Cellphone Etiquette

Mind Your Manners!

A cellphone always emits weak radio waves while it is turned on, even when you are not talking with it. Enjoy using your cellphone without forgetting to be considerate of those around you.

Some locations do not allow the use of cellphones

- Using a cellphone while driving is dangerous and prohibited by Traffic Control Law.
- Using a cellphone in an aircraft is prohibited by law. Be sure to turn off your cellphone.

Watch out where you use your cellphone, and keep your voice down

- Do not make calls at cinemas, theaters, museums, libraries, or other similar locations. Turn off the cellphone or use Manner Mode to ensure that the ring tone does not disturb others.
- When in public, move to a location where you will not be blocking traffic.
- On the Shinkansen, in a hotel lobby, or in other similar locations, move to a location where you will not disturb others.
- Take care to avoid talking on the phone in a loud voice.
- Before taking a picture of others, be sure to obtain permission first.

Cellphone radio waves may interfere with electrical medical equipment

- On a train or in other crowded locations, there is always the possibility that someone nearby may be wearing a pacemaker. Turn off your cellphone when you are in a crowded area.
- Follow the rules of hospitals and other medical facilities prohibiting the use or possession of cellphones.

When Carrying W63K Handset

Lock the handset keys to prevent the activation for accidental operations.

Simple Mode

Your W63K has Normal Mode and Simple Mode. Simple Mode lets you display in the menu only frequently used functions such as phone and mail, in an easy-to-use manner. The phone is in Normal Mode at the time of purchase. This manual describes operation for Normal Mode.



Manner Mode and Answer Memo

Manner Mode

Use Manner Mode to turn off the ring tone so as not to bother others around you.

When the standby screen is displayed, hold down $\underbrace{\bigstar^{\text{constant}}_{\text{constant}}$ for at least one second.



Answer Memo

If you cannot answer a call, Answer Memo plays an answering message and records the caller's message.

When the standby screen is displayed, hold down $\begin{bmatrix} 237\\ x \\ x \end{bmatrix}$ for at least one second.

Checking Power, Signal Strength, and Battery Level

Using Your Cellphone While Driving is Prohibited

Do not use your phone while riding a bicycle or a motorbike, or while driving a car. Doing so may cause an accident. Using a cellphone while driving a car or riding a motorcycle is prohibited by Japanese law. You may also be penalized for using a cellphone while riding a bicycle.

Beware of Spam and One-ring Calls!

If you receive spam . . .

You can set up mail filters to block specific mail or spoof E-mail. Your cellphone mainly has the following functions to block spam.

- ·Blocks mail identified as "未承諾広告※"(Unsolicited advertisement)
- · Blocks specific mail
- · Blocks spoof E-mail
