## Safety and use.....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimise its performance.

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the phone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump, etc. In particular when using the phone, you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

To avoid hearing impairment, pick up the call before holding your phone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let children use the phone and/or play with the telephone and accessories without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10°C to +55°C.

At over 55°C the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Emergency call numbers may not be reachable on all cellular networks. You should never rely only on your phone for emergency calls.

Do not open, dismantle or attempt to repair your mobile phone yourself.

Do not drop, throw or bend your mobile phone.

Do not paint it.

Use only batteries, battery chargers, and accessories which are recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates and are compatible with your phone model (see Accessories List, page 93). TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates disclaim any liability for damage caused by the use of other chargers or batteries.

Remember to make back-up copies or keep a written record of all important information stored in your phone.

Some people may suffer epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, or when playing video games. These seizures or blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout. If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult your doctor before playing video games on your phone or enabling a flashing-lights feature on your phone.

Parents should monitor their children's use of video games or other features that incorporate flashing lights on the phones. Prolonged exposure to music at full volume on the music player may damage the listener's hearing.

Pursuant to such laws and regulations, it may be strictly forbidden to take photographs and/or to record the voices of other people or any of their personal attributes, and duplicate or distribute them, as this may be considered to be an invasion of privacy. It is the user's sole responsibility to ensure that prior authorisation be obtained, if necessary, in order to record private or confidential conversations or take a photograph of another person; the manufacturer, the seller or vendor of your mobile phone (including the operator) disclaim any liability which may result from the improper use of the mobile phone.

## • BATTERY:

Before removing the battery from your phone, please make sure that the phone is switched off.

Observe the following precautions for battery use:

- Do not attempt to open the battery (due to the risk of toxic fumes and burns).
- Do not puncture, disassemble or cause a short-circuit in a battery.
- Do not burn or dispose of a used battery in household rubbish or store it at temperatures above 60°C.

Batteries must be disposed of in accordance with locally applicable environmental regulations. Only use the battery for the purpose for which it was designed. Never use damaged batteries or those not recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and/or its affiliates.

The chargers designed for your mobile phone meet with the standard for safety of information technology equipment and office equipment use. Due to different applicable electrical specifications, a charger you purchased in one jurisdiction may not work in another jurisdiction. They should be used for this purpose only.

## • RADIO WAVES:

Proof of compliance with international standards (ICNIRP) or with European Directive 1999/5/EC (R&TTE) is required of all mobile phone models before they can be put on the market. The protection of the health and safety for the user and any other person is an essential requirement of these standards or this directive.

THIS DEVICE MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves (radio frequency electromagnetic fields) recommended by international guidelines. The guidelines were developed by an independent scientific organization (ICNIRP) and include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The radio wave exposure guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg.

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. The highest SAR values under the ICNIRP guidelines for this device model are:

During use, the actual SAR values for this device are usually well below the values stated above. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimize interference on the network, the operating power of your mobile device is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the call. The lower the power output of the device, the lower its SAR value.

Body-worn SAR testing has been carried out at a separation distance of 1.5 cm. To meet RF exposure guidelines during body-worn operation, the device should be positioned at least this distance away from the body. If you are not using an approved accessory ensure that whatever product is used is free of any metal and that it positions the phone the indicated distance away from the body.

The World Health Organization has stated that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile devices. They recommend that if you are interested in further reducing your exposure then you can easily do so by limiting your usage or simply using a hands-free kit to keep the device away from the head and body.

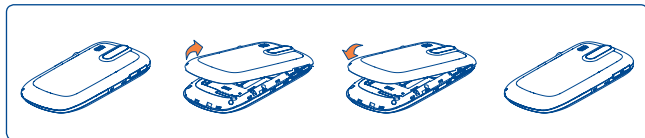

# Getting started .....

## 1.1 Set-up

### Removing or installing the back cover



### Inserting or removing the SIM card <sup>(1)</sup>

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your phone and remove battery before inserting or removing the SIM card.

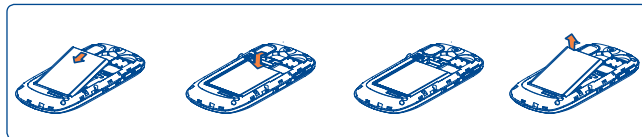
Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press and slide it out.



The SIM1 slot can support both 2G and 3G network, while the SIM2 slot can only support a 2G network.

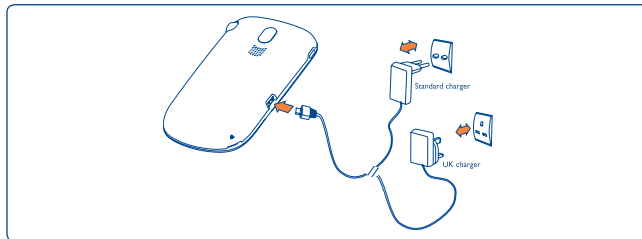
<sup>(1)</sup> Check with your network operator to make sure that your SIM card is 3V or 1.8V compatible. The old 5 Volt cards can no longer be used. Please contact your operator.

## Installing or removing the battery



- Insert and click the battery into place, then close the telephone cover.
- Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

## Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your phone and mains socket respectively.


- Charging may take about 20 minutes to start if the battery is flat.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The mains socket must be near to the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).
- When using your telephone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours). You are advised to fully charge the battery (🔋).






To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi <sup>(1)</sup>, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

## 1.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the  key until the telephone powers on, type in your PIN code if necessary and then confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your telephone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

If Broadcast SMS are displayed, touch to browse through them or press  to return to the Home screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, "Searching/Emergency" will be displayed.

## 1.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the  key from the Home screen.

## 1.4 Using the touchscreen

### Touch



To access an application, touch it with your finger.

### Drag



Place your finger on the screen to drag the object to the destination.

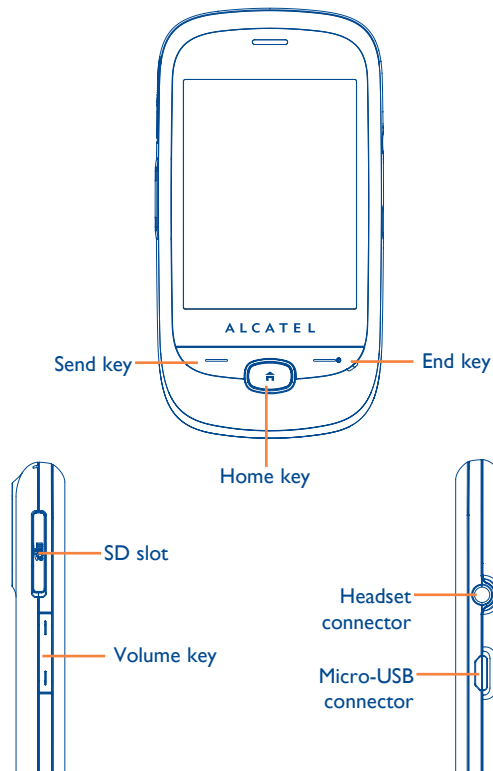
### Scroll



Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, web pages...at your convenience.

## 2.2 Home screen

You can bring all the items (shortcuts and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access.



The Home screen is provided in an extended format to provide you with more space for adding widgets and shortcuts. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. Small dots at the bottom of the screen indicate which screen you are viewing.

### 2.2.2 Status list

The Status list contains information about significant events, like Missed calls, Unread messages, E-mails as well as the Radio & Music player current playing information., etc. The purpose is to allow you faster access to the interactive applications.

Touch the status bar and drag down to open, drag up to close.


To open an application, touch it from the list.

### 2.2.3 Toolbar

Toolbar with 4 fixed shortcuts to access **Main menu**, **Calls**, **Message**, **Edit Home screen**.



### 2.2.4 Personalize your home screen

#### Adding items

To add an item, touch and hold an empty area of the Home screen or select  from the toolbar.


- **Add shortcuts** To add a shortcut to the Home screen, such as Alarm, Bookmarks, Contacts, etc.
- **Add widgets** To add a widget to the Home screen, such as the World clock, Music player, etc.

#### Editing/Removing/Re-organizing items

Long press the application on the Home screen to edit/remove/re-organize it, touch  to edit (only for my favourites), touch  to remove. Touch and hold the application and drag it to the location you desire, and then confirm by touching **Done**.

### Customizing wallpaper

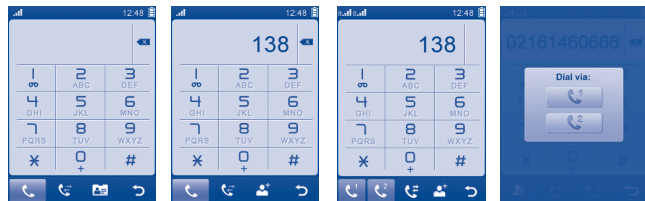
To personalize your wallpaper, you can select one of the following two ways:








- Touch and hold an empty area from the Home screen, select **"Wallpaper"**, then touch a folder to select an image as your wallpaper.
- Touch  from the tool bar, select **"Wallpaper"**, then touch a folder to select an image as your wallpaper (See page 51).






## 3 Making a call.....



### 3.1 Placing a call

To place a call, you may touch  from tool bar.





Enter the desired number on the on-screen keypad directly or select a contact from Call log or Contacts by touching  or  respectively, then touch  or press  key to place the call. Press  to return to the middle Home screen, and then touch  or press  to retrieve the call.

For dual SIM model, touch  or  if you wish to place a call or press  key and touch  or  in the pop up window. This will give you the option to select either SIM1 or SIM2 to place a call.


The number you entered can be saved to Contacts by selecting . If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching .

To hang up the call, press the  key.


### Making an emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and press the  key or touch  to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.






### 3.2 Calling your voicemail <sup>(1)</sup>


Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time. To access your voicemail, hold down  on the on-screen keypad.

If the access number for your operator's voicemail service does not work, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to "My numbers" (see page 44).


 To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

### 3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the  key to answer and then hang up using the  key. Press  to return to the middle Home screen, and then touch  or press  to retrieve the call.

If the  icon is displayed, the vibrator is activated and there is no ringtone.

If the  icon is displayed, the phone neither rings nor vibrates.

 The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

## Muting the ringtone

You may mute ringtone of current incoming call by touching .





Answer the call by pressing the  key.

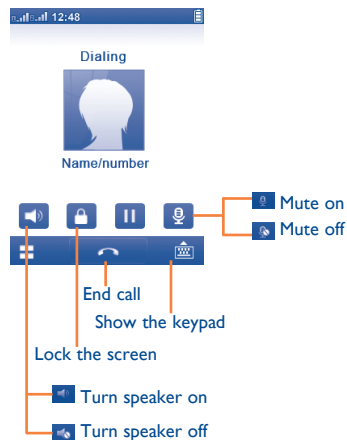
## Rejecting a call

Press the  key once to reject the call, or reject call with SMS by touching .

## 3.4 During a call <sup>(1)</sup>

### Available functions

During a call, touch  to use your contacts, calendar, short messages etc. without losing your caller. Press  to return to the middle Home screen, and then touch  or press  to retrieve the call.

Move the handset away from your ear while turn on the speaker because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

You can switch the audio function from handset to Bluetooth device when connected.



## Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the sound level during a call using the Volume key.

## Handling two calls

- Answering a second call (ensure that "Call waiting" is activated, see page 45).
- To call a second party during a call, you may touch  and select "New call".

## 3.5 Conference calls <sup>(1)</sup>

Your phone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to five). If you are on a double call, touch  and select "Conference". If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing the  key and speak with your new caller.

This caller becomes a member of the conference if you press  and select "Conference call".

### 3.6 Line switching <sup>(1)</sup>

Your SIM card can contain two distinct telephone numbers. Under "**Call log\Options\Call settings**", choose "**Line switching**" and then select a default line; all your outgoing calls will be made from this number. Incoming calls, however, will continue to use either of the two lines.

The services programmed on the default line do not impact those selected on the other line.

## 4 Message.....

You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this mobile phone.




MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.



The MMS function can only be used if the service is provided by your operator, and if your contract includes the MMS option and if all the parameters for MMS have been entered (see page 34).


### 4.1 Access

You may access this menu using the following options:

- Touch  to enter the main menu screen, and then select .
- Access from tool bar by selecting .

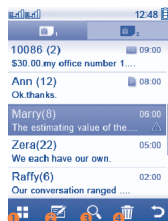
For dual SIM model, touch either SIM1 or SIM2 on the above tabs to complete message operation.

### 4.2 Conversational On (Off) mode

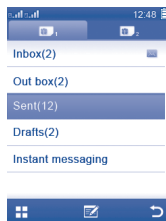
In conversational on mode, you can view chat history in chronological order. In conversational off mode, you can access the following folders: **Inbox, Outbox, Sent, Broadcast SMS, Voicemail, Drafts**, etc. You can switch between these two modes by selecting "**Switch view mode**" via . Conversational on mode is set as the default mode and the following instructions are based on this mode.

## 4.3 Write message

Touch  to create text/multimedia messages (See page 89).

One or more recipients can be added from the contact list. To remove a recipient, move the cursor to the end of the recipient's name, and press  key. You can select a recipient from Contacts.


For dual SIM model, you can select recipients in either SIM1 or SIM2 contacts and select SIM1 or SIM2 you wish to send it by touching  or .

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when: images, videos, audio, slides or attachments are inserted; Subject, CC/BCC/email address is added; or the message contains more than 8 pages of text.

 Specific letters (accent) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

## Timer send

Schedule an SMS/MMS to be sent out at predefined time (select "Timer send" via ).

 An SMS message of more than a certain number of characters (the number of characters depends on your language) will be charged as several SMS. An MMS message containing photos and/or sounds may also be billed as more than one message.

## 4.4 Search

To search for a thread, you may touch  and input the initial of a contact name. Subsequent letters may be added to refine the search.

## 4.5 Alerts

### 4.5.1 Setting messages

The storage of provisioning messages.

View and edit the voicemail number.


### 4.5.3 Broadcast SMS

#### Text messages

**Alphabet management** Enables the definition of SMS data coding for SMS sending.

**Memory status** Memory used on the phone.

**Preferred storage** Select default message storage, SIM or phone.

**Preferred bearer** Bearer preference.

<sup>(1)</sup> Depending on your network operator.

## Multimedia messages

**Edit** Set slide timing, edit mode, image size signature, etc.

**Send** Set the values for validity period, Read report, etc.

**Retrieve** Set the values for Home network, Roaming network, etc.

**Edit profiles** Follow the same procedure as for setting your WAP connection.

**Memory status** Memory used on the phone.

### Broadcast SMS <sup>(1)</sup>

**Receiving mode** Enable to receive Broadcast SMS.

**Languages** Language selection.

**Channel settings** Select/Add/Edit/Delete channels.

### 4.7.4 SIM messages

This option contains messages stored in your SIM card.

### 4.7.5 Memory status

This records total memory usage for both phone and SIM.

# 5 Email .....



Your phone has an email client with the settings predefined for a few popular email services like – GoogleMail, Yahoo, AOL, etc. Besides this, you can set up other POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts that you may be using.

## 5.1 Access

Touch  from tool bar to enter the main menu, select **"Email"**.

## 5.2 Email account set-up

### Pre-defined email service

If you own an email account of predefined services, you can install it to your phone by selecting the service (GoogleMail, yahoo, etc.), entering the username, password and account name, and then confirming with **"Save"**.

For dual SIM model, you can touch **"Options\Edit account\Advanced settings\Account settings\Data account"** to select either SIM1 or SIM2 option after setting up a new account.

### New email service

To set up a new email account other than the predefined email services, select **"Other Email accounts"**.

You are required to enter your email address, display name, password, account name, then confirm with **"Save"**. After you'll need to select protocol<sup>(1)</sup> (POP3 or IMAP4) and network, then enter your incoming server address and outgoing server address, select **"Save"**.

## 5.3 Write email

Touch  to enter write email interface.

You can add recipient by entering Email address from enter bar, or selecting contact from Contacts.

## 5.4 Inbox

Folder of all received Emails.

## 5.5 Outbox

Folder of all unsent Emails.

## 5.6 Sent

Folder of all sent Emails.

## 5.7 Drafts

Folder of all draft Emails.

<sup>(1)</sup> Consult your email service provider for more information about protocol.

## 5.8 Available options

<b>Signature</b>	To attach your signature when sending emails.
<b>Check interval</b>	To check for new emails at a pre-set interval.
<b>Edit account</b>	To edit the detailed configuration information of the selected account.
<b>Delete account</b>	To delete the current selected account.

## 6 Palringo <sup>(1)</sup> .....

Palringo Instant message (IM) allows you to chat with other people using Palringo account. You can also connect to other popular IM services through Palringo, like Yahoo, AIM, GG, ICQ, GTalk, iChat etc.

Please note that the services accessible to you will depend on your client version and dynamic Palringo server options.

### 6.1 Access

To access Palringo, touch  to enter the main menu, select .

### 6.2 Open a Palringo account online

Before activating this service, you are required to open a Palringo account online. There are two ways to do this:

- Select "**Create an Account**" tab to open an account via phone.
- You can also open account directly on website:

### 6.3 Sign in/Sign out

To connect to Palringo instant message server, please select "**Sign in**" tab. You are required to input your Palringo account information, like username (Email address), password, sign in status, etc.

To sign out, touch "**Menu**", then "**Sign out**".

## 6.4 Add service

Various services (Yahoo, GTalk, ICQ etc.) can be added by "**Menu\Add Service**".

## 6.5 Chat

To start a chat, select one online contact, then touch "**Private chat**".

During chat, you can also exchange voice or photo messages with your community.

## 6.6 Contacts

### Add a contact

To add a contact, click "**Menu**", then select "**Add contact**".

First, you need to specify which service, Yahoo for example, you want to add the new contact to. Then input the contact's email address or ID.



Your request will be sent to the contact for approval. Once accepted, the contact's name and status will appear on your contact list.

### Delete a contact

To delete a contact, select one contact, then touch "**Delete contact**".

The selected contact will be removed from your contact list.

## 6.7 Groups

With this menu, you can "**Join a group**" or "**Create a new group**". You can begin chatting with all members in the group simultaneously.

# 7 Contacts .....

## 7.1 Consulting your contacts

To access the Contacts, touch  from tool bar to enter the main menu, and select "**Contacts**".

For dual SIM model, touch either SIM1 or SIM2 on the above tabs to view contacts information.

Your favourite contacts are at the top of the entire contact list in your phone contacts.

For the first time consulting your contacts, you are required to import contact from SIM card to your phone. For dual SIM model, you can select to import contact from either or both SIM1/SIM2.

## Searching for a contact

Touch  to search for a contact by inputting the initial of his/her name. Subsequent letters may be added to refine the search. Alternatively scroll up/down to find the contact you need after reaching the initial letter within the contact list (A-Z) section.

## Viewing a contact

Select a name from your contacts to read the contact information.



## 7.2 Adding a contact

You can add a new contact by touching .

Following fields are accessible when you create a new contact in the Contacts: Name, Image, Mobile, Save to phone/Save to SIM card, Home, Work, Email, Birthday, URL, Ringtone, Group.

For dual SIM model, you can add a contact and select to Save to phone/Save to SIM card/Save to SIM1/Save to SIM2.

You can move from one field to another by scrolling up and down or using the Volume key.

### Birthday reminder

You can set a birthday reminder when editing contact information. This will remind you at regular intervals during the day prior to the set date.



If you use your phone abroad, store the numbers in your Contacts in international format "+" followed by the country code (see page 25).


## 7.3 Contacts importing, exporting and sharing

This phone enables you to import/export contacts from/to a SIM card, or to copy contacts to the phone, which can then be used to back up your information.

From the phone contacts screen, select "**More**" via  and touch "**Import from SIM card**" or "**Export to SIM card**".

From the SIM contacts screen, select "**More**" via  and touch "**Copy to phone**".

For dual SIM Model, you can make full use of both SIM1 and SIM2 for information backup.

From a detailed Contact view screen, you can share the contact information with others by selecting "**Share contact**" via  and then send it by Bluetooth, MMS, Email, etc.


## 7.4 Available options

From the contact list, you can access the following options:

<b>Group</b>	You can view, send messages or e-mails to the group you select or you can create, delete groups as you want.	
<b>Delete contact</b>	Delete the selected contact.	
<b>Synchronization</b>	Synchronize with the account you've set.	
<b>More</b>	<b>My number</b>	Type in, modify or send the user's own number by SMS.
	<b>Memory status</b>	View used and available space in SIM and Phone contacts.
	<b>Import from SIM card</b>	Copy the whole contacts to the Phone contacts only if there is sufficient memory.
	<b>Export to SIM card</b>	Copy the whole Contacts to SIM card only if there is sufficient memory.
	<b>Default storage</b>	Select the default storage location for messages.
	<b>Copy to phone</b>	Copy the whole contacts to Phone contacts if there is sufficient memory.

## 8 Call log.....

### 8.1 Access

You may access this function from the main menu "Call log" or by pressing  from the Home screen.

For dual SIM model, the complete call logs of both SIM1 and SIM2 are available in this menu.

### 8.2 Available options

When you touch , you can have access to **Delete**, **Send message**, **Save to Contacts**, **Edit before call**, etc.

#### 8.2.1 My numbers

Type in or modify your telephone number or the number to access your voicemail. Your telephone number is usually written on your SIM card.

### 8.2.2 Billing <sup>(1)</sup>

You can access different items with this option:

<b>Last call cost/Total cost/Max cost/Reset cost/Price per unit</b>	You can view the last call cost/total cost/Max cost/Reset cost/Price per unit of charged calls, modify or reset them .
<b>Duration</b>	You can view the total duration of all outgoing calls or reset it.
<b>GPRS counter</b>	Management of data usage volume (in kilobytes).
<b>Beep duration</b>	You can activate or cancel the beep emitted during a call with a specified frequency (enter the frequency and confirm by touching "√").

### 8.2.3 Call settings <sup>(1)</sup>

You can access a number of items with this option:

#### Call waiting

Activate/deactivate the notification of a second incoming call by a beep.

#### Call forwarding

You can activate, cancel or verify the status of the call forwarding to the voicemail or to a specified number.

#### Call barring

You can activate or deactivate the call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

##### Outgoing calls

The following configurations are possible:

- **All calls** All outgoing calls are barred.
- **International calls** Outgoing international calls are barred.
- **International except home** Outgoing international calls except those to your country of subscription are barred.

##### Incoming calls

The following configurations are possible:

- **All calls** All incoming calls are barred.
- **Roaming** Incoming calls are barred when you are abroad.

##### Cancel all barring

Deactivate all call barring.

##### Change barring Password

Change the original Password for activating call barring.

## Caller ID

Activate/deactivate CLIR.

## Line switching <sup>(1)</sup>

Line switch between line 1 and line 2.

## Auto redial

You can activate or deactivate the automatic callback of your party for calls that do not get through the first time.

## 9.1 Music player .....



To access this function, touch  to enter the main menu and select .

You will have full flexibility of managing music both on your mobile and SD card.

**Equalizer** Different music styles preset in the phone for your selection. You may also customise it simply by touching  on the screen.

**Bluetooth settings** Set to play music in a bluetooth device

**Display** Enable your player to display song information. or lyric.

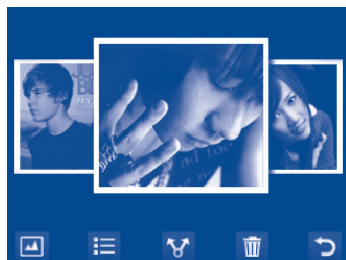

## 9.4 Radio .....

Your phone is equipped with a radio <sup>(1)</sup> with RDS <sup>(2)</sup> functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service. You can listen to it while running other applications.

<sup>(1)</sup> The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.

To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.

Your mobile phone is fitted with a camera for taking photos and shooting videos that you can use in different ways:



- store them in your **"File manager\My creations"**.
- send them in a multimedia message (MMS) to a mobile phone or an email address.
- send them directly by Email or Bluetooth.
- personalize your Home screen (see page 81).
- select them as incoming call image to a contact in your contacts.
- transfer them by data cable or microSD card to your computer.
- upload them directly to an available SNS <sup>(1)</sup> (Social network service).

## 12.1 Access

To access the function from the Home screen, touch  from tool bar to access the main menu and select the  icon.

## 12.2 Camera

### 12.2.1 Take a photo, save or delete

The screen acts as the viewfinder. Position the object or landscape in the viewfinder and touch  to take the image and the images will be automatically saved. If you don't want it, you may directly delete it by touching .

### 12.2.2 Settings in framing mode


Before taking the photo, you can adjust a number of settings by touching .

### 12.2.3 Options available after taking the photo

Once you have taken a photo, five icons appear on the photo so you can choose to send your photo by Bluetooth, MMS and Email, assign it to a contact, or set it as wallpaper, etc.

## 12.3 Video

You can record a video clip of unlimited length, as long as the battery sustains and there is sufficient memory.


### 12.3.1 Framing mode

When you enter the **"Video"** function, you are in framing mode. Use the mobile screen as a viewfinder and touch  for the **Exposure Value**, **Night mode**, **Video quality**, **Record audio**, **Color mode**, and **Storage** settings.

Touch  to access **My Videos** to view the videos you have taken.

Touch  or  to switch between camera mode and video mode.

### 12.3.2 Recording mode

Once you have chosen your settings, you can launch the recording of your video-clip by touching  on the screen.



If you receive a call in recording mode, video recording will be stopped and a pop up message will inquire if you want to save it.

## 13 Profiles.....



With this menu, you may personalise ringtones for different events and environments.

### 13.1 General

You can modify the sound settings within any profile by touching .

<b>Ringtone</b>	Select a melody from the list by scrolling up and down or using the Volume key then confirm by pressing <b>"Options\Select"</b> (see page 49).
<b>Mode</b>	You may set your phone ringtone to Normal, Discreet (ring with beep), Vibration (all sounds are replaced by vibrations except for alarms), Vibration and Melody, Vibration then Melody, Beep and Vibration, Silence (no sounds except for alarms, the  icon will be displayed).
<b>Volume</b>	Adjust the volume level.
<b>Key beep</b>	Select the type of key beep.
<b>Message beep</b>	Select a melody for a new incoming message.
<b>Power on beep</b>	Select a Power on melody for your phone.
<b>Power off beep</b>	Select a Power off melody for your phone.

### 13.2 Meeting

When this is selected the phone will not ring or beep unless an alarm has been set. A new event will cause it to vibrate.

### 13.3 Outdoor

It is a profile designed for outdoor users who require louder ringtones.

### 13.4 Indoor

Ringtone/beep volume will be slightly lower than General mode volume.

### 13.5 Silence

This profile will turn off all ringtones, including notification sounds.

### 13.6 Flight mode

Voice calls, Bluetooth, message and Wi-Fi functions are barred. It can be used to increase standby duration.

You will have access to all audio and visual files stored in phone or SD card in File manager.

Two icons behind will indicate the saving locations of each file:

### 14.1 My audios

Choose an audio file for an incoming call ringtone, a message alert beep, power on/off ringtone, contact ID tone, etc.

The "My audios" album contains the following folders <sup>(1)</sup>:

- Music: full track music.
- Melodies: melodies that can be set as ringtone.
- Recorded: all recorded sounds.
- General: contains all audio files stored in phone or SD card.

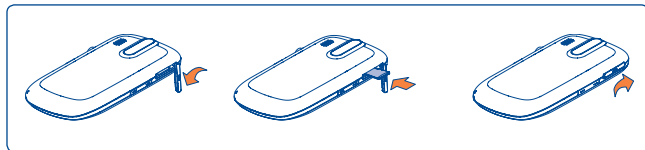
## 14.8 SD card

You can access all files stored in the SD card here.



When a SD card is inserted for the first time, it will be scanned and default folders will be created.

### Inserting the SD card:



- Unclip the cover and insert the MicroSD card into the slot.
- Unclip the cover and gently push the SD card until unlocked. Take out your MicroSD card and clip the cover closed.

- Select it to use hands-free communication. Only one Bluetooth audio device (your Bluetooth headset or your Bluetooth car kit) can be connected during the communication.

## Pair and register your Bluetooth device

Activate the Bluetooth feature by selecting the **"Bluetooth\Activation\On"** option. Then enter the **"Device list\Search"** menu to search for connectable Bluetooth devices. 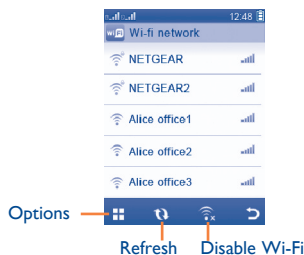

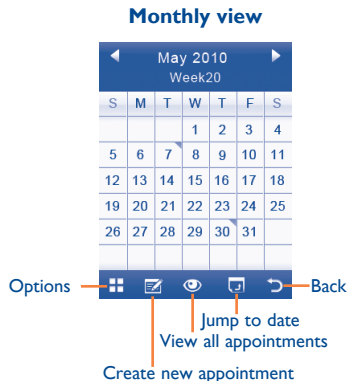

## 17.5 Clock .....

### 17.5.1 Alarm

Your phone's software will now have the latest software.

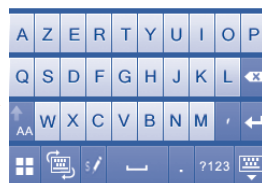

## 23 Troubleshooting.....

Before contacting the aftersales department, you are advised to follow the instructions below:

- You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimise its performance.
- You are advised to fully charge  the battery for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data in your telephone as this may affect the performance of your telephone.

and carry out the following checks:

### **My mobile phone will not switch on**

- Press  until the screen comes on
- Check the battery charge level
- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your telephone back on

### **My phone has not responded for several minutes**

- Press the  key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then switch the phone back on

### **My screen is difficult to read**

- Clean your screen
- Use your mobile phone in accordance with the recommended conditions of use

### **My mobile phone turns off by itself**

- Check that your keypad is locked when you are not using your mobile phone
- Check the battery charge level

### **My mobile phone will not charge properly**

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; If the battery is flat, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charger indicator on the screen
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C - +40°C)
- Make sure your battery is inserted. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger



- Make sure you are using an Alcatel battery and charger in the box
- When abroad, check that the electrical current is compatible

#### **My mobile phone will not connect to a network**

- Try connecting in another location
- Verify the network coverage with your operator
- Check with your operator that your SIM card is valid
- Try selecting the available network(s) manually (see page 85)
- Try connecting at a later time if the network is overloaded


#### **SIM card error**

- Make sure the SIM card has been correctly inserted (see page 13)
- Verify with your operator that your SIM card is 3V or 1.8V compatible; the old 5V SIM cards cannot be used

#### **Touch screen does not respond**

- Make sure your phone is not locked.

#### **Unable to make outgoing calls**

- Make sure you have dialled a valid number and press the  key
- For international calls, check the country and area codes
- Make sure your mobile phone is connected to a network, and that the network is not overloaded or unavailable
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not barred outgoing calls (see page 46)

#### **Unable to receive incoming calls**

- Make sure your mobile phone is switched on and connected to a network (check for overloaded or unavailable network)
- Check your subscription status with your operator (credit, SIM card valid, etc.)
- Make sure you have not forwarded incoming calls (see page 46)
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls

#### **The caller's name does not appear when a call is received**

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your operator
- Your caller has concealed his/her number

#### **The sound quality of the calls is not optimal**

- You can adjust the volume during a call by means of the Volume key
- Check the network strength 

#### **I am unable to use the features described in the manual**

- Check with your operator to make sure that your subscription includes this service
- Make sure this feature does not require an Alcatel accessory

#### **When I select a number from my contacts, the number is not dialled**

- Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file
- Make sure that you have selected the country prefix when calling a foreign country

#### **I am unable to add a contact in my contacts**

- Make sure that your SIM card contacts is not full; delete some contacts or save the contacts in the phone contacts (i.e. your professional or personal directories)

#### **My callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail**

- Contact your network operator to check service availability

#### **I cannot access my voicemail**

- Make sure your operator's voicemail number is correctly entered in "My numbers"
- Try later if the network is busy

#### **I am unable to send and receive MMS**

- Check your phone memory available as it might be full
- Contact your network operator to check service availability and check MMS parameters (see page 34)
- Verify the server centre number or your MMS profile with your operator
- The server centre may be swamped; try again later

#### **The flickering icon is displayed on my standby screen**

- You have saved too many short messages on your SIM card; delete some of them or archive them in the phone memory

#### **"No service" is displayed**

- You are outside of the network coverage area

### **I have already entered 3 incorrect PIN codes**

- Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key)

### **I am unable to connect my telephone to my computer**

- Install first of all Alcatel's PC suite
- Use "Install the connection" and perform the installation
- Check that your computer meets the requirements for Alcatel's PC Suite installation

### **I am unable to download new files**

- Check for free space
- Delete some files
- Select the MicroSD Card to store the files you downloaded
- Check your subscription status with your operator

### **The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth**

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your mobile phone is visible to other users (see page 73)

### **My mobile phone is frozen, can't power on**

- Make sure your battery is not completely used up or damaged
- Remove your battery, remove your SIM card then reinstall them to power on again, if still does not work
- Hold down Volume key (up) and press Power on/off key for a while to reset the phone



ALL User phone data: contacts, photos, messages and files, downloaded applications like Java games will be lost permanently.

### **How to make your battery last longer**

- Make sure you followed the complete charge time (minimum 3 hours)
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication
- Switch on the backlight upon request.
- Extend email auto-check interval as long as possible.
- Update news, weather information. upon demand manually or set its auto-check interval longer.
- Exit Java background-running applications if they are not being used for a long time.
- Deactivate Bluetooth when not in use.

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
