

- 2. Connect the player to your PC using the USB cable.

Step 3: Press AD/REC and hold to enter the music recode mode and start recording, the picture on the right will be shown on the LCD screen.





The files recorded will be saved in MP3 format in the system directory MUSIC.

2.5.1 START

When the radio is playing, press AD/REC and hold to start the FM mp3 encoding.



2.5.2 STOP



Press PLAY to stop while recording.

- 1. The files recorded will be saved with the name "FM_X. MP3" in the system root directory.
- 2. When encoding, the system maybe find that memory is insufficient and will display "No SPACE" on the LCD screen. At this time, the encoding operation will be stopped.


