

Wall Mounting


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Note

This mounting guide provides illustrations of Arbor represented like the image featured on this page Be aware that the gray areas in the illustration represent the acoustic felt backer and the white areas represent the wood veneer.



wall mounting

Arbor is available in two depths - Arbor and Arbor Slim - with different thicknesses that have a substantial impact on the acoustics of a space. Arbor measures 21mm and weighs 26 lbs. Arbor Slim is a more compact option at 10mm and weighs 6 lbs. This mounting guide applies to both models.


To begin, prepare the wall. Clean it thoroughly and remove anything that might get in the way, such as screws or nails. Determine the size of the wall by measuring its dimensions.



Using screws secure Arbor to the wall, making sure to drill through the acoustic felt backer and not the wood veneer. Place each screw every 16" to 24".



Step 3 Repeat step two, making sure that each Arbor panel is oriented the **Notes:** same way vertically; i.e. if the acoustic felt backer is on the left then each panel following should have acoustic felt backer on the left.

- Use a Box Cutter to cut through the acoustic felt backer and a Circular Saw when cutting through the wood veneer.
- To prevent the wood veneer from splintering use *Masking Tape*.







Step 1 To begin, prepare the wall. Clean it thoroughly and remove anything that might get in the way, such as screws or nails. Determine the size of the wall by measuring its dimensions.




Apply Construction Adhesive to the backside of each Arbor panel.



Step 3 Place Arbor onto the wall then using a nail gun secure the panel to the wall with finishing nails in each corner, until the adhesive dries.



Repeat step three, making sure that each Arbor panel is oriented the same way vertically. Once the adhesive is dried remove finishing nails.

- Use a Box Cutter to cut through the acoustic felt backer and a Circular Saw when cutting through the wood veneer.
- To prevent the wood veneer from splintering use *Masking Tape*.




Arbor wall mounting, furring strips


- Measure multiple points on the wall with a level, accounting for irregularities.

- Arbor looks best when installed with no gaps between ends
- Screws or nails should always be placed through acoustic
- Furring strips should be attached to wall studs.
- For additional support use adhesive on each strip.

Step 1 To begin, prepare the wall. Clean it thoroughly and remove anything that might get in the way, such as screws or nails. Determine the size of the wall by measuring its dimensions.




Step 2


Attach the furring strips to the wall every 24", creating a framework for Arbor to attach to. Furring strips should always hang in the counter direction of the Arbor panels.



Step 3 Using screws secure Arbor to the furring strips, making sure to drill through the acoustic felt backer and not the wood veneer. Place each screw every 16" to 24".



Repeat step three, making sure that each Arbor panel is oriented the same way vertically; i.e. if PET is on the left then each panel following should have PET on the left.

Step 1

To begin, prepare the ceiling. Clean it thoroughly and remove anything that might get in the way, such as screws or nails. Determine the size of the wall by measuring its dimensions.




Using a screwdriver, attach the furring strips to the ceiling every 24", creating a framework for Arbor to attach to. Furring strips should always hang in the counter direction of the Arbor panels.




Arbor Ceiling Mounting | Loftwall | 10 direct ceiling mounting, screws

Step 3 Using screws secure Arbor to the furring strips, making sure to drill through the acoustic felt backer and not the wood veneer. Place each screw every 16" to 24".



Step 4 Repeat step three, making sure that each Arbor panel is oriented the same way vertically; i.e. if PET is on the left then each panel that follows should have PET on the left.






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Arbor t-grid ceiling mounting, screws





Begin by removing all existing ceiling tiles.




Using a measuring tape, take note of the dimensions of the t-grid, making sure you know the length and width of the frame.




Step 3 Begin hanging Arbor, making sure to drill through the black acoustic backing and into the frame.



If your ceiling requires cutting, measure the space that is required to fill and cut from the excess panels. Be sure to read the section about cutting Arbor before beginning.



Step 5 Be sure as you hang the panels that each one is oriented the same way horizontally; i.e. if the acoustic backing is on the left then each **Arbor** panel that follows should have acoustic felt backer on the left.

- Use a Box Cutter to cut through the acoustic felt backer and a Circular Saw when cutting through the wood veneer.
- To prevent the wood veneer from splintering use *Masking Tape*.
- Reattach wooden slats to the acoustic felt backer backing with 0.5" Screws from the back of the panel after making cuts.












Arbor Slim Panel

- Measure multiple points on the wall with a level, accounting for irregularities.
- Using decorative framing, such as molding, can help offset irregular or an uneven wall surface.
- Arbor looks best when installed with no gaps between ends
- Screws or nails should always be placed through acoustic felt backer.
- Ensure that your ceiling grid can support the weight of your Arbor installation.


Step 1

Begin by removing all existing ceiling tiles.




Step 2

Using a measuring tape, take note of the dimensions of the t-grid, making sure you know the length and width of the frame.




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
Step 3 Cut Arbor Slim panels to the measured dimensions of the ceiling tiles. Be sure to read the section about cutting Arbor before beginning.



Drop the cut Arbor Slim panels into the t-grid squares in the ceiling. Each panel should rest comfortably on the frame.




Step 5 Continue step 4 until all tiles have been filled with Arbor Slim.
