### Safety Information

#### Installation/Set-up

Install and use the TV set in accordance with the instructions below in order to avoid any risk of fire, electrical shock or damage and/or injuries.

#### Installation

- The TV set should be installed near an easily accessible mains socket.
- Place the TV set on a stable, level surface.
- Only qualified service personnel should carry out wall installations.





### Transporting

- Before transporting the TV set, disconnect all cables.
- When transporting the TV set by hand, hold it as shown on the right. Do not put stress on the LCD panel.
- When transporting the TV set, do not subject it to jolts or excessive vibration.

transporting the TV set for repairs or when moving, pack it using the original carton and packing material.

#### Ventilation

- Never cover the ventilation holes or insert anything in the cabinet.
- Leave space around the TV set as shown below.

- To ensure proper ventilation and prevent the collection of dirt or dust: - Do not lay the TV set flat, install upside down, backwards, or sidewavs.
- Do not place the TV set on a shelf, rug, bed or in a closet.

- Do not cover the TV set with items

such as curtains or newspapers, etc. - Do not install the TV set as shown below.

### Mains lead

Handle the mains lead and socket as follows in order to avoid any risk of fire, electrical shock or damage and/ or injuries:

- Use only mains leads supplied by Sony, not other suppliers.
- Insert the plug fully into the mains socket.
- Operate the TV set on a 220–240 V ~ 50-60 Hz supply only.
- When wiring cables, be sure to unplug the mains lead for your safety and take care not to catch your feet on the cables.
- Disconnect the mains lead from the mains socket before working on or moving the TV set.
- Keep the mains lead away from heat sources.
- Unplug the mains plug and clean it regularly. If the plug is covered with dust and it picks up moisture, its insulation may deteriorate, which could result in a fire.

#### Notes

- Do not use the supplied mains lead on any other equipment.
- Do not pinch, bend, or twist the mains lead excessively. The core conductors may be exposed or broken.

### Situation:

### If the following problems occur...

#### When:

- Mains lead is damaged.
- Poor fitting of mains socket.
- TV set is damaged by being dropped, hit or having something thrown at it.
- Any liquid or solid object falls through openings in the cabinet.

## Precautions

#### Viewing the TV

- View the TV in moderate light, as viewing the TV in poor light or for a long period of time strains your eyes.
- When using headphones, adjust the volume so as to avoid excessive levels, as hearing damage may result.

### LCD Screen

- Although the LCD screen is made with high-precision technology and 99.99% or more of the pixels are active, black dots or bright points of light (red, blue, or green) may appear constantly on the LCD screen. This is a structural feature of the LCD screen and is not a malfunction.
- Do not push or scratch the front filter, or place objects on top of this TV set. The image may be uneven or the LCD screen may be damaged.
- If this TV set is used in a cold place, a smear may occur in the picture or the picture may become dark. This does not indicate a failure. These phenomena disappear as the temperature rises.
- Ghosting may occur when still pictures are displayed continuously.
- The screen and cabinet get warm when this TV set is in use. This is not a malfunction.
- The LCD screen contains a small amount of liquid crystal. Some fluorescent tubes used in this TV set also contain mercury. Follow your local ordinances and regulations for disposal.

#### Handling and cleaning the screen surface/ cabinet of the TV set

Be sure to unplug the mains lead connected to the TV set from mains socket before cleaning.

To avoid material degradation or screen coating degradation, observe the following precautions.

• To remove dust from the screen surface/cabinet, wipe gently with a soft cloth. If dust is persistent, wipe with a soft cloth slightly moistened with a diluted mild detergent solution.

- Do not spray water or detergent directly on the TV set. If may drip to the bottom of the screen or exterior parts, and may cause a malfunction.

- Do not force a disc into the disc slot. When there is already a disc inside the built-in DVD player, trying to insert another disc may cause malfunction.
- Sound may jump or picture distortion may occur if a lens is dirty with dust. For repair, contact the shop from which the product was purchased or a customer information service centre.

### Precautions about built-in DVD player

- The TV has a region code located on the rear of the unit.
- Do not use cleaning discs or disc/ lens cleaners (including wet or spray types). These may cause the apparatus to malfunction.
- When ejecting a disc, the disc may hit objects and cause damage or injury. Keep an open space around the disc slot.
- Take out any discs from the builtin DVD player when you move the

TV. If you don't, the disc may be damaged. Eject and take out the disc before moving the TV.

- Do not pull out the AC power cord (mains lead) while the built-in DVD player is playing.
- Be sure small children do not put hands into the disc slot. It may cause injury.

- Connect the TV to the mains, and press () on the side of the TV.

### No picture or no menu information from equipment connected to the scart connector

- Press Đ to display the connected equipment list, then select the desired input.
- Check the connection between the optional equipment and the TV.

#### Double images or ghosting

- Check the aerial/cable connections.
- Check the aerial location and direction.
- Only snow and noise appear on the screen
- · Check if the aerial is broken or bent.
- Check if the aerial has reached the end of its service life (three to five years in normal use, one to two years at the seaside).

#### Picture or sound noise when viewing a TV channel

• Perform fine tuning to obtain better picture reception (page 30).

### Some tiny black points and/or bright points appear on the screen

• The picture of a display unit is composed of pixels. Tiny black points and/or bright points (pixels) on the screen do not indicate a malfunction.

#### No colour on programmes

• Select "Restore Factory Settings" (page 33). No colour or irregular colour when viewing a signal from the Y Pb Pr (Component) sockets

Television in the UK is going digital, bringing us all more choice and new services. Starting in late 2007 and ending in 2012, television services in the UK will go completely digital, TV region by TV region. Please see overleaf to find out when your area switches to digital.

Digital UK is the independent, non-profit organisation leading the process of digital TV switchover in the UK. Digital UK provides impartial information on what people need to do to prepare for the move to digital, and when they need to do it.

#### How the switchover affects your TV equipment:

Your new TV has a digital tuner built in, which means it is ready to receive the Freeview signal by simply plugging it into your aerial socket (check if you can get digital TV through your aerial now, or whether you'll have to wait until switchover, at **www.digitaluk.co.uk**).

When the TV switchover happens in your area, there are at least two occasions when you will need to re-tune your TV in order to continue receiving your existing TV channels, and also to pick up new ones. Digital UK, the body leading the digital TV switchover, will advise you when you need to re-tune during the switchover. If you choose to connect your TV to satellite or cable with a digital box then it will not be affected by switchover, and you won't need to re-tune.

### How to re-tune

- **1** Press "MENU on the remote.
- **2** Press  $\partial/\partial$  select "Settings then press  $\oplus$ .
- **3** Press  $\partial/\partial$  select "Channel Setup" then press  $\oplus$ .
- 4 Press d = 4 select "Auto Tuning" then press  $\oplus$ .
- 5 Press ☆/☆ select "Scan Type" and press ⇔/⇔ select "DTV" then press ⊕.
- 6 Follow the on secren instructions.

If you are missing any channels, it may be that they are not available in your area, or that your aerial needs upgrading.
