




# Install the SIM Card and Battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card with subscription

details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

#### To install the SIM card and battery:

- If the phone is on, press and hold [①] and select Power off to turn it off.
- 2. Remove the back cover.



Be careful not to damage your fingernails when you remove the back cover.

3. Insert the SIM card.



- Place the SIM card in the phone with the goldcoloured contacts facing down.
  - If you do not insert a SIM card, you can only use your phone's non-network services and some menus.
  - · Do not insert a memory card into the SIM card slot.

Insert the battery. 4.



5. Replace the back cover.



# Charge the Battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery. You can charge the phone with the provided travel adapter or by connecting the phone to a PC with a PC data cable



Only use Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unauthorized chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your phone.



When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and display a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and start blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge the battery to continue using the phone.

#### To charge the battery using the travel adapter:

- 1. Slide open the cover to the multifunction jack on the top of the phone.
- Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
  - You can use the phone while it is charging, but it might take longer to fully charge the battery.
    - While charging, the battery might heat up. This is normal and should not affect the phone's life span or performance.
    - If your phone is not charging properly, bring the phone and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet and then from the phone.

Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing so might cause damage to the phone.

5. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.

#### To charge the battery using the PC data cable:

- 1. Slide open the cover to the multifunction jack on the top of the phone.
- 2. Plug the micro USB end of the PC data cable into the multifunction jack.
- Plug the other end of the PC data cable into a USB port on a PC.



- Depending on the type of PC data cable you are using, it might take some time before charging begins.
- When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the PC data cable from the phone and then from the PC.

# Insert a Memory Card (optional)

To store multimedia files and use some phone functions, such as the camera, you must insert a memory card. Your

phone accepts microSD<sup> $\mathrm{TM}$ </sup> or microSDHC<sup> $\mathrm{TM}$ </sup> memory cards up to 32 GB (depending on the memory card manufacturer and type).

- 🚺 Sa
  - Samsung uses approved memory standards for memory cards but some brands might not be fully compatible with your phone. Using an incompatible memory card might damage your phone or the memory card and can corrupt data stored on the card.
  - Your phone only supports the FAT file structure for memory cards. If you insert a card formatted with a different file structure, your phone will prompt you to reformat the memory card.
    - Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the life span of memory cards.

#### To insert a memory card:

1. Remove the back cover.

2. Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.



- Push the memory card into the memory card slot until it locks into place.
- 4. Replace the back cover.

#### To remove a memory card:

Before removing the memory card, unmount it for safe removal.

Do not remove the memory card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this might result in the loss of data or damage to the memory card or phone.

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  SD card and phone storage  $\rightarrow$  Unmount SD card  $\rightarrow$  OK.
- 2. Remove the back cover.
- 3. Push the memory card gently until it disengages from the phone.
- 4. Pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.
- 5. Remove the memory card.
- 6. Replace the back cover.

#### To format a memory card:

Formatting your memory card on a PC might cause incompatibilities with your phone. Only format the memory card on the phone. In order to format the card, it must first be unmounted.

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  SD card and phone storage  $\rightarrow$  Unmount SD card  $\rightarrow$  OK.
- 2. Select Format SD card → Format SD card → Erase everything.
  - Before formatting the memory card, remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on the card as it will be completely erased. The manufacturer's warranty does not cover the loss of data resulting from user actions.

# Attach a Hand Strap (optional)

#### To attach a hand strap to your phone:

- 1. Remove the back cover.
- 2. Slide the hand strap through the slot and hook it over the small projection.



3. Replace the back cover.

# getting started with your phone

# Turn Your Phone On and Off

To turn your phone on, press and hold [ $\bigcirc$ ]. Your phone will automatically connect to the network. When you turn on your phone for the first time, tap the Android image on the screen and follow the on-screen instructions to set up your phone for its first use.



You might be charged for the data connection because the connection to the Google web server is always active by default.

### To turn your phone off:

- 1. Press and hold [ ① ].
- 2. Select Power off.
- Ø

 Follow all posted warnings and directions when in area where the use of wireless devices is restricted, such as airplanes and hospitals.  To only use your phone's non-network services, switch to Flight mode. Press and hold [①] and select Flight mode.

# Use the Touch Screen

Your phone's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions.



- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause it to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with water. The touch screen might malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.



- For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your phone.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body. For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip.

#### To control the touch screen:

- **Tap:** Tap once with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- **Tap and hold:** Tap an item and hold it for more than two seconds to open a pop-up option list.
- Scroll: Tap and drag your finger up, down, left, or right to move to items on the list.
- **Drag and drop:** Tap and hold your finger on an item and then drag your finger to move the item.

• **Double-tap:** Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos or web pages.



- Your phone turns off the touch screen when you do not use the phone for a specified amount of time. To turn on the touch screen, press [①] and then flick the locked window with your finger.
- You can also adjust the backlight time. In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Display → Screen timeout.

#### To lock or unlock the touch screen and keys:

You can lock the touch screen and keys to prevent any unwanted phone operations.

- To lock, press [ ① ].
- To unlock, turn on the touch screen by pressing [ ① ] and then flick the lock window with your finger.

# Get to Know the Idle Screen

When your phone turns on or is in Idle mode, the Idle screen is displayed. From this screen, you can access various features and status information.

The Idle screen has seven panels. Scroll left or right to a panel on the Idle screen. You can also select a dot on the top of the screen to move to the corresponding panel of the Idle screen.

#### Add items to the Idle screen:

You can customize the Idle screen by adding shortcuts to applications or items in applications, widgets, or folders.

To add items to the Idle screen:

- 1. Press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  Add.
- 2. Select the item category and then select an item:
  - · Widgets: Add widgets to the Idle screen.

- Shortcuts: Add shortcuts to items, such as applications, bookmark, and contacts.
- Folders: Create a new folder or add folders for your contacts.
- Wallpapers: Set a background image.



Available items vary depending on the current Idle screen mode.

#### To move items on the Idle screen:

- . Touch and hold the item that you want to move.
- 2. Drag the item to a new location.

#### To remove items from the Idle screen:

 Touch and hold the item that you want to remove. The item is magnified and the micro appears, indicating that the application tab has switched to the trash tab.

- 2. Drag the item to the trash tab.
- 3. When the item and the trash tab turn red, release the item.

# Use the shortcuts panel

In Idle mode or while using an application, tap the indicator icons area and drag your finger down to open the shortcuts panel. You can activate or deactivate wireless connection features and access a list of a notifications, such as messages, calls, events, or processing status.

To hide the shortcuts panel, drag the bottom of the list up.

In the shortcuts panel, you can access the following options:

- Wi-Fi: Activate or deactivate the WLAN connection feature. ► p. 76
- Bluetooth: Activate or deactivate the Bluetooth wireless connection feature. ► p. 74

- · GPS: Activate or deactivate GPS mode.
- Silent: Activate or deactivate Silent mode.
- Auto rotation: Activate or deactivate the auto rotation.



Your phone has a built-in motion sensor that detects its orientation. While using some features, if you rotate the phone the interface automatically switches to landscape view. To set the interface to retain the portrait orientation when the phone is rotated, deactivate **Auto rotation** in the shortcuts panel. You can also set it by selecting **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Display**  $\rightarrow$  **Auto-rotate screen**.

# Add or remove panels from the Idle screen

You can add or remove panels from the Idle screen to organize widgets according to your preferences and needs.

1. In Idle mode, press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  Edit.

You can also place two fingers on the screen and pinch to switch to Edit mode.

- 2. Add or remove panels by using the following features:
  - To remove a panel, tap and hold the thumbnail of a panel and drag it to the trash bin at the bottom of the screen.

  - To change the order of the panels, tap and hold the thumbnail of a panel and drag it to the location you want.
- When you are finished, press [ ≤ ].

# Access Applications

#### To access your phone's applications:

 In Idle mode, select Applications to access the application list.

- Scroll left or right to display the application screens. You can also select a dot at the top of the screen to move to the corresponding main menu screen.
- 3. Select an application.



- In order to use applications provided by Google, you must have a Google account. If you do not have a Google account, you will need to create one.
- You can add a shortcut to an application by tapping and holding an application icon in the application list. You can then move the icon on the Idle screen as needed.
- 4. Press [  $\$  ] to return to the previous screen or press [  $\$  ] to return to the Idle screen.

# To organize applications:

You can reorganize the applications in the application list by changing their order or by grouping them into categories to suit your needs.

- 1. In the application list, press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  Edit.
- 2. Tap and hold an application.
- Drag the application icon to a new location. You can move an application icon to another main menu screen. You can also move commonly used applications next to Home.
- 4. Press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  Save.

### To access recent applications:

- Press and hold [
   (
   )] to open a list of applications that you have recently accessed.
- 2. Select the application that you want to access.

# Customize Your Phone

Get more from your phone by customizing it to suit your needs.

#### To set the current date and time:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Date and time.
- 2. Set the date and time and change other options as needed.

#### To turn the touch tone on or off:

 In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Sound → Audible touch tones.

#### To adjust the volume of the ring tones:

 In the Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down to adjust the ringtone volume.

# To switch to or from Silent mode:

To mute or unmute your phone, do one of the following:

- In the Idle mode, select Phone → Dialer and tap and hold #.
- In Idle mode, press and hold [ ① ] and select Silent mode.
- In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Sound  $\rightarrow$  Silent mode.

#### To change your ringtone:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Sound → Phone ringtone.
- 2. Select a ringtone in the list and select OK.

#### To activate animation for switching windows:

 In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Display → Animation → Some animations or All animations.

#### To select wallpaper for the Idle screen:

- In the Idle mode, press [ □] → Wallpaper and select an option.
- 2. Select an image.
- 3. Select Save or Set wallpaper.



Samsung is not responsible for any use of default images or wallpapers provided on your phone.

#### To adjust the brightness of the display:

You can manually adjust the brightness of the display by disabling Automatic brightness control and dragging the slider bar left or right.

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Display → Brightness.
- 2. Clear the checkbox next to Automatic brightness.
- 3. Drag the slider to adjust the level of brightness.

# 4. Select OK.



The brightness level of the display will affect how quickly the phone uses battery power.

### To set a screen lock:

You can lock the touch screen with an unlock pattern, PIN, or password to prevent unauthorized people from using your phone without your permission.

- Ø ·
  - Once you set a screen lock, your phone will require an unlock code each time you turn it on or unlock the touch screen.
  - If you forget your PIN or password, bring your phone to a Samsung Service Centre to unlock it. Remember to make backup copies of all important data stored on your device.
  - Samsung is not responsible for any loss of security codes or private information.

#### To set an unlock pattern:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Location and security → Set screen lock → Pattern.
- 2. Follow the on-screen instructions and example patterns and select **Next** (if needed).
- Draw a pattern by dragging your finger to connect at least 4 dots.
- 4. Select Continue.
- 5. Draw the pattern again to confirm.
- 6. Select Confirm.

#### To set an unlock PIN code:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Location and security → Set screen lock → PIN.
- 2. Enter a new PIN (numeric) and select Continue.
- 3. Enter the PIN again and select OK.

# To set an unlock password:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Location and security → Set screen lock → Password.
- 2. Enter a new password (alphanumeric) and select **Continue**.
- 3. Enter the password again and select OK.

If you do not want the phone to require a pattern, PIN, or password to unlock, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Location and security**  $\rightarrow$  **Change screen lock** and select **None** from the unlock settings. You are first required to confirm your set pattern, PIN, or password to display the screen unlock settings.

#### To lock your SIM card:

You can lock your phone by activating the PIN supplied with your SIM card.

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Location and security → Set up SIM card lock → Lock SIM card.
- 2. Enter your PIN and select OK.

Once the PIN lock is enabled, you must enter the PIN each time you turn on the phone.

- If you enter an incorrect PIN too many times, your SIM card will be blocked. You must enter a PIN unlock key (PUK) to unblock the SIM card.
  - If you block your SIM card by entering an incorrect PUK, bring the card to your service provider to be unblocked.

# Enter Text

You can enter text by selecting characters on the virtual keypad or by inputting handwriting on the touch screen. You can enter text and create messages or contacts.



You cannot enter text in some languages. To enter text, you should change the writing language to one of the supported languages. ► p. 105

#### To change the keyboard type:

You can change the type of keyboard that is used to enter text. Tap and hold on the text input field, select **Input method**, and select a keyboard type (**Swype** or **Samsung keypad**).

# Using the Swype keyboard

#### To enter text using the Swype keyboard:

 Select the first character of a word and drag your finger to the second character without releasing the finger from the screen. A line joins the selected characters.



- 2. Pause on the second character for a moment and then drag your finger to the next character.
- 3. Continue until you have finished the word.
- 4. Release the finger on the last character. The word is inserted into the text input field.

- Repeat steps 1-4 to complete your text. Tap and hold each key to enter additional characters.
- 6. You can also use the following keys:



Number	Function
1	Change case.
2	Switch between Symbol mode and ABC/Number mode.
3	Delete characters.
4	Insert a space.



- To hide the Swype keyboard, press [ ].
- If the path you trace matches more than one word, Swype displays a menu of words to choose from.
- To view the Help information about using the Swype keyboard, tap and hold .

# Using the Samsung keypad

# To enter text using the Samsung keypad:

1. Enter text by selecting alphanumeric keys.

2. You can also use the following keys:



Number	Function
1	Change case.
2	Switch between Number/Symbol mode and ABC mode.
3	Enter text by voice.
4	Clear your input.
5	Start a new line.
6	Insert a space.

#### To change the keypad language

If you have enabled more than one input language in the settings for the Samsung Keypad ( ▶ p. 106), the current language is indicated on the spacebar and you can change the language used by tapping and dragging on the spacebar until the required language appears in the selection box.



# Copy and paste text

While you are entering text, you can use the copy and paste feature to use the same text in other applications.

#### To copy and paste text:

- 1. Tap and hold the text input field.
- 2. Select Select text in the option list.
- 3. Drag your finger across the text you want to highlight.
- 4. Tap and hold the highlighted text.
- Select Copy to copy, or Cut to cut the text onto the clipboard.
- 6. In another application, tap and hold the text input field.
- Select Paste to insert the text from the clipboard into the text field.

# Android Market

Android Market provides you with an easy way to shop for games and mobile applications. Based on the Android platform, your phone's functionality can be extended by installing additional applications.



This feature might not be available in your region.

#### To install applications:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Market.
- 2. Select Accept in the terms and conditions page.
- 3. Select an item category and then select an item.
- 4. Select Install (for free items) or Buy.
  - If you select Install, select OK to download the item immediately.
  - If you select **Buy**, you need to enter your credit card information. Follow the on-screen instructions.

# To uninstall applications:

- 1. In the Android Market home screen, press My apps.
- 2. Select the item that you want to delete.
- 3. Select Uninstall  $\rightarrow$  OK.

# Download Files from the Web

When you download files or web applications from the web, your phone stores them in a memory card.



Files that you download from the web can include viruses that will damage your phone. To lessen your risk, only download from sources that you trust.



Some media files include Digital Rights Management to protect copyrights. This protection might prevent you from downloading, copying, modifying, or transferring the files.

# To download files from the web:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications → Internet.
- 2. Search for a file or application and download it.

To install applications downloaded from websites other than Android Market, you must enable **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Unknown sources** (touch the box to enter a check mark).

# To view the download history:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Internet**.
- 2. Press [  $r \equiv 1$  ]  $\rightarrow$  More  $\rightarrow$  Downloads.
- To cancel downloading, press [ I=I ] → Cancel all downloads.

# Synchronize Data

You can synchronize data (Google messages, calendar, and contacts) with the Google web server and back up or restore your data.

When the synchronization is complete, your phone stays connected to the web. If any change is made on the web, the updated information will appear on your phone and automatically will begin synchronization, and vice-versa.



• This feature might not be available in your region.

To synchronize with the Google web server, you
must have a Google account. If you do not have a
Google account, sign up for a Google account by
selecting Create on the first setup screen.

## To set up a server account:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Accounts and sync.
- 2. Select Add account and select an account type.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the account setup.

For online community services, such as Facebook, Twitter, or MySpace, enter your user name and password and select **Log in**.

# To activate automatic sync:

If you add or edit data in any of the applications on the web

(Google Mail, Calendar, and Contacts), the updated information will appear on your phone, and vice-versa.

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Accounts and sync.
- 2. Enable **Auto-sync** (touch the box to enter a check mark).
- 3. Select the applications that you want to synchronize. To exclude applications from automatic synchronization, clear the checkbox next to the application that you do not want to synchronize.

# To synchronize data manually:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Accounts and sync.
- 2. Select an account.
- Press [ I=] → Sync now. Your phone will start synchronizing the data you have selected for synchronization.

# communication

# Calls

You can use your phone to make and answer calls, use options during calls, and customize and use call-related features.

# Make and answer calls

# To make a call:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Phone.
- 2. Enter an area code and phone number.
- 3. Select **C** to make a voice call.



When you hold the phone close to your ear during a call, it automatically locks the touch screen to prevent accidental inputs.

4. To end the call, select End call.



- Use the phonebook to save the numbers that you dial frequently. ▶ p. 59
- To quickly access the call log to redial numbers that you have dialed recently, select Phone → Call logs.
- · Use the voice command feature to dial by voice.

# To answer a call:

1. When a call comes in, slide the Accept icon.



When the phone is ringing, press the Volume key to mute the ringtone.

# 2. To end the call, select End call.

# To reject a call:

When a call comes in, slide the **Reject** icon. The caller will be directed to your voice messaging system.

To send a message when you reject incoming calls, slide up the **Reject call with message** icon and select a message.

# To call an international number:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Phone**, and tap and hold **0** to insert the + character.
- 2. Enter the complete number that you want to dial (country code, area code and phone number), and then select to dial the number.

# To call a contact from Contacts:

You can call numbers directly from Contacts using stored contacts.  $\blacktriangleright$  p. 59

- 1. In Idle mode, select Contacts.
- 2. Select a contact's name.
- 3. Select the number that you want to dial.

#### To use the headset:

By plugging the supplied headset into the phone, you can make and answer calls:

- · Answer a call: Press the headset button.
- · Reject a call: Press and hold the headset button.
- Place a call on hold or retrieve a held call during a call: Press and hold the headset button.
- · End a call: Press the headset button.

The supplied headset is only designed to be used with for your phone and might not be compatible with other phones and MP3 players.

# Use options during a voice call

You can use the following options while a voice call is in progress:

- Adjust voice volume: Press the Volume key up or down.
- Place a call on hold: Select .
- Retrieve a held call: Select
- Dial a second number: Select Add call and then dial the new number.
- Answer a second call: Slide the Accept icon when the call waiting tone sounds. The new call is answered and the first call is placed on hold automatically. You must subscribe to a call waiting service to use this feature.
- · Open the dialing screen: Select Dialpad.

In noisy environments, you might have difficulty hearing some calls while using the speakerphone. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

# Use additional features



# Contacts

You can use contact cards and groups to store personal information in the phone's memory or on your SIM card. You can save names, mobile phone numbers, home phone numbers, email addresses, birthdays and more for your contacts.

# To add a contact to the contact list:

- 2. Select 🕀
- 3. Select a storage location.
- 4. Enter contact information.
- 5. Select Save to add the contact card to memory.

To create a contact from the dialer screen:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Phone → Dialer.
- 2. Enter a phone number.

- Select Add to Contacts  $\rightarrow$ 3
- 4. Select a memory location.
- Enter contact information 5
- 6. Select Save to add the contact to memory.

#### To import or export contacts:

- In Idle mode, select Contacts,
- 2. Press [ I=I ] → Import/Export.
- 3. Select an import or export option and press OK.

# To find a contact.

- In Idle mode, select Contacts.
- Scroll up or down in the contact list, tap the first letter of the name in the vertical letter list at the right side of the screen to move to that section of the list, or start entering the contact name in the search box.

#### To view the communication log:

#### To view social network activities:

You can view the recent activities of contacts in social network services, such as Facebook, MySpace, and Twitter.

# Calendar

You can create and manage daily, weekly, or monthly events, and set alarms to remind yourself of important events.

# To create an event:

- 4. Select Save.

# To change the calendar view:

# To view events of a specific date:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Calendar**.
- Select a date on the calendar. In the month view, days with scheduled events are indicated by a small triangle. To move to a specific day by entering a date manually, press [ □] → Go to, enter the date by selecting + or -, and select Set.

To select today's date, press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  Today.

3. Select an event to view its details.



You can send the event to others by pressing [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  Send via and select an option.

#### To stop an event alarm:

If you set an alarm for a calendar event, the event alarm icon will appear at the specified time.

## Memo

You can record important information to save and view later.

## web

Web services require a data connection. Contact your operator to choose the best data plan.

Web-based services such as Layar, Google Maps, Google Latitude, Places and YouTube may work differently from the description shown here due to changes in the online programs.

## Internet

You can access and bookmark your favourite web pages.



- You might incur additional charges for accessing the web and downloading media. For details, contact your service provider.
- Available icons can vary depending on your region.

#### To browse web pages:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Internet. The preset homepage opens.
- To access a specific web page, select the URL input field, enter the web address (URL) of the web page and select Go.

You can also select select read to open a list of saved bookmarks, frequently visited pages, and recent internet history.

While browsing web pages, you can use the following options:

- Zoom in or out: Double-tap the screen and select (a) or . You can also place two fingers on the screen and slowly pinch or spread them apart to zoom in or out.
- [ $\blacksquare$ ]  $\rightarrow$  New window: Open a new window.
- [□] → Brightness Setting: Adjust the brightness of the screen. This feature might be unavailable in your region.

- [r=1] → Windows: View the currently active windows. You can open multiple pages and switch back and forth between them.
- $[\square] \rightarrow \text{Refresh:}$  Reload the current web page.
- [ $\blacksquare$ ]  $\rightarrow$  Forward: Go to the next page in history.
- [ I=] ] → More → Add bookmark: Bookmark the current web page.
- [□] → More → Add shortcut to Home: Adds a shortcut to the current web page on the idle screen.
- [ □ → More → Add RSS feeds: Add an RSS feed. You can read RSS feeds using Google Reader.
- [□□] → More → Find on page: Search for text on the web page.
- [ □] → More → Page info: View the web page details.
- [□□] → More → Share page: Send the web address (URL) of the web page to others.

- [I=] → More → Downloads: View the download history.
- [I=] → More → Settings: customize the browser settings.

#### To bookmark your favourite web pages:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications → Internet.
- 2. Select Bookmarks.
- Select Add. To bookmark the web page you were viewing, press [ I=I ] → Bookmark last-viewed page.
- 4. Enter a page title and a web address (URL).
- 5. Select OK.

In the bookmark list, tap and hold a bookmark and use the following options:

- Open: Opens the web page.
- Open in new window: Open the web page in a new window.
- · Edit bookmark: Edit the bookmark details.
- Add shortcut to Home: Add the bookmark shortcut to the Idle screen.

- Share link: Send the web address (URL) of the web page to others.
- Copy link URL: Copy the web address (URL) of the web page.
- Delete bookmark: Delete the bookmark.
- Set as homepage: Use the web page as the homepage in the browser.

#### To add an RSS feed address:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Internet**.
- 2. Move to a web page that has an RSS feed.
- 3. Press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  More  $\rightarrow$  Add RSS feeds.

To access frequently visited pages or the recent history:

You can add a web page to the bookmark list by selecting the star icon on the right side of the screen.

## Google Search

You can search for information from websites using the Google Search service. The Google Search bar is added to your Idle screen by default.

You are then connected to the Google website.

## Layar

Layar allows you to browse locations for real-time local information or maps using the camera in your phone and to share the information with others.

In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Layar**. This feature might not be available in your region.

## Google Maps™

You can use Google Maps to find your location, search the online map for streets, cities, or countries, and get directions.

- To use Google Maps, you must select Settings → Location and security → Use wireless networks or Use GPS satellites.

#### To change the map view:

#### To search the map:

- 2. Drag your finger to scroll through the map.

- 2. Tap on the blue arrow and then tap My Location box.

- Select a travel route to view the details of your trip (if necessary).
- 6. For voice-guided navigation, select A Navigate.

To share your location using Google Latitude<sup>TM</sup>:

You can share your location with your friends and view your friend's locations using Google Latitude<sup>TM</sup>.

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Latitude**.
- Press [ I=I ] → Add friends and select an option.

 Select the friends that you want to add or enter an email address and select Add friends → Yes. When your friend accepts your invitation, you can share locations.

## YouTube™

YouTube is a free online video streaming service. You can view and share videos using YouTube.



This feature might not be available in your region.

#### To watch videos on YouTube:

You can get current weather and news information from the web.

To select the information displayed on the screen, press [ $\square$ ]  $\rightarrow$  .

## Market

You can download games, ringtones, or other applications from the Android Market.

- 2. Search for a file and download it to the phone. ► p. 26

## Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 10 metres without requiring a physical connection.

You do not need to line up the phones to beam information with Bluetooth. If the phones are within range of one another, you can exchange information between them even if they are located in different rooms.

- Samsung is not responsible for the loss, interception, or misuse of data sent or received using the Bluetooth wireless feature.
  - Always ensure that you share and receive data with phones that are trusted and properly secured. If there are obstacles between the phones, the operating distance may be reduced.

 Some phones, especially those that are not tested or approved by Bluetooth SIG, might not be compatible with your phone.

#### To turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Wireless and network → Bluetooth settings.
- Select Bluetooth to turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature. A green check mark appears at the right side to indicate that it is turned on.

#### To find and pair with other Bluetooth-enabled phones:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Wireless and network → Bluetooth settings → Scan devices.
- 2. Select a device.
- Enter a PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature or the other phone's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and select

**OK**. Alternatively, select Accept to match the PIN between your phone and the phone.

When the owner of the other phone enters the same PIN or accepts the connection, pairing is complete. If the pairing is successful, the phone will automatically search for available services.



Some phones, especially headsets or hands-free car kits, might have a fixed Bluetooth PIN, such as 0000. If the other phone has a PIN, you must enter it.

#### To send data using the Bluetooth wireless feature:

- Select a file or item, such as a contact, calendar event, memo, or media file, from an appropriate application or from My Files.
- 2. Press [ r=1 ]  $\rightarrow$  Share, Send via, or Send namecard via  $\rightarrow$  Bluetooth.
- 3. Search for and pair with a Bluetooth-enabled phone.

#### To receive data using the Bluetooth wireless feature:

 In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Wireless and network → Bluetooth settings → Visible.

Your phone is visible to other Bluetooth phones for 120 seconds.

- When prompted, enter the PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature and select **OK** (if necessary).
- If necessary, select Accept to confirm that you are willing to receive data from the other phone.

Received data is saved to the appropriate application or to a folder according to its type. For example, a music or sound clip is saved to the sound folder and a contact to the phonebook.

## Wi-Fi

You can use your phone's wireless networking capabilities to activate and connect to any wireless local area network (WLAN) compatible with the IEEE 802.11 b/g/n standards. You can connect to the internet or other network phones anywhere an access point or wireless hotspot is available.



Your phone uses non-harmonized frequency and therefore some countries might restrict the use of a WLAN.

#### To activate the WLAN feature:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Wireless and network  $\rightarrow$  Wi-Fi settings.
- Select Wi-Fi to turn on the wireless networking feature. A green check mark appears at the right side to indicate that it is turned on.



An active WLAN running in the background will consume battery power. To preserve battery power, only activate the WLAN when needed.

## To find and connect to a WLAN:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings. The phone will automatically search for available WLANs.
- 2. Select a network under Wi-Fi networks.
- 3. Enter a password for the network (if necessary).
- 4. Select Connect.

## To add a WLAN manually:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings → Add Wi-Fi network.
- 2. Enter the SSID for the network and select the security type.
- 3. Set the security settings depending on the selected security type.
- 4. Select Save.

## To connect to a WLAN using a Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS):

Using WPS, you can connect to a secured network.

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings.
- 2. Select WPS button connection.

Press a WPS button on the access point within two minutes.

#### To connect to a WLAN with a WPS PIN:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Wireless and network → Wi-Fi settings.
- 2. Select a network indicated by the WPS icon and select **WPS PIN**.
- 3. On the access point, enter the PIN and press the start button.

## AllShare

You can use the Digital Living Network Alliance (DLNA) service to share media files between DLNA-enabled phones in your home over a WLAN.

You must first activate the WLAN feature and add a WLAN profile. ► p. 76

## To customize DLNA settings for sharing media files:

To allow other DLNA-enabled phones to access media files on your phone, you must activate media sharing.



Some files may not play on the DLNA-enabled phones depending on the phones.

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **AllShare**.
- 2. Select Settings.
- Adjust the following settings to customize the DLNA feature:

#### To play your files on another DLNA-enabled phone:

- 5. Select a player (the one that will play the media file). Playback begins on the selected player.
- 6. Control playback using the icons on your phone.



Playback might be buffered, depending on the network connection and the connected server.

### To play others' files on your phone:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **AllShare**.
- Select Play file from server on my phone. Your phone automatically searches for DLNA-enabled phones.
- 3. Select a phone as the media server (the one that contains media files).
- 4. Select a media category and a file.
- 5. Control playback using the icons on your phone.

#### To play files from one phone on the other phone:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **AllShare**.
- 2. Select Play file from server on another player via my phone.

Your phone automatically searches for DLNA-enabled phones.

- 3. Select a phone to be the media server (the one that contains the media files).
- 4. Select a media category and a file.
- 5. Select a player (the one that will play the media file). Playback begins at the selected player.
- 6. Control playback using the icons on your phone.

## Mobile AP

The Mobile AP feature sets your phone to be a wireless AP (Access Point) to connect to the internet on other network phones.

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Wireless and network  $\rightarrow$  Mobile AP.
- 2. Select Mobile AP to activate the Mobile AP feature.
- 3. Select Yes to confirm.

To change settings, select Mobile AP settings.

- - To protect your wireless access point from unauthorized connection, change the security setting to WPA2 PSK and create a password that must be entered on all devices accessing the AP.
- From another phone, locate your phone's name in the available connection list and connect to the network. If WPA2 PSK security is enabled, enter the appropriate password in the WPA field.

## TV Connections (TV Out Mode)

You can connect your phone to a TV and view the phone's interface on the TV screen.

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Display → TV out.
- 2. Select TV out to activate TV out mode.
- 3. Select TV system.
- 4. Select a video encoding system according to your region.

## PC Connections

You can connect your phone to a PC in various USB connection modes: you can use the Samsung Kies program to update the phone's firmware, synchronize files with Windows Media Player, transfer data to and from your phone directly, or use your phone as a wireless modem.

#### To connect with Samsung Kies:

Ensure that Samsung Kies is installed on your PC. You can download the program from the Samsung website (www.samsungmobile.com).

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Applications → USB settings → Samsung Kies.
- 2. Press [ 1] to return to Idle mode.
- 3. Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC.

 Run Samsung Kies and use wireless connections to copy data and files.
 Refer to the Samsung Kies help for more information.

## To synchronize with Windows Media Player:

Ensure that Windows Media Player is installed on your PC.

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Applications → USB settings → Media player.
- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC on which Windows Media Player is installed.
   When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.
- 4. Open Windows Media Player to synchronize the music files.
- 5. Edit or enter your phone's name in the pop-up window (if necessary).

- 6. Select and drag music files to the sync list.
- 7. Start synchronization.

#### To connect as a mass storage phone:

You can connect your phone to a PC as a removable disk and access its file directory. If you insert a memory card into the phone, you can also access the file directory of the memory card by using the phone as a memory card reader.



The file directory of the memory card will appear as a removable disk.

- 1. If you want to transfer files to or from a memory card, insert a memory card into the phone.
- In Idle mode, select Applications → Settings → Applications → USB settings → Mass storage.

- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC. When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.
- 5. Open the folder to view the files.
- 6. Copy files from the PC to the memory card.
  - To disconnect the phone from the PC, click the Safely Remove Hardware and Eject Media icon in the Windows task bar and select Eject SAMSUNG\_Android. Disconnect the phone when the Safe to Remove Hardware message appears. Then disconnect the PC data cable from the PC. Otherwise, you might lose data stored on the memory card or damage the memory card.

## USB Tethering

You can set your phone as a wireless modem for PC's and share your phone's mobile network connection via USB.

## Clock

You can set and control alarms for important events and set various world clocks. You can also use the stopwatch and count-down timer.

#### To set a new alarm:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Clock  $\rightarrow$  Alarm.
- 2. Select Create alarm or press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  Create.
- 3. Set the alarm details.
- 4. When you are finished, select Save.



If you set **Smart alarm**, your phone will play a natural sound and display the alarm screen until the set alarm goes off.

#### To stop an alarm:

When an alarm sounds:

- To stop the alarm, drag I right until it reaches the dot.
- To repeat the alarm after a specified length of time, drag i right until it reaches the dot.

#### To delete an alarm:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Clock**  $\rightarrow$  **Alarm**.
- 2. Press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  Delete.
- 3. Select the alarms that you want to delete.
- 4. Select Delete.

#### To create a world clock:

- In Idle mode, select Applications → Clock → World clock.
- 2. Select Add city or press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  Add.
- 3. Enter a city name or select one from the city list.

To select a city in the world map view, select in .

- 4. To add more world clocks, repeat steps 2 and 3.
  - To allow clock adjustment for daylight savings time, tap and hold the clock for the city and select **DST** settings. Touch a setting (Automatic, Off, 1 hour, 2 hours).

### To use the stopwatch:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Clock  $\rightarrow$  Stopwatch.

You can keep a photo diary on your phone.

#### To create a Mini Diary:

To upload a mini diary to your community website, press [ r=1 ]  $\rightarrow$  **Publish**.

## Files

You can quickly and easily access all of your images, videos, music, sound clips, and other types of files stored in your phone and on a memory card.

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Files**.
- 2. Select a folder and then select a file.

In a folder, press [ I=I ] to use the following options:

- Share: Share files with others via AllShare, Messaging, Bluetooth, Picasa, Email, Samsung Email, Gmail, or YouTube.
- Create folder: Create a new folder.
- · Delete: Delete files or folders.
- · View by: Change the view mode.
- · List by: Sort files or folders.
- More: Use additional features when using a file, such as Move, Copy, Rename, Bluetooth visibility and Settings.

## ThinkFree Office

You can view and edit document files on a memory card in your phone. If you have an account with the ThinkFree and Google Docs™ web services, you can manage documents online. This application supports the following file formats:.txt, .doc, .docx, .xls, .xlsx, .ppt, .pptx, and .pdf.

#### To create a new document:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **ThinkFree Office**.
- If you are launching this application for the first time, select Accept to confirm activation. Select Activate now to activate the application on your phone.
- 3. Select My Docs.
- 4. Press [  $\blacksquare$  ]  $\rightarrow$  New and select a document type.
- 5. Enter a name for the document and select OK.
- 6. Enter contents in the document using the tools at the bottom of the screen.

#### To view and edit a document on your phone:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **ThinkFree Office**.
- 2. Select My Docs and then select a document.

- 3. Select a text encoding type (if necessary).
- 4. View and edit the document.
  - To move between pages or pan through the document, scroll in the corresponding direction.

- · around high-voltage or electromagnetic fields
- · in a vehicle with tinted windows

## Voice Search

You can search for information on the web by voice.

- 1. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Voice Search.
- Say a keyword into the microphone. The device searches for information and web pages related to the keyword.

## Kobo

The kobo application allows you to easily download and read book files.

#### Read a book file:

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Applications**  $\rightarrow$  **Kobo**.
- 2. Sign in if you already have an account or create a new account if you are new to kobo.
- Once you are signed in, your reading list is displayed. Select a book from your reading list. The file opens.
- To move the pages, tap near the left or right edge of the device or sweep your finger across the screen. You can also tap the centre of the screen and use the slider bar to move to the required page.
- To add a note or highlight text and add it to the Highlights list, tap and hold on the screen and tap Select Text.

- To launch widgets, tap and hold the empty area on the idle screen and select **Samsung Widgets** from the list.

- RAM manager: shows the amount of RAM (random access memory) in use and available. You can also clear the memory.

## **Bluetooth settings**

- Bluetooth: Turn the Bluetooth wireless feature on or off.
   p. 74
- Device name: Set a Bluetooth name for your phone.
- Visible: Set your phone to be visible to other Bluetooth phones.
- · Scan devices: Search for available Bluetooth devices.

## Tethering

Activate the USB tethering feature to share your device's mobile network connection with PC's via USB. When connected to a PC, your device is used as a wireless modem for a PC.  $\blacktriangleright$  p. 84

## VPN settings

Set up and manage Virtual Private Networks (VPNs).

## Mobile networks

- Use packet data: Set to allow packet switched data networks for network services.
- Data roaming: Set the phone to connect to another network when you are roaming or when your home network is not available.
- Access Point Names: Set access point names (APNs).

- Network mode: select the type of network the phone should operate on: GSM/WCDMA (auto mode), GSM only, or WCDMA only.
- Network operators: Search for available networks and select a network for roaming.

## Call Settings

Customize the settings for calling features.

## All calls

- Show my number: Show your mobile phone number to recipients. (You must insert the SIM card to use this feature.)
- Auto reject: Enable or disable the auto reject feature and specify a list of callers to automatically reject.
- Answering call: Set how to answer calls by pressing any key or set the phone to answer automatically after a specified amount of time.

  - Calibration may not be possible in areas with strong magnetic fields. If the calibration fails, move to another area and try again.
  - If you enter an area with strong magnetic fields after calibration, your phone will automatically attempt to recalibrate the geomagnetic sensor.
  - The geomagnetic sensor in your phone does not support the bird's-eye view, which fixes the direction. Therefore, a small error may occur in measuring angles and cause a map to be turned upside down.

### Location and Security

 Background data: Allows applications to sync, send, and receive data at any time (required in order to use the auto sync feature).  Auto-sync: Set the phone to automatically synchronize contact, calendar, and email data.

### Privacy

Change the settings for managing your settings and data.

- Back up my data: Back up your phone's current settings to the Google server.
- Automatic restore: When reinstalling an application, backed up settings and data will be restored.
- Factory data reset: Reset your settings to the factory default values.

### SD Card and Phone Storage

Check used and available storage space for an External SD card and internal phone storage.

### SD card

- Total space: View the total amount of storage space.
- Available space: View the amount of available storage space.
- Unmount/Mount SD card: Unmount the SD card for safe removal or before formatting, mount to allow use.
- Format SD card: Format (erase) the SD card.

### Application storage

 Available space: View the amount of available application storage space.

### Locale and Text

Change the settings for text input.

### Select locale

Select a display language for all menus and applications, and a writing language for all text editors.

### Select Input Method

Select your preferred method of inputting text using **Swype** or the **Samsung keypad**.

### Swype

· Language: Select a language for text input.



You cannot enter text in some languages. To enter text, you should change the writing language to one of the supported languages.

# troubleshooting

If you are having trouble with your mobile phone, try these troubleshooting procedures before contacting a service professional.

When you turn on your phone or while you are using the phone, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the phone's lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password that you set for the phone.
PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM card. You can disable this feature using the Lock SIM card menu.

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
PUK	Your SIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
PIN2	When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

## Your phone displays "Service unavailable" or "Network error"

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you might lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

### The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen. Protective covers might prevent the phone from recognising your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen phones.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.

- Restart your phone to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your phone's software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, take it to your local Samsung Service Centre.

### Your phone freezes or has fatal errors

If your phone freezes or hangs, you might need to close programs or reset the phone to regain functionality. If your phone is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold [ $\bigcirc$ ] for 8-10 seconds. The phone will reboot automatically.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. In Idle mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Settings  $\rightarrow$  Privacy  $\rightarrow$  Factory data reset  $\rightarrow$  Reset phone  $\rightarrow$  Erase everything.

### Calls are being dropped

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you might lose your connection to the network. Move to another area and try again.

### Outgoing calls are not connected

- Ensure that you have pressed the Call key.
- Ensure that you have accessed the correct cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialing.

### Incoming calls are not connected

- · Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the correct cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

### Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

### Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you might lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

### When dialing from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- · Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.

### The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes

• Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

### The battery does not charge properly or the phone turns off

- The battery terminals might be dirty. Wipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery (refer to your local bylaws for proper disposal instructions).

### Your phone is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your phone for an extended period of time, your phone may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.

### Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung phone must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Restart the phone. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

### Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files might not play on your Samsung phone for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your phone, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRM protected, ensure that you have the appropriate license or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your phone supports the file type.

### Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your phone.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device that you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your phone and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 metres).
- If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

### A connection is not established when you connect the phone to a PC

- Ensure that the PC data cable you are using is compatible with your phone.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and to ensure peak performance of your mobile phone. Getting the Most Out of Your Reception

### **Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength**

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

### **Understanding How Your Phone Operates**

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

### **Knowing Radio Frequency Safety**

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below. In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993. the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

### Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

There are several simple guidelines for operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- · Speak directly into the mouthpiece.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a dealer store or call Customer Support for service.

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For the best care of your phone, only authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

# Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

Failure to follow the instructions outlined may lead to serious personal injury and possible property damage.



Excessive exposure to sound at high volumes can cause hearing damage. Always turn the volume down before plugging the headphones into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

### **Using Your Phone While Driving**

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free phone) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

When using your phone in the car:

- Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and re-dial.
- · When available, use a hands-free phone.
- · Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.
- Dial 911 to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- · Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

### **Following Safety Guidelines**

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

## Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical phones, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.



Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

### **Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying**

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

### **Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas**

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF phones to set off explosives.

Turn off your phone when you are in an area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it is rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. These areas include:

- · Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- · Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.



Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.



Do not use your device during a thunderstorm. Your device may malfunction and your risk of electric shock is increased.

### **Restricting Children's Access to your Phone**

Your phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone, dial 911 by mistake or make calls that increase your phone bill.

### Warning Regarding Display

The display on your handset is made of glass or acrylic and could break if your handset is dropped or if it receives significant impact. Do not use if screen is broken or cracked as this could cause injury to you.

### **Protecting Your Battery**

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Samsung approved batteries and desktop chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- · Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- · Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- · Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.

- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. When used correctly, the battery can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules: Less than one month:
