## **Handling USIM Card**

• For handling USIM Card, see the manual provided with USIM Card.

#### Before Using USIM Card

When using USIM Card, be careful of the following.

- Do not put labels, etc. on USIM Card. May cause malfunction.
- USIM Card will be reissued for a fee if lost or damaged.
- · Clean USIM Card with a dry soft cloth.
- · Keep the IC (metal) part clean.



- Do not touch IC (metal) part with hand or metal.
- If USIM Card/handset with USIM Card inserted is lost or stolen, always follow emergency procedures to suspend service.
   For details, contact Inquiries.
- SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any damages arising from inserting USIM Card into IC Card readers, etc. of other third party devices.





#### SIM Unlocking

Handset supports SIM unlocking. After SIM-unlocking handset, other companies' SIM Cards can also be used on handset.

- When using another company SIM Card, available services and functions may be restricted.
   SoftBank Corp. makes no guarantees whatsoever regarding the proper operation of handset.
- For details on SIM unlocking, see SoftBank Website.

Like Data Folder in handset, data can be saved in SD Card.

 Handset supports microSD™ Cards up to 2GB and microSDHC™ Cards up to 32GB. (as of September 2017)

Note that not all operations are guaranteed.

#### Before Using SD Card

When using SD Card, be careful of the following.

- SD Card data may be lost or altered due to an accident or malfunction. Keep a copy of your data in a separate place. Note that SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any damages arising from lost/ changed data.
- Do not insert or remove SD Card forcefully.
- Do not touch terminals with hand or metal.
- Do not remove Battery or power off handset while reading/writing data in SD Card.
- Be careful not to delete or overwrite data accidentally.









## **Handling Battery and Charger**

# ■ Before Using Battery and Charger

When purchased, Battery is not sufficiently charged. Be sure to charge before initially using.

 For charging time and battery usage time: (P.11-5)

#### About Battery

- Soiled Battery, handset or metal part of Charger (Charging Terminals) may cause poor contact, resulting in power failure or insufficient charging. Clean handset, Battery and Charger with a clean, dry swab.
- Battery is a consumable item. Replace Battery with a new one if the operation time becomes extremely short even after it is fully charged. Purchase a new Battery.
- To help maintain performance and life of Battery, do not store in the following conditions (battery level should be at approximately 40% for optimal storage).
  - Full (immediately after charging is complete)
  - Exhausted (too low to power on handset)
- Carry Battery in a bag, etc. when carrying it separately.

#### Charging

- Battery cannot be charged without handset. Install Battery in handset to charge it.
- Charging may take longer when handset is powered on.
- Move Charger away from TV/radio if interference occurs.

#### Battery Life

- Using handset in the following conditions may shorten Battery life:
  - Extremely high or low temperatures
  - Handset, Battery or Charging Terminals of Charger is soiled
  - Weak signal/no signal
  - Handset is left powered on in mid-operation (not in Standby)
- To extend Battery life:
  - Set Backlight Time to a shorter time: (P.10-3)
  - Set Key Sound to OFF: (P.10-6)

#### Recycling

Lithium-ion batteries are recyclable. To recycle a used lithium-ion battery, take it to any shop displaying the recycling symbol.

## Installing/Removing Battery


Always power off beforehand.

### Installing Battery


- Place a fingertip on the notch of handset and hold the center of Battery cover and gently lift Battery Cover in direction shown to remove
  - · Be careful not to hurt your finger or nail.



2 Slide Battery in direction ① onto metal terminals, and press into handset in direction ②



Fit Battery Cover on handset, and press Battery Cover in directions shown



Trace the circumference of Battery Cover in direction ① with finger and press and hold in direction ② to install Battery Cover completely



#### Removing Battery

- Open Battery Cover (P.1-11)
- Place a fingertip on the removing hook of Battery, and gently lift Battery in direction shown
  - · Be careful not to hurt your finger or nail.





## Charging with AC Adapter

AC Adapter is an optional accessory. After installing Battery, charge handset using AC Adapter (sold separately).

- Use optional AC Adapter (microUSB Quick Charge<sup>TM</sup> 2.0 compatible) [ZSDBA4]\*1, or AC Adapter (microUSB 1.0 A) [ZSDBA6]\*2.

## Powering On/Off



Insert microUSB plug on External Connection Terminal

Extend blades and plug AC Adapter into AC outlet

When charging starts, icon ( 1 ) appears and notification LED lights in red. Notification LED goes out once charging completes.

- After changing completes, unplug AC Adapter
  - Remove the plug of AC Adapter from AC outlet and remove microUSB plug from handset.

## **■** Power On

Long Press .

Handset powers on. Then Standby appears after a while.



#### Manner

Please be considerate of people around you and use your handset responsibly.

#### On Airplanes

Using handset may affect safe operation of aircraft (Follow airline instructions for proper use on an airplane).

#### In Hospitals

If using or bringing handset is prohibited by medical institutions such as hospitals, follow instructions of each medical institution for use in a hospital.

#### Congested Places

Persons with an implanted pacemaker, defibrillator, etc. may be around you. Electronic signals may affect operation of implanted pacemakers, defibrillators. Turn off handset.

## Public Places such as Cinemas, Theaters, Museums

Using handset in public places may annoy other people around you.

# Setting Manner Mode/Drive Mode/Original Mode

Three types of manner modes such as Manner Mode/Drive Mode/Original Mode are available for handset.

- The following tones sound in each mode.
  - · Shutter sound for photo shooting
  - Movie record start/stop
  - Alarm ringtones
  - Ringtones for Urgent News

#### Setting Manner Mode

Mute notification sounds such as incoming calls, new mails and other handset sounds such as Key Sound. Handset vibrates for incoming calls and notifications

- After Manner Mode is set, " Tan appears in Status Bar.
- Vibration and LED work at initial value settings in Manner Mode.

In Standby, Long Press # → "OK"

Manner Mode is set.

#### Setting Drive Mode

Mute notification sounds such as incoming calls, new mails and other handset sounds such as Key Sound. Incoming calls and notifications appear on the screen.

- When a call is received in Drive Mode, it is answered by a guidance that the call cannot be answered since you are driving, and recorded by Answering Machine.
- · Handset does not vibrate.
- In Standby, → "Settings" → "Sound/ Notification" → "Manner Mode Settings"

### 2 "Drive"

Drive Mode is set.

 In Standby, Long Press # → "OK" each time to set/cancel Drive Mode

#### Setting Original Mode

Set whether to sound ringtones according to the ringtone type.

- In Standby, → "Settings" → "Sound/ Notification" → "Manner Mode Settings"

## **2** "Original"

Original Mode is set.

- When setting ringtone type, (a) (Edit) → Set each item → (b) (Set).
- When resetting ringtone type, (a) (Edit) → (Beset) → "Yes" → (a) (Set).

## **Airplane Mode**

Security Codes

Suspend signal-transmitting functions and disable functions such as making/receiving calls, sending/receiving mails.

1 In Standby,  $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  "Settings"  $\rightarrow$  "Network"

**2** Check "Airplane Mode" ( 🗹 )

Airplane Mode is set.

• To cancel, uncheck "Airplane Mode" (  $\square$  ).

When using handset, the following security codes are required.

| Handset Code          | Code required for using each function. It is not set by default.  |
|-----------------------|---|
| Lock No./<br>Password | Code for unlocking screen. It is not set by default.  |
| Security Code         | 4-digit code in contract. Required for changing details of contract, using optional services from landlines, etc. |

- Do not forget Security Code. If you forget the code, servicing is required. For details, contact Inquiries (P.11-25).
- Be careful not to reveal security codes to others.
   If misused by others, SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any resulting damages.

#### **PIN Code**

PIN Code is a code for USIM Card.

It is used to prevent unauthorized use by others. It is set to 9999 by default.

#### Enabling PIN Code

When PIN code is enabled, set to show the screen where PIN entry is required for handset use each time handset is powered on with USIM Card installed.

- In Standby, → "Settings"
- 2 "Security" → "USIM Card Lock Settings" → Check "Lock USIM Card" ( \( \sqrt{V} \) )
- 3 Enter PIN code → ■
  PIN code is enabled.

#### Changing PIN Code

Changing PIN code is available only when PIN code is enabled.

- In Standby, → "Settings"
- 2 "Security" → "USIM Card Lock Settings" → "Change USIM PIN"
- 3 Enter current PIN code → ■
- 4 Enter new PIN code → ■
- 5 Enter new PIN code → ■
  PIN code is changed.

## CAUTION

#### Wrong PIN Code Input

 If wrong PIN is input three times in a row, PIN is locked, and handset usage is restricted.
 Enter Personal Unblocking Key (PUK code) to release PIN lock. (P.1-22)

#### Canceling PIN Lock (PUK Code)

- For Personal Unblocking Key (PUK code), contact Inquiries (P.11-25).
- 1 Enter PUK code →
- 2 Enter PIN code → ■
- 3 Enter PIN code again → ■
  PIN lock is canceled.



#### Wrong PUK Code Input

 If wrong PUK is input ten times in a row, USIM Card is locked, and handset is no longer operable. Input carefully; a locked USIM Card will need to be reissued (fees apply) at a SoftBank shop.

#### Setting Notification LED

Set notification LED pattern (color) when calls/messages arrive.

- Vibration works at initial value settings in Manner Mode.
- In Standby, → "Settings" → "Sound/ Notification"
- 2 "Phone Call"/"Mail Notification" → "LED"
- 3 Select a pattern →



## **Text Entry**

Use Dial Keys to enter text.

The file name of saved data is a save date. For example, if a contact file is saved on November 15 in 2017, the name will be "17111500.vcf." When multiple files are saved on the same day, the name will be "17111501.vcf" and the lower 2-digit number will be increased.

#### Savable Number of Files

Up to 100 files can be saved to server/SD Card, etc. respectively for each Phone Book data/Calendar data/Call Log data/image data/music data/movie data.

#### When Data Cannot be Saved

When you make settings such as Secret Mode so that you do not allow a third party to view data, some data may not be saved to server.





Failure to do so may cause injury, etc.

Skeep out of reach of infants.

# Handset Use & Electronic Medical Equipment

#### **↑** WARNING

When carrying handset, keep a minimum of 15 cm from implanted cardiac pacemaker, implanted defibrillator, etc.

Electronic signals may interfere with the

operation of electric medical equipment.

When using electronic medical devices as home medical treatment other than an implanted pacemaker and an implanted cardioverter defibrillator outside medical facilities, check individually with the manufacturer of the electronic medical equipment regarding the influence of electronic signals.

Electronic signals may interfere with the operation of electric medical equipment.

Set handset not to emit electronic signals (power off or place in Airplane mode) if you will be in a packed location and cannot maintain a distance of 15 cm from those around you. Persons who might have implanted cardiac pacemakers or implanted defibrillators may be in the vicinity. Electronic signals may interfere with the operation of electric medical equipment.

Follow instructions of each medical institution for use of handset in a hospital.

Electronic signals may interfere with the operation of electric medical equipment.

### Usage

- Handset supports software update. Use the latest software.
- Since handset uses signal, calling may be difficult in a location such as indoor, underground, in a tunnel, in a car with weak or poor signal reception even if you are in service area. And if you move to a location with weak or poor signal reception during calls, calling may be suddenly interrupted.
- When using handset in public places, take care not to annoy other people around you.
   Note that theaters or vehicles have designated places where using handset is prohibited.
- Handset is a radio station specified in the Radio Law. Therefore, the inspection based on the Radio Law may be required.
- Use of handset near a landline phone, TV, or radio may affect the image and sound quality of the equipment.
- As the advantages and special characteristics of digital system, handset maintains stable high call quality up to the limit in locations with weak signal reception. Therefore, if the limit is exceeded during calls, calling may be suddenly interrupted.

- Digital system has high privacy of communication. Wiretapping may result. Pay full attention on usage.
- Note that the following may cause information saved on handset to be erased or altered. SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any damages resulting from alteration or loss of information. It is recommended that you keep a separate copy of important data to minimize any damages from alternation or loss of information.
  - · When used improperly
  - When affected by static electricity or electrical noise
  - · When powered off during operation
  - When malfunctioning, submitted for repairs
- Be sure to charge Battery before using handset for the first time or if handset has not been used for a long time. Even if Battery is not used, storing Battery for extended period causes battery to be gradually discharged.
- SD Card (commercially available) may be warm after extended use. This is normal.
- Do not use or store SD Card (commercially available) in locations prone to static electricity or electrical noise.

• Back up SD Card (commercially available) data to a PC or other media (FC·MO·CD-R/W). SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any damages resulting from loss of saved data due to damage, etc. of SD Card (commercially available).

### When Using Handset in a Car

Using handset while driving a car is dangerous and it is prohibited by law. Use handset after parking a car in a safe place.

### Handling

- Do not use handset in places subject to extremely high or low temperatures, high humidity, direct sunlight, or with much dust.
- Although general handset use in temperatures over 35 °C is possible, handset may become warm. Charging or various functions may stop in such a high temperature. This is normal.
- Do not drop handset, or subject it to impact.
- To clean handset, wipe it with a dry, soft cloth. Do not use alcohol, thinner, benzene. Doing so may discolor or remove exterior features or print.
- Take care not to let nails or fingertips get caught in handset groove gap. May cause injury, etc.
- Do not touch USIM Card slot metal part or Antenna part when Battery Cover is removed. Static electricity may cause malfunction.
- Be sure to power off handset before removing Battery. May cause malfunction.

- Note that having Battery removed for extended period or leaving Battery low may cause content saved on handset to be erased or altered. SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any damages resulting from alteration or loss of content.
- Battery is consumable and lithium-ion.
   Depending on conditions of usage,
   however, even if Battery is fully
   charged, its usage time may become extremely short. Replace Battery. Purchase a specified Battery.
- When removing Battery, be sure to place a fingertip on the notch of handset and lift the one side of Battery. Removing Battery forcefully may cause damages to terminal.
- Communication antenna is built in handset. This means that it doesn't protrude above the surface of handset. If the built-in antenna is touched with hand or covered with finger, signal reception may become weak. Especially, do not attach sticker, etc. to the built-in antenna. If signal reception becomes weak, making/receiving calls may not be available.
- For handling USIM Card, read User Guide of USIM Card carefully to use it safely and properly.

 Insert SD Card (commercially available) correctly. SD Card (commercially available) can only be used if inserted correctly.

### Camera

- Do not leave Camera Lens under direct sunlight. May burn or fade colors of elements.
- Shooting photos or storing handset in a warm place for extended period may affect image quality.
- Camera is high-precision, including pixels which always appear bright or dark. Blue, red, white, etc. dots will appear when shooting in extremely dark conditions.
- When shooting indoors under fluorescent lighting, flickering (extremely faint and not visible)
  may appear as stripes in image. This is not a
  defect or malfunction.
- Camera may make sound during operation, such as when being activated. This is not a defect or malfunction.

- Keeping Photo Viewfinder open or shooting photos, operating Browser, etc. repeatedly for a continuous and extended period causes handset to become warm. Skin contact for extended period when handset is warm may cause low temperature burns.
- Observe proper etiquette when using Camera.
- Creating a public nuisance with Camera may be punishable by law.
- Practice taking and previewing pictures, videos, and audio before using Camera on important occasions like wedding ceremonies.
- Photo files (below, content) may be altered or erased due to malfunctions, repairs or other handling. SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any damages or lost profit resulting from content alteration/erasure or its restoration.
- Do not use Camera in locations such as bookstores where shooting photos or videos is prohibited.

### Music/Videos

- Do not listen to music or watch videos while driving a vehicle or riding a scooter/bicvcle. Such use of a mobile phone is prohibited by law (use while riding a bicycle may also be punishable). Also be alert while walking: if surroundings are difficult to hear or attention is on Display, a traffic accident may result. Be careful especially at railway crossings, on station platforms, and at intersections.
- Listening at loud volume for an extended period may affect hearing.
- Take care not to disturb those around you (on train, etc.) with earphone or other noise.

### Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) for This Product (for Japan)

This mobile phone [Simply] meets Japanese technical regulations\* and international guidelines for exposure to radio waves.

The Japanese technical regulations for exposure to radio frequency energy established permitted levels of radio frequency energy, based on standards developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies.

The regulations employ a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR.

The SAR limit is 2 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over ten grams of tissue. The limit includes a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.
