

# IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using an electrical appliance, basic precautions should always be followed, including the following:

# READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE USING THIS APPLIANCE

# $\label{eq:WARNING} \textbf{WARNING} - \textbf{To reduce the risk of fire or injury:}$

- 1. Do not leave appliance when battery fitted. Remove battery from appliance when not in use and before servicing.
- 2. Do not expose to rain. Store indoors.
- 3. Do not allow to be used as a toy. Close attention is necessary when used by or near children.
- 4. Use only as described in this manual. Use only manufacturer's recommended attachments.
- 5. Do not use with damaged battery. If appliance is not working as it should, has been dropped, damaged, left outdoors, or dropped into water, return it to a service center.
- 6. Do not put any object into openings. Do not use with any opening blocked; keep free of dust, lint, hair, and anything that may reduce air flow.
- 7. Keep hair, loose clothing, fingers, and all parts of body away from openings and moving parts.
- 8. Use extra care when cleaning on stairs.
- 9. Do not use to pick up flammable or combustible liquids such as gasoline or use in areas where they may be present.
- 10. Use only the charger supplied by the manufacturer to recharge.
- 11. Do not pick up anything that is burning or smoking, such as cigarettes, matches, or hot ashes.
- 12. Do not use without dust bag in place when collecting dust.
- 13. AVOID UNINTENTIONAL STARTING. Don't carry battery fitted tool with finger on switch. Be sure switch is OFF when insert the battery.
- 14. Do not use on wet surfaces.

### **ADDITIONAL SAFETY RULES**

- 1. Read this instruction manual and the charger instruction manual carefully before use.
- 2. Be aware that this tool is always in an operating condition, because it does not have to be plugged into an electrical outlet.
- 3. Always use protective goggles, a cap and mask when using the blower.
- 4. Never point the nozzle at anyone in the vicinity when using the blower.
- 5. Always use the dust bag when collecting dust, chips and the like.
- 6. Do not collect still smoldering cigarette ashes freshly cut metals shavings, screws, nails and the like.
- 7. Never block suction inlet and/or blower outlet. Increased motor revolution may cause dangerous fan breakage.


## SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS.

This appliance is intended for household use.

#### FUNCTIONAL DESCRIPTION

#### Installing or removing battery cartridge

- Always switch off the tool before insertion or removal of the battery cartridge.
- •To remove the battery cartridge, withdraw it from the tool while pressing the buttons on both sides of the cartridge.
- To insert the battery cartridge, align the tongue on the battery cartridge with the groove in the housing and slip it into place. Always insert it all the way until it locks in place with a little click. If not, it may accidentally fall out of the tool, causing injury to you or someone around you.



• Do not use force when inserting the battery cartridge. If the cartridge does not slide in easily, it is not being inserted correctly.

## CAUTION:

Please refer to the charger's instruction manual before charging the battery. Charge the battery cartridge with your Makita charger properly before use. Following batteries can be used for this blower.






#### Blowing

For dust blowing, attach the nozzle to the blower outlet, turning clockwise to lock it in place.

For dust suction, fit the nozzle onto the suction inlet and the dust bag onto the blower









#### CAUTION:

Empty the dust bag before it becomes too full, or the suction force weakens.

#### Installing set plate For UB121D

Always install the set plate when using battery cartridges 1200, 1202 or 1202A. Install the set plate on the tool with the screw provided.





#### Switch action

CAUTION:

Before inserting the battery cartridge into the tool, always check to see that the switch trigger actuates properly and returns to the "OFF" position when released.

To start the tool, simply pull the trigger. Tool speed is increased by increasing pressure on the trigger. Release the trigger to stop.


#### MAINTENANCE

#### CAUTION:

Always be sure that the tool is switched off and the battery cartridge is removed before attempting to perform inspection or maintenance.

#### Cleaning

From time to time, wipe off the outside of the tool using a cloth dampened in soapy water. Never use gasoline, thinner or the like, or discoloration and/or cracks can take place.



To maintain product SAFETY and RELIABIL-

ITY, repairs, maintenance or adjustment should be performed by Makita Authorized or Factory Service Centers, always using Makita replacement parts.

## **Recycling the Battery**

The <u>only</u> way to dispose of a Makita battery is to recycle it. The law prohibits any other method of disposal.



To recycle the battery:

- 1. Remove the battery from the tool.
- 2. a). Take the battery to your nearest Makita Factory Service Center or
  - b). Take the battery to your nearest Makita Authorized Service Center or Distributor that has been designated as a Makita battery recycling location.

• Call your nearest Makita Service Center or Distributor to determine the location that provides Makita battery recycling. See your local Yellow Pages under ''Tools-Electric''.




