GUIDELINES FOR SANCTION AND DISBURSEMENT OF CAPITAL INVESTMENT SUBSIDY UNDER AGRICULTURE POLICY-2013

The Government have announced an Agriculture Policy which has come into effect from 1st APRIL, 2013. The said policy provides for

payment of Capital Investment Subsidy as follows.

- 1) The above mentioned list of enterprises can be amended/ modified by the Government from time to time in the changing circumstances.
- 2) The entrepreneur should get net income of 10% of the project cost minimum to Rs.2.00 lakh per annum from all the above mentioned projects.

 3) The CAE projects against which no minimum prerequisite is there, the viable project report should be prepared so that entrepreneur should get net income of 10% of the project cost minimum to Rs.2.00 lakh per annum from the project.

Other notes:

Land based activities such as seed production, papaya, banana (short duration crops/annual/biennial plantation crops) will not be eligible for CIS.

CIS is allowed for expansion/modernization of all enlisted 63 nos. of projects provided that the existing capacity of the said project is increased at least by 50% by way of such modernization or expansion.

The working capital in a project cannot be included as capital cost for the purpose of CIS assessment.

- * Self financed Commercial Agri-Enterprises shall be allowed up to project of Rs.10.00 lakhs.
- * For projects costing more than 10 lakhs, bank financing shall be mandatory for not less than 10% of project cost as term loan.
- * The initial application format will be simplified through ADHAAR authentication and farmers ID .

1. Commencement of operation

The guidelines shall be deemed to have come into operation with effect from the date of notification. APICOL, as the nodal agency for successful implementation of the scheme may revise the format and guide line with inclusion /modification/

deletion through executive order looking to the changing circumstances.

2. Terms, Expressions, Definition & Steps to be followed.

Implementing Agency— The Agricultural Promotion and Investment Corporation of Odisha Limited (APICOL) under the Department of Agriculture & Farmers' Empowerment will be the nodal agency for implementation of this programme. The district level line department officers like Chief District Veterinary Officer (CDVO), Deputy Director of Agriculture (DDA), Deputy Director Horticulture (DDH) and District Fisheries Officer (DFO) will implement the programme at the field level. The Block level line department officers like Additional Veterinary Asst. Surgeon (AVAS) or BVO in absence of AVAS, Asst. Agricultural Officer (AAO), Asst. Horticultural Officer (AHO), Asst. Fisheries Officer (AFO) and the Asst. Agricultural Engineer (AAE) of concerned DAO office will issue feasibility report and verify the DPR of the proposed CAE uploaded by the entrepreneur for the cases where the security deposit has been made through payment gate way. In

case of Integrated farming projects, the BVO/AVAS will submit the feasibility report after site verification with other concerned BLO. If the Integrated farming project does not have an ARD component then the concerned BLO with higher project component will submit the feasibility report to his DNO after observing due formalities. The BLO will periodically monitor the execution process and upload the photograph in the portal.

<u>Eligible Beneficiary</u>- The eligible beneficiary include an individual, partnership enterprise, body of individuals, registered NGOs, SHGs and private limited companies. **Group of Individuals like registered FPOs,FPCs,NGOs, SHGs, PACs, LAMPs, private limited companies etc. will be eligible for availing CIS to the tune of 40% limited to 50.00 lakh. This will not be applicable to the group as mentioned above, where all members are women/SC/ST/Graduates in Agriculture and allied discipline. In such case, the CIS would be 50% limited to Rs 50.00 lakh.**

<u>Eligibility criteria</u>- The applicant should be a permanent resident of Odisha. The subsidy limit for a particular eligible beneficiary/group (as mentioned above) will be Rs 50.00 lakh. An entrepreneur/group can avail CIS for any nos. of projects. But the total subsidy involvement for all such projects in respect of that particular prospective entrepreneur should be limited to Rs 50.00 lakh. One who has once availed CIS for an Agri-enterprise, will be eligible to apply for another new project after 5 years, provided the old one is not defunct, the entrepreneur is not bankrupt after five years of completion/trial production of old enterprise and he has refunded all the loan amount from the financing institution against the previous project.

<u>Dist.Nodal officer</u>- A good number of projects concerning to different line Departments are included under subsidy in the CAE fold. The concerned Dist.level officer relating to their projects will act as the "**Dist. Nodal Officer**". The Dy. Director Agriculture (DDA) of a particular district will function as nodal officer in respect of projects related to Agriculture, Food Processing and Agro industries etc. and in respect of projects related to horticulture, Fisheries and Animal Husbandry the concerned Dist. Level officer like Dy. Director Horticulture (DDH), District Fishery Officer (DFO) and Chief District Veterinary Officer (CDVO) will be the nodal officer.

<u>Project Cost:</u> The project cost of each enterprise may vary and there is no fixed limit due to variation in type of projects as well as size of

projects. The consultant while preparing the DPR will adopt the PWD schedule of rates for buildings, tanks, wells and fencing materials. In case of irrigation equipments, he will adopt the rates provided in the Rules for private Lift Irrigation points. In the case of Micro Irrigation Systems he will adopt the rates approved by the Director of Horticulture. In the case of plants, trees, birds, animals, fries and fingerlings, he will adopt the scale of finance as approved by NABARD/Line Department. However, the size/capacity of the project should be such that, the net annual income from the enterprise should not be less than 10% of the project cost with minimum Rs 2.00 lakh.

Model DPR to be reflected in website indicating capital investment and financial analysis for reference.

3. Committees

- "State Level Committees (SLC)" means, the Committee constituted under item-5.1 of the guidelines.
- "Sub-Committee" means, the committee appointed by the Chairman of the State Level Committee under item-5.2 of the guidelines.
- "Krushi Sahayak Kendra (KSK)" will act as the District Consultative Committee and will constitute the members under item 5.3 of the guide line.
- "District level Scrutiny Subcommittee" means, the Committee constituted under item-5.4 of the guidelines.

4. Assessment of Fixed Capital

4.1 Land

No subsidy will be paid on cost of land. The land on which the CAE is proposed to be set up should be

- (a) In the Name of Entrepreneur/Group/Company/Partners., or
- **(b)** Leased out in favour of entrepreneur /Group /Company / partners for a period of more than 15 years in the office of the concerned Sub-Registrar.
- **(C)** Leasing of land is not required in case of woman entrepreneur if the land stands in the name of her husband

4.2 Building

Only those newly constructed buildings specifically required for the project erected at the site after issue of Go Ahead Letter will qualify for subsidy. Dwelling houses, quarters used for residential purposes, toilets, guard room, RCC/ Masonry compound wall and internal road will not qualify for the subsidy.

4.3 Project Report

The cost of preparation of Project Report will be treated as a Capital Investment and will qualify for investment subsidy as a part of the cost of the project. The report should have been prepared by either a chartered accountant, O.U.A.T. or any Institute of Government of India or a consultant approved by APICOL or concerned line department officers or professionals in agriculture and allied sectors. The admissible cost of Project Report would be limited to 1% of the total project cost (excluding cost of land).

4.4 Plant & Machinery

The value of plant and machinery as erected at Factory site or on the farm will be taken into account which will include the cost of productive equipments, such as machineries, tool, jigs, dies and moulds etc. Transport charges, loading, unloading charges, demurrage, insurance premium, electrical installations including generators etc.; the cost of plants, trees, birds, animals, fries and fingerlings, the cost of tank, well, bore well or any other water body as a source of irrigation; equipments used in irrigation, cultivation, post harvest management; cost of permanent fencing; and such other items as may be included from time to time, provided that subsidy from any other source is not claimed on any of the items.

4.5 Mode of Evaluation

In case of self finance projects, the valuation of completed projects irrespective of the project cost will be done by the *Dist. Nodal Officer* and one Engineer not below the rank of Asst. Engineer of any Government Department (Agril. PWD, RWSS, OLIC, OAIC, WR, PR Dept. etc.) and solely by the financing institution in bank finance cases. The concerned officer will adopt the PWD schedule of rates for evaluation of buildings, tanks, wells and fencing materials. In case of irrigation equipments, he will adopt the rates provided in the Rules for private Lift Irrigation points. In the case of Micro Irrigation Systems he will adopt the rates approved by the Director of Horticulture. In the case of plants, trees, birds, animals, fries and fingerlings, he will adopt the scale of finance as approved by NABARD/Line Department. *The evaluation report will be filled up by the evaluator based upon the detail valuation for civil construction, authenticate bills and vouchers*

with TIN/SRIN for the investment made towards electrification, water supply and equipment/machinery.

5. Sanctioning Committee

5.1. State Level Committee (SLC)

There will be a Joint State Level Committee consisting of the following members to consider proposals for sanction of Capital Investment Subsidy for the projects costing more than 1.00 crore.

5.2 Sub-Committee

The Chairman of the State level Committee may, if he thinks expedient to do so, authorize a sub-committee to exercise any of the powers and functions of the State Level Committee. Provided that the decision of the sub-committee shall be placed before the State Level Committee at their next meeting for approval.

5.3 Krushi Sahayak Kendra (KSK)

There will be a Krushi Sahayak Kendra (KSK) in each District, which is the apex supervisory body at the District Level for taking up consultative works. It will function at each District HQ. The members of the KSK at each District HQ for the purpose of CAE are as follows.

- 1. Deputy Director of Agriculture (DDA) Member convener
- 2. Chief District Veterinary Officer (CDVO) Member
- 3. Deputy Director Horticulture (DDH) Member
- 4. District Fisheries Officer (DFO) Member
- 5. Head of the local Regional Agricultural Research Station- Member
- 6. Lead Bank Manager- Member

The Krushi Sahayak Kendra (KSK) will meet every month on a fixed date for preparing strategy, framework, counseling with an aim for creating maximum number of agri-entrepreneurs in relation to the projects specific for their district. It may also meet as often if the need arises. The KSK will review the position of application and instruct the concerned officers for necessary follow up measures for preparation of DPR etc. Since the projects

are of varied nature, in case of any clarification as regards to the technical standard, viability, marketing and profitability of a particular project, the State level resource persons from OUAT, Industries, respective departments may be referred to.

5.4 District Level Scrutiny Sub-Committee

There will be a District Level Scrutiny Sub Committee in each revenue district. The members of the Scrutiny Sub Committee are as follows.

Collector and District Magistrate of the District-Chairman

Lead Bank Manager-Member

AGM, NABARD-Member

General Manager, DIC- Member

Dist. Nodal Officer of the Department- Member

Deputy Director of Agriculture-Member Convener for all listed projects

The submitted DPRs concerning to the projects (as reflected in the SAP-2013-Annexure-II) of different line Departments will be placed before the scrutiny sub-committee for deliberation and consequential issue of go-ahead letter by the Dist. Nodal officer for execution of the projects irrespective of project cost. The Committee shall go into merits of each case to decide whether the project qualifies for grant of State Capital Investment Subsidy or not.

. For the projects set up by the entrepreneur without the knowledge of the Dist. Nodal Officer/ scrutiny subcommittee, he can apply for CIS within 6 months of completion/trial production. In such cases, the certificate of trial production/completion need to be submitted by the concerned DNO and it should be approved by the DLSSC. The relief of 6 months for availing CIS will be applicable only for Bank Finance cases.

Proceedings of each such meeting shall be recorded by the Convener. The minutes of the meeting duly approved by the Chairman shall be circulated to all concerned members, Director of Agriculture, MD, APICOL and copy thereof endorsed to the Government in Agriculture Department and F & ARD Deptt.

6. Implementation Modalities

6.1 The new portal for online application for establishment of CAE is https:/apicol.nic.in.

The prospective entrepreneur has to submit an application in prescribed form (**Annexure-I**) to the Block Level Officer enclosing all the details of capital investment in the Project Report summary format (Annexure-II). The said application form will be available online at https:/apicol.nic.in.

6.2 The application will be viewed online by the BLO. After receipt of application from entrepreneur, the BLO shall verify the application and in case of any discrepancy shall revert back the application to the entrepreneur within 5 working days for compliance. An auto generated alert message/email will be sent to the applicant regarding this. The information pertaining to feasibility report like road connectivity, electrification, distance from nearby village shall be furnished by the entrepreneur as a part of DPR.

After receipt of the compliance, he will visit the farm site, verify the relevant land records, take a GPS photograph of the site in a mobile app and upload in the web portal only for the cases who have deposited security deposit of Rs.10,000/-through online payment gateway. He will upload and submit the feasibility report (Annexure-III) in the web portal within 15 days.

The security money will be refunded at the time of disbursal of subsidy or else, it will be forfeited in case of non-establishment of the unit without valid reasons after issue of Go Ahead letter. For bank finance cases, if the bank will not sanction the loan, then the security amount will also be refunded. The DPR will be prepared by the Departmental resource person if the applicant desires. Otherwise, he may take the help of any other designated consultants/experts for preparing DPR.

Upon receipt of the proposal along with feasibility report and project report from the BLO online, the concerned Dist. Nodal Officer will process and review the same and retrieve the land records from Bhulekh. The DNO may carry out on the spot verification of the proposal and interact with the entrepreneur personally if necessary. Once the DNO is satisfied, he shall upload recommendation. His recommendation will be either (a)recommended or (b) not recommended, In not recommended cases, he will upload the reasons for rejection in three points and maximum 50 characters within 15 days of receipt of the proposal. For all cases an alert message will be sent to the Chairman, DLSSC to fix up a date for meeting. An alert message will also be sent to the DDA-cum-Convener, DLSSC to convene the meeting & MD, APICOL for information. DLSSC should mandatorily sit every month on a fixed date (if the date falls on a holiday then it should be convened on the next working day) as decided by the Chairman. All proposals will be placed by the DNO before DLSSC for consideration. The DDA will take the responsibility of preparing the proceedings and get it signed from Chairman DLSSC within 3 working days. He will tick **OK** online on the day of approval of the proceedings after which the Go Ahead Letter will be auto-generated within 7 days. The Go Ahead letter is to be uploaded in the website with the seal & full signature of the DNO. The entrepreneur will get Go Ahead within a maximum of 60days from the date of on line application completed all respect. **SMS** alert will be issued to all the stake holders like entrepreneur, BLO, DNO, DDA, Collector and APICOL.It will be reflected in citizen view. In rejected proposals, SMS will be sent to the entrepreneur with reasons of rejection. Security deposit shall be refunded automatically through payment gateway with message to APICOL.

In case of non delivery of assigned task by the BLO,DNO,DDA within the stipulated period, an alert message will be sent to next higher level for taking necessary action .6.3 The specimen copy of go-ahead letter is enclosed at **Annexure-III**. The scheduled date for completion of the project will be maximum 2 years from the date of issue of go-ahead letter.

In case of delay in execution of the project within stipulated period mentioned in the Go Ahead Letter (2 years), 20% of CIS will be deducted from the eligible subsidy amount in case of completion delayed by 6 months and 50% will be deducted from eligible CIS in case of delay in completion from 6 months to one year. No subsidy will be provided in case the project completion is delayed beyond one year.

7. After completion of the project, the application for Capital investment subsidy shall be made by the beneficiary in the prescribed format **Annexure-IV** for investment made towards electrification, water supply and equipment machineries along with the detailed estimate of civil *construction prepared* by one assistant engineer to the District Nodal Officer and Lending Bank, who in turn will take steps for evaluation of the project. He will upload all relevant bills & vouchers in DNO site after due verification by DNO. The completion-cum-subsidy application form submitted by the entrepreneur in prescribed format will be approved by the DNO online after visiting the project site. The completion papers will be forwarded to the lending Bank for action at their level. For the proposals against which Go ahead has been issued as per the recommendation of DLSSC need not be placed again before DLSSC for sanction of subsidy after completion of the unit. Subsidy will be calculated as per rules laid down in SAP guidelines and released in favour of the financing bank/entrepreneur by APICOL.

8-Evaluation will be done (Annexure-V) by the Dist nodal officer for self finance cases and by the Branch Manager of the lending bank for bank financed cases irrespective of the project cost basing upon authentic bills and vouchers with GST No. submitted by the entrepreneur and detailed estimate submitted by an Assistant Engineer/approved valuer duly countersigned by the Valuer Lowest of the capital investment reflected in project report, evaluation report submitted by the Bank/DNO and detailed estimate, authentic bills and vouchers with GST No./TIN/SRIN submitted by the promoter will be eligible for capital investment against which CIS will be sanctioned.

FOR PROJECTS WITHIN 1.00 CRORE

The DNO will upload the scanned copy of the evaluation report (Annexure-V) obtained from the branch manager in bank financed cases and prepared by himself in self financed cases in the portal.

- The DNO will prepare a comparative statement(Annexyre-VI) of capital investment reflected in project report (Annexure-II), the evaluation report (Annexure-V) and authentic bills and vouchers with GST No. as well as detailed estimate submitted by an Assistant Engineer/approved valuer. The lowest of the three will be considered as the eligible capital investment.
- The District Nodal Officer will generate the subsidy release certificate on line (Annexure-VIII). Then he will submit all the relevant documents on line to MD, APICOL. He will also upload the agreement (Annexure-VII) executed by the entrepreneur with the DNO on non-judicial stamp paper worth Rupees thirty signed by both in all pages. He will also send signed copies of all the documents(hard copies) as per check list (Annexure-XI) to MD, APICOL for purpose of audit. MD, APICOL shall release the CIS through RTGS directly to the bank account of entrepreneur in self finance cases and to the concerned financing bank for adjustment against the term loan account in bank finance cases.

FOR PROJECTS ABOVE 1.00 CRORE & UPTO 20.00 CRORE

For the projects costing more than one crore, the DNO will submit the required documents to APICOL. On receipt of the CIS proposal, evaluation of the project will be done in **Annexure-V** by the State Level Evaluation Team constituted by APICOL. Then APICOL will place it before the state level committee (SLC) for sanction of subsidy.

- ❖ After receipt of the CIS proposal, evaluation report and verification report from the DNO, MD, APICOL will prepare agenda and convene the SLC meeting as per the date and time fixed by the Chairman, SLC once in every month for sanction of subsidy.
- * After discussion in the SLC and approval of the same, the MD, APICOL will log in through their respective user-ID and Pass word and approve the particular project on line for disbursal of subsidy. He will also sign the auto generated subsidy sanction certificate (Annexure-VIII). An agreement (Annexure-VIII) to be executed by the entrepreneur with the MD, APICOL on non-judicial stamp paper worth Rupees thirty signed by both in all pages before release of the CIS. Then CIS will be released through RTGS directly to the bank account of entrepreneur in self finance cases and to the concerned financing bank for adjustment against the term loan account in bank finance cases.

FOR PROJECTS ABOVE 20.00 CRORE

❖ For projects having project cost of more than 20.00 crore, the project proposal shall be forwarded by APICOL to IPICOL for appropriate action under the "Single Window Clearance" mechanism. IPICOL may

place such proposals before the Agriculture Task Force to be constituted for this purpose.

9. Disbursement of Capital Investment Subsidy

Capital Investment Subsidy will be disbursed after the unit is completed, trial production made in case of manufacturing units and completion of the project in all other cases.

Explanation

For projects other than manufacturing units the date of completion would mean the date on which investment on building, plant and machinery has been actually completed but would not include investment on maintenance on subsequent years.

The date of trial production/completion of the project would be as certified by will be certified by the Dist. Nodal Officer irrespective of the project cost.

- 9.1 The entrepreneurs shall be required to execute an agreement with the District Nodal Officer/MD, APICOL as per **Annexure-VII** before release of subsidy i.e at the time of submission subsidy release certificate.
- 9.2 The amount of subsidy provided in the budget will be placed with the APICOL and will be released to the Financing Institution/ Entrepreneurs after due sanction by the Competent Authority.
 - 9.3 Subsidy will be disbursed to the lending bank in case of projects financed by them. In all other cases the subsidy will be disbursed to the Entrepreneur directly through his bank Account.
 - 9.4 Access may be provided to bankers atleast at two levels i.e. HO level and zonal level to facilitate credit monitoring.
 - 9.5 Edit option for change of banks in all cases and change of source of finance (for project costing below 10 lakhs) shall be provided to the DNO.

10. Audit

The accounts maintained by APICOL shall be submitted to the Government of Odisha within 4 months from the date of financial year ending. The A.G., Odisha on receipt of such reports will cause audit of the accounts.

11. Recovery of the Capital Investment Subsidy

Where an Enterprise in the opinion of the State Level Committee/ District Level Committee has availed the CIS by misrepresentation of facts or by furnishing false and misleading information or suppressing any information, cessation of the unit/changing the site of the unit prior to the period mentioned in the agreement (**Annexure-VII**), the subsidy will be recoverable as arrears of land revenue under OPDR Act.

12. Establishment of Agribusiness facilitation cell at APICOL.

An Agribusiness facilitation cell will be established at APICOL with dedicated manpower to facilitate agrientrepreneurship, handholding and aftercare support.

- 1. In consideration of the Government agreeing to give to agroentrepreneurs under the said scheme. In such Installments the Government in its sole discretion think fit, an aggregate..... amount of Rs by way of the capital investment subsidy to the agro-entrepreneur(s) creating the fixed assets of for the purpose of the said unit and the agro-entrepreneur(s) do and each of them do hereby covenant with the Government as under:
- I) The Department will be entitled in its sole discretion to make disbursement of the capital investment subsidy or of any part thereof either in one or more installments to the first party on its applying with the terms and condition and the State subsidy scheme and of this agreement.
- II) In the event of the State Level Committee/ District Level Scrutiny Sub Committee ultimately deciding for any reason whatsoever, that the agro-entrepreneur (s) are entitled to a lesser amount of subsidy the excess amount of the capital investment subsidy shall be repaid by the entrepreneur (s) to the Government or to the corporation as the Agent of the Government along with interest thereon at the rate of 12.5 (Twelve half percent) per annum or such other higher rate (s) as the Government might decided from time to time from the date of payment of the said amount of Rs......or any part thereof paid under this agreement till the repayment.
- III) The entrepreneur (s) shall duly observe and perform the covenants and the condition to be observed and performed by him /them under the said scheme.

 - ii) If the Agro-entrepreneurs shift the known location of the office of the enterprise outside the state without taking prior permission of the State Government.
- d) If any information furnished by the agro entrepreneurs in his/their application for the subsidy or otherwise, prior to the sanctioning of the sum of Rs...... as the subsidy is found to be incorrect or false or misleading and there has been suppression of any materials /fact.
- e) If a distress of execution shall be levied upon any property of the entrepreneurs or any part of the said enterprise or a receiver thereof be appointed.
- f) If the entrepreneurs shall commit a breach of any and of the covenants or provisions here in continued and on his/its/their part to be observed and performed.
- g) If the entrepreneurs close the said enterprise for a period exceeding six months at a time for reasons other than labor trouble, want of electric power or raw materials or shall cease to carry on agricultural business for any reason whatsoever within ten years from the date or trial production/completion of the enterprise.
- h) If the agro-entrepreneurs or any of them file a petition for being adjudicated as insolvent or are/is adjudicated as insolvent.
- i) If any petition for winding up the entrepreneur's agricultural enterprise is presented to any Court or the enterprise passes any resolution for being wound up.
- j) If the agro-entrepreneurs fail or neglect to forthwith execute such further documents as may be required by the Government or to duly comply with any directions given to it by the Government. In each one of the aforesaid contingencies the entrepreneur (s) agree to repay the whole amount mentioned above with interest thereon at the rate of 12.5 per cent per annum or such higher rate as the Government might define from time to time from the date of disbursement of the subsidy till the repayment.

- 4. The entrepreneur is free to procure any brand as per his choice from the approved list.
- 5. For non-standard items / items for which no SLTC approval has been accorded, the beneficiary will have to procure those items on the basis of at least 3 quotations obtained from manufacturers / authorized dealers having TIN/ SRIN number.
- 6. The other implementation modalities and guidelines relating to sanction and disbursement of Capital Investment Subsidy (CIS) under APR-2013 for ASC will be the same as that prescribed for Commercial Agri Enterprises (CAE) communicated vide Government in Agriculture Department letter No.AP-II-18/13(pt)18887, dt.07.11.13 and Directorate letter No.IS (12)22/13-274/Agril, dt.03.02.2014.
