About NAVFone



NAVFone is a digitized street directory that allows you to view maps on Symbian phones and much more.

The main user interface for **NAVFone** is the map view window. All the features can be accessed via the menu. The application provides zooming and panning capabilities to facilitate map navigation.

For easy and fast access to specific positions of interest, waypoints, with friendly names and textual descriptions, can be created and marked on the map. The icon type and priority of each waypoint can also be customized to enable easy identification on the map.

The software also allows users to perform various types of search in the database to suit different needs. Matching results can then be selected and viewed in detail.

Asia GIS' GPRX™ technology with GPS-like feature, allows you to determine your location in an instance. This feature also allows you to find the location of your friends. Connect it to a Bluetooth GPS device and turn your mobile phone into a Navigation device!

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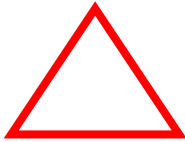

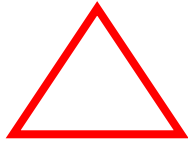

The **serial number** provided with the NAVFone is for installation on a **single mobile phone only**. Please keep it at a safe location. **agis** will not be liable for misplace or misuse of the **serial number**.

When NAVFone program is lost due to **loss, damage or repair of mobile phone**, **agis** will not be liable for a replacement. However, with supporting documents such as a police report or a repair invoice, replacement can be obtained on a case to case basis. **Administrative charges may apply.**

1.0 Getting Started

The NAVFone is an advanced and intelligent information system that harnesses the cutting edge technology of GPRX (cell-based location engine) and Geographical Information System (GIS) to provide detailed street level map information and LBS (Location Based Services). When connected to a GPS receiver via Bluetooth, NAVFone is able to provide street level turn-by-turn voice-guided navigation.

NAVFone is developed for Symbian Platform.

1.1 System requirements

Before you begin with the installation, make sure that the following requirements are met:

A mobile phone:

- Using Symbian OS Nokia Series 60 Version 2, Version 3.
- Free memory space of 50 MB
- Connector cable, IrDA, Bluetooth or other forms of communication with the PC

Please contact us to have an updated list of compatible mobile phones.

Desktop or laptop:

- PC running Microsoft Windows
- Connector cable port, IrDA, Bluetooth or other forms of communication port with your mobile phone
- Your mobile phone PC suite (See your mobile phone's user manual for installation procedures.)(Optional)

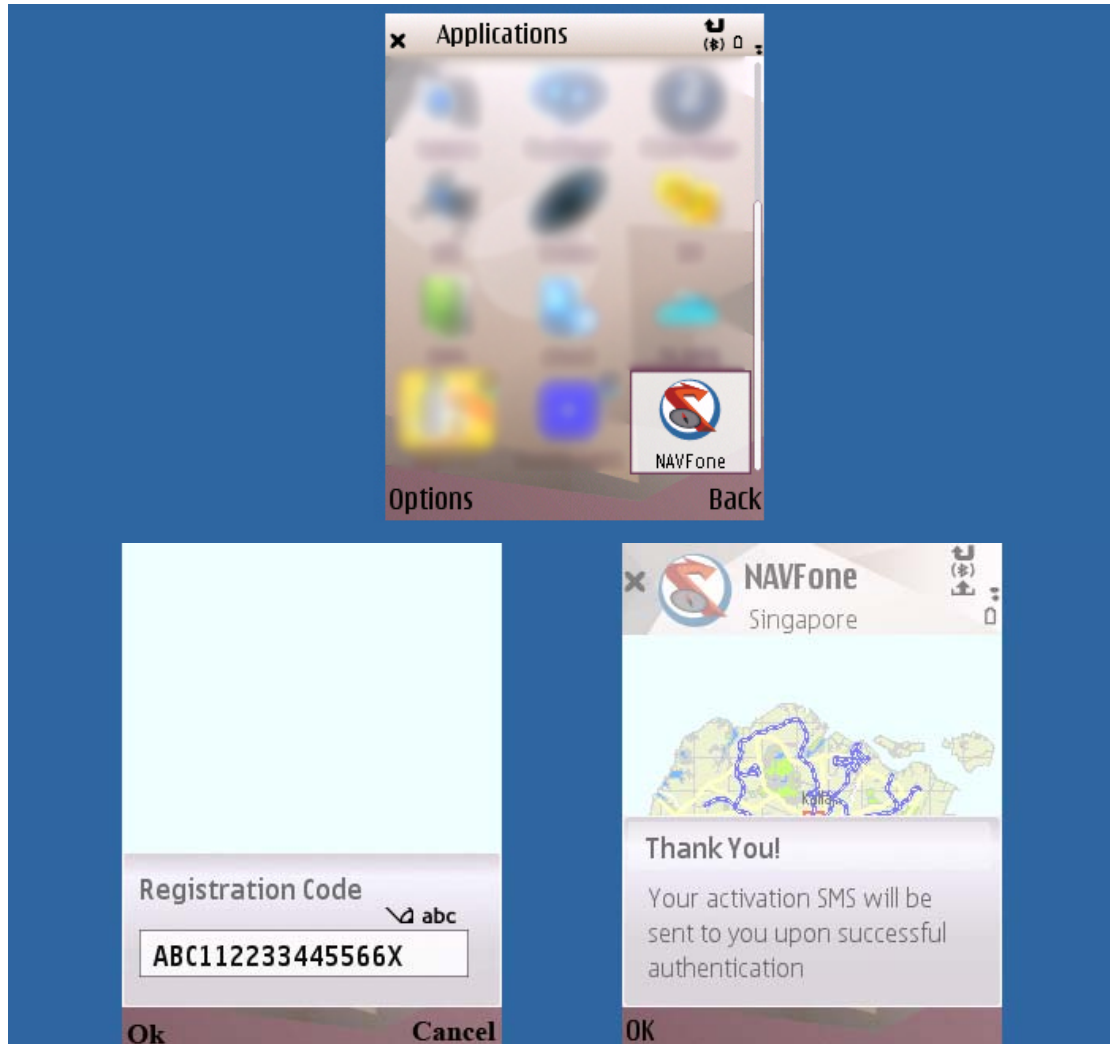
Note: If any of the above requirements is not met, you will not be able to complete the installation.

2.0 Using NAVFone

2.1 Launching NAVFone



After you have successfully completed the installation, you will see the **NAVFone** icon in the application launcher screen.

To launch the application

1. Go into Menu
2. Move the cursor to the Installations folder and Open.
3. Move the cursor to the NAVFone Icon
4. Press **Options** and select **Open**. (Skip procedure 5-12 after you activated the software)
5. Enter License number and then press Ok. This can be obtained from the NAVFone scratch card provided. (Take note it is case sensitive)
6. Once activation SMS is received, start NAVFone again.



7. Scroll down and read the Disclaimer
8. After reading the Disclaimer, click OK
9. Scroll down and read the Agreement
10. After reading the Agreement, click OK
11. Select default map.
12. NAVFone is ready to be used once the map is loaded.

2.2 The Map View



The Map View window shows the main screen.

All maps shown are always orientated to the North. The cursor can be used to call up the Map menu or select an object by moving the cursor button over the object and clicking on it. The name of the item selected is shown at the top of the map. The scale on the bottom left changes according to the zoom level and provides a rough estimate of distances between places and objects.

Just as the phone cursor is used to move the red map cursor, the numeric * and # of the keypad is used to zoom in and out of the map.

2.3 Accessing the Menus

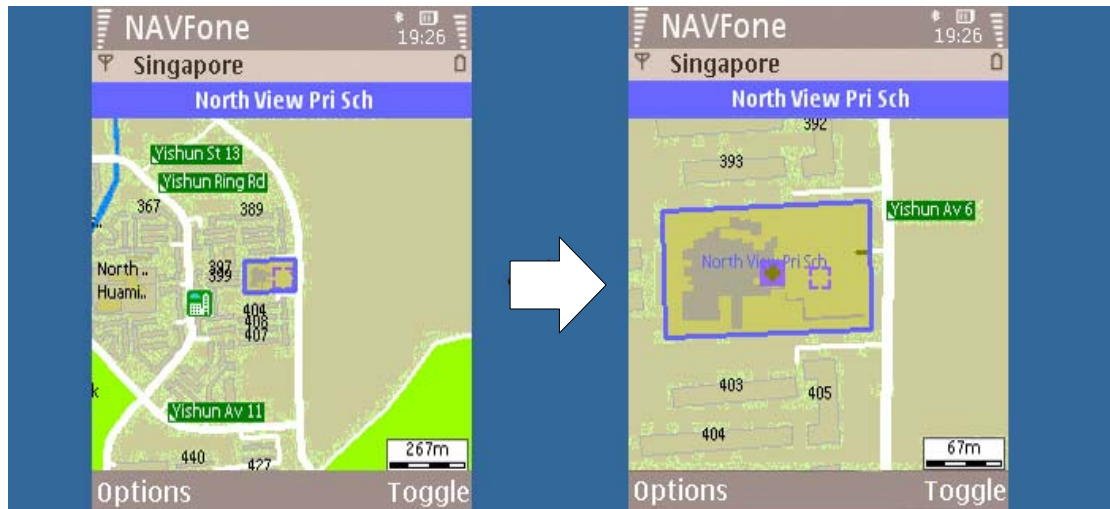
There are two menus in the Map view window.

Note: The two menus stated above are available only in the Map view window. The list of commands available varies with different windows.

3.0 Basic Map Function

3.1 Zoom In



Method 1: Pressing key * on the keypad of the mobile device to zooms in onto the cursor position.

Method 2: Press Options > Zoom > Zoom In

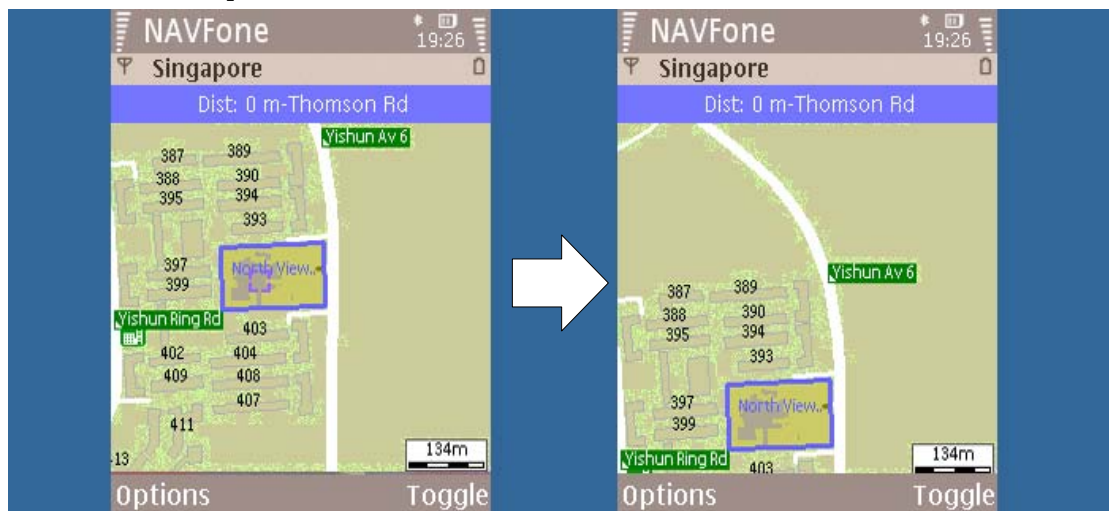
3.2 Zoom Out



Method 1: Pressing key # on the keypad of the mobile device to zooms out of map.

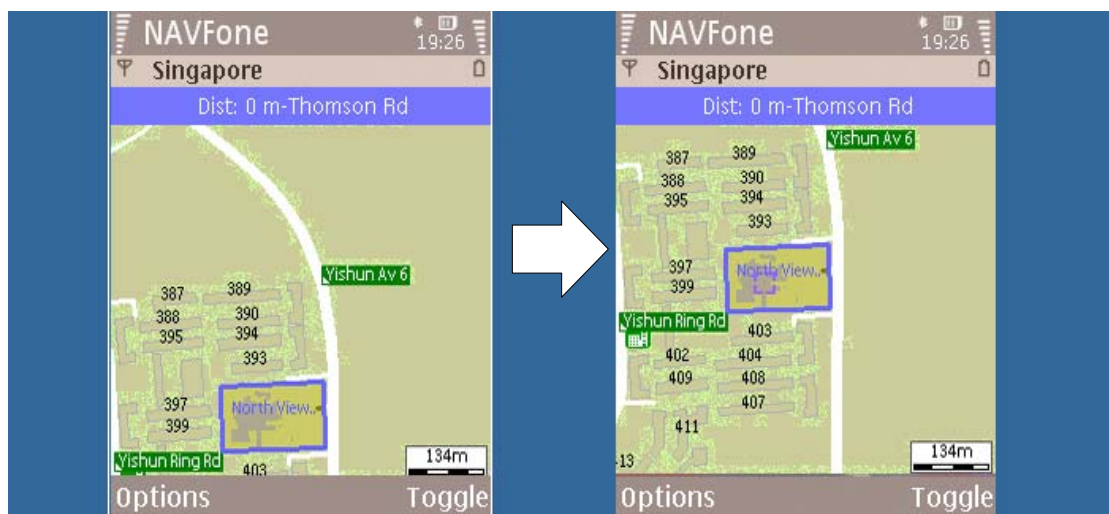
Method 2: Press Options > Zoom > Zoom Out

3.3 Pan Up



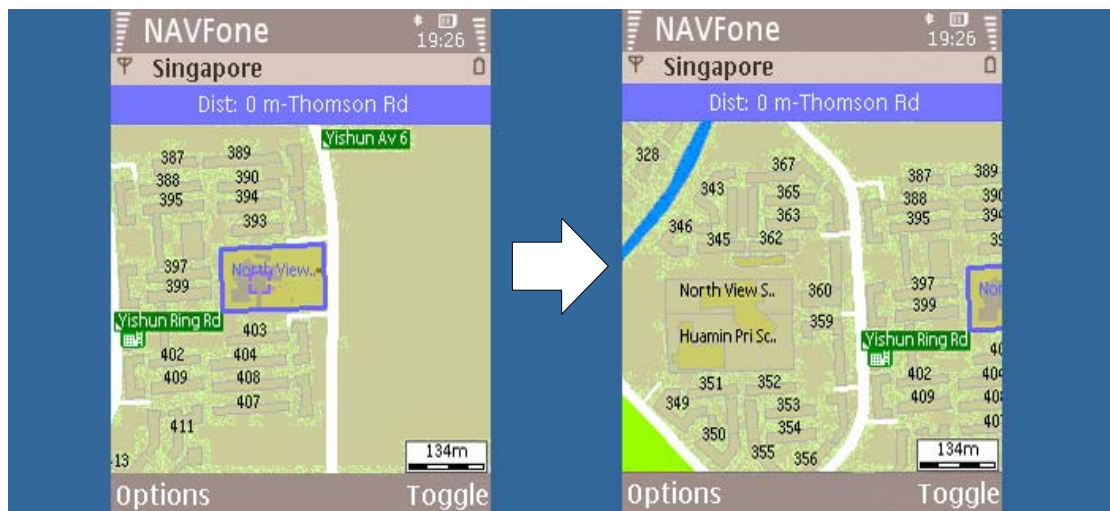
Moving the cursor upwards will display more map details to the top of the current view.

3.4 Pan Down



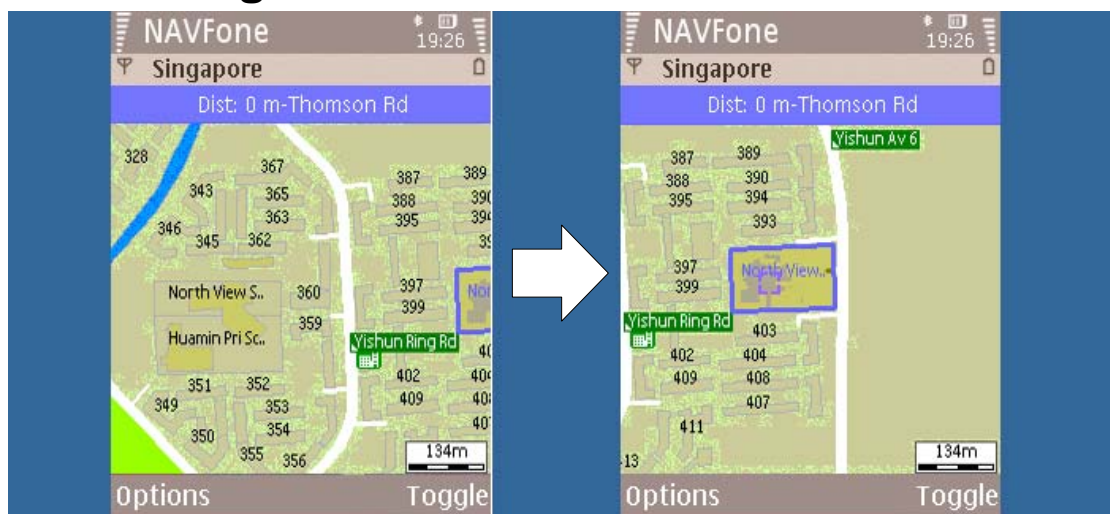
Moving the cursor downwards will display more map details to the bottom of the current view.

3.5 Pan Left



Moving the cursor to the left will display more map details to the left of the current view.

3.6 Pan Right



Moving the cursor to the right will display more map details to the right of the current view.

3.7 Home View



The Home View returns the user to the overview of the selected country.

To Set the current map as your default

1. Click on Options and Scroll to the Map Option.
1. Navigate one step to the right
2. Select the option Home View

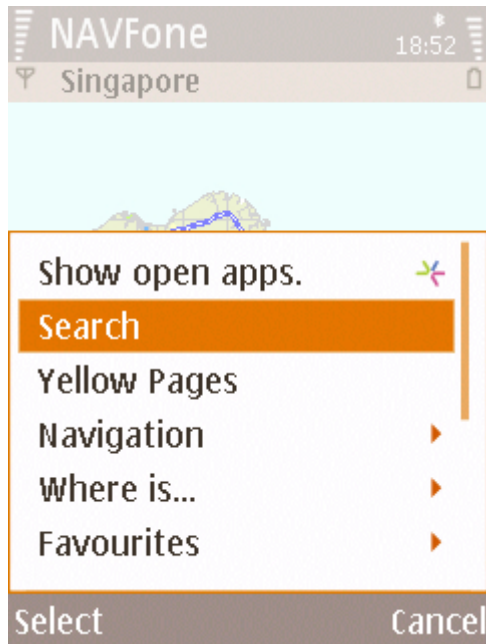
3.8 Cursor Movement

Use the directional button to move the cursor in the Map view window.

Push down the directional button to highlight and show the name of the location the cursor is at.

4.0 Search

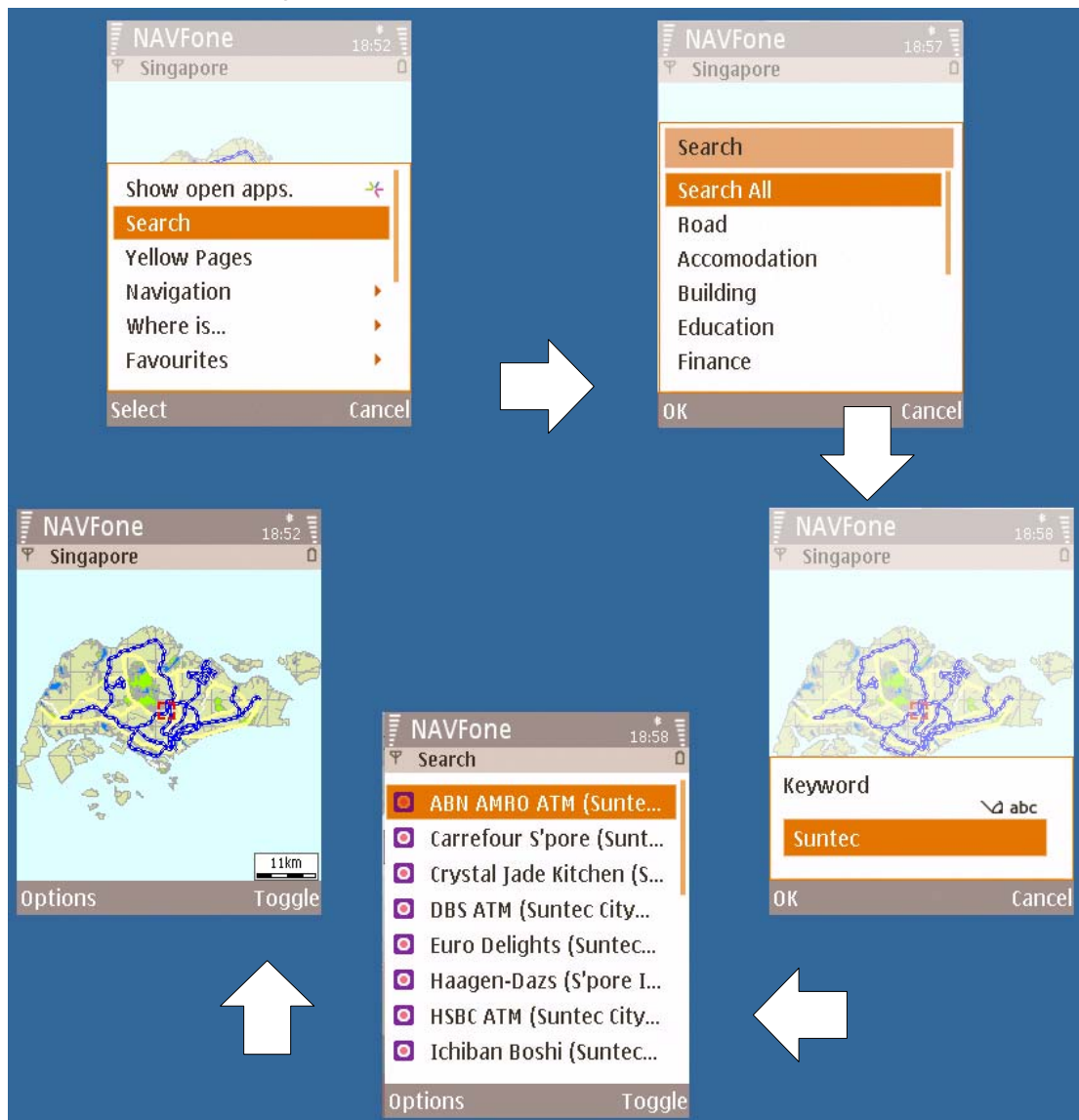
There are 2 types of search available in this application.



The first type search command performs a search for locations or map features in the map, based on a keyword or phrase and list them in alphabetical order. Search can be conducted for all layers or a single layer.

The other search command conducts a search for locations or map features in the vicinity of the current cursor position on the map. No keyword is required for this search, and results are listed with respect to the distance from the cursor. Search can be conducted for all layers or a single layer.

4.1 Search Keyword



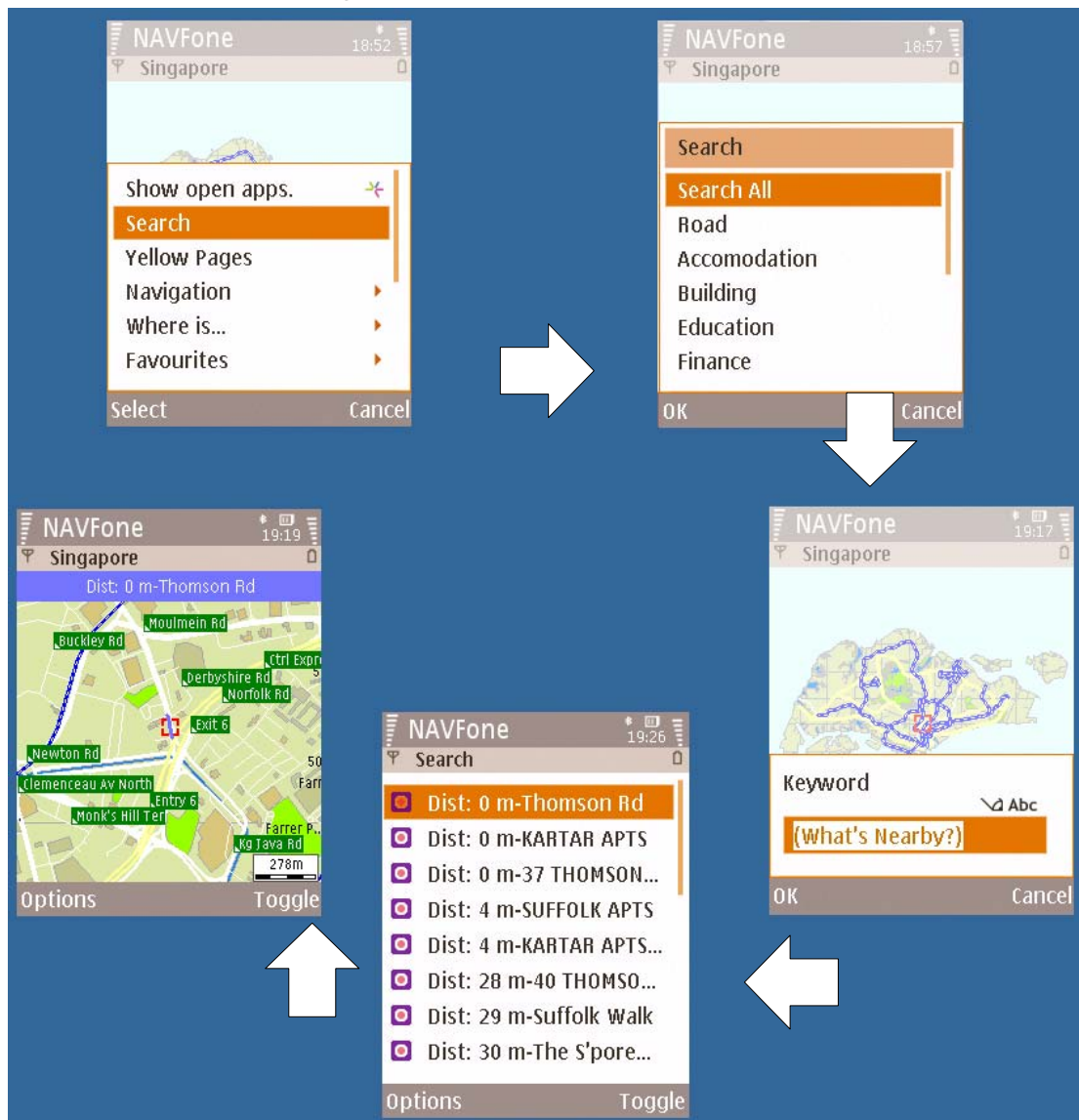
This command allows the user to perform a search in the map by layers and using a keyword or phrase.

To perform a 'Search' search

1. Press **Option** and select **Search**.
2. Using the up or down navigation key, move the cursor to select a layer* (e.g **BUILDING**, **FOOD**, etc) or **Search all** to search all layers.
3. Press **Ok** to confirm selection. Alternatively, press the center of navigation key.
4. Input keyword(s) using the keypad.
5. Press **Ok** to confirm selection. Alternatively, press the center of navigation key.
6. Maximum number of results is limited to 200.

* All map features in the map are classified into many groups called layers. Select all map features (Search all) or one that you are interested to continue your search.

4.2 What's Nearby?



This command conducts a search for locations or map features in the map with respect to a reference point. This reference point is the cursor position on the map in the Map view window. The result is listed out according to their distance away from the reference point. No keyword is required for this search command.

To perform a 'What's Nearby' search

1. Press **Option** and select **Search**.
2. Using the up or down navigation key, move the cursor to select a **layer** * (e.g. **BUILDING**, **FOOD**, etc) or do **Search all** to search all layers.
3. Keyword dialog box will appear with the default "(What's Nearby?)" wording.
4. Press **Ok**. Alternatively, press the center of navigation key.
5. The search result window will open.

* All map features in the map are classified into many groups called layers. Select all map features (Search all) or one that you are interested to continue your search.

4.3 Search Result



Both search result window are similar. A list of search results is formed. If 'What's Nearby?' search is used, the result will be listed according to their distance away from the cursor. If no result is found, it will automatically return the Map view window.

To view location on the map

1. Using the phone cursor buttons, scroll to the wanted object then press the center of navigation key.

To do a new search

1. Press **Option** and select **Clear Search**. Then repeat the search function shown on section 4.1 and 4.2.

To create a new WP at the object

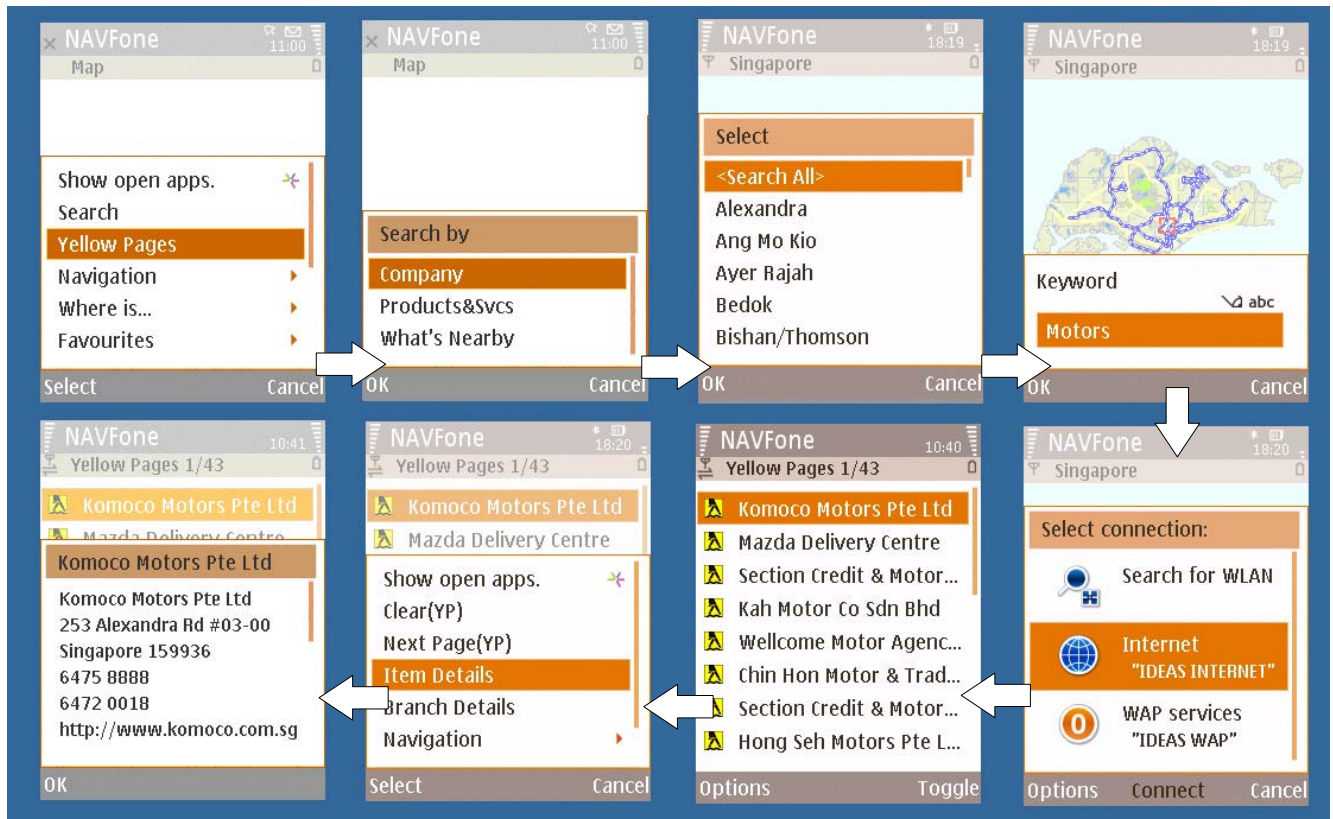
1. Press **Menu** and select **Clear Search** then press **Menu, Favourites, New**. After which, type in a name you will want to call the place and click OK. A waypoint will subsequently be created at the object's location.

You can also create your WP using the main menu and in WP viewer window.

5.0 Yellow Pages

Yellow Pages is now available in NAVFone. This feature allows you to search within Yellow Pages extensive database.

5.1 Search Keyword (Yellow Pages)

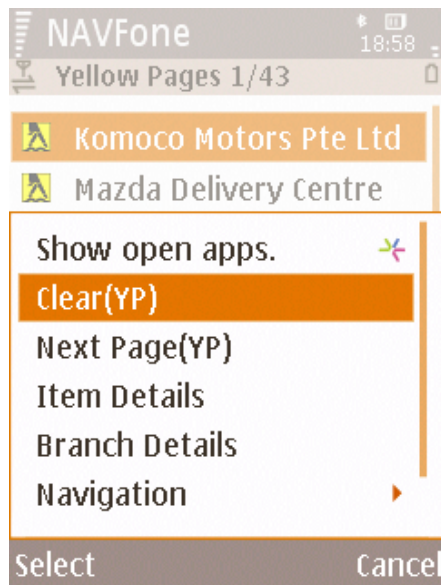


This command allows the user to perform a Yellow Pages search by categories and using a keyword or phrase.

To perform a 'Search' search

1. Press **Option** and select **Yellow Pages**.
2. Using the up or down navigation key, move the cursor to select a search category* (Company, Product & Services, What's Nearby).
3. Select a location or use Search All for full coverage.
4. Input keyword(s) using the keypad.
5. Select the internet access point. The search query is done online. Note that if GPRS is used, normal data charges will apply.
6. Select a search result.
7. Press **Option** and select **Item Details**.

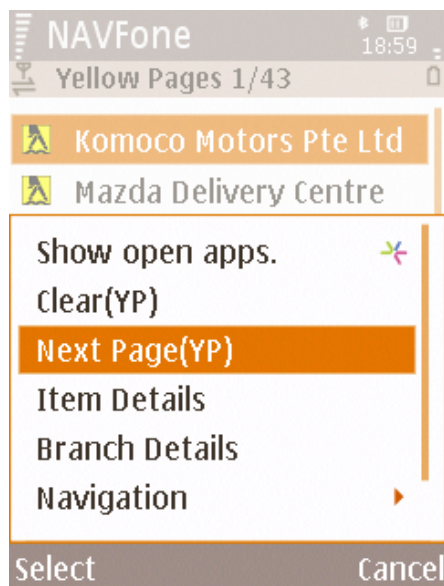
5.1.1 Clear Search (Yellow Pages)



To clear the current results

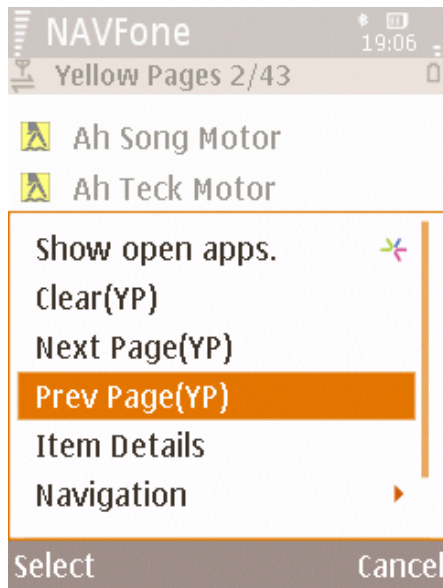
- Press **Options** and select **Clear (YP)**.

5.1.2 Next/Previous Page (Yellow Pages)



To view next set of results

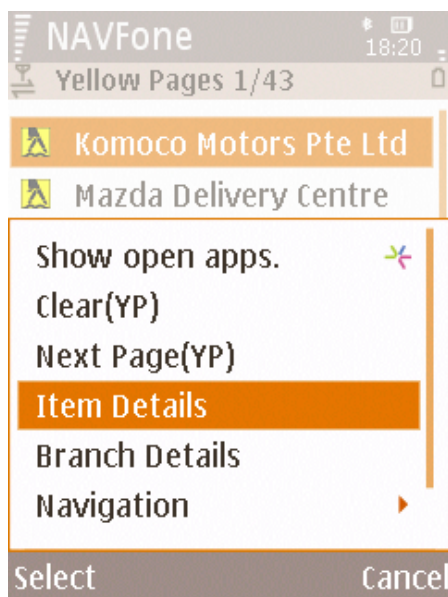
- Press **Options** and select **Next Page (YP)**.

- Press **Options** and select **Prev Page (YP)**.

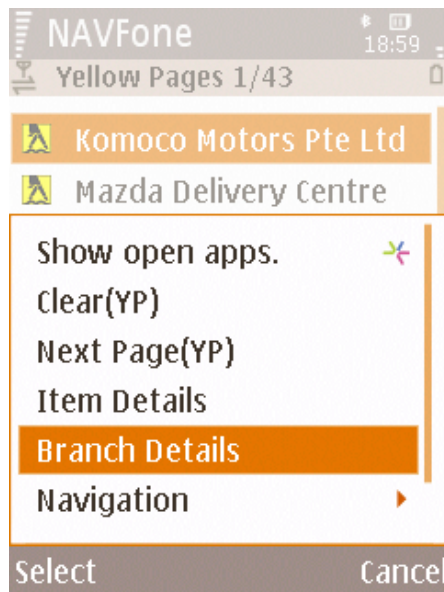
5.1.3 Item Details

- Press **Options** and select **Item Detail**.

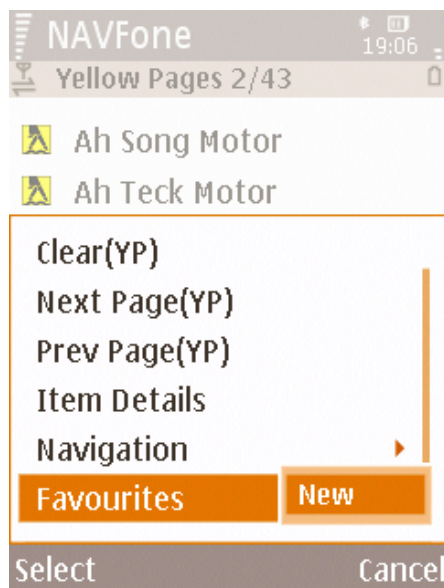
5.1.4 Branch Details (Yellow Pages)

- Press **Options** and select **Branch Detail**.

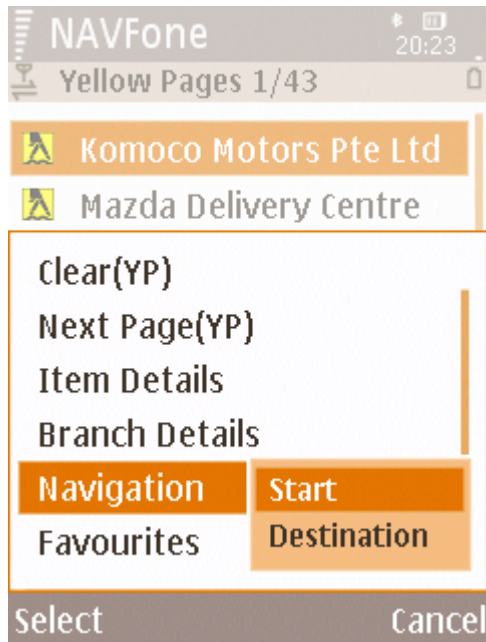
5.1.5 Favourites (Yellow Pages)



To add select search results to favourites

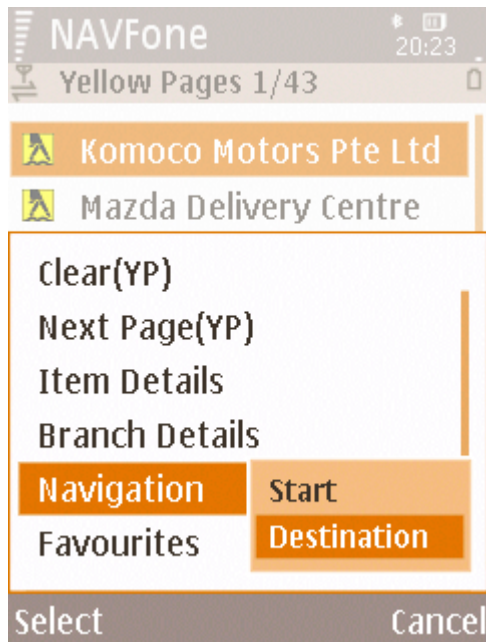
- Press **Options** and select **Favourites** and then **New**.

5.1.6 Navigation (Yellow Pages)



To set selected result as navigation start point

- Press **Options** and select **Navigation** and then **Start**.



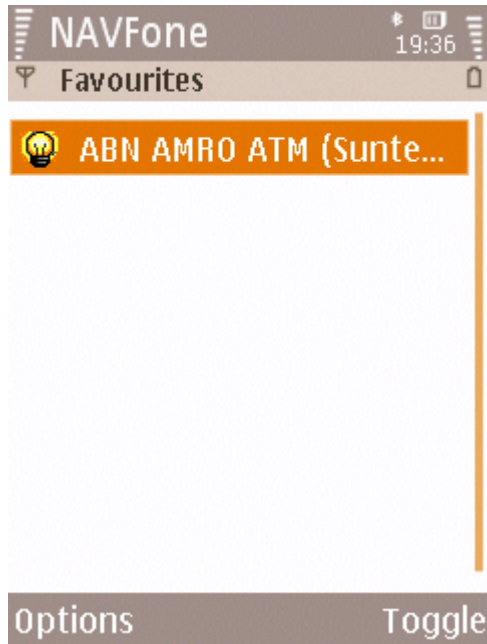
To set selected result as navigation destination

- Press **Options** and select **Navigation** and then **Destination**.

6.0 Favourites Management

Favourites (also known as waypoints) are points that can be created and displayed in the map as an icon with a label attached to it. All waypoint can be saved for later use and easy reference. Each waypoint's label, icon type and size can be set to differentiate one from another. A short note can also add to it.

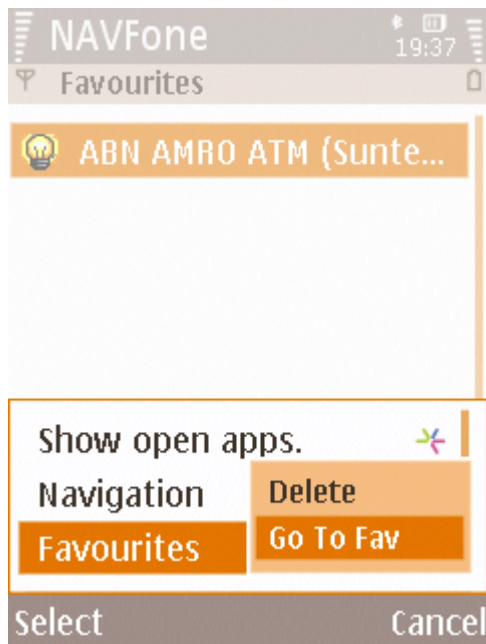
6.1 WP Viewer



This command allows the user to create new waypoints. Pressing the **Toggle** button allows you to enter the WP viewer window quickly.

The WP viewer lets you create, edit and view your waypoints.
Press **Options** to display and select actions available.
Press **Toggle** to return to Map view window.

6.1.1 Jump to WP

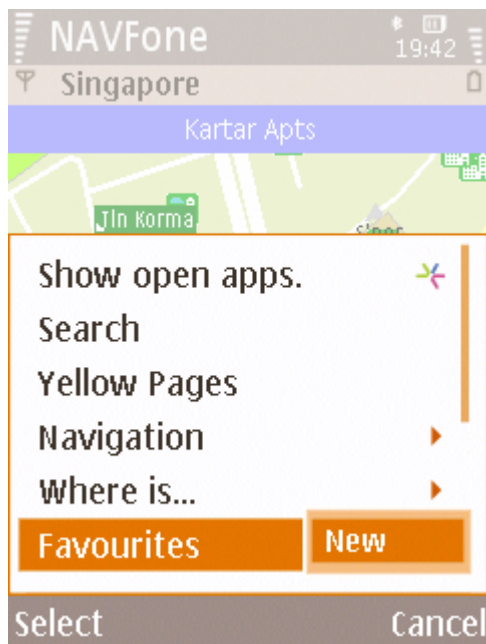


This option shows the user the location of the WP.

To show a WP in the map

1. Using the up or down navigation key, move the cursor to the WP you want to show in the map.
2. Press **Select**, **Favourites** and select **Go To Fav**.

6.1.2 Create a New WP



This option creates a WP at where the cursor is in the map and opens the WP settings window.

To create a new WP from Map view window

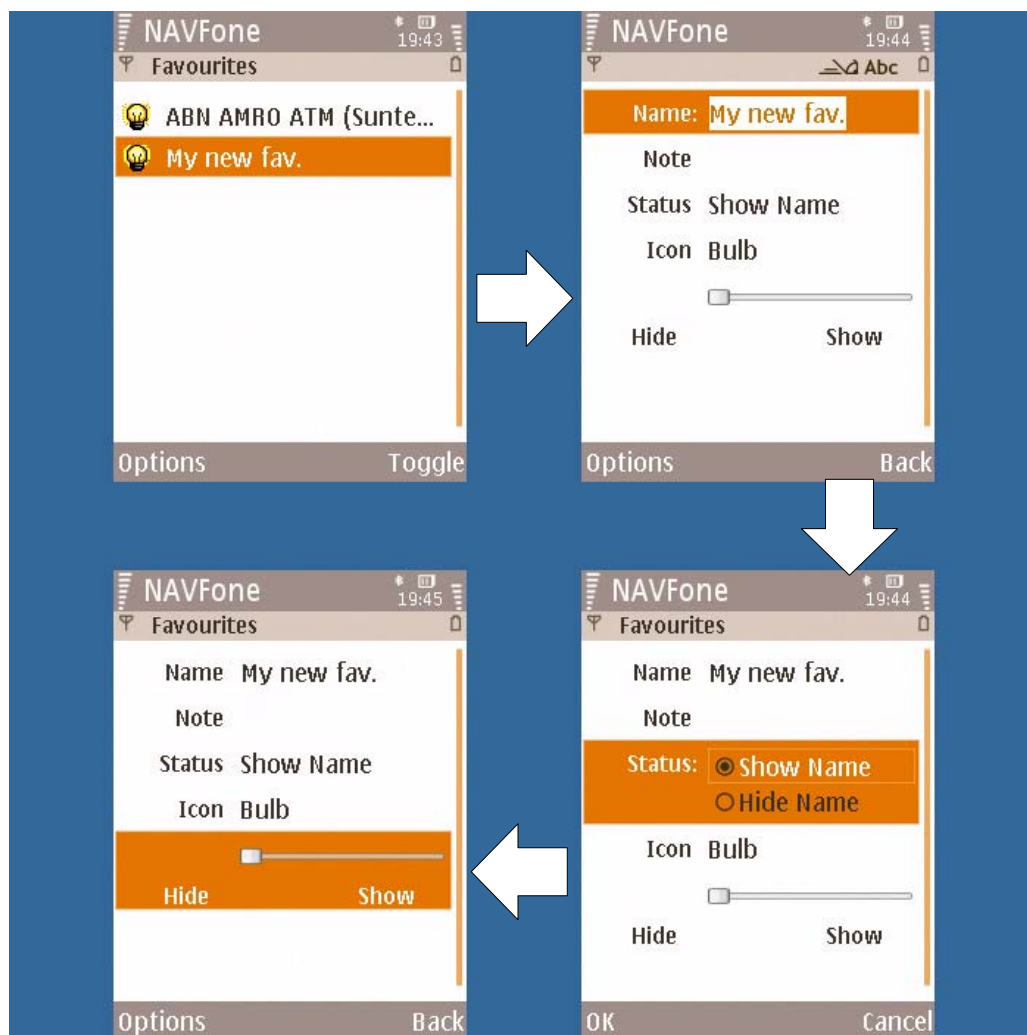
1. Press **Options, Favorites** and select **New**.
2. The WP settings window will open up.

To create a new WP from WP viewer window

3. Press **Options, Favourites** and select **New**.
4. The WP settings window will open up.

You can also create your WP in the Map view window and search result window.

6.1.3 View/Edit WP

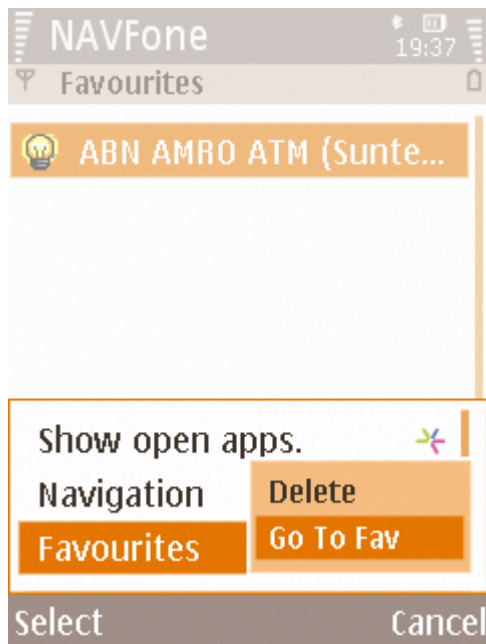


This option opens the WP settings window for user to view or edit existing WP.

To view or edit existing WP

1. Using the up or down navigation key, move the cursor to select the WP you want to view or edit.
2. Press the center of navigation key to enter the WP settings window.
3. The WP settings window will open up.

6.1.4 Delete WP



This option deletes an existing WP in the WP viewer.

To delete an existing WP

1. Move the cursor to select the WP you want to view or edit using the up or down navigation key.
2. Press **Options**, **Favourites** and select **Delete**.
3. The software will not double prompt if you wish to delete the selected WP so please delete with caution.

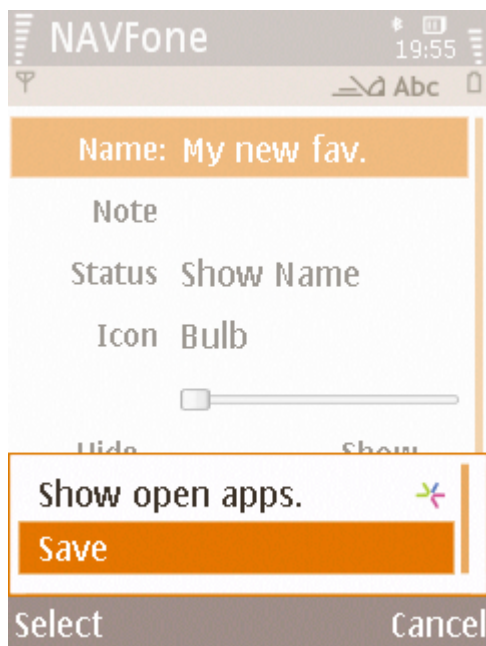
6.2 WP Settings

The WP settings window allows you to set your waypoint properties.

Press **Options** to display and select actions available.

Press **Cancel** to return to WP viewer window.

6.2.1 Save

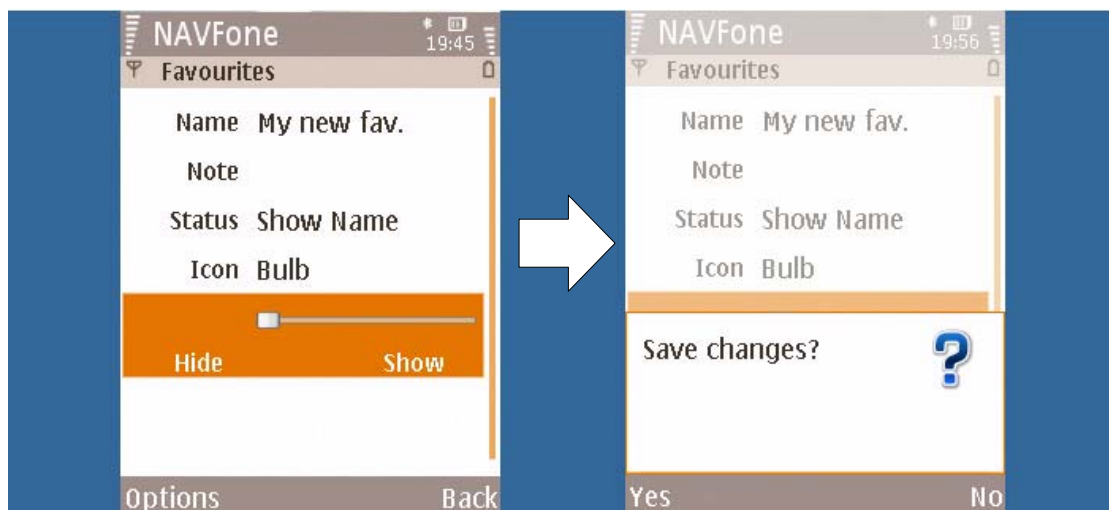


This option saves the settings of the current WP and returns to the WP viewer window. Newly created/edited WP must be saved for the changes to take effect.

To save the settings of the current WP

1. Press **Options** and select **Save**.

6.2.2 Cancel



This option returns to the WP viewer window without saving the settings of the current WP.

To return to the WP viewer window

1. Press **Back** and select **No** when prompt if you wish to "Save changes?".

6.3 List of WP properties

6.3.1 Name

User can label the WP for easy reference. The software will try to capture the street name, building etc if it is available, otherwise a default name, eg. WP#1, is given to a WP upon creation.

To change your WP name

1. Move the cursor to **Name** using the up or down navigation key.
2. Press the center of navigation key to select.
3. Start writing the WP name using the keypad.
4. Press the up / down of the navigation key to exit the field.

User can add additional notes about the WP.

To add or edit WP note

1. Move the cursor to **Note** using the up or down navigation key.
2. Press the center of navigation key to select.
3. Start writing or editing the WP note using the keypad.
4. Press the up / down of the navigation key to exit the field.

You can also view your WP note in the Map window.

6.3.3 Status

To allow the Name to show / stay hidden on the map

1. Move the cursor to **Status** using the up or down navigation key.
2. Press the center of navigation key to select.
3. Mover the cursor to show or hide the name field on the map.
4. Press the up / down of the navigation key to exit the field.

6.3.4 Icon



To change the WP icon type

1. Move the cursor to **Icon** using the up or down navigation key.
2. Press the center of navigation key to select.
3. Select the icon type using the left or right navigation key.
4. Press the up / down of the navigation key to exit the field.

6.3.5 Visibility



The Visibility denotes the visibility of the waypoints at different zoom scales. A newly created waypoint has its Icon Priority automatically pegged to the current zoom scale that it is created. It only becomes visible from that zoom onwards, and invisible when



zoomed out. User can override the Icon Priority defaults by adjusting the priority levels.

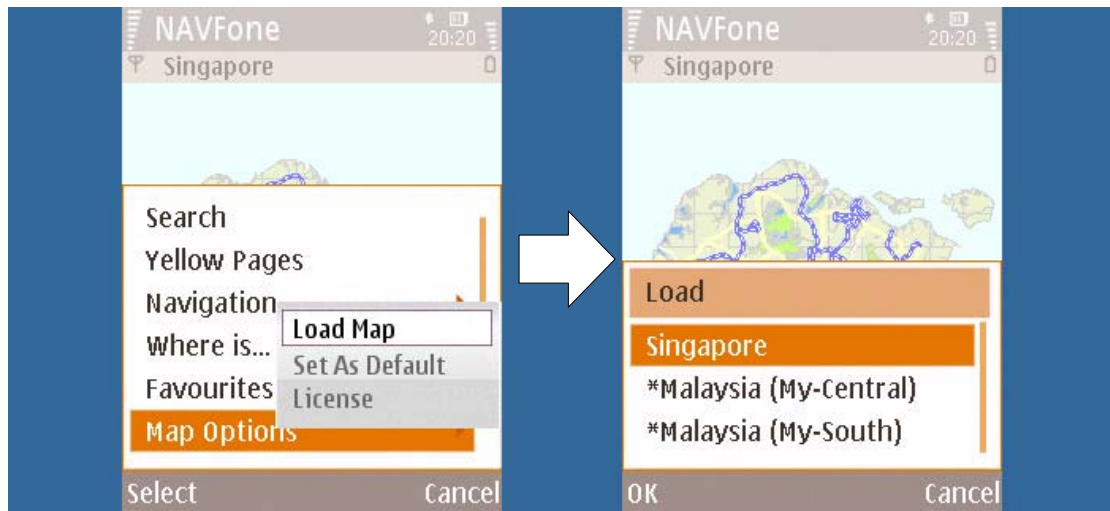
To change your icon priority

1. Move the cursor to **Visibility** using the up or down navigation key.
2. Press the center of navigation key to select.
3. Select the icon priority using the left or right navigation key.
4. Press the up / down of the navigation key to exit the field.

Note: Your settings MUST be saved them to take effect. To save settings, Press Options and select Save.

7.0 Map Options

7.1 Load Map

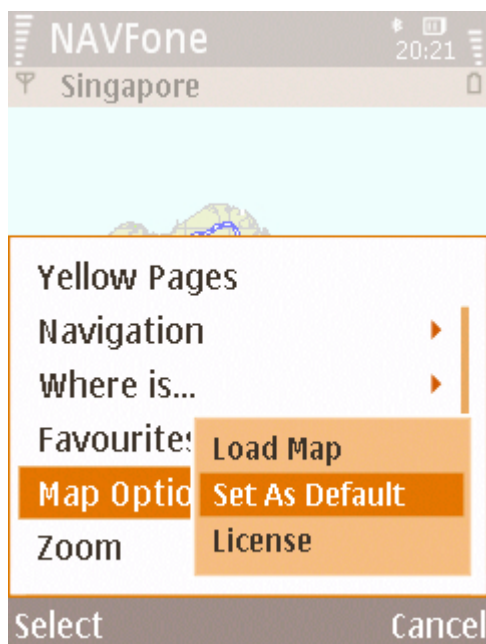


This function allows the user to load the various maps layers of different country that you may have purchased.

To Load Map

1. Click on Options and Scroll to the Map Option.
2. Navigate one step to the right
3. Select the option Load Map
4. Select the chosen map and click OK

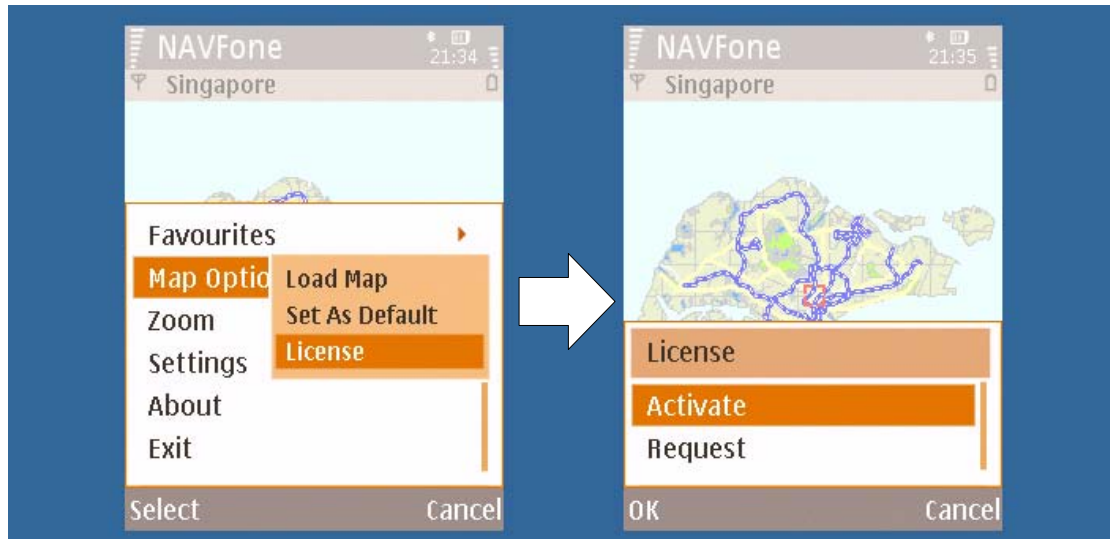
7.2 Set as Default



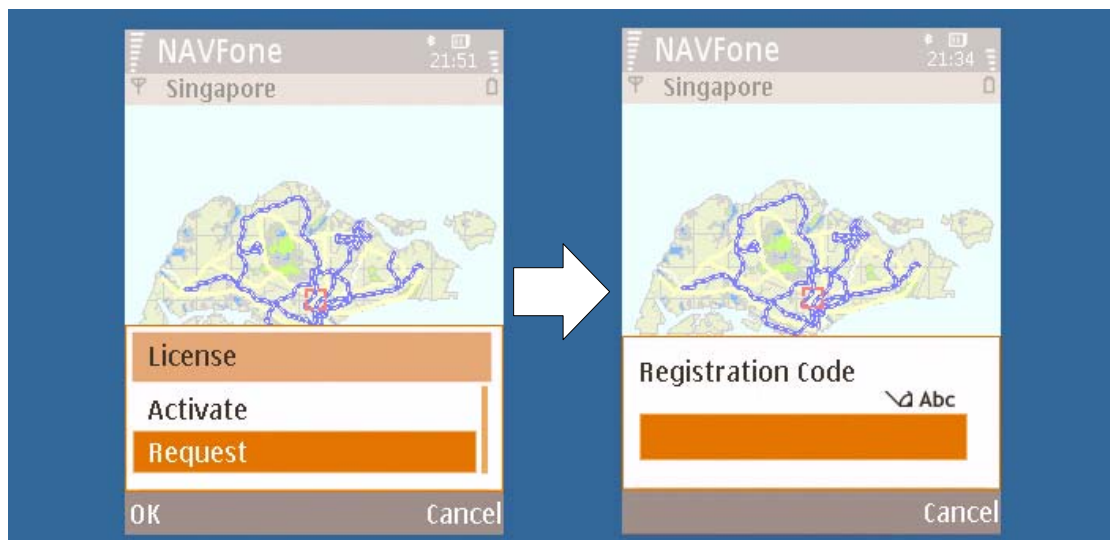
To Set the current map as your default

1. Click on Options and Scroll to the Map Option.
2. Navigate one step to the right
3. Select the option Set as Default

7.3 License



This option is for the activation of newly installed maps. Additional maps can be purchased from the Agis Online Store. A license number will be given when a map is purchased.



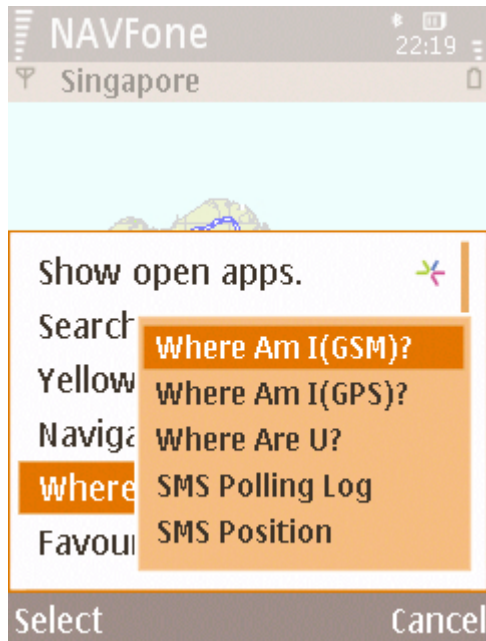
To activate purchased maps;
Go to Options -> Map Options -> Request. Key in the License number. This process is similar to initial NAVFone activation.

Once the activation SMS is received, select Activate. The new map is now functional.

8.0 Where is

The Where is function uses agis' Gprx™ GPS-like technology to find your location and also your friend's location.

8.1 Where Am I?

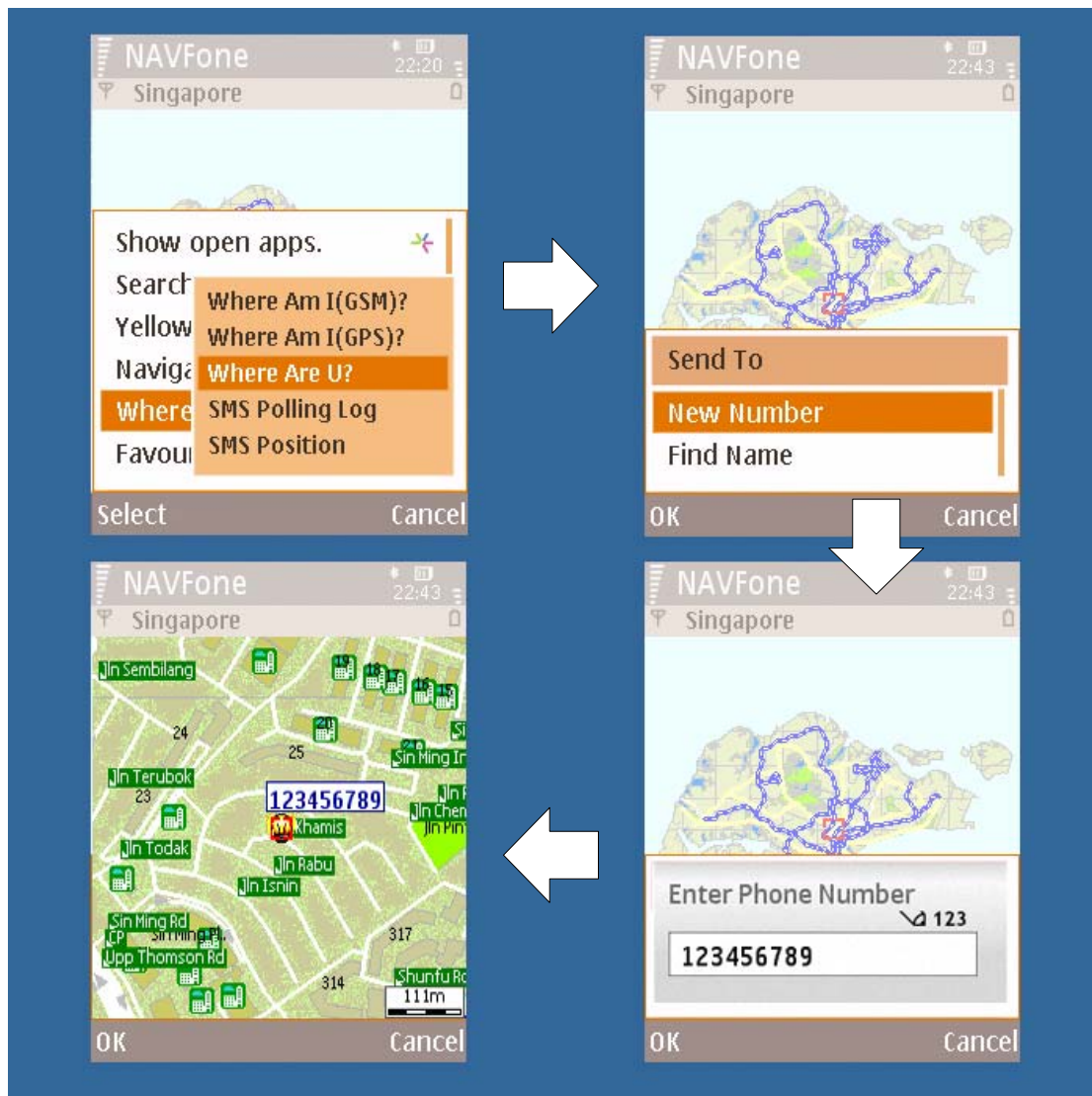


This command shows you the current location you are in.

To show your current location

1. Press **Option->Where is...->Where am I (GSM)?**
Your current location will be indicated with a green circle.
2. To show current GPS position, Press **Option->Where is...->Where am I (GPS)?**

8.2 Where Are U?



This command allows you to request the location of another user of NAVFone.

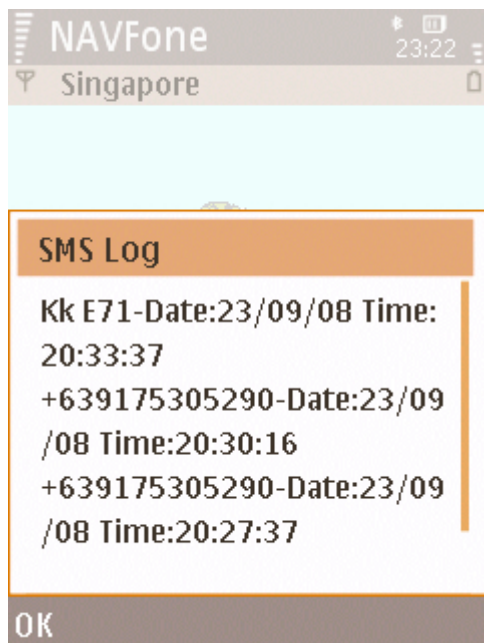
1. Press **Option->Where is...-> Where are U?**
2. Select either **New Number** or **Find Name**
3. Enter the recipient mobile number or name and press **OK**
4. Recipient's position will be shown on map.

8.3 Set Visible/Invisible



This command allows you to be or not to be located when a user of NAVFone try to request for your location.

8.4 SMS Polling Log



When the being-pollled user is set to invisible mode, this command shows the sms log of who has been requesting for the location of the polled user. The message indicates the poller's handset number and the date and time of this message.

To check the sms polling log

- Press **Options** and select **Settings**, then **SMS Polling Log**

8.5 SMS Position



This command sends the position of location, where the cursor is in map, to another phone via SMS. The message indicates the position of location and the date and time of this message sent.

To send position

1. Press **Menu** and select **SMS Position** from **Where is....**
2. You may type in a short message at the Attach Message dialog box.
3. Enter the recipient's mobile number or find an existing number from phone number list.
4. Press **Ok** and to SMS your position to another NAVFone user.

If the recipient has NAVFone, a WP is created automatically with your mobile number and can be viewed on the map.

If the receiving party is also running the NAVFone, the message would be intercepted and appear as a waypoint zoomed in on the location. Normal sms would not be intercepted by the program.

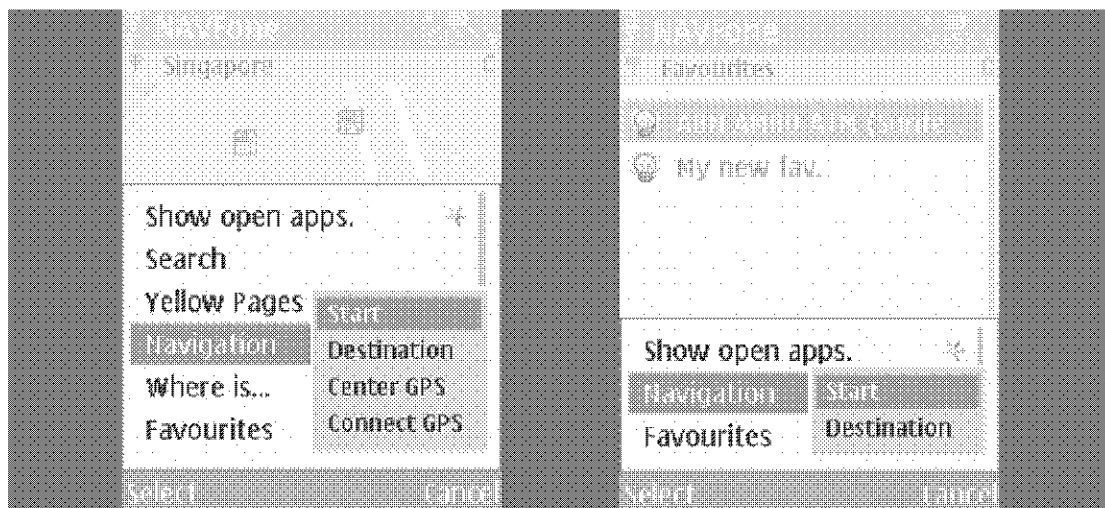
9.0 Navigation



Under the navigation options:

- **Start** – defines the beginning point of your journey
- **Destination** – defines the end point of your journey
- **Center GPS** – always show the GPS position
- **Connect GPS** – connects to GPS

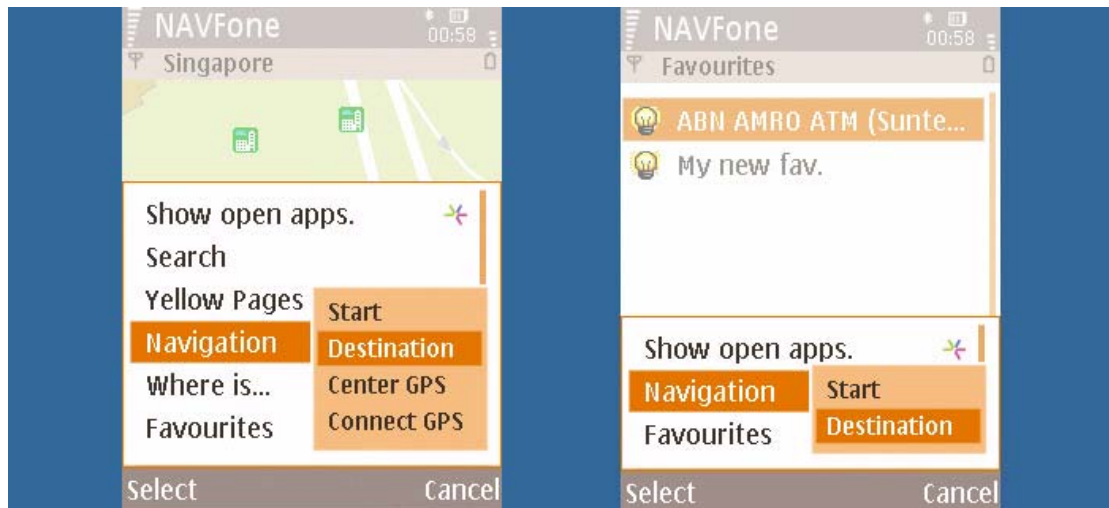
9.1 Planning your route (start point)



- To begin, select your start location (base on current cursor position).
- Select **Menu** and then **Navigation**, select **Start**. This marks the location as your start point. Alternatively, you can set it from your WP viewer window.

9.2 Planning your route (destination point)

Do a search for your destination by going SEARCH. Enter the keyword of the place you would like to travel to. When the result appears, click on the link to zoom to your destination which is highlighted on your map.



- Select **Menu** and then **Navigation**, select **Destination**. This marks the location as your end point. Alternatively, you can set it from your WP viewer window.

9.3 Routing

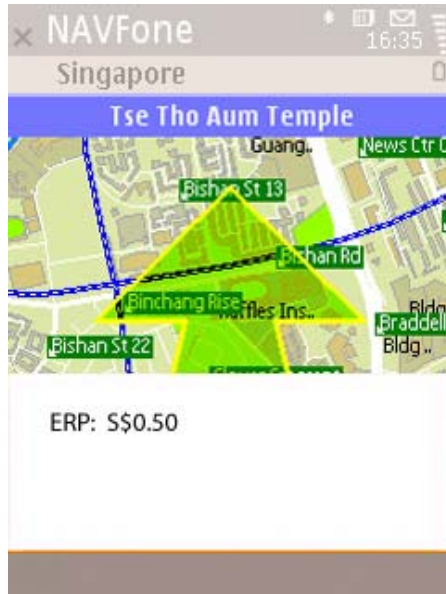
Upon selecting your destination, the software will request to connect to a GPS.

The software will then begin to plan a route



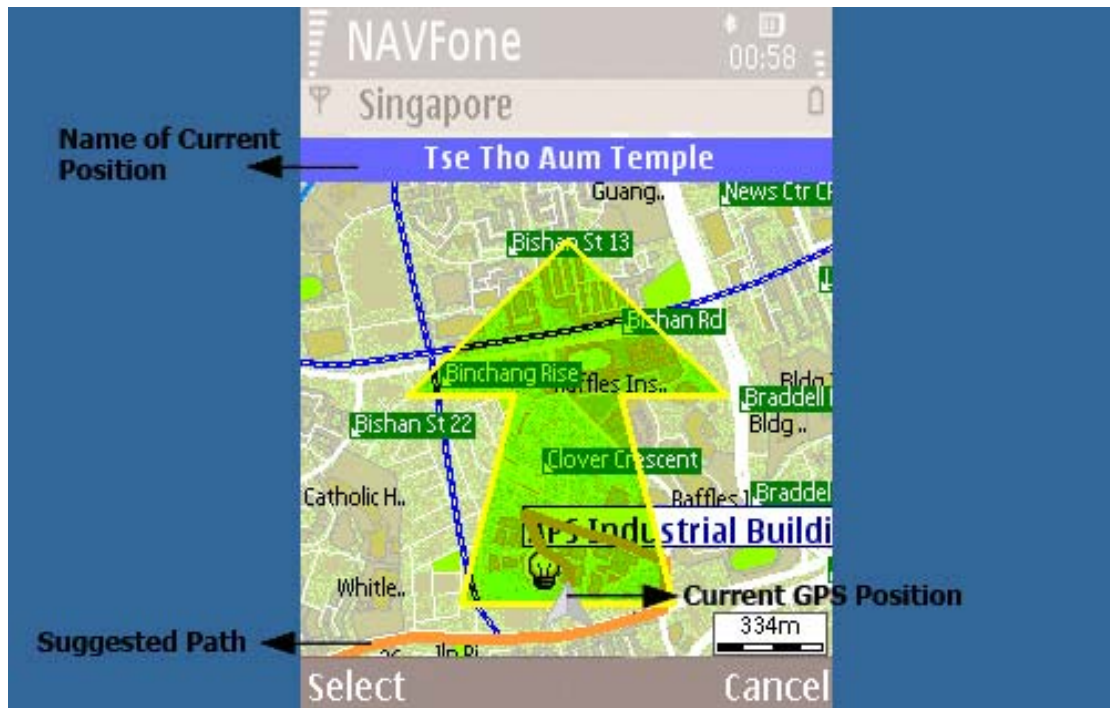
9.4 ERP Cost

Once routing is completed, the ERP cost for the planned route will be shown momentarily.



9.5 Navigation Map View

The route will then be shown on the map (highlighted in orange). If you have GPS connection and outdoor with GPS locked, the map will also indicate your current position with a red arrow.



9.6 Simulating a planned route

You can choose to simulate a route that NAVFone have generated.



During playback, there will be a green arrow showing next turn. It will also include voice prompts during the routing.

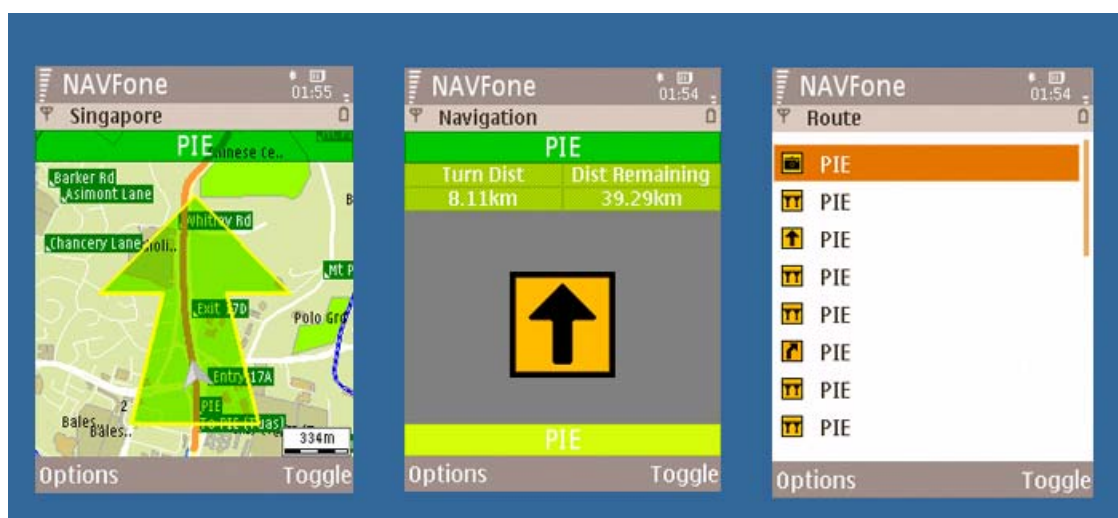
You can also choose to toggle to a different view by clicking on Toggle.

9.7 Toggle view

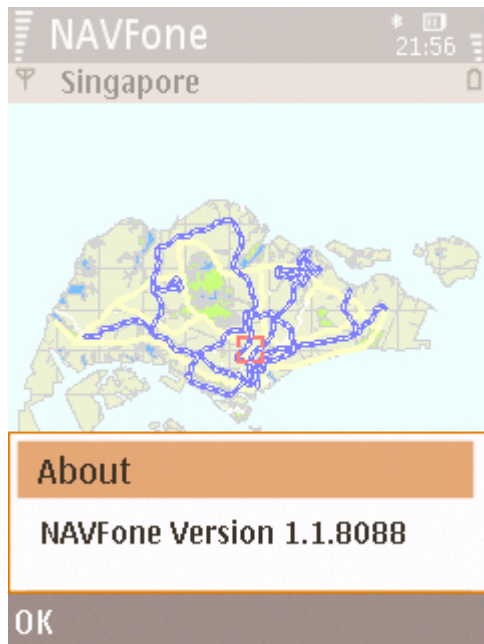
There are 3 type of display mode for routing.

1. Full maps feature.
2. Arrow indicator (no maps in the background)
3. Text based (clear road name and small arrow indication only).

All 3 modes will still include voice navigation capabilities.



10.0 About



Options -> About, shows the version of the software.

11.0 Settings

This feature allows you to change certain NAVFone options and settings.

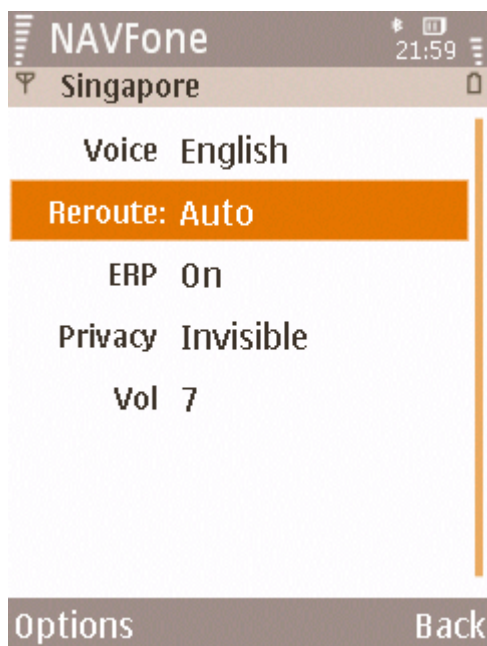
- Goto **Options** and select **Settings**.

There are 5 available settings.



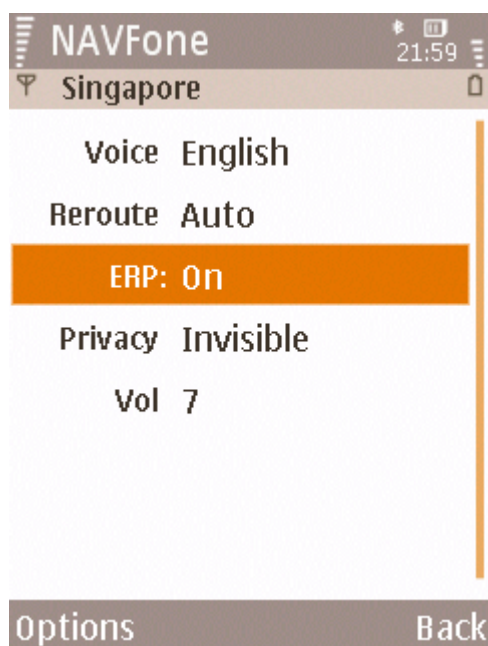
Voice:

- Toggles English, Chinese & Indonesian languages



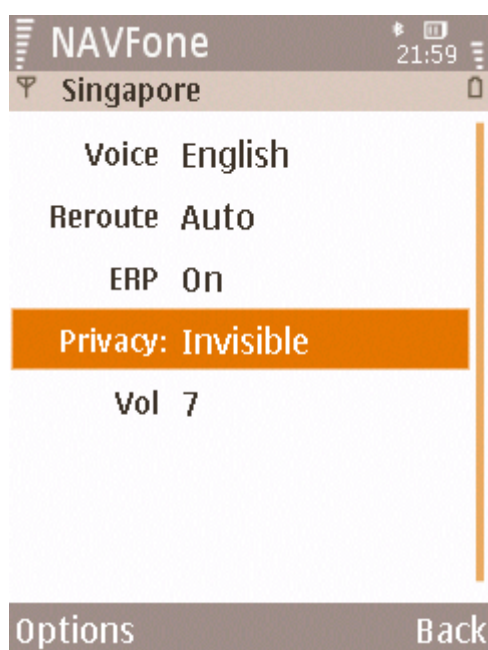
Reroute:

- Toggles Auto and Off



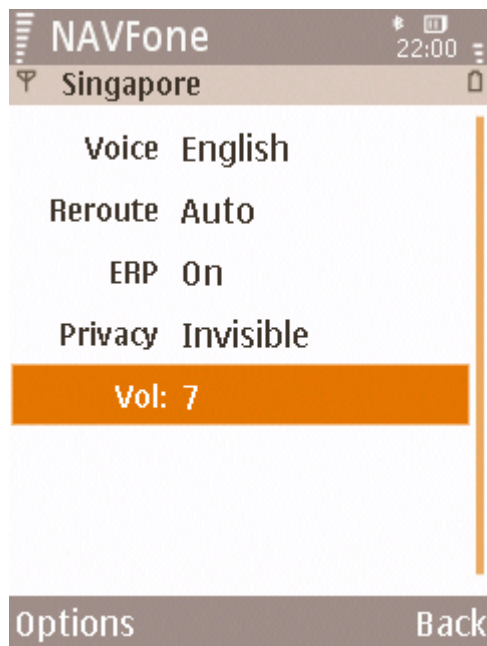
ERP

Vol:

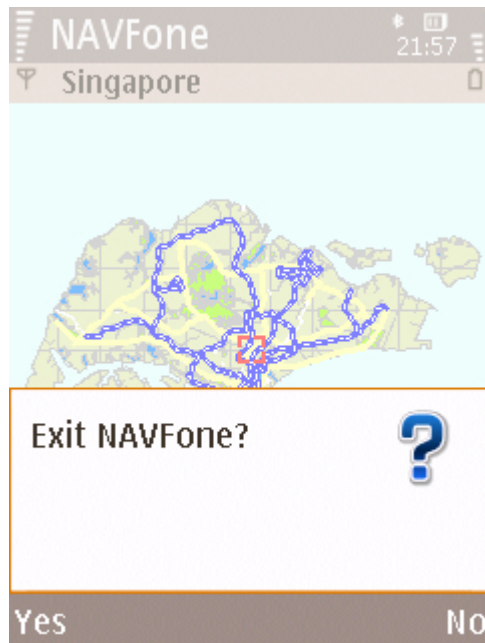
- Changes the volume level of the voice prompts, ranges from 0 to 10.



To save changes

- Goto **Options** and select Save

12.0 Exit NAVFone



This command quits the application.

To quit NAVFone

1. Click on Options
2. Scroll down to the **Exit** option
3. Press **Yes** to quit or **No** to continue using the application.
