WARNINGS

- To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not expose this appliance to rain or moisture.

USE OF THE REMOTE CONTROL

BATTERIES

• Remove the cover on the rear of the Remote Control and insert two AAA Batteries.

• Make sure the + (positive) and – (negative) ends of the batteries are facing the correct direction as shown inside the remote control. Close the rear battery cover.

• When using the Remote Control, point the Remote directly at the IR receiving lens (6) on the Front Panel of the DVD Player. Make sure there are no objects obstructing the infrared beam and the Receiving Lens (6) on the player Front Panel as they will block the beam from being received by the DVD Player.

 The Remote Control will only operate from a maximum distance of 5-30 Feet from the Player. If the Remote stops functioning well from your normal distance, replace both batteries in the Remote Control.

• The Battery compartment should be checked on a regular schedule to confirm there is no battery leakage which can damage the remote. Replace any leaking batteries immediately.

REMOTE CONTROL OPERATION

- · POWER: Power ON or OFF (Standby) the Player
- OPEN/CLOSE: Open or Close the DVD disc tray

NUMBERS (1-9): Used for entering numbers. For example; numbers of DVD Chapters CD song tracks.

• VOL- / VOL+: Increase or decrease the audio volume.

• SETUP: Press and the Setup Menus will appear for your selection of different functions and operating preferences.

• ENTER: Press to confirm your selection

NAVIGATION LEFT : Press to move back to the previous menu selection or to navigate left on the on-screen display

NAVIGATION RIGHT : Press to move forward to the next menu selection or to navigate right on the on-screen display

- UP NAVIGATION: Press to move up to the menu selection
- · DOWN NAVIGATION: Press to move down to the menu selection
- MENU: Press the MENU button to return to the Main Menu for playing a DVD.

• OSD (On Screen Menu): Press OSD repeatedly to cycle through the various types of disc play information. Each Press; (1) Disc Time, (2) Title, (3) Chapter, (4) Audio Track, (5) Subtitle, (6) Angle, (7) OFF

• ZOOM: Press ZOOM repeatedly (for ZOOM enabled DVDs only) to select; (1) 2X ZOOM (2) 4X ZOOM, (3) 8X ZOOM, (4) ZOOM OFF

- PLAY/PAUSE: Play Disc. Pause Disc
 - o STOP: STOP button has two functions;
 - o Press STOP ONCE to stop Disc. Press STOP again and playing will resume from memory of location Disc was stopped.
 - o Press STOP TWO times to stop Disc and clear memory of stop point.

To Play a DVD Disc

Turn on the TV set and select A/V mode.

 Press the **POWER** button on the front panel. If there is a DVD in the tray, DISC LOADING will appear. NOTE: If there is no disc in the player, NO DISC will appear.

2. Press the **OPEN/CLOSE** button and the disc tray will open.

3. Place a DVD on the disc tray. NOTE: Make sure desired screen resolution is facedown (Wide-screen, Full-screen).

4. Press **OPEN/CLOSE** to close the tray. The disc type (DVD, MP3, and JPEG) will appear in the upper left hand corner.

NOTE: It is possible to damage a disc if not placed correctly on the guides in the disc tray. This can also cause the DVD player to malfunction. Only use a 5" DVD or CD with this DVD player. Never move the DVD player during playback. To avoid damaging the DVD player, only use the OPEN/CLOSE button key on the DVD player or DVD player remote to open and close the disc tray.

5. Press the **PREV** or **NEXT** buttons to play the previous or next track. To resume normal playback press the **PLAY/PAUSE** button.

6. Press the FWD or REV buttons on the remote to active fast forward or reverse. NOTE: The speed will change each time the button is pressed. Press the PLAY/PAUSE button to resume normal playback.

Stop Playback:

1. Press the **STOP** button to stop the DVD. With some disc formats, like DVD, this player will resume play exactly where **STOP** was pressed.

 Press PLAY/PAUSE to resume playback from where the disc was stopped.
NOTE: If you press STOP 2x the DVD player will stop and playback will restart from the beginning.

Screen Display

While a disc is playing the status of various fuctions can be checked by pressing the **OSD** button.

1. Press **OSD** 1x to display the title, chapter, and time played

2. Press **OSD** 2x to display the remaining time for that particular title.

3. Press **OSD** 3x to display the total elapsed time for that particular chapter.

4. Press OSD 4x to display the total

remaining time for that particular chapter.

5. Press OSD 5x and the display will turn off.

Subtitles

This DVD player can display subtitles in 32 different languages.

1. Press the **SUBTITLE** button. The subtitle menu will appear. Select the desired language by pressing the SUBTITLE button.

2. To remove subtitles, press the SUBTITLE button until the subtitles disappear. NOTE: The DVD must be multi-subtitle encoded for this function to work.

Camera Angle

This DVD player has the ability to change the camera angle.

- Press the ANGLE button on the remote to shift the camera angle. Each press will change to a different angle.
- 2. This button will only work when the flashing angle icon appears in the DVD's display panel.

NOTE: The camera angle can only be changed on DVD discs with multi-angle capability encoded.

Search Function

- 1. Press the **SEARCH** button. The title menu will appear on the TV screen.
- Press the appropriate scroll button to select desired title. A title may also be located by pressing its assigned number with the number buttons.
- Press the ENTER button. This will start playback from chapter 1 of selected title.

NOTE: Some discs will not respond to this function. If different instructions appear on your DVD follow those instructions. Title procedures may vary depending on the content of a particular DVD.

A-B Repeat

Press A-B once to set a start point, then press A-B again to set an end point. The selected start and end point will now repeat. Press A-B 3x to cancel this function. FUNCTIONS

Volume

It is suggested you set the volume level on the DVD player output to a mid-level seting using the VOL+ or VOL- buttons. Use the volume controls on your TV remote to adjust the sound level coming out of your television.

Repeat Play

This DVD player allows repeated playback of specific titles, chapter/tracks, or segments.

Select the item to repeat
Press the **REPEAT** button.

NOTE: The repeat mode changes each time the **REPEAT** button is pressed. (1x = repeat title, 2x = repeat chapter, 3x = repeat all, 4x = repeat off)

Zoom Enabled DVD

This DVD player can enlarge the picture up to 8x during standard playback.

- 1. Press **ZOOM** once to enlarge image by 2x.
- 2. Press ZOOM 2x to enlarge the image by 4x.
- 3. Press ZOOM 3x to enlarge the image by 8x.
- 4. Press ZOOM 4x to return to normal size.

DVD Menu Setup

Press the **SETUP** button on the remote and the menu will appear.

1. Press the scroll button up or down to select desired menu. Press the **ENTER** button to confirm your selection and enter the desired submenu.

General Setup

This option is used to setup the following format and functions: TV screen format, video functions, DVD settings, language, parental controls, and others.

Language

OSD Language: languages to select from: English, French, and Spanish.

SUBTITLE: When playing DVD discs, the player can support: English, French, and Spanish subtitles. Subtitles can be set to Automatic or OFF.

AUDIO: This DVD player can support English, French, and Spanish.

DVD MENU: When playing DVD, MPEG4, or VCD discs, the player can support English, French and Spanish.

Video Setup

Aspect Ratio: Depending on the disc format, there are two kinds of aspect ratio options: 4:3 & 16:9.

Parental Control

To Restrict viewing of certain movie ratings use the DVD remote to to select the Ratings menu. Enter the password (default password 0000), then set to "OFF" on the menu to modify the parental control settings.



Set password: The default password is 0000. Enter 0000 the first time you access parental settings. If you like to set a custom password, select "Set Password" on the system menu.

MISC. Setup

MISC Setup: If you want to reset the DVD player to it's factory default settings, select "Use Default Settings" in the MISC Setup menu.

7. TROUBLE SHOOTING

Problem	Reason	Solution
Power is connected but the player does not work.	Plug is not inserted correctly into the wall outlet.	Reinsert the power cord into the wall outlet or try a different wall outlet.
Disc is inserted in the player but there is nothing displayed on the TV screen.	Disc is inserted upside-down; disc is dirty, scratched, or cracked.	Correctly insert the disc into the player; repair or clean the disc and wait until the disc has completely dried (one-hour) before re-inserting into the player.
No sound	Audio cables are not properly connected.	Make sure the RED & WHITE cables are properly connected on both the DVD player and TV.
No Picture	Video Cable is not properly connected; TV is not on the correct INPUT	Make sure the YELLOW cable is properly connected on both the DVD player and TV. Adjust the TV to the correct INPUT/SOURCE (refer to TV owners manual)
The Remote Control doesn't work	Batteries no longer work; remote is not pointed directly at the remote sensor.	Change the batteries. Move closer to the DVD player and point the remote directly at the front. Make sure there is no object between the remote and the IR receiver on the player.
During playback, the image freezes, skips, or the sound is distorted.	The disc is in poor condition.	Repair or clean the disc and wait until the disc has completely dried (one-hour) before re-inserting into the player.
