Making Management of the TMD Patient Palatable

This course focuses on evaluation, evidence based treatment and management for patients with temporomandibular joint dysfunction. Discussion and review of TMJ anatomy and its relationship to the cervical spine will be included to better understand relevant biomechanics and contribution to dysfunction. This course is designed to have a working knowledge of a comprehensive evaluation and examination, identifying impairments and efficient clinical decision making in the management of TMD patients. Treatment strategies and manual therapy techniques will also be demonstrated with a mini lab session , applying theory to practice .Participants will be able to take skills that can they implement and use in the clinic for the management of TMD.

2. To present evaluation and examination of the TMJ that will guide clinicians with their clinical decision making.

3. Demonstrate a simplified approach of Manual therapy techniques and exercises in the management of TMD .
