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Mississauga Celebration Square is an outdoor public space and the City's premiere outdoor event venue located in the heart of downtown Mississauga.





Since opening in 2011, Celebration Square has hosted nearly 500 events and welcomed millions of visitors from near and far.

Throughout the year, visitors head to the Square to enjoy the seasonal fountain or skating rink, delicious food vendors, digital screen events, playing on the lawn – and that's when the Square isn't busy with a host of award-winning free events and festivals. Celebration Square offers more than 50 events and festivals throughout the year, delivering an attendance of more than 725,000 visitors annually.

Celebration Square's summer season offers an eclectic variety of events, including weekly fitness classes and movie nights, concerts, a Canada Day Celebration and a wide variety of independently produced festivals that showcase the arts, cultural diversity and talent Mississauga has to offer; the venue is home to three of the top 100 festivals and events, as recognized by Festivals and Events Ontario (FEO).

Mississauga Celebration Square met a range of criteria for award consideration, including: addressing or overcoming accessibility issues, having accessibility features, improving quality of life for people with disabilities and being an example of best practices for others.

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Food and Beverage

Throughout the summer season, the Square has daily food trucks serving up delicious treats. During events, organizers have the option of bringing on a host of vendors to satisfy the appetites of visitors.

The Fountain

During the summer, Celebration Square is home to the largest interactive water feature in Mississauga.

Located on the Upper Square, kids of all ages enjoy splashing and cooling off from April to October.





Skating Rink

In the winter season, the water feature is transformed into Mississauga's largest outdoor ice rink and offers a unique and free urban ice-skating experience.

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Amphitheatre

The Amphitheatre is an outdoor space available for smaller theatre shows, events and performances. Seating is in traditional fixed, multi-level amphitheatre style and is concrete; the **seating capacity is 300 people**. Lighting, sound equipment and other technical services are available to organizers that wish to rent the space.

The Amphitheatre is located on the north-east portion of the Upper Square, near the Civic Centre, Art Gallery of Mississauga and The Fountain/rink.

Glass Pavilion

All events at Mississauga Celebration Square have access to the Glass Pavilion, an indoor space attached to Mississauga Central Library. With a capacity of 75 people, it is an ideal space to host a VIP reception, or a designated warm-up or cool-down zone at your event.





Noel Ryan Auditorium

Event organizers also have the option of booking the indoor 244-seat Noel Ryan Auditorium located within Mississauga Central Library, perfect for performances, film screenings, and/or large meetings.

Mainstage

Celebration Square's mainstage comes equipped with lighting, audio and video systems as well as technical staff to operate. This ensures staging festivals are fun and easy. The technical crew is non-union and use of the core team is mandatory to ensure a successful event. Guest lighting designers and audio engineers are always welcome.



Large Events

There is a competitive application process to host large events at Mississauga Celebration Square. A Large Event is any pre-planned, organized activity with an expected attendance of 1,000 or more that will be facilitated with the support and expertise of City staff. Applications to host a large event are accepted in the fall, and are evaluated by the Mississauga Celebration Square Community Reference Group.

Small Events

Small Events have approximately 1,000 attendees or less, and do not require the main stage concert systems. Small events may only include one commercial or display vendor and one food vendor. Celebration Square has seasonal food vendors through the summer months who will be onsite and selling during Small Events. Small Events are considered on a case-by-case basis, based on the availability of City resources. Small Event Applications must be submitted a minimum of 12 weeks prior to the event date to be considered.





Organizers are encouraged to contact the Supervisor, Event Services in advance of submitting an application to discuss the event and availability of dates.

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Insurance Requirements

General liability insurance is required for all events at Mississauga Celebration Square. The following insurance requirements must be met for all events at the Square:

- \$5 million general liability insurance
- Name "The Corporation of the City of Mississauga" as an additional insured
- Cover all event dates including set-up and clean-up
- Proof of Insurance will only be accepted on the City of Mississauga template
- Must be signed, dated, and stamped by the insurance provider or broker

Deposit Requirements& Contract Execution

All arrangements for rentals are considered to be tentative until a contract has been signed.

For Small Events, estimated event fees are due and payable immediately on contract signing.

For Large Events, ten (10%) percent of estimated event fees are due at contract signing. For returning events, the deposit will be ten (10%) percent of the previous year's actuals, plus the Celebration Square permit fee.





Vendors at The Square: Overview

Organizers have the option of hosting several food and/or display vendors at the Square for their event. There is a wealth of space available under the Market Trellis and City Centre Drive for an array of food trucks, carts, trailers and booths.



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Vendor Types

All special event vendors are either commercial or display vendors and either food or non-food vendors.

Commercial vendor: Vendor who sells or displays for sale any goods, foods, or services

Display vendor: Vendor who is not selling or displaying for sale any good, foods or services (can include sponsors, info booths, free games, free food)

Food vendor: Vendor that serves or

sells food

Non-food vendor: Vendor that does not

serve or sell food

Mobile Licensing

Event Organizers require a Special Event License when an event includes vendors selling any service or product, when sales proceeds are being donated, when a service or product is being given out for free but is paid for by the event organizer or other **involved** party.

To obtain a license for a special event read and complete the Special Event License Application Form & Event Organizer Participation Agreement. For more information on how to obtain a license for a special event, read the Licences and Permits webpage and complete the application form.

Region of Peel Health Department

If an event will be selling or distributing food, Peel Public Health requires notification. Event organizers must complete a <u>Special Event Application</u> for Event Organizers a minimum of 30 days prior to the event. A Public Health Inspector will contact event organizers and vendors to review information on the forms, and obtain additional required information prior to issuing written notice to event organizers. A Public Health Inspector may also conduct inspections during the event.



Safety & Security

Health and Safety

As required by the City of Mississauga and provincial regulations, employers and workers are required to comply with fire, health and safety regulations. The following section outlines specific health and safety requirements for Celebration Square.



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Parking

Paid parking is available in the Mississauga Civic Centre/Central Library and the Living Arts Centre. Parking spots on the layby on Burnhamthorpe can be reserved through Celebration Square.

Public Transportation

Celebration Square is easily accessible by public transportation and is surrounded by several Mississauga bus routes. For more information, including schedules and maps, visit:

Vehicles

Driving is only permitted on City Centre Drive and the roadway behind the Market Trellis. Vehicles are permitted onsite only during designated load-in and load-out times. Vehicles are not permitted onsite during events with the exception of display vehicles or vehicles necessary for reasons of food safety.



Safety & Security

Security

Event organizers must ensure that all participants and patrons are adequately safeguarded. Events at Celebration Square require paid duty police, professional third party security and professional first aid services (subject to approval by the City of Mississauga and/or Peel Regional Police). Event organizers must submit a security plan to Celebration Square prior to the event for consideration.



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Alcohol

A Special Occasion Permit (SOP) is needed any time alcohol is sold or served anywhere other than in a licensed establishment or a private place. A Special Occasion Permit holder is responsible for the safety and sobriety of people attending the event, as well as compliance with the Liquor Licence Act and Regulations. More information, terms & conditions, and SOPs can be found on our **Alcohol Fact Sheet**.

Washrooms

Events with expected attendance of less than 5,000 can be accommodated by the existing indoor washroom facilities located on the Upper Square, in Civic Centre, and in the Central Library. For events with an expected attendance of over 5,000, portable washroom facilities, including accessible facilities and hand washing stations, must be pre-arranged.

Weather

Outdoor events are by their nature subject to inclement weather. In the case of rain, a performance can continue provided that it is deemed safe by the Technical Services team. In the case of lightning, the technical staff are required to shut down the stage to reduce the risk of a lightning strike in accordance with the Outdoor Venues Safety Guideline for the Live Performance Industry in Ontario.



Assistive Listening Devices

Should an assistive listening device be requested, please contact our Onsite Event Coordinator. Assistive listening devices are available free of charge.
