Brightness—Adjusts the brightness.
 - **Contrast**—Adjusts the contrast.
 - **Color**—Adjusts the color saturation.
 - **Tint**—Adjusts the image tint.
 - Sharpness—Adjusts the sharpness.
 - Advanced Video—Lets you set the following:
 - Aspect Ratio-Select Normal, Zoom, Wide, Cinema, or Auto Zoom.
 - **Overscan**—Turn this **On** to adjust the picture's reproduction rate when receiving DVI signals in VIDEO format. Available when the signal uses EIA timing (480i/480p/720p/1080i/1080p).

- Color Temperature–Select Warm (increased red), Normal, or Cool (increased blue).
- **Backlight**-Adjusts the overall brilliance of the screen.
- Noise Reduction—Selects the noise reduction mode to reduce picture noise (snow). Choose High, Middle, Low, or Off.
- Advanced Contrast—Turn this On to optimize the picture display for a more vivid image.
- Reset Picture Settings—Resets all picture settings to factory default.
- **Note:** You can only adjust Brightness, Contrast, Color Temperature, Tint, and Sharpness if you set the Mode to Custom.
- 3 Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

Adjusting the computer image

To adjust the computer image:

- 1 Make sure that your TV is in VGA mode. For more information, see "On-screen menu overview" on page 11.
- 2 Press MENU. The on-screen menu opens.



3 Press VOL+ or VOL- to highlight Settings, then press ENTER/CH-. The Settings menu opens.

Setting parental controls

DVD Playback

Basic playback

To load and play a DVD:

- 1 Press **DVD** on the remote control to enter DVD mode.
- 2 When the TV displays "OPEN," place a DVD in the disc slot with the label facing the back of the TV.

The disc is loaded automatically after one to two seconds, then the DVD player reads the DVD and displays the opening menu. (If there is no disc placed in the DVD slot, "OPEN" will remain on the screen.)

- **3** Press the cursor buttons on the remote control to select menu options, then press **PLAY/ENTER** to start playback. You can also press the digit buttons to select a menu option directly, though some DVDs do not allow this during startup. During playback you can:
 - Press PAUSE II to pause playback (still mode). The sound is muted during still mode.
 - Press **PLAY/ENTER** to resume normal playback.
 - Press FWD ►► to fast forward through the disc. Each time
 FWD ►► is pressed, the fast forward speed changes.
 - Press **PLAY/ENTER** to resume normal playback.
 - Press REV << to fast reverse through the disc. Each time REV << is pressed, the fast reverse speed changes.
 - Press **PLAY/ENTER** to resume normal playback.
 - Press PREV I to repeat the current chapter. If you press within two seconds of when the current chapter begins, it will move to the last chapter until the start of the disc is reached.
 - Press NEXT ► to skip the current chapter and play the next one.
 - Press STOP I to stop playback. The TV screen shows the start logo. With some discs, such as DVDs or CDs, the player can resume playback from the point where it was stopped.
- 4 Press **PLAY/ENTER** to resume playback from the location where the playback was stopped.
- 5 Press STOP 🔳 twice to stop completely.

Advanced playback

All described functions can be activated by pressing the indicated button on the remote control. These functions are for DVDs. If you play other disc formats, the operation and on-screen display are different.

SUBTITLE—Press this to select a subtitle from the available languages. The screen displays "SUBTITLE 01/XX", where "01" indicates the ordinal number of the language, "XX" indicates the total number of languages available. (The number of language available depends on disc.) This function can select up to 32 languages, if available.

REPEAT—Press to repeat a portion of the DVD.

- Press once to repeat the current chapter ("CHAPTER" is be displayed on screen).
- Press twice o repeat the current title ("TITLE" is displayed on the screen).
- Press three times to repeat the entire DVD ("ALL" is displayed on the screen).
- Press a fourth time to cancel the repeat function.

A-B—Press to repeat a selected portion of a DVD. Press once to set a starting point, press again to set an end point and complete the set up. The selected section will be repeated. Press a third time to cancel this function.

ANGLE—When enjoying sports, concert, or theatre, press this key to view the DVD from different angles (when available).

MENU—Press this key to display the DVD root menu.

DISPLAY—Pressing this key cycles through information about the DVD, including Title Elapsed, Title Remaining, Chapter Elapsed, Chapter Remaining, and Display off.

PROGRAM—Press to enter program mode, then press the number buttons to select the program number that you want. When finished move the cursor to select **START**, then press **PLAY/ENTER** to confirm and start the program playback.

T.SEARCH—Press once to display the search menu for chapter search. Enter a chapter number to go to that chapter. Press **T-SEARCH** twice for time search. Enter hour, minute and second number to go to that spot. Press the program number buttons to input the item you want, then press **PLAY/ENTER** to confirm.

SLOW—Press to play a disc in slow motion. Each time the button is pressed, the slow motion speed changes. Press **PLAY/ENTER** to resume normal playback.

Note: This function does not work for CDs.

TITLE—Pressing this key displays the title menu on some DVDs. You can then use the number buttons to select the item you prefer. **AUDIO**—Press to cycle between Mono Left, Mono Right, Mix-Mono, and Stereo audio modes.

JPEG disc playback

A JPEG disc contains JPEG (.jpg) format picture information that can be decoded by software and displayed through the video output interface or on the television screen.

This function has many applications. For example, you can save files from a scanner or digital camera in the JPEG format, record these on a CD-R disc and present them to an audience through this player. The JPEG format is a convenient method to store images in a small amount of memory space, and is ideal for archiving information. When a disc containing standard JPEG picture files is inserted into the player, a navigation menu is displayed automatically. Use the \blacktriangle (up) and \checkmark (down) cursor buttons to select a file then press **PLAY/ENTER** to begin a slide show.

Press **PREV I** or **NEXT I** to move between pictures. Press **PAUSE II** to stop on the current picture. Press **PLAY/ENTER** to resume normal playback.

Screen saver

This TV employs a screen saver mode to help protect the screen during static video pictures. This can be turned off on the *GENERAL SETUP* page.

In PS mode, wide screen material will fill the screen, but at the expense of chopping off extreme left and right edges of the original film picture.
