 - Windows 7: Click or tap Start → Shut down.



NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.

- 3 Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all cables such as telephone cables, network cables and so on, from your computer.
- 5 Disconnect all attached devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, monitor, and so on, from your computer.
- 6 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- After the computer is unplugged, press and hold the power button for 5 seconds to ground the system board.

Removing the Base Cover




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Procedure

- **3** Using a plastic scribe, pry the base cover out of the base frame.

- **1** Remove the screws that secure the battery to the base frame.
- 2 Lift the battery off the base frame.







- 2 Align the screw hole on the wireless card with the screw hole on the system board.
- **3** Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.
- 4 Place the wireless-card bracket on the wireless card and align the screw hole on the wireless-card bracket with the screw hole on the system board.
- 5 Replace the screw that secures the wireless card and the wireless-card bracket to the system board.

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



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

Folding the Keyboard Cables









CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.



NOTE: The original thermal grease can be reused if the original system board and heat sink are reinstalled together. If either the system board or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to make sure that thermal conductivity is achieved.









Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board. To flash the BIOS:

- 1 Turn on the computer.
- 2 Go to dell.com/support.
- 3 If you have your computer's Service Tag, type your computer's Service Tag and click **Submit**.

If you do not have your computer's Service Tag, click **Detect My Product** to allow automatic detection of the Service Tag.
