



The abundance of art in this area is a delight for visitors. There's not only one of Victoria's most prestigious regional galleries, Castlemaine Art Museum, but also many artists' studios in Castlemaine, Maldon and Newstead that are often open to the public.

For performing arts, the town proudly hosts the internationally renowned Castlemaine State Festival and other events like the Maldon Folk Festival, the Castlemaine Film Festival and the Newstead Live Music Festival.

### Central Victoria prides itself on its creative population of writers, musicians, artists and poets



This is a brainy region blessed with many bookstores with five in Castlemaine and several others dotted across the region. As well as reading, locals keep busy by creating amazing art, beautiful gardens and some of Victoria's best regional cuisine.

But if you just rock up to town any old weekend you're guaranteed to see excellent live music at many local venues and the latest arthouse and blockbuster films at the historic and rejuvenated Theatre Royal.





Castlemaine & Surrounds can feel the full force of nature and the seasons however the local soil and climate is perfect for cider, wine and ginger beer production, particularly at Harcourt. Summer is dry and hot, autumn is warm with cool nights, winter is frosty and spring often brings the rain. Organic fruit and vegetables are farmed in this area so why not stock up on the freshest of local produce before you leave.


Top restaurants such as The Public Inn, Bistro Lola and Togs Café delight in serving locally sourced and organic produce. In Maldon you will find many cosy cafes and a couple of historic pubs where you can relax and watch the world go by.

A visit to The Mill in Castlemaine is like visiting a market in Tuscany. There's onsite smoked meats, locally roasted coffee, a small beer brewery, and a vegetable store that stocks organic and local produce. Pack up a picnic and take yourself to our magnificent Castlemaine Botanical Gardens across the road from The Mill. ■

### Once one of the richest gold seams in the world, the Victorian gold rush transformed Melbourne and central Victoria during the 1800s



Mining settlements that exist around Castlemaine to this day, such as Guildford, Chewton and Fryerstown, are living history. But the jewels in the crown are Castlemaine and Maldon, with intact heritage buildings, such as the Courthouse and Town Hall in Castlemaine and wide streets lined with mature trees. At Maldon the streetscape itself is the hero.

Beautifully restored and maintained period architecture, from miners cottages to the grand Buda goldfields villa in Castlemaine, can be found all over the region.

Castlemaine Diggings National Heritage Park is one such mining site, where the treasures and toils of the gold digging past can still be seen today.






### You won't find chain stores here! Castlemaine Maldon & Surrounds is home to a thriving scene of independent shops



A rare manuscript shop, bespoke clothing, ceramics, second-hand book stores, garden art, farmers and artists markets, also antiques and curiosity stores. And at The Mill, you can buy everything from vintage clothing to 12-seat dining tables. You will be amazed at the creativity of this region.





Year-round, nature in the goldfields is constantly changing



In spring, it's wildflower season. In summer, be sure to swim at the reservoir at Golden Point or the picturesque Vaughan Springs. In autumn, see the leaves change colour on the mature trees in the goldfields' towns, and enjoy a bushwalk that suits all levels along the tracks of Mt. Alexander. When the weather cools down, warm up by mountain bike riding at La Larr Ba Gauwa Park, a world-class mountain biking facility with around 34kms of single track trails on the north-western slopes of Mt. Alexander.

This region has diverse natural wonders. In one walk you're likely to see fern gullies, thick woodlands, ironbark and stringybark forests, flora reserves, vineyards and rolling farming hills.

Explore the Goldfields Track, or at least a section of its 210km length, with camping options along the way. And don't forget the new Castlemaine to Maldon Walking and Cycling trail — 17kms of track running alongside the historic goldfields steam railway.

Be sure to keep your eye out for native animals. Kangaroos and wallabies are often sighted in the area.





We love a party in central Victoria - and with more than 100 events a year in the region, your visit is sure to coincide with a festival, concert or celebration

There are events for car enthusiasts, foodies, art lovers, music fans and culture vultures — all year round.

Festivals include the internationally renowned biennial Castlemaine State Festival, featuring the best of local and overseas performances, as well as the annual Maldon Folk Festival, Castlemaine Jazz Festival and Newstead Live. Car-lovers are well serviced with Chopped and the Rotary Truck Show.

Each weekend you will find the Wesley Hill market open with baked goods and fresh produce for sale, while once a month, the Maldon Market and the Castlemaine Artists and Farmers Market draw hungry crowds from across the district.

And many nights of the year, there's films or bands performing at venues like the Theatre Royal, The Taproom, and many local pubs.







Buda is a gracious historic villa residence and garden built during the goldrush era. From 1863 it was home to noted colonial goldsmith and jeweller, Ernest Leviny, and his creative family. The property was opened to the public in 1982 and the Leviny family's remarkable collection of art, decorative objects and personal belongings can be viewed on display in the house. The surrounding 1.2 hectare heritage garden is one of the

most intact of its era still in existence in the state with its old-world plantings, meandering paths and unique garden structures. Buda is an accredited museum and has an annual program of interesting events and exhibitions, along with a plant nursery and giftshop for visitors.




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

Walking down the winding main street is like going back into time — but inside the gorgeous shopfronts you'll find boutique stores including hip homewares, funky garden accessories and don't miss the Maldon Lolly Shop.

Sample local wines and food from farm gates and cellar doors. Like many towns in the region Maldon is spoilt with fresh, organic produce and wine, as well as antiques, vintage wares and collectables. Home to many artists, the backstreets are full of period homes and classic Australian bush landscape.

Ride on the Victorian Goldfields Steam Railway for a nostalgia-hit and great views of the countryside. Be sure to time your visit with one of many local festivals, including the Maldon Folk Festival or Maldon in Winter.



Rest your weary calves and chill out with a glass of wine or cider at the end of a day. It's the best of all worlds. ■







Chewton

A thriving village on the outskirts of Castlemaine, Chewton is a picturesque former gold mining site with a modern twist — a thriving foodie farmto-table pub, community-run swimming pool, antique shop, post office and cafe.

Located on the Pyrenees Highway, Chewton is surrounded by box ironbark forests and in the spring wildflowers bloom. A great spot for walkers and cyclists.

This vibrant rural village is notable for its patches of native forest and lush valley farmland, as well as the 19th century Taradale viaduct. The former gold rush town is popular with tree changers, and those wanting to live in a close-knit and sustainable environment.



A creative and vibrant rural community, Newstead is home to an eclectic mix of artists, farmers and foodies. Sustainability is a key component of this environmentally progressive town.

Situated on the picturesque banks of the Loddon River, you will find artist studios, walking tracks and historic hotels.

The town also hosts the Newstead Live music festival and Chopped which brings traditional style rods and custom cards from all over the country.

### Baringhup

The jewel in the crown of rural Baringhup is the Cairn Curran reservoir, a popular spot for boating, swimming, canoeing and fishing. The town also features in the modern Australian classic, Raimond Gaita's Romulus, My Father.

### Fryerstown

**Nestled in the Castlemaine Diggings** National Heritage Park Fryerstown was home to thousands of miners during the height of the gold rush. Now known for its strong sense of community and appeal to tree changers.

### Guildford

Halfway between Castlemaine and Daylesford, gorgeous Guildford on the Loddon River was once home to a large encampment of Chinese miners during the gold rush.

Check out the famous Ron Barassi bust, the Big Tree estimated to be over 500 years old or catch a gig at the local pub or music hall.

### Vaughan

Vaughan is home to Vaughan Springs, a natural waterhole in a bushland setting, that for years has been a closely held local secret.

There's plenty of parking, so take a picnic down to the banks of the river, taste the mineral water from the pump, swim in the refreshing river or take the kids down the huge slide.



#### From the Melbourne Airport or Melbourne city:

Excellent public and private transport options are available from Melbourne to Castlemaine. A great option is Bendigo Airport Services which operate shuttle buses to and from the Melbourne Airport several times a day. These buses stop at various towns including Castlemaine.

Train: With departures nearly every hour from Melbourne's Southern Cross Station, Castlemaine is just over an hour from Melbourne by train and is the perfect way to sit back, relax and enjoy the journey. Public transport requires you to use a Myki card, these can be purchased online at ptv.vic.gov.au. The Castlemaine Railway Station is an easy walk, just minutes from the CBD.

For steam rail buffs visit vgr.com.au to access information on the steam railway service between Castlemaine and Maldon.

By Car: This region is very accessible by car - just over an hour from Melbourne via the Calder Freeway.

By Bus: Once you arrive in Castlemaine you will find both public and private companies providing some regular services.
