Listens to music stored on your **Bluetooth** device.

Blends the end of one song into the beginning of another for seamless playback.

USB Direct Recording

Records music to your USB device.

Listens to music from your portable device. (MP3, Notebook, etc.)

TAPE

Cassette tapes can be played back in this unit.

Music file requirement

MP3/WMA file compatibility with this unit is limited as follows.

- Sampling frequency : within 32 to 48 kHz (MP3), within 32 to 48 kHz (WMA)
- Bit rate : within 32 to 320 kbps (MP3), 40 to 192 kbps (WMA)
- Maximum files : Data CD : 999 / USB : 2,000
- Maximum folders : Data CD : 99 / USB : 200
- File extensions : "mp3"/".wma"
- Certain MP3/WMA files may not be played depending on the type or format of the file.
- CD-ROM file format : ISO 9660/JOLIET
- We recommend that you use Easy-CD Creator, which creates an ISO 9660 file system.

The DTS is not supported. In case of DTS audio format, audio is not output.

You have to set the disc format option to [Mastered] in order to make the discs compatible with the LG players when formatting rewritable discs. When setting the option to Live File System, you cannot use it on LG players.


Compatible USB Devices

- MP3 Player : Flash type MP3 player.
- USB Flash Drive : Devices that support USB2.0 or USB1.1.
- The USB function of this unit does not support all USB devices.

USB device requirement

- Devices which require additional program installation when you have connected it to a computer, are not supported.
- Do not extract the USB device while in operation.
- For a large capacity USB, it may take a few minute to be searched.
- To prevent data loss, back up all data.
- If you use a USB extension cable or USB hub, the USB device is not recognized.
- Using NTFS file system is not supported. (Only FAT(16/32) file system is supported.)
- This unit recognizes up to 2,000 files.
- External HDD, card readers, locked devices, or hard type USB devices are not supported.
- USB port of the unit cannot be connected to the PC. The unit cannot be used as a storage device.
- Some USB may not work with this unit.



Replacement of battery



Remove the battery cover on the rear of the remote control, and insert the batteries with \bigoplus and \bigoplus matched correctly.

PROGRAM/MEMORY :

- Stores radio stations.
- Creates a programmed list you want to listen to.
- Deletes all the saved stations.

DELETE :

- Deletes MP3/WMA files. (USB only).



Connecting to speakers

Connecting the speakers to the unit

To connect the cable to the unit, press each plastic finger pad to open the connection terminals on the unit. Insert the wire and release the finger pad.

Connect the black of each wire to the terminals marked - (minus) and the other end to the terminals marked + (plus).



\triangle Caution

- When you connect the speakers to the unit, make sure to connect the speaker's cable and plug to the corresponding speaker connector.
- Check the volume level before playing music to prevent infirm, child, and pregnant women from being shocked by the sudden and loud sound from the unit.
- Use the speaker supplied with this unit only. Using any other speaker may cause malfunction.
- Be careful to make sure children do not put their hands or any objects into the *speaker duct.


* speaker duct : A hole for plentiful bass sound on speaker cabinet (enclosure)

 The speakers contain magnet parts, so color irregularity may occur on the TV screen or PC monitor screen. Please use the speakers far away from either TV screen or PC monitor.


Connect a USB device to the USB ports on the unit.




AUX IN Connection

Connect an output of auxiliary device(Camcorder, TV, Player, etc) to the **AUX IN(L/R)** connector.

If your device has only one output for audio(mono), connect it to the left(white) audio jack on the unit.




To the audio output jacks of your component (Camcorder, TV, Player, etc.)



PORT. IN Connection

Connect an output (earphone or line out) of portable device (MP3 or PMP etc) to the **PORT. IN** connector.



Listening to music from your portable player or external device

The unit can be used to play the music from many types of portable player or external device.

1. Connect the portable player to the **PORT. IN** connector of the unit.

Or

Connect the external device to the **AUX IN** connector of the unit.

- 2. Turn the power on by pressing \bigcirc .
- 3. Press **F** on the remote control to select AUX or PORTABLE function.
- 4. Turn on the portable player or external device and start it playing.

Basic Operations

CD/USB Operations

- Insert the disc by pressing ▲ on the remote control or △ on the unit. Or connect the USB device to the USB port.
- 2. Select CD or USB function by pressing **F** on the remote control.
- 3. On CD function, select the disc by pressing **DISC SKIP**.

*DIR : Directory

- When you play programmed list, only RPT 1 and RPT ALL are available.
- Even after restarting the unit or switching one function to another, you can listen to music from the point where it's last been played.
- If you leave the disc tray open for 5 minutes, it will close automatically.

Auto Play

- AUDIO/MP3/WMA CD is played automatically after disc tray is open and then closed.
- Automatically the unit switches to the CD function if disc tray is opened and then closed even when there is no disc in disc tray.

TAPE Operations

Listening to cassette tapes

- 1. Press **F** on the remote control or **TAPE** on the unit to select TAPE function.
- 3. Load a cassette tape with the side you want to play facing forward.

Even if you change the TAPE function to another, TAPE function works but mutes the sound.

Other Operations

Programmed Playback

The program function enables you to store your favorite files from any disc or USB device. A program can contain 20 tracks/files for media.

On CD function, select the desired disc by pressing **DISC SKIP**.

- Press PROGRAM/MEMORY on the remote control or MEMORY/REPEAT on the unit in stop status.
- Press I → I on the remote control or
 I → I on the unit to select a track/file.
- Press PROGRAM/MEMORY on the remote control or MEMORY/REPEAT on the unit to save and select a next track/file.
- Repeat steps 2 3 to store other tracks/files. (You can modify the list by pressing PRESET/FOLDER ∧/V on the remote control to select the program number.)
- Press PROGRAM/MEMORY on the remote control or MEMORY/REPEAT on the unit once again.

To play the programmed list, press ►II on the remote control or ►II on the unit after you make the list.

- 🕛 Note

When making or modifying the programmed list, REPEAT mode is off.

Deleting Programmed list

Deleting function only works in the edit mode.


- 1. Press **PROGRAM/MEMORY** on the remote control or **MEMORY/REPEAT** on the unit in stop status.
- 2. Select a song by pressing PROGRAM/MEMORY on the remote control or PRESET/FOLDER Λ/V on the remote control repeatedly.
- 3. Press **DELETE** on the remote control while a song is selected.

- 🕕 Note

- Programmed list is cleared in the case below.
 Removing the disc or the USB device.
 - Deleting or recording music files in the USB device.
 - Unplugging the power cord.
- Program is switched off in the case below.
 - Changing to a different function.
 - Turning off and on the unit.

Searching for a folder and an MP3/WMA file

- Press PRESET/FOLDER Λ/V on the remote control repeatedly until a desired folder appears.
- 2. Press ►II on the remote control or ►II on the unit to play it. The first file of the folder will be played.



- If there is no file in a folder, the folder will not appear.
- Folders will be presented as the following order,
 ROOT → FOLDER1 → FOLDER3 →

FOLDER 7 \rightarrow FOLDER 8 \rightarrow FOLDER 5 \rightarrow FOLDER 6

- File will be played from ♪ file No.1 to ♪ file No.14 one by one.
- Files and folders will be presented in order recorded and may be presented differently according to the record circumstances.
- *ROOT : The first screen you can see when a computer recognize the CD/USB is "ROOT".

Deleting a file/folder or format

You can delete file, folder on your USB or format the USB.

- 1. Select USB function by pressing F.
- -Deletes file : Select the file you want to delete and select "DEL FILE" by pressing DELETE on the remote control.

-Deletes folder : Select the folder you want to delete and select "DEL DIR" by pressing **DELETE** on the remote control.

-Formats USB : Select "FORMAT" by pressing **DELETE** on the remote control to format the USB device.

If you want to exit the current mode, Press \blacksquare on the remote control or \square on the unit.

3. To delete file/folder or format, press ►II on the remote control or ►II on the unit.

- 🖄 Caution -

- Do not extract the USB device during operation. (play, delete, etc.)
- Regular back up is recommended to prevent data loss.
- The delete function may not be supported according to the USB status. (lock, etc.)

AUTO DJ

Auto DJ blends the end of one song into the beginning of another for seamless playback. It equalizes volume across tracks for uninterrupted playback.

Press **AUTO DJ** repeatedly, the display changes as followings.

AUTO DJ RANDOM \rightarrow AUTO DJ SEQUENTIAL \rightarrow AUTO DJ OFF

Mode	Display Window	Description

RANDOM	AUTO DJ RANDOM	The music is played randomly on this mode.
REPEAT	AUTO DJ SEQUENTIAL	The music is played repeatedly on this mode.

Note

- AUTO DJ mode does not support searching for a section within a track/file or to play repeatedly or randomly.
- If you move to other functions or stop the music using ■ on the remote control or □ on the unit on AUTO DJ mode, AUTO DJ will be disabled.
- AUTO DJ is not supported in the music file whose length is less than 60 seconds.
- During recording, AUTO DJ is not available.
- Only AUTO DJ SEQUENTIAL is selected when played programmed list.

Turn off the sound temporarily

Press ⋪ on the remote control to mute your sound. You can mute your unit, for example, to answer the telephone, the "♥ " will appear in the display window. To cancel it, press ⋪ on the remote control again or change the volume level.

Using a BLUETOOTH® wireless technology

About BLUETOOTH

Bluetooth is wireless communication technology for short range connection.

The sound may be interrupted when the connection has interference from other electronic devices or you connect a **Bluetooth** device from a different room. Connecting individual devices under **Bluetooth** wireless technology does not incur any charges. A mobile phone with **Bluetooth** wireless technology can be operated via the Cascade if the connection was made via **Bluetooth** wireless technology.

- Available Devices : Smart phone, MP3, Notebook, etc.
- Codec : SBC

BLUETOOTH Profiles

In order to use **Bluetooth** wireless technology, devices must be able to interpret certain profiles. This unit is compatible with following profile.

A2DP (Advanced Audio Distribution Profile)

Listening to music stored on the BLUETOOTH devices

Pairing your unit and BLUETOOTH device

Before you start the pairing procedure, make sure the **Bluetooth** feature is activated on your **Bluetooth** device. Refer to your **Bluetooth** device's user guide. Once a pairing operation is performed, it does not need to be performed again.

- 1. Turn on the unit.
- Operate the **Bluetooth** device and perform the pairing operation. When searching for this unit with the **Bluetooth** device, a list of the devices found may appear in the **Bluetooth** device display depending on the type of **Bluetooth** device. Your unit appears as "LG CM3370(XX)".

- I Note

- XX means the last two digits of Bluetooth address. For example, if your unit has a Bluetooth address such as 9C:02:98:4A:F7:08, you will see "LG CM3370(08)" on your Bluetooth device.
- Depending on the **Bluetooth** device type, some devices may have a different pairing process. Enter the PIN code (0000) as needed.
- When this unit has successfully connected with your **Bluetooth** device, "PAIRED" will be appear on the display window. After a short amount of time, the **Bluetooth** device name will be displayed.

Note

If the device name is unavailable, "_" will be displayed.

4. Listen to music.

To play a music stored on your **Bluetooth** device, refer to your **Bluetooth** device's user guide

Note

 When using Bluetooth technology, you have to make a connection between the unit and the Bluetooth device as close as possible and keep the distance.
 However, it may not work well in certain

situations as described below:

- There is a obstacle between the unit and the **Bluetooth** device.
- There is a device using same frequency with **Bluetooth** technology such as a medical equipment, a microwave or a wireless LAN device.
- You should connect your **Bluetooth** device to this unit again when you restart it.
- The sound may be interrupted when the connection has interference from other electronic devices.
- Depending on the type of the device, you may not be able to use the **Bluetooth** function.
- You can enjoy wireless system using phone, MP3, Notebook, etc.
- The more distance between the unit and the **Bluetooth** device, the lower the sound quality becomes.
- **Bluetooth** connection will be disconnected when the unit is turned off or the **Bluetooth** device gets far from the unit.
- When **Bluetooth** connection is disconnected, connect the **Bluetooth** device to the unit again.
- When a **Bluetooth** device is not connected, "BT READY" appears on the display window.
- When you use **Bluetooth** function, adjust the volume to a proper level on the **Bluetooth** device.
- When you connect **Bluetooth** device (iOS device etc.) to this unit or operate the device, the volume level can be synchronized with each other.
- To connect a new Bluetooth device, disconnect the currently connected Bluetooth device and connect a new Bluetooth device.

Radio Operations

Listening to the radio

- Press F on the remote control or FM on the unit until FM appears in the display window. The last received station is tuned in.
- Auto tuning : Press and hold TUNING -/+ on the remote control or I / / > I on the unit for about two seconds until the frequency indication starts to change, then release.

Scanning stops when the unit tunes in a station.

Or

 Adjust the volume by pressing VOL +/- on the remote control or rotating volume knob on the unit repeatedly.

Improving poor FM reception

press $\blacktriangleright II$ on the remote control or $\ensuremath{\mathsf{STEREO}/\mathsf{MONO}}$ on the unit.

This will change the tuner from stereo to mono and usually improve the reception.

Presetting the Radio Stations

You can preset 50 stations for FM. Before tuning, make sure to turn down the volume.

- 1. Press **F** on the remote control or **FM** on the unit until FM appears in the display window.
- Select the desired frequency by pressing TUNING -/+ on the remote control or I
 Image: Image of the select of the sel
- Press PROGRAM/MEMORY on the remote control or MEMORY/REPEAT on the unit. A preset number will blink in the display window.
- Press PRESET/FOLDER ∧/V on the remote control or PRESET +/- on the unit to select the preset number you want.
- Press PROGRAM/MEMORY on the remote control or MEMORY/REPEAT on the unit. The station is stored.
- 6. Repeat steps 2 to 5 to store other stations.
- 7. To listen to a preset station, press **PRESET/FOLDER** Λ/V on the remote control or **PRESET +/-** on the unit.

Deleting all the saved stations

- Press and hold PROGRAM/MEMORY on the remote control or MEMORY/REPEAT on the unit for two seconds. "ERASE ALL" will flash up on the unit display.
- Press PROGRAM/MEMORY on the remote control or MEMORY/REPEAT on the unit to erase all the saved radio stations.

Sound adjustment

Setting the sound mode

This system has a number of pre-set surround sound fields. The displayed items for the equalizer may be different depending on sound sources and effects.

You can select a desired sound mode by using SOUND EFFECT.

On Display	Description
POP CLASSIC JAZZ ROCK	This program lends an enthusiastic atmosphere to the sound, giving you the feeling you are at an actual rock, pop, jazz or classic concert.
AUTO EQ	Sets the sound equalizer on the mode that is the most similar to the genre which is included in the MP3 ID3 tag of song files.
BASS BLAST	Reinforces the treble, bass and surround sound effect.
STANDARD	You can enjoy optimized sound.



Note

- On some speakers, sound may not be heard or heard in low sound depending on the sound mode.
- Maybe you need to reset the sound mode, after switching the input, sometimes even after the sound track changed.
- By pressing BASS BLAST, you can directly select BASS BLAST effect.

Advanced Operations

Recording to USB

Recording to USB - CD, AUX, PORTABLE, FM

You can record a various sound source to USB. (CD, AUX, PORTABLE, FM)

- 1. Connect the USB device to the unit.
- 2. Select a function by pressing **F** on the remote control.

One track/file recording - You can record to USB after playing a track/file you want.

All tracks/files recording - You can record to USB after full stop status.

Programmed list recording - After showing the programmed list, you can record it to USB. (Refer to page 19)

- 3. Start the recording by pressing **USB REC** on the remote control or **R** on the unit.
- To stop recording, press on the remote control or □ on the unit.

Recording to USB - TAPE

You can record a various sound source to USB. (TAPE)

- 1. Connect the USB device to the unit.
- 2. Select TAPE function by pressing **F** on the remote control or **TAPE** on the unit.
- 3. Load a cassette tape with the side you want to record facing forward.
- 4. Press > on the unit.
- 5. Start the recording by pressing **USB REC** on the remote control or **R** on the unit.
- 6. To stop recording, press on the remote control or □ on the unit.

Pausing recording

During recording, press ►II on the remote control or ►II on the unit to pause recording. Press it again to restart recording. (Only AUX, PORTABLE, TAPE, FM)

To select recording bit rate and speed

- 1. Press **USB REC** on the remote control or **R** on the unit for longer than 3 seconds.
- 2. Use I I in the remote control to select the bit rate.
- Press USB REC on the remote control or R on the unit again to select the recording speed.
- Press I◄◀ / ►►I on the remote control to select a desired recording speed : (AUDIO CD only)



- You can check the recording percentage rate for the USB record on the display window during the recording. (MP3/WMA CD Only)

- Do not remove the USB device or turn off the unit during USB recording. If does not, an incomplete file may be made and not deleted on PC.
- If USB recording does not work, the message like "NO USB", "ERROR", "USB FULL", "NOT SUPPORT" or "NO REC" is displayed on the display window.
- Multi card reader device or external HDD cannot be used for USB recording.
- A file is recorded by about 512 Mbyte when you record for a long term.

Setting the Clock

- 1. Turn the unit on.
- 2. Press and hold CLOCK.
- 3. Select time mode by pressing **I** on the remote control.
 - AM 12:00 (for an AM and PM display) or 0:00 (for a 24 hour display)
- 4. Press SET to confirm your selection.
- 5. Select the hours by pressing **I** on the remote control.
- 6. Press SET.
- 7. Select the minutes by pressing **I** on the remote control.
- 8. Press SET.

Using your player as an alarm clock

- 1. Turn the unit on.
- 2. Press and hold ALARM.

Note

- If you set the clock, you can check the time by pressing CLOCK even when the player is turned off.
- You can set alarm after you set the clock.
- If you set the clock and alarm, you can check the alarm icon "^(C)" and setting information by pressing ALARM even when the unit is turned off.
- You can select ALARM on/off mode by pressing **ALARM**.

Sleep Timer Setting

Press SLEEP on the remote control or SLEEP/ DEMO on the unit repeatedly to select delay time between 10 and 180 minutes. After the delay time, the unit will be turned off.

To cancel the sleep function, press SLEEP on the remote control or SLEEP/DEMO on the unit repeatedly until "SLEEP 10" appears, and then press SLEEP on the remote control or SLEEP/DEMO on the unit once again.

Note

You can check the remaining time before the unit is turned off. Press **SLEEP** on the remote control or SLEEP/DEMO on the unit. The remaining time appears in the display window.

Dimmer

Press SLEEP on the remote control or SLEEP/ DEMO on the unit once. The display window will be darkened by half. To cancel it, press SLEEP on the remote control or SLEEP/DEMO on the unit repeatedly until dim off.

DEMO

In the power off status, press SLEEP/DEMO on the unit once. The unit will power on and display the each of functions with demo sound in the display window. To cancel the DEMO function, press **SLEEP/DEMO** on the unit once more.



- While in DEMO, this unit will keep DEMO status even if you unplug the power cord connection.
- You can enjoy other functions during the DEMO, the DEMO will temporarily pause.
 - Without input key in 10 sec, the DEMO will playback automatically.

Auto power down

This unit will turn itself off to save electricity in the case were the main unit is not connected to an external device and is not used for 1.5 minutes.

The unit will also turn itself off after six hours if the main unit has been connected to another device using the analog inputs.

AUTO POWER On

This unit automatically turns on by an input source : **Bluetooth**

If you try to connect your **Bluetooth** device, this unit turns on and the unit will be connected your **Bluetooth** device.

Note

- Depending on the connected device, this function may not operate.
- Depending on the connected device, the unit turns on but **Bluetooth** function may not be connected.
- If you disconnect Bluetooth connection by this unit, some Bluetooth devices try to connect to the unit continually. Therefore it is recommended to disconnect the connection before turning off the unit.
- If you have already paired with this unit, automatically this unit can turn on by an input source when this unit is turned off.
- If you turn off the unit by pressing the power button for more than 5 seconds, Auto Power On function is disabled.
 To activate it, turn on the unit.

Auto function change

This unit recognizes input signals such as **Bluetooth** and then changes suitable function automatically.

When you try to connect Bluetooth device

When you try to connect your **Bluetooth** device to this unit, **Bluetooth** function is selected. Play your music on the **Bluetooth** device.



- This function is not available during recording or deleting.
- This function only works with devices that were previously connected.

Troubleshooting

Handling the Unit

When shipping the unit

Please save the original shipping carton and packing materials. If you need to ship the unit, for maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

Keeping the exterior surfaces clean

Do not use volatile liquids such as insecticide spray near the unit.

Wiping with strong pressure may damage the surface.

Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time.

Cleaning the unit
