



Display icons and symbols (see Fig. 2 in page 5)

The LCD display gives you information on the current status of the telephone.

	Meaning
Y	Steady when the handset is in range of the base. Flashes when out of range of the base or not registered to the base.
=	Steady when an intercom call is in progress. Flashes when there is an incoming internal call.
(Indicates a call is in progress on that handset.

4	Indicates that speakerphone is being used.
¥.	Indicates that the handset ringer is switched off.
	Steady when an alarm is set. Flashes when the alarm is sounding.
6	Indicates that the keypad is locked.

6. Installation

Connecting the base station (see Fig. 4 in page 5)

- Plug the power supply and line cord into the base station.
- Plug the power adapter into an electrical wall outlet and the telephone line cord into your telephone line socket.

WARNING:

Use only the provided adaptor, using other power supplies may cause a hazard or damage the phone.

Install the base unit in a position where the mains adapter plug will reach an easily accessible mains socket to unplug in case needed. Never try to lengthen the mains power cable.

NOTE:

The base unit needs power for normal operation, it is not just for charging the handset batteries.

Installing and charging the batteries (see Fig. 5 in page 5)

- Place the two batteries, included with your telephone, inside the battery compartment making sure the correct polarity is properly aligned.
- Place the battery compartment cover in place and slide upwards until it snaps in closed position.
- Place the handset in the base and charge for at least 15 hours before using your telephone for the fist time.
 - →The handset will make a short sound when it correctly placed in a telephone base or charging base.

7. Telephone operation

Making a call

Predialing to make a call

- Enter the phone number and press to connect to the line and dial the number.
 - → When entering the number, if you make a mistake, press **C**/⊗ to delete digits.

Direct dialing

• Press uto connect to the line and then enter the phone number.

Calling from the phonebook

- Press \blacksquare , \blacktriangledown , **OK** to enter the phonebook, then press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to select a number.
- Press uto make the call to the selected number.

Calling from the call list

- Press ▲ to enter the call list and then press ▲ or ▼ to select a number from the call list.
- Press uto make the call to the selected number.

Calling from the redial list

- Press ▼ to enter the redial list and then press ▲ or ▼ to select a number from the redial list.
- Press uto make the call to the selected number.

Call timer

Your handset automatically times the duration of every call. The call timer is displayed as soon as you answer a call or 15 seconds after dialing and remains on the screen for 5 seconds after the end of the call. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM:SS).

Answering a call

If the handset is not in its charging base:

• Press uto answer a call when there is an incoming call.

NOTE:

If AUTO ANSWER is activated, then lifting the handset off the base or charger will answer the call automatically and no keys need to be pressed.

Ending a call

- During a call, press o to hang up and end the call, or
- Place the handset on the base cradle and the call will be ended.

Handset speakerphone

During a call, you can press d to alternate between hands-free speakerphone and normal handset use.

Adjusting the volume

There are 5 levels, VOLUME 1 to VOLUME 5, to choose from for each of the earpiece and speaker volumes.

During a call:

- Press \triangle/∇ to select volume 1-5. The current setting is shown.
 - → When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

Turning off the handset ringer

In idle, press and hold # to turn off the handset ringer. The icon \sharp is displayed on the LCD.

NOTE:

Activating the keypad lock

You can lock the keypad so that it cannot be used accidentally while carrying it around.

• In idle, press and hold * to turn on the keypad lock and the icon for will show up in the display.

NOTE:

You can still use — to answer a call when the handset is ringing.

Redialing the last number

You can redial any of the 5 last numbers called. If you have stored a name in phonebook to go with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recent last number will display at the top of the redial list.

Redialing a number from the redial list

• In idle mode, press ▼ to access the redial list.

NOTE:

If the redial list entry shows a name, press # to view the number of this entry.

- Press ▲/▼ to browse the redial list.
- Press ut to dial to the selected redial number.

NOTE:

If there are no numbers in the redial list, the display shows EMPTY.

Finding a handset

You can locate the handset by pressing the find key •)). All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone and show PAGING on the display for 60 seconds.

You can stop the paging by pressing on any handset or) on the base again.

NOTE:

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

8. Private phonebook

Each handset can store up to 20 private phonebook entries with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also select different ringtones for your phonebook entries. (Note that the different ringtones only play when you receive a call if you subscribe to caller display and the incoming number matches the stored number.) Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

Adding a new phonebook entry

In idle:

- Press OK to show ADD.
- Press OK and then enter the name.
- Press OK and then enter the number.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.
- Press OK to store the phonebook entry.

Searching for a phonebook entry

In idle:

- Press \blacksquare and \triangle/∇ to select PHONEBOOK and then press OK to access the phonebook or by pressing \square .
- Enter the first letter of the name using the alphanumeric keys (e.g. if it begins with C, press the 2 key three times) and then \triangle/∇ to scroll to the entry.

Editing a phonebook entry

In idle:

- Press ▲/▼ to select the desired phonebook entry.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select EDIT.
- Press OK to display the current name.
- Edit the name and press OK.
- Edit the number and press OK.
- Press \triangle/∇ to select the ringtone and press OK to confirm.

Deleting a phonebook entry

In idle:

- Press and ▲/▼ to select PHONEBOOK and then press OK to phonebook or by pressing □.

9. Call identification (Network dependent)

This feature is available if you have subscribed to the call line identification service with your network service provider. Your phone can store up to 10 received calls with date/time information in the call list. The number will be shown on the handset display when the phone is ringing. If the number matches with one of the entries in your private phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed alternately with the number, and the handset will ring with the ringtone associated with that phonebook entry. If the call is from someone who withheld their number, WITHHELD will be displayed.

If the call is from someone whose number is unavailable, e.g. an international call or from a private exchange, OUT OF AREA will display. If you've got new caller display records, the handset will display X NEW CALLS in standby mode. The new calls indication will remain until all the new call records have been viewed on that handset.

Viewing the call list

All received calls are saved in the call list with the latest call at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. Any unanswered calls which have not been viewed are marked with a *\pi\$ icon at the center of the bottom line of the display.

- Press ▲ to acces the call list, or
 press 国 and ▲/▼ to show CALL LIST and then press OK.
- Press ▲/▼ to select the number or name desired.
- Press # to view the caller's number if applicable.
- Press \blacksquare and \triangle/∇ to show DETAILS and then press OK to display the date and time of the call.
- Press OK to go back to the previous screen.

Deleting an entry in the call list

- Follow steps 1 and 2 in section 9, Viewing the call list.
- Press and ▲/▼ to select DELETE.
- Press OK to confirm.

Deleting all call list entries

- Follow steps 1 and 2 in section 9, Viewing the call list.

Call identification 14

- Press OK to display CONFIRM?
- Press OK to confirm.
 - → All entries will be deleted and the display will show EMPTY.

10. Phone settings

Your phone comes with a selection of settings that you can change to personalise your phone the way you like it to work.

Setting the handset language

- Press and ▲/▼ to select HS SETTINGS.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select LANGUAGE.
- Press OK and \triangle/∇ to select the desired language.
- Press OK to confirm.

Base settings

Setting the base ringer melody

- Press \blacksquare and \triangle/∇ to select BS SETTINGS.
- Press OK and \triangle/∇ to select BS RINGER.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select the desired melody you want from a choice of five.
- Press OK to confirm.

NOTE:

The respective ringer melody will be played while browsing the melody list.

Setting the ringer volume

- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select RING VOLUME.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select the desired ringer volume (a total of 6 ringer volume levels including VOLUME OFF.
- Press OK to confirm.

NOTE:

The respective ringer volume will be played during your selection.

Handset registration

IMPORTANT:

When you purchase your phone, all handsets are already registered to your base, so you do not need to register them. Handset registration is only necessary when you buy extra handsets or if a handset has become faulty.

You can register additional handsets to have up to five handsets per base unit, with each handset's number (1 to 5) shown on its display. (Note: each handset can only be registered to one base.)

Registering handset to the base:

- Press and hold n) on the base station for more than five seconds, to put the base station into registration mode. It will stay in registration mode for about 1 minute, so the following handset sequence must be completed within this time.
- Press OK to display PIN?----.
- Enter the 4-digit system PIN (default 0000).
- Press OK to confirm, and the display will show SEARCHING. If the handset registration is successful, you will hear a confirmation tone and the \mathbf{v} will stop flashing.

The handset will automatically be allocated the next available handset number. This handset number is shown in the handset display in standby mode. If the handset registration is unsuccessful, the Υ will still flash.

11. Digital answering machine

Your phone includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. The answering machine can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of approximately 15 minutes. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone.

If the answering machine memory is full, the handset will display TAM FULL alternately with the handsets name or time, depending on the handset standby display mode set. You will have to delete some messages before any new ones can be recorded.

Some answering machine functions can be operated from the base, including playing messages and turning the answering machine on or off. The answering machine can also be controlled and set up using the handset menu functions, as below.

Turn on/off your answering machine

You can turn the answering machine on or off using the handset. When the answering machine is set to ON, calls will be answered after the set answer delay and the caller can then leave you a message. When the answering machine is set to OFF, calls will be answered after 14 rings and the answer only message will be played to your callers. They will not be able to leave you a message.

- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select TAM ON/OFF.
- Press OK and \triangle/∇ to select ON or OFF.
- Press to confirm.
 - \rightarrow If the answering machine is set to ON, \bigcirc displays on the handset screen.
 - → If the answering machine is set to OFF, will not display on the handset screen.

Listening to the stored messages

When new messages are recorded on the answering machine, the \bigstar flashes on the handset display until all the new messages are played. After a new message is played it will be saved as an old message automatically unless it is deleted.

Old messages will be played after all new messages are all played.

- Press \blacksquare and \triangle/∇ to select ANS MACHINE.
- Press ▲/▼ to select MSG PLAYBACK.
- Press OK to start message playback through the earpiece and the screen displays the date and time information of the message received.

NOTES:

A \star is placed at the center of the bottom of the handset display to indicate that it is a new message. When a message has been played, the \star will disappear and will not be shown when you listen to this message again.

If there are no messages, the handset display will briefly show 00-00 00-00 then return to MSG PLAYBACK.

- During message playback, press ▲/▼ to increase or decrease the message playback volume respectively.

STOP	Stops the current message playback and returns to the ANS MACHINE menu.
FORWARD	Skips to play the next message. The date and time information of the next message will display if there is another message.
PREVIOUS	Repeats the current message from the beginning. The date and time information of the current message will display
DELETE	Delete the current message and the next message will be played.

NOTE:

Alternatively, you can use the following shortcut keys to control different operations during message playback.

- Press key 5 to stop message playback.
- Press key 4 once to skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. Press twice to skip backward to play the previous message.
- Press key 6 to skip to play next message.
- Press key 2 to delete the current message playback.

Deleting all messages from the answering machine

- Press \blacksquare and $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ to select ANS MACHINE.
- Press OK and \triangle/∇ to select DELETE ALL.
- Press OK to display CONFIRM?
- Press OK to delete all old messages.

NOTE:

If there are no more messages in the answering machine, EMPTY will display and return back to ANS MACHINE menu.

Answering machine settings

You can use the TAM SETTINGS menu through the handset to change the settings of your answering machine.

Setting up the answering mode

By default, the answer machine is set to ANS & REC mode which allows callers to leave a message. This mode can be changed to ANSWER ONLY which does not allow callers to leave a message. In that case, your callers will be prompted to call back later

- Press OK and \triangle/∇ to select TAM SETTINGS.
- Press OK and \triangle/∇ to select ANSWER MODE.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS & REC or ANSWER ONLY.
- Press OK to confirm.

When your answering machine memory is full and it is in ANS & RECORD, the answer mode will change to ANSWER ONLY automatically. It will return to ANS & RECORD mode automatically after some messages have been deleted.

Recording your own outgoing message (OGM)

You can record your own message for ANS & REC mode or ANSWER ONLY mode. When you record your own message, it will be used when the answering machine answers the call. If your personalised message is deleted, the pre-set outgoing message will be restored automatically.

- Press and ▲/▼ to select ANS MACHINE.
- Press OK and \triangle/∇ to select TAM SETTINGS.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select OGM SETTINGS.
- Press OK and \triangle/∇ to select ANS & RECORD or ANSWER ONLY.
- Press OK and ▲/▼ to select RECORD MESS.
- Press OK to start recording your personalised OGM and RECORDING will be displayed on the screen.
- Press OK to stop and save your personalised OGM.
 - → Your newly saved OGM will playback automatically.
- Alternatively, press **c**/⊗ to return to previous screen without saving the personalised OGM.
