- 3 Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all cables such as telephone cables, network cables and so on, from your computer.
- 5 Disconnect all attached devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, monitor, and so on, from your computer.
- 6 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.


Removing the Base Cover

Procedure

- 1 Close the display and turn the computer over.
- 2 Remove the screws that secure the base cover to the computer.
- **3** Using a plastic scribe, pry the base cover away from the computer.

Replacing the Base Cover



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Procedure

- 1 Slide the tabs on the base cover into the slots on the computer base and snap the base cover into place.
- 2 Replace the screws that secure the base cover to the computer base.

Removing the Battery




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Prerequisites

Remove the base cover.

Procedure

- 1 Remove the screws that secure the battery to the palmrest and keyboard assembly.
- 2 Remove the hard-drive cable from the routing guides on the battery.
- **3** Lift the battery off the palmrest and keyboard assembly.

Replacing the Battery



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Procedure

- Align the screw holes on the battery with the screw holes on the palmrest and keyboard assembly and place the battery on the palmrest and keyboard assembly.
- 2 Route the hard-drive cable through the routing guides on the battery.
- 3 Replace the screws that secure the battery to the palmrest and keyboard assembly.

Removing the Memory Module



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
Prerequisites

Replacing the Memory Module



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
Procedure





Replacing the Hard Drive

Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the hard drive with the screw holes on the harddrive bracket.
- 2 Replace the screws that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive.
- **3** Connect the interposer to the hard drive.
- 4 Align the screw holes on the hard-drive assembly with the screw holes on the palmrest and keyboard assembly.
- 5 Replace the screws that secure the hard-drive assembly to the palmrest and keyboard assembly.
- **6** Connect the hard-drive cable to the system board.

Removing the Coin-Cell Battery

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CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS settings before removing the coin-cell battery.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the base cover.
- 2 Remove the battery.

Procedure

Using a plastic scribe, gently pry the coin-cell battery out of the battery socket on the system board.

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

- 1 Disconnect the antenna cables from the wireless card.
- 2 Remove the screw that secures the wireless card to the system board.

3 Slide the wireless card from the wireless-card slot on the system board.

Replacing the Wireless Card



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Procedure



CAUTION: To avoid damage to the wireless card, do not place any cables under it.

- 1 Align the notch on the wireless card with the tab on the wireless-card slot on the system board.
- 2 Insert the wireless card at an angle into the wireless-card slot.
- **3** Align the screw hole on the wireless card with the screw hole on the system board.
- **4** Replace the screw that secures the wireless card to the system board.
- 5 Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.

The following table provides the antenna-cable color scheme for the wireless card supported by your computer.

Removing the Keyboard Daughter-Board





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

- 5 Adhere the adhesive tape that secures the power and volume-buttons board cable to the palmrest and keyboard assembly.

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







- **6** Slide the keyboard cable into the keyboard daughter-board connector and press down the latch to secure the cable.





Removing the Heat Sink



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WARNING: The heat sink may become hot during normal operation. Allow sufficient time for the heat sink to cool before you touch it.



CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.


Prerequisites

1 In sequential order (as indicated on the heat sink), loosen the captive screws that secure the heat sink to the system board.

Replacing the Heat Sink



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CAUTION: Incorrect alignment of the heat sink can cause damage to the system board and processor.



NOTE: The original thermal grease can be reused if the original system board and heat sink are reinstalled together. If either the system board or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to make sure that thermal conductivity is achieved.

Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the heat sink with the screw holes on the system board.
- 2 In sequential order (indicated on the heat sink), tighten the captive screws that secure the heat sink to the system board.

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

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

NOTE: Before disconnecting the cables from the system board, note the location of the connectors so that you can reconnect them correctly after you replace the system board.











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Procedure

Place the palmrest and keyboard assembly on a flat surface with the keyboard facing down.





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



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
