



#### Install the SIM Card and Battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.


#### To install the SIM card and battery:

- If the phone is on, press and hold [①] and select Power Off to turn it off.
- 2. Remove the back cover.



Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the back cover.

Insert the SIM card.





- Place the SIM card in the phone with the goldcoloured contacts facing down.
- If you do not insert a SIM card, you can only use your phone's non-network services and some menus.
- Do not insert a memory card into the SIM card slot.

#### Insert the battery.



#### Replace the back cover.



#### Charge the Battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery. You can charge the phone with the provided travel adapter or by connecting the phone to a PC with a PC data cable




Only use Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unauthorized chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your phone.



When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and display a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and turn red. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge the battery to continue using the phone.

#### To charge the battery using the travel adapter:

 Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.



- You can use the phone while it is charging, but it might take longer to fully charge the battery.
- While the phone is charging, the touch screen might not function due to an unstable power supply. If this happens, unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- While charging, the phone might heat up. This is normal and should not affect the phone's lifespan or performance.
- If your phone is not charging properly, bring the phone and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the phone and then from the power outlet.



Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing so might cause damage to the phone.



To save energy, unplug the travel adapter when not in use. The travel adapter does not have a power switch, so you must unplug it from the outlet to interrupt the power supply. The travel adapter should remain close to the socket when in use.

#### To charge the battery using the PC data cable:

Before charging, ensure that your PC is turned on.

- Plug the micro USB end of the PC data cable into the multifunction jack.
- Plug the other end of the PC data cable into a USB port on a PC.



Depending on the type of PC data cable you are using, it might take some time before charging begins.

When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the PC data cable from the phone and then from the PC.

#### Insert a Memory Card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD $^{\rm TM}$  or microSDHC $^{\rm TM}$  memory cards up to 32 GB (depending on the memory card manufacturer and type).




Samsung uses approved memory standards for memory cards but some brands might not be fully compatible with your phone. Using an incompatible memory card might damage your phone or the memory card and can corrupt data stored on the card.



- Your phone only supports the FAT file structure for memory cards. If you insert a card formatted with a different file structure, your phone will prompt you to reformat the memory card.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.
- When you insert a memory card into your phone, the file directory of the memory card will appear in the /sdcard folder

#### To insert a memory card:

 Open the cover of the memory card slot on the side of the phone. Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.



- Push the memory card into the memory card slot until it locks into place.
- Close the cover of the memory card slot.

#### To remove a memory card:

Before removing the memory card, unmount it for safe removal



Do not remove the memory card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this might result in the loss of data or damage to the memory card or phone.

- In Idle mode, select → Settings → SD card and phone storage → Unmount SD card → OK.
- Open the cover of the memory card slot on the side of the phone.
- 3. Push the memory card gently until it disengages from the phone.
- Pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.
- Close the cover of the memory card slot.

#### Attach a Hand Strap (optional)

#### To attach a hand strap to your phone:

- 1. Remove the back cover.
- Slide the hand strap through the slot and hook it over the small projection.



Replace the back cover.

# getting started with your phone

#### Turn Your Phone On and Off

To turn your phone on, press and hold [ $\mathbb{O}$ ]. Your phone will automatically connect to the network. When you turn on your phone for the first time, follow the on-screen instructions to set up your phone.



You might be charged for the data connection because the connection to the Google web server is always active by default.

#### To turn your phone off:

- Press and hold [ ①].
- Select Power off → OK.



 Follow all posted warnings and directions when in area where the use of wireless devices is restricted, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.  To only use your phone's non-network services, switch to Flight mode. Press and hold [♠] and select Flight mode.

#### Use the Touch Screen

Your phone's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions.



- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause it to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with water. The touch screen might malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.



- For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your phone.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body. For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip. The touch screen will not react to the touches of sharp tools, such as a stylus or pen.

#### To control the touch screen:

- Tap: Tap once with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Tap and hold: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to open a pop-up option list.
- Drag: Tap and drag your finger up, down, left, or right to move to items on lists
- Drag and drop: Tap and hold your finger on an item and then drag your finger to move the item.

• **Double-tap:** Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos or web pages.



- Your phone turns off the touch screen when you do not use the phone for a specified amount of time. To turn on the touch screen, press [ ①] or [ ①].
- You can also adjust the backlight time. In Idle mode, select 
   → Settings → Display → Screen timeout

#### To lock or unlock the touch screen and keys:

You can lock the touch screen and keys to prevent any unwanted phone operations.

- · To lock, press [ ①].
- To unlock, turn on the touch screen by pressing [ ①] or [ 〔 ], and drag ⑥ right until it reaches the dot.

#### Get to Know the Idle Screen

When your phone turns on or is in Idle mode, the Idle screen is displayed. From this screen, you can access various features and status information.

The Idle screen has multiple panels. Scroll left or right to a panel on the Idle screen.

#### Add items to the Idle screen:

You can customize the Idle screen by adding shortcuts to applications or items in applications, widgets, or folders.

#### To add items to the Idle screen:

- Press [ = ] → Add or tap and hold in an empty area in the Idle screen.
- . Select the item category and then select an item:
  - Widgets: Add widgets to the Idle screen. Widgets are small applications that provide convenient functions and information to your Idle screen.

- Shortcuts: Add shortcuts to items, such as applications, bookmarks, and contacts.
- Folders: Create a new folder or add folders for your contacts
- · Wallpapers: Set a background image.



Available items vary depending on the current Idle screen mode.

#### To move items on the Idle screen:

- Tap and hold the item that you want to move until the item appears grey.
- 2. Drag the item to a new location.

#### To remove items from the Idle screen:

- Tap and hold the item that you want to remove. The trash bin appears at the bottom of the Idle screen.
- Drag the item to the trash bin.

3. When the item turns red, release the item.

#### Use the shortcuts panel

In Idle mode or while using an application, tap the indicator icons area and drag your finger down to open the shortcuts panel. You can activate or deactivate wireless connection features and access a list of notifications, such as messages, calls, events, or processing status.

- To hide the shortcuts panel, drag the bottom of the list up.
- To clear the notification list, select Clear.
   In the shortcuts panel, you can access the following options:
- Wi-Fi: Activate or deactivate the WLAN connection feature. ► p. 70
- B/T: Activate or deactivate the Bluetooth wireless connection feature. ➤ p. 68
- GPS: Activate or deactivate the GPS feature.

- Sound/Vibration: Activate or deactivate Vibration mode.
- Auto rotation: Activate or deactivate auto rotation.



Available options might vary depending on your region or service provider.

#### Add or remove panels from the Idle screen

You can add or remove panels from the Idle screen to organise widgets according to your preferences and needs.

- In Idle mode, press [□□] → Edit.
   You can also place two fingers on the screen and pinch to switch to Edit mode.
- 2. Add or remove panels using the following features.
  - To remove a panel, tap and hold the thumbnail of a panel and drag it to the trash bin at the bottom of the screen
  - To add a new panel, select .

- To change the order of the panels, tap and hold the thumbnail of a panel and drag it to a new location.
- When you are finished, press [ ➡].

#### **Access Applications**

#### To access your phone's applications:

- In Idle mode, select ## to access the application list.
- 2. Scroll left or right to display the application screen.
- 3. Select an application.



- When you use applications provided by Google, you must have a Google account. If you do not have a Google account, you will need to create one.
- You can add a shortcut to an application by tapping and holding an application icon in the application list. You can then move the icon on the Idle screen as needed

4. Press [ ★ ] to return to the previous screen or press [ ← ] to return to the Idle screen.



#### To organize applications:

You can reorganize the applications in the application list by changing their order or by grouping them into categories to suit your needs.

- In the application list, press [□] → Edit.
- 2. Tap and hold an application.

- Drag the application icon to a new location. You can move an application icon to another main menu screen.
- 4. Press [ ⇒ ] to return to the previous screen or press [ ⊕ ] to return to the Idle screen.

#### To change the order of the main menu screens:

- In the application list, place two fingers on the screen and pinch.
- Tap and hold the thumbnail of a screen and drag it to a new location.

#### To access recent applications:

- Press and hold [ ] to open a list of applications that you have recently accessed.
- Select the application that you want to access.

#### To use the task manager:

Your phone is a multitasking device. It can run more than one application at the same time. However, multitasking

might cause hang-ups, freezing, memory problems, or additional power consumption. To avoid these problems, end unnecessary programs using the task manager.

- 2. To close an application, select **End**. To close all active applications, select **End all**.

#### Customize Your Phone

Get more from your phone by customizing it to suit your needs.

#### To set the current date and time:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **⊞** → **Settings** → **Date & time**.
- Set the date and time and change other options as needed.

#### To turn the touch tone on or off:

#### To adjust the volume of the ringtones:

Press the Volume key up or down to adjust the ringtone volume.

#### To switch to or from Silent mode:

To mute or unmute your phone, do one of the following:

- In Idle mode, select ₩ → Keypad and tap and hold #.
- Open the shortcuts panel at the top of the screen and select Sound. It will be changed to Vibration.
- Press and hold [ ①] and select Silent mode.

#### To change your ringtone:

#### 2. Select a ringtone in the list and select **OK**.

#### To activate animation for switching windows:

In Idle mode, select → Settings → Display →
 Animation → Some Animations or All Animations.

#### To select wallpaper for the Idle screen:

- In the Idle mode, press [r≡1] → Wallpaper and select an option.
- Select an image.
- 3. Select Save or Set wallpaper.
- Samsung is not responsible for any use of default images or wallpapers provided on your phone.

#### To adjust the brightness of the display:

- Drag the slider to adjust the level of brightness,
- 3 Select OK



The brightness level of the display will affect how quickly the phone uses battery power.

#### To set an unlock pattern:

You can lock the touch screen with an unlock pattern or password to prevent unauthorized people from using your phone without your permission.

- Follow the on-screen instructions and example patterns and select **Next** (if needed).
- Draw a pattern by dragging your finger to connect at least 4 dots.
- Select Continue.

- Draw the pattern again to confirm.
- 6 Select Confirm



- When you have set an unlock pattern, your have to use the pattern each time you turn on the phone. If you do not want the phone to require a pattern, clear the checkbox next to Use visible pattern in Location & security.
- If you forget the unlock pattern, take your phone to a Samsung Service Centre to be unlocked.
- Samsung is not responsible for the loss of passwords or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

#### To set an unlock PIN code:

- 2. Enter a new PIN (numeric) and select Continue.

3. Enter the PIN again and select **OK**.

#### To set an unlock password:

- Enter a new password (alphanumeric) and select Continue.
- 3. Enter the password again and select **OK**.

#### To lock your SIM card:

You can lock your phone by activating the PIN supplied with your SIM card.

- 2. Enter your PIN and select OK.

Once the PIN lock is enabled, you must enter the PIN each time you turn on the phone.



- If you enter an incorrect PIN too many times, your SIM card will be blocked. You must enter a PIN unlock key (PUK) to unblock the SIM card.
- If you block your SIM card by entering an incorrect PUK, bring the card to your service provider to be unblocked.

#### **Enter Text**

You can enter text by selecting characters on the virtual keypad or by inputting handwriting on the screen. You can enter text and create messages or contacts.



You cannot enter text in some languages. To enter text, you should change the writing language to one of the supported languages. ▶ p. 89

#### To change the keyboard type:

You can change the type of keyboard that is used to enter text. Tap and hold on the text input field, select **Input method**, and select a keyboard type (**Swype** or **Samsung keypad**).

#### Using the Swype keyboard

#### To enter text using the Swype keyboard:

- Select the first character of a word and drag your finger to the second character without releasing the finger from the screen. A line joins the selected characters.
- 2. Pause on the second character for a moment and then drag your finger to the next character.

3. Continue until you have finished the word.



- 4. Release the finger on the last character. The word is inserted into the text input field.
- Repeat steps 1-4 to complete your text.
   Tap and hold each key to enter additional characters.

6. You can also use the following keys:

- To view the Help information about using the Swype keyboard, tap and hold

depending on the selected input language.

#### Using the Samsung keypad

To enter text using the Samsung keypad:

You can select one of key input methods (QWERTY or traditional keypad) or the handwriting input methods.

 Enter text by selecting alphanumeric keys or by writing on the screen.

You can also use the following keys:



Number	Function
1	Change case.
2	Switch between Number/Symbol mode and ABC mode.

Number	Function
3	Enter text by voice. This icon is only available when you activate the voice input feature for the Samsung keypad.  This feature might not be available depending on the selected input language.
4	Clear your input.

6	Access the keypad settings. Change the text Input method (tap and hold).
7	Insert a space. Insert a period (double-tap). Change the input language (scroll left or right).  This feature might not be available depending on the selected input language.



If you have text input keyboards downloaded from the web, you can change the keypad type. Tap and hold the text input field, select **Input method**, and select a keypad type.

#### Copy and paste text

While you are entering text, you can use the copy and paste feature to use the same text in other applications.

#### To copy and paste text:

- I. Place the cursor on the text that you want to copy.
- 2. Select .
- 3. Select <sup>T</sup>T to select a word or select <sup>T</sup> to select all of the text.
- 4. Drag or to select the required text.
- 5. Select to copy, or to cut the text onto the clipboard.

- In application, place the cursor where you want to place the text.
- Select 
   → to paste the text from the clipboard into the text field.

#### Android Market

Android Market provides you with an easy way to shop for games and mobile applications. Based on the Android platform, your phone's functionality can be extended by installing additional applications.



- · This feature might not be available in your region.
- Your phone will save user files from downloaded applications to the internal memory.

#### To install applications:

- 2. Select Accept in the terms and conditions page.

- Select an item category and then select an item.
- 4. Select Free or Buy.
  - If you select **Free**, select **OK** to download the item immediately.
  - If you select Buy, you need to enter your credit card information. Follow the on-screen instructions.

#### To uninstall applications:

- In the Android Market home screen, [□] → My apps.
- Select the item that you want to delete.
- 3. Select Uninstall → OK.

#### Download Files from the Web

When you download files or web applications from the web, your phone stores them in a memory card.





Some media files include Digital Rights Management to protect copyrights. This protection might prevent you from downloading, copying, modifying, or transferring some files.

#### To download files from the web:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **⊞** → **Browser**.
- $2. \quad \text{Search for a file or application and download it.} \\$

To install applications downloaded from websites other than Android Market, you must select **Settings** → **Applications** → **Unknown sources** → **OK**.

#### To view the download history:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **⊞** → **Browser**.
- 2. Press [□ ] → More → Downloads.

 To delete download history, select the checkbox next to the download(s) that you want to delete then select Delete. Select Clear selection to clear checkbox selections

# Synchronise Data

You can synchronise data with various web servers and back up or restore your data.

When the synchronisation is complete, your phone stays connected to the web. If any change is made on the web, the updated information will appear on your phone and automatically will begin synchronisation, and vice-versa.



This feature might not be available in your region.

#### To set up a server account:

- 2. Select **Add account** and select an account type.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the account setup.

For online community services, such as Facebook, Twitter, or MySpace, enter your user name and password and select **Log in**.

# To activate automatic sync:

If you add or edit data in any of the applications on the web (Google Mail, Calendar, and Contacts), the updated information will appear on your phone, and vice-versa.

- 1. In Idle mode, select  $\blacksquare$   $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Accounts and sync.
- Select Auto-sync.

# To synchronise data manually:

- 2. Select an account.
- Press [==] → Sync now. Your phone will start synchronising the data you have selected for synchronisation.

# Calls

You can use your phone to make and answer calls, use options during calls, and customize and use call-related features.

# Make and answer calls

#### To make a call:

- Enter an area code and phone number.
- Select to make a voice call.



When you hold the phone close to your ear during a call, it automatically turns off and locks the touch screen to prevent accidental inputs.

#### 4. To end the call, select End call.



- Use the phonebook to save the numbers that you dial frequently. ► p. 53
- To quickly access the call log to redial numbers that you have dialed recently, select ¬ Logs.

#### To answer a call:

 When a call comes in, drag to the right until it reaches the dot.



When the phone is ringing, press the Volume key to mute the ringtone.

To end the call, select End call.

# To reject a call:

When a call comes in, drag to the left until it reaches the dot. The caller will hear a busy tone.

#### To call an international number:

- 2. Enter the complete number that you want to dial (country code, area code and phone number), and then select to dial the number

#### To call a contact from Contacts:

You can call numbers directly from Contacts using stored contacts. ▶ p. 53

- 2. Select a contact's name.
- 3. Select the number that you want to dial.

# To use the headset:

By plugging the supplied headset into the phone, you can make and answer calls:

- Answer a call: Press the headset button.
- · Reject a call: Press and hold the headset button.
- Place a call on hold or retrieve a held call during a call: Press and hold the headset button.
- End a call: Press the headset button.



The supplied headset is only designed to be used with for your phone and might not be compatible with other phones and MP3 players.

# Use options during a call

You can use the following options while a call is in progress:

- Adjust voice volume: Press the Volume key up or down.
- Place a call on hold: Select Hold.
- Retrieve a held call: Select Unhold.
- Dial a second number: Select Add call and then dial the new number.

- Answer a second call: Drag to the right until it reaches the dot when the call waiting tone sounds. The first call goes on hold. You must subscribe to a call waiting service to use this feature.
- Open the dialling screen: Select Dialpad.
- Activate the speakerphone: Select Speaker.



In noisy environments, you might have difficulty hearing some calls while using the speakerphone. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode

- Turn off the microphone: Select Mute so that the caller cannot hear you.
- Use a Bluetooth headset: Select Headset to use a Bluetooth headset to listen and talk to the caller.
- Switch between two calls: Select Swap.
- Make a multiparty call (conference call): Make or answer a second call and select Merge calls when

connected to the second party. Repeat to add more parties. You must subscribe to the multiparty call service to use this feature.

# View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed.

#### To dial the number of a missed call:

- 1. Open the shortcut panel.
- 2. Select the missed call.

# Use additional features

You can use various other call-related features, such as call forwarding or call waiting.

# To set call forwarding for voice calls:

Call forwarding is a network feature that allows you to send incoming calls to another number that you specify. You can

set this feature separately for several conditions when you are not able to answer calls, such as when you are already on the phone or when you are outside the service area.

- . In Idle mode, select ⊞ → Settings → Call settings → Call forwarding.
- 2. Select a condition.
- Enter a number to which calls will be forwarded and select Enable.
   Your setting will be sent to the network.

# To set call waiting:


Call waiting is a network feature that alerts you of an incoming call when you are on a call.

- In Idle mode, select → Settings → Call settings → Additional settings → Call waiting.
- 2. Your setting will be sent to the network.


#### To view call logs:

You can view logs of your calls and filter them by their types.

- In Idle mode, select Logs.
- Press [r=1] → View by and select an option for sorting the call logs.



3. Select a log to view its details.



# Text and Multimedia Messages

You can create an send text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages, and view or manage messages that you have sent or received. For instructions on entering text, see ▶ p. 22.



You might incur additional charges for sending and receiving messages while outside your home service area. For details, contact your service provider.

#### To send a text message:

- 2. Select Contacts.

You can enter a number manually or select one from a recent recipient or contact group by selecting another button.

Select the checkboxes next to the contacts and select Add.

- Select Tap to compose and enter your message text.
   To insert emoticons, press [r=1] → Insert smiley.
- 5. Select **Send** to send the message.

#### To send a multimedia message:

- 1. In Idle mode, select → New message.
- 2. Select Contacts.

You can enter a number manually or select one from a recent recipient or contact group by selecting another button.

- Select the checkboxes next to the required contacts and select Add.
  - When you enter an email address, the phone will convert the message into a multimedia message.

#### Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 10 metres without requiring a physical connection.

You do not need to line up the phones to beam information with Bluetooth. If the phones are within range of one another, you can exchange information between them even if they are located in different rooms.



- Samsung is not responsible for the loss, interception, or misuse of data sent or received using the Bluetooth wireless feature.
- Always ensure that you share and receive data with phones that are trusted and properly secured. If there are obstacles between the phones, the operating distance might be reduced.

 Some phones, especially those that are not tested or approved by Bluetooth SIG, might not be compatible with your phone.

#### To turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature:

- Select Bluetooth to turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature.

#### To find and pair with other Bluetooth-enabled phones:

- Select a device.
- Enter a PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature or the other phone's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and select

**OK**. Alternatively, select **Accept** to match the PIN between your phone and the phone.

When the owner of the other phone enters the same PIN or accepts the connection, pairing is complete. If the pairing is successful, the phone will automatically search for available services



Some phones, especially headsets or hands-free car kits, might have a fixed Bluetooth PIN, such as 0000. If the other phone has a PIN, you must enter it.

#### To send data using the Bluetooth wireless feature:

- Select a file or item, such as a contact, memo, or media file, from an appropriate application or from My files.
- Press [□□] → Share, Send via, or Send namecard via → Bluetooth.
- 3. Search for and pair with a Bluetooth-enabled phone.

#### To receive data using the Bluetooth wireless feature:

- When prompted, enter the PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature and select **OK** (if necessary).
- Select Accept to confirm that you are willing to receive data from the phone (if necessary).

Received data is saved to the bluetooth folder.

#### Wi-Fi

You can use your phone's wireless networking capabilities to activate and connect to any wireless local area network (WLAN) compatible with the IEEE 802.11 b/g/n standards.

You can connect to the internet or other network phones anywhere an access point or wireless hotspot is available.



Your phone uses non-harmonised frequency and therefore some countries might restrict the use of a WLAN.

#### To activate the WLAN feature:



An active WLAN running in the background will consume battery power. To preserve battery power, only activate the WLAN when needed.

#### To find and connect to a WLAN:

 In Idle mode, select → Settings → Wireless and networks → Wi-Fi settings. The phone will automatically search for available WLANs.

- 2. Select a network under Wi-Fi networks.
- 3. Enter a password for the network (if necessary).
- Select Connect.

#### To add a WLAN manually:

- Enter the SSID for the network and select the security type.
- 3. Set the security settings depending on the selected security type.
- Select Save.

#### AllShare

You can use the Digital Living Network Alliance (DLNA) service to share media files between DLNA-enabled phones in your home over a WLAN.

You must first activate the WLAN feature and add a WLAN profile. ► p. 70

#### To customise DLNA settings for sharing media files:

To allow other DLNA-enabled phones to access media files on your phone, you must activate media sharing.



Some files may not play on the DLNA-enabled phones depending on the phones.

## troubleshooting

If you are having trouble with your mobile phone, try these troubleshooting procedures before contacting a service professional.

When you turn on your phone or while you are using the phone, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the phone's lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password that you set for the phone.
PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM card. You can disable this feature using the Lock SIM card menu.

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
	Your SIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
PIN2	When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

### Your phone displays "Service unavailable" or "Network error"

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you might lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription.
   Contact your service provider for more details.

#### The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen.
   Protective covers might prevent the phone from recognising your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen phones.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.

- Restart your phone to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your phone's software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, take it to your local Samsung Service Centre.

#### Your phone freezes or has fatal errors

If your phone freezes or hangs, you might need to close programs or reset the phone to regain functionality. If your phone is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold [ ⊙ ] for 8-10 seconds. The phone will reboot automatically.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. In Idle mode, select  $\coprod \to \mathbf{Settings} \to \mathbf{Privacy} \to \mathbf{Factory}$  data reset  $\to \mathbf{Reset}$  phone  $\to \mathbf{Erase}$  everything.

#### Calls are being dropped

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you might lose your connection to the network. Move to another area and try again.

#### Outgoing calls are not connected

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key.
- Ensure that you have accessed the correct cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialling.

#### Incoming calls are not connected

- · Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the correct cellular network
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

#### Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

#### Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you might lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

#### When dialling from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.

#### The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes

 Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

## The battery does not charge properly or the phone turns off

- The battery terminals might be dirty. Wipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery (refer to your local bylaws for proper disposal instructions).

#### Your phone is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your phone for an extended period of time, your phone may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance

#### Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung phone must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Restart the phone. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

#### Error messages appear when launching the FM radio

The FM radio application on your Samsung phone uses the headset cable as an antenna. Without a headset connected, the FM radio will be unable to receive radio stations. To use the FM radio, first ensure that the headset is properly

connected. Next, scan for and save the available radio stations.

If you still cannot use the FM radio after performing these steps, try accessing the station with another radio receiver. If you can hear the station with another receiver, your phone might require service. Contact a Samsung Service Centre.

#### Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files might not play on your Samsung phone for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your phone, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights
  Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRM
  protected, ensure that you have the appropriate license
  or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your phone supports the file type.

#### Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your phone.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device that you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your phone and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 metres).
- If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

## A connection is not established when you connect the phone to a PC

- Ensure that the PC data cable you are using is compatible with your phone.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and to ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.

#### Getting the Most Out of Your Reception

#### **Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength**

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

#### **Understanding How Your Phone Operates**

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

## **Knowing Radio Frequency Safety**

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below. In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

#### **Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance**

There are several simple guidelines for operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- Speak directly into the mouthpiece.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a dealer store or call Customer Support for service.



For the best care of your phone, only authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

# Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

Failure to follow the instructions outlined may lead to serious personal injury and possible property damage.



Excessive exposure to sound at high volumes can cause hearing damage. Always turn the volume down before plugging the headphones into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

# **Using Your Phone While Driving**

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free phone) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

When using your phone in the car:

- Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and re-dial.
- · When available, use a hands-free phone.
- · Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.
- Dial 911 to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

#### **Following Safety Guidelines**

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

# Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check

with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical phones, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.



Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

#### **Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying**

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

## **Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas**

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF phones to set off explosives.

Turn off your phone when you are in an area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it is rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. These areas include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders.

 Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.



Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

#### Restricting Children's Access to your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone, dial 911 by mistake or make calls that increase your phone bill.

#### Warning Regarding Display

The display on your handset is made of glass or acrylic and could break if your handset is dropped or if it receives significant impact. Do not use if screen is broken or cracked as this could cause injury to you.

# Caring for the Battery

## **Protecting Your Battery**

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Samsung approved batteries and desktop chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- · Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.

- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. When used correctly, the battery can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:

Less than one month:

-4° F to 140° F (-20° C to 60° C)

More than one month:

-4° F to 113° F (-20° C to 45° C)

The SAR value of a phone is the result of an extensive testing, measuring and calculation process. It does not represent how much RF the phone emits. All phone models are tested at their highest value in strict laboratory settings. But when in operation, the SAR of a phone can be

substantially less than the level reported to the FCC. This is because of a variety of factors including its proximity to a base station antenna, phone design and other factors. What is important to remember is that each phone meets strict federal guidelines. Variations in SARs do not represent a variation in safety.

All phones must meet the federal standard, which incorporates a substantial margin of safety. As stated above, variations in SAR values between different model phones do not mean variations in safety. SAR values at or below the federal standard of 1.6 W/kg are considered safe for use by the public.
