This section walks you through setting up service for your PCS Phone, unlocking your phone, setting up your voicemail, and how to contact Sprint for assistance with your PCS Service.

## **Getting Started With PCS Service**

#### **Determine if Your Phone is Already Activated**

If you received your phone in the mail or purchased it at a Sprint Store, it probably has been activated. All you need to do is unlock your phone.

If your phone is not activated, please refer to the Start Here Guide included with your phone.

#### **Unlocking Your Phone**

Follow these steps to unlock your phone:

1. Press (ND/O) to turn the phone on.

2. Press Unlock (left softkey).

Note: The left and right softkey buttons are located directly above the and a located buttons, respectively, and they correspond with the softkey actions shown on the bottom line of your phone's display screen. Softkey actions change according to the screen you're viewing and will not appear if there is no corresponding action available.

**3.** Enter your four-digit lock code. For security purposes, the code is not visible as you type.

Tip: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of either your Social Security number or PCS Phone Number or try 0000. If none of these work, call PCS Customer Service Solutions<sup>™</sup> at 1-888-211-4PCS (4727).

#### **Activating Your Phone**

To activate your phone, follow the directions in the Start Here Guide included with your phone.

# **Setting Up Your Voicemail**

All unanswered calls to your PCS Phone are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. Therefore, you will want to set up your voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your PCS Phone is activated.

To set up voicemail:

- 1. Press and hold

# **Your PCS Phone: The Basics**

Your PCS Phone is packed with features that simplify your life and expand your ability to stay connected to the people and information that are important to you. This section will guide you through the basic functions and calling features of your phone.

## **Front View of Phone**



#### Your Phone's Features

- **1. Side Camera Key:** Press to display Camera mode. Lets you mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls.
- **2. Volume Keys:** Lets you adjust the receiver volume during a call, or ringer volume in Standby mode. Lets you mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls.
- **3. Headset Jack:** Insert the plug of the headset (sold separately) for hands-free listening.
- 4. LED (green/red light): Incoming Call = Green blinks/ Notification (Message, Voicemail, Alerts, etc.) = Red blinks.
- **5. Camera Lens:** This built-in camera lens allows you to use auto focus function.

- **6. Sub LCD:** Lets you monitor the phone's status and see who's calling without opening the phone.
- 7. Main LCD (display): Displays the phone's main menu, features, modes, etc.
- **8. Softkey (left):** Lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom left line on the Main LCD.
- 9. Navigation Key: Lets you navigate quickly and easily through the menu options. Press ▲ or ▼ of the Navigation key to adjust the receiver volume during a call. It takes a shortcut to the menu by pressing, ►=Phone Book (Find Name),
  - $\blacktriangleleft$ =My Shortcut,  $\blacktriangle$ =Share Picture and  $\blacktriangledown$ =Downloads.
- **10. MENU/OK:** Lets you see the phone's menus and select menu options.
- 11. Camera Key: Lets you see Pictures menu.
- **12. TALK:** Lets you place a call, receive a call, answer Call Waiting, use Three-Way Calling and Voice Dial.
- **13. Standard Charger Jack:** Connect the Sprint Standardized Charger (sold separately). Please ask a Sprint Store for this charger.
- **14. Accessories Connector:** Connect the charging accessories such as Travel Charger (included), Desktop Charger or PCS Wireless Connection Kit (sold separately).
- **15. Number Keys:** Lets you enter numbers, letters and characters, and navigate within menus. Press and hold 2-9 key to make a Speed Dial call.
- **16. END/POWER:** Turns the phone ON and OFF. Lets you disconnect a call while talking or mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls.
- **17. BACK:** Allows you to clear characters from the screen, mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls or display Time/Date while the phone is in use.
- **18. Softkey (right):** Lets you select the menu corresponding to the bottom right line on the Main LCD.

# **Viewing the Display Screen**

This list identifies the symbols you'll see on your display screen.

- ► T<sub>ill</sub> shows your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal.
- ▶ 🔀 means your phone cannot find a signal.
- ▶ ∥ tells you a call is in progress.
- ▶ ∯ indicates PCS Vision access is dormant.
- ▶ indicates PCS Vision access is active.
- ▶ 🐂 indicates PCS Vision access is disabled.
- ▶ 🖾 indicates you have text messages waiting.
- ▶ 🖾 indicates you have voicemail messages waiting. Press and hold 🖭 to call your voicemail box.
- ► Im indicates you have text messages and voicemail messages waiting.
- ► 🔝 indicates you are "roaming" off the Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.
- ► We shows the level of your battery charge. The more black you see, the more power you have left. It turns the while charging.
- ▶ 📲 indicates you have menus to scroll (in four directions).
- ▶ 🖬 indicates the vibrate feature is set to ON.
- ▶ 📳 indicates volume level 4 and vibrate feature is set to ON.
- $\blacktriangleright$   $\oplus$  indicates the Location Service of your phone is enabled.
- ▶ 1 indicates the Location Service of your phone is disabled.
- ▶ 🖬 indicates you have new caller's message.
- ▶ ¶<sup>0</sup> indicates the Screen Call Auto setting is ON.
- ▶ 🔄 indicates you have new downloaded data.
- indicates self timer is on in Camera mode.

- ▶ 2 indicates selected picture has stored in Picture Wallet.
- ▶ 🔄 indicates selected picture has uploaded.
- ▶ ☐ indicates selected picture has assigned to Screen Saver, Incoming Calls or Phone Book.

**Tip:** Display indicators let you know when you're off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network and whether you're operating in digital or analog mode.

- Dual band/tri mode capability provides access to other PCS Digital and Analog Networks where Sprint has implemented roaming agreements (pages 62-63).
- PCS Vision<sup>w</sup> provides access to the wireless Internet in digital mode (pages 159-191).
- PCS Mail and Short Mail provide quick and convenient text messaging capabilities (pages 177-179).
- ▶ PCS Connection Kit<sup>™</sup> offers wireless modem capabilities for your personal computer in digital mode (pages 166-167).
- PCS Voice Command<sup>®</sup> lets you dial phone numbers by speaking someone's name or the digits in their phone number (pages 193-195).
- Downloadable ringers, screen savers (image), games and more allow you to turn down time into fun time and to personalize your phone (pages 182-189).
- ► The built-in scheduler lets you schedule alerts to remind you of important events (pages 96-104).
- Speed Dialing lets you call the phone number stored in the Phone Book by one touch dialing (pages 92-93).
- Phone Book can store up to 300 names, 500 phone numbers, 300 Email addresses, and 300 Web addresses. Each entry can contain 7 phone numbers, 1 Email, 1 Web, Ringer and Image (section 2G).
- Built-in camera allows you to take a picture. You can also send to your friends and family a photo sharing site for storage, upload pictures to a personal Web site, or send images to a site for printing (pages 131-145).

# **Turning Your Phone ON and OFF**

#### **Turning Your Phone ON**

To turn your phone on, press END/0.

Once your phone is ON, it displays "Looking for service..." which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters standby mode – the phone's idle state. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode.

In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for PCS Service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned ON).

**Tip:** The Power Save feature helps to conserve your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

#### **Turning Your Phone OFF**

Press (1000) for two seconds until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

# **Using the Battery**

#### **Battery Capacity**

Your PCS Phone is equipped with a Lithium Ion (LiIon) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained. The battery provides approximately 2.8 hours of continuous digital talk time (1.4 hours in analog) or approximately 10.7 days of continuous digital standby time (14 hours in analog). When the battery reaches 5% of its capacity, the battery icon appears. When there are approximately five minutes of talk time left, the phone sounds an audible alert and then powers down.


**Note:** Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, and browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

**Tip:** Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

#### Installing the Battery

Your PCS Phone comes with a LiIon battery. Follow these steps to install it:


- **1.** Place the battery into the space beneath the antenna with the metal contacts at the bottom, facing downward.
- **2.** Gently press down until it's in place and the battery release latch snaps.



**Removing the Battery** 

To remove your battery, follow these easy steps:

- **1.** Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.
- 2. Push the battery release latch up and hold the battery.
- **3**. Then pull it up and out at a 45-degree angle.



#### **Charging the Battery**

Your PCS Phone comes with a rechargeable battery. You should charge the battery as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off and you will lose all the information you were just working on. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of your phone's display screen. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon appears and the phone sounds a warning tone.

Always use a Sprint-approved desktop charger, travel charger, or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

**Warning!** Using the wrong battery charger could cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.

#### **Using the Travel Charger**

To use the travel charger provided with your phone:

- **1.** Plug the travel charger into a wall outlet.
- **2.** Plug the other end of the travel charger into the bottom of your phone (with the battery installed).
- Charging when your phone is turned on: The battery icon appears on the display while charging. The battery icon turns to w when charging is complete.
- ► Charging when your phone is turned off: The battery icon ← appears, and the message "BATTERY CHARGING-Power Off-" is shown on the display while charging. When the battery is completely discharged, you may wait for several minutes until the message is shown on the display. The battery icon turns to ∰ , and message changes to "CHARGING COMPLETE-Power Off-" when charging is complete.

It takes approximately 3.5 hours to fully recharge a completely rundown battery. With the Sprint-approved LiIon battery, you can recharge the battery before it becomes completely run down.

# **Displaying Your Phone Number**

Just in case you forget your phone number, your PCS Phone can remind you.

To display your phone number:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Info and press ( 2.)
- 3. Highlight Phone# UserID and press (Ser.).
- User ID also appears on the display if you sign in.

**Note:** To access the phone's main menu, press (F) from standby mode. Menu items may be selected by highlighting them with the Navigation key and pressing (F), or you can press the number corresponding to the menu item on your keypad.

# **Making and Answering Calls**

## **Making Calls**

Your PCS Phone offers many different ways to make calls, including PCS Voice Command<sup>®</sup> (pages 193-195), Speed Dialing (pages 92-93), and using Call History (pages 71-75).


To make a call using your keypad:

- **1.** Make sure your phone is on.
- **2.** Enter a phone number. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press **BACK** to erase one digit at a time. Press and hold **BACK** to erase the entire number.)
- 3. Press TALK. (To make a call when you are roaming and Call Guard is enabled, press (), highlight Roam Call and press (). See "Call Guard" on page 65.)
- 4. When you're finished, press (ND/O).

Tip: To redial your last outgoing call, press TALK twice.

**Tip:** When making calls off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network, always dial using 11 digits (1 + area code + phone number).

**Important:** When you use your PCS Phone to maximize performance, extend the antenna and do not touch the antenna (see pages 201-202).



### **Answering Calls**

- **1.** Make sure your phone is on. If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.
- 2. When a call comes in, answer the call by pressing TALK.Depending on your settings, your PCS Phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:
- ► The phone rings or vibrates.
- ▶ The LED flashes.
- ▶ The backlight illuminates.
- The screen displays an incoming call message.
- ▶ If available, the phone number of the caller is displayed.
- ► If the phone number is in your Internal Phone Book, the Phone Book entry's name is displayed.

The following options are also displayed by pressing **WRP**. To select an option, highlight it and press **WRP**.

- **Call Guard** to answer the call while you are in roaming. See "Call Guard" on page 65.
- **Answer** to answer the call.
- **Don't Answer** to hang up the incoming call and return to Web while you are in the Web operation. (This feature appears when PCS Vision access is dormant.)

- ► Screen Call to answer the call by using pre-recorded announcement. (This feature appears when you are in Sprint Service area or digital roaming area.) See pages 127-129 for setting up.
- Quiet Ringer to mute the ringer. (This feature appears when the ringer is set.)

To answer a call when you are roaming and Call Guard is enabled, you must press (R), highlight **Answer** and press (R) to answer the call. See "Call Guard" on page 65.

Note: If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.

**3.** To disconnect the call, press **END/0**.

## **Changing Ringer Volume**

To change the ringer volume, adjust the Volume keys when the phone is in Standby mode.

**Note:** To change the ringer volume from the main menu, see "Adjusting the Phone's Volume Settings" on page 34.

## **Adjusting Volume During a Conversation**

Whether you need to hear more or less of a conversation, adjust the Volume keys or press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  of the Navigation key during a call.

## **Muting a Call**

There are times when it's necessary to mute a call so that your caller does not hear you or certain background noise.

To use this function during a call:

Press (MR), highlight Mute and press (MR). When the phone is muted, "Mute" appears on the display.

To unmute a call:

▶ Press (MEND), highlight **Unmute** and press (MEND).

## **Missed Call Notification**

When an incoming call is not answered, your phone displays the Missed Call Notification. You can view the number of Missed Calls and the last caller's name on the screen.

To call the last missed call:

Simply press TALK.

To display the list of Missed Calls:

Press any key except TALK, then press View (left softkey). To make a call from the list, highlight an entry you wish to call and press TALK.

> You cannot return calls to entries listed as No Caller ID.

**Note:** If the phone is locked, you need to press **Unlock** (left softkey), then enter the lock code and press **View** (left softkey).

### **Calling Emergency Numbers**

You can place calls to 911 (dial **9 1 1** and press **TALK**), even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted. Once the dial is made, you will enter Emergency mode. The phone tries to dial to 911 automatically until the dial will be connected. While you are in the Emergency mode, all phone calls can be received.

To exit from the Emergency mode, follow these instructions:

1. Press END/O.

**2**. Press **(Mar)** to display the options.

3. Highlight Exit Emergency and press

## **Dialing Options**

Dialing options are displayed when you press (IP) after entering numbers in the Standby mode.

To select an option, highlight it and press .

- **Call** to dial the phone number. (If you are roaming and have the Call Guard feature activated, you need to take an extra step. See "Call Guard" on page 65.)
- Save Phone# to save the phone number in your Internal Phone Book. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 24.)
- ► **Hard Pause** to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 25.)
- ► **12-Sec. Pause** to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 25.)
- ► **Hyphen** to insert a hyphen manually where you like however, they are mainly for show.

**Tip:** To Speed Dial a phone number, press and hold the appropriate Speed Dial location from 2-9. See pages 92-93 for setting.

This option appears when you enter 4-digit and press (

• Abbrev. Dial to dial the phone number in your Internal Phone Book that ends with the four digits you enter. (See "Four-Digit Dialing" on page 26.)

This option appears when you enter four or more digits and press (BR).

► Find to display Internal Phone Book entries that ends with the digits you enter. (See "Finding a Phone Number" on page 25.)

## **In-Call Options**

During a call, your phone displays menu options by pressing .

To select an option, highlight it and press ().

- ▶ **Flash** to answer an incoming Call Waiting call or connect a third party during Three-Way Calling.
- Mute or Unmute

Select **Mute** to mute your phone's microphone. Select **Unmute** to reactivate the microphone.

- **Three -Way Call** to call a third party.
- ► **Call History** to use like a main menu. (See "Managing Call History" on pages 71-75.)
- ▶ **Phone Book** to use like a main menu. (See "Using the Internal Phone Book" on pages 77-93.)
- Messaging to use like a main menu. (See "Messaging" on pages 168-176.)
- **Voicemail** to use like a main menu. (See pages 150-155.)
- Settings to use like a main menu. (See "Controlling Your Phone's Settings" on pages 29-51.)
- ► **Calendar** to use like a main menu. (See "Calendar" menu instructions on pages 96-104.)
- ▶ VoiceServices to use like a main menu. (See pages 121-129.)
- ▶ Phone Info to use like a main menu. (See page 105.)

**Note:** Flash menu appears in Call Waiting and Three-Way Call. Mute menu does not appear during a 911 call. Three-Way Call Menu does not appear in Roaming area.

## **End-of-Call Options**

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is not in your Internal Phone Book, the phone number and the duration of the call is displayed. You can display the following menu options by pressing I within 10 seconds after disconnecting the call.

To select an option, highlight it and press (MRW).

- **Call Again** to dial the phone number.
- ► **Save Phone#** to save the phone number in your Internal Phone Book. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 24.)

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is in your Internal Phone Book, the Phone Book entry name, phone number and the duration of the call are displayed. You can display the following menu options by pressing ( ) within 10 seconds after disconnecting the call.

To select an option, highlight it and press .

- **Call Again** to dial the phone number.
- Alternate to save the other phone number into the same entry in your Internal Phone Book.

**Note:** The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as No ID or Restricted.

### **Saving a Phone Number**

Your PCS Phone can store a total of 500 phone numbers in 300 Internal Phone Book entries. Each Phone Book entry can store seven phone numbers, and the entry's name can contain 16 characters. Your phone automatically sorts the Internal Phone Book entries alphabetically.

To save a number from the main menu:

- **1**. Enter a phone number.
- 2. Press MENU .
- 3. Highlight Save Phone# and press (Sec. 2010).
- 4. Select a label by highlighting **Home**, **Work**, **Mobile**, **Pager**, **Data**, **Fax** or **No Label** and press **Mathematical Selection**.
- 5. Enter a Name and press (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on pages 79-83.) Or you can also save the phone number without a name by pressing (See from the name entry display, highlighting **Yes** and then pressing (See If you have already stored entries in the Phone Book, you are prompted to select the following entry modes:
- New Name to enter a name directly.
- **From Ph. Book** to select a name from Phone Book entry list.
- 6. Press Save (left softkey).

After you have saved the number, the new Internal Phone Book entry is displayed. (See "Internal Phone Book Entry Options" on page 78.)

## **Finding a Phone Number**

You can search Internal Phone Book entries for phone numbers that ends with the digits you entered.

To find a phone number:

- 1. Enter four or more digits and press (R). The more numbers you enter, the more specific the search becomes.
- 2. Highlight **Find** and press **MEND**.
- **3.** The Phone Book entry list that ends with the digits you entered appears.
- 4. Highlight your desired entry. Press () to display the entry details.

Press TALK to dial.

## **Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses**

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers. If you select a hard pause, the next set of numbers are sent when you press **TAUK**. If you select a 2-second pause, your phone automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

**Note:** You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

To dial or save phone numbers with pauses:

- 1. Enter the phone number and press ().
- **2.** Highlight either **Hard Pause** or **2-Sec. Pause** and press **CRP**. Hard Pauses are displayed as a "H" and 2-second pauses as a "T".
- 3. Enter additional numbers.
- 4. Press (MEW), highlight **Call** to dial the number or **Save Phone#** to save the number in your Internal Phone Book and press (MEW).

When dialing a number with a hard pause, press () and highlight **Send Tone** and press () to send the next set of numbers.

## **Four-Digit Dialing**

Enter four digits and press (R) to display the 4-Digit Dialing option. If you select **Abbrev. Dial**, your phone dials the phone number in your Internal Phone Book that ends with the four digits you entered. See "Setting Abbreviated Dialing" on page 49.

To use 4-Digit Dialing:

- **1.** Dial the last four digits of an Internal Phone Book entry's phone number.
- **2**. Press to display the menu options.
- 3. Highlight Abbrev. Dial and press (MRV) or (TALK)

**Note:** 4-Digit Dialing dials the first number in your Internal Phone Book that matches the four digits.

## **Dialing From the Internal Phone Book**

To dial directly from an Internal Phone Book entry:

- **1.** Press **Merry** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Book and press
- 3. Highlight **Find Name** and press **CERP**.

Shortcut: Press the right Navigation key to list entries.

- **4.** Use your Navigation key to scroll through the Phone Book list and highlight one of the appropriate entries and press **MRP**.
- 5. Highlight the number you wish to call.
- **6**. Press **Options** (right softkey) for the menu options.
- 7. Highlight **Call** and press .
- For more options, see "Internal Phone Book Entry Options" on page 78.

Tip: You can also make a call by pressing  $\fboxtime{Call}$  (left softkey) during step 5 above.

## **Using One-Touch Speed Dialing**

With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 2-9. (See pages 92-93 for storing a Speed Dial number.)

To use One-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 2-9:

Press and hold the appropriate key for few seconds. The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Connecting...".

**Reminder:** To access the phone's main menu, press (WWP) from standby mode. Menu items may be selected by highlighting them with the Navigation key and pressing (WWP).

# **Sound Settings**

## **Ringer Types**

Ringer types help you identify incoming calls and messages. You can assign ringer types to individual phone book entries, types of calls, and types of messages.

- Preprogrammed Ringers include a variety of standard ringer types and familiar music.
- Vibrating Ringer alerts you to calls or messages without disturbing others.
- **Downloaded Ringers** can be downloaded right to your phone. (See "Downloading Ringers" on page 186.)

#### **Selecting Ringer Types for Voice Calls**

Your PCS Phone provides a variety of ringer options which allow you to customize your ring and volume settings.

To select a ringer type for voice calls so you recognize when a certain type of call is coming in by the ringer:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Settings** and press **MENU**.
- 3. Highlight Sounds and press (MENU).
- 4. Highlight **Ringer Type** and press **MP**.
- 5. Highlight Voice Calls and press (SP).
- 6. Select the menu under With Caller ID, No Caller ID or Roaming and press (MR).
- 7. Highlight your desired ringer type and press ().
- Get New: start up a Browser and you can select an item to download. (See page 112.)
- Multimedia: to set the ringer downloaded by Multimedia Master (see page 107 for downloading).

#### **Selecting Ringer Types for Voicemail**

To select a ringer type for voicemail:

- **1**. Press **WERU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight Sounds and press
- 4. Highlight Ringer Type and press ().
- 5. Highlight Voicemail and press (SP).
- 6. Select the menu under **Voicemail** and press (MRP).
- 7. Highlight your desired ringer type and press ().
- Get New: start up a Browser and you can select an item to download. (See page 112.)
- Multimedia: to set the ringer downloaded by Multimedia Master (see page 107 for downloading).

#### **Selecting Ringer Types for Messages**

To select a ringer type for messages:

- **1**. Press **()** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRW).
- 3. Highlight **Sounds** and press **MRP**.
- 4. Highlight **Ringer Type** and press (MRP).
- 5. Highlight Messaging and press
- 6. Select the menu under **Messaging** and press (MRW).
- 7. Highlight your desired ringer type and press 🕮.
- Get New: start up a Browser and you can select an item to download. (See page 112.)
- Multimedia: to set the ringer downloaded by Multimedia Master (see page 107 for downloading).

#### **Selecting Ringer Types for Calendar**

To select a ringer types for calendar:

- **1**. Press **(BP)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (SEP).
- 3. Highlight **Sounds** and press **EXP**.
- 4. Highlight **Ringer Type** and press **EXP**.
- 5. Highlight **Calendar** and press (1987).
- 6. Select the menu under **Calendar** and press ().
- 7. Highlight your desired type and press (MRP).
- Get New: start up a Browser and you can select an item to download. (See page 112.)
- Multimedia: to set the ringer downloaded by Multimedia Master (see page 107 for downloading).

## **Selecting a Tone Length**

Longer tone lengths may be better for tone recognitions when dialing voicemail or other automated systems.

To select a tone length:

- 1. Press ( to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRC).
- 3. Highlight **Sounds** and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight **Others** and press **Mere**.
- 5. Select the menu under **Tone Length** and press ().
- 6. Highlight **Short** or **Long** and press (MRC).

## Setting a Start-up/Power-off Tone

- **1**. Follow the steps 1 to 4 above.
- 2. Select the menu under **Start-up Tone** or **Power-off Tone** and press ().
- **3.** Highlight your desired option and press (MENU).
- Get New: start up a Browser and you can select an item to download. (See page 112.)
- **Multimedia:** to set the ringer downloaded by Multimedia Master (see page 107 for downloading).

**Tip:** The volume of the Start-up Tone and Power-off Tone can be set through the volume setting. See page 34 for instructions.

## **Using Voice Prompt**

This feature allows you to hear voice prompts at Voice Memo, Screen Call setting or Voice Dial etc. (Default Setting is On).

To deactivate this feature:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight Sounds and press ().
- 4. Highlight **Others** and press **(1989)**.
- 5. Select the menu under Voice Prompt and press (SEP).
- 6. Highlight Off and press MENU.

**Tip:** When ringer volume is set to "Silence All", voice prompts cannot be heard.

## **Adjusting the Phone's Volume Settings**

To adjust the ringer/key volume:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (SEP).
- 3. Highlight **Sounds** and press (MP).
- 4. Highlight Ringer/Key Vol and press (MR).
- 5. Select the menu you wish to change and press ().
- **Ringer Volume** for adjusting Ringer tone volume.
- **Start-up/Pw-off** for adjusting Start-up/Power-off tone volume.
- ► Key Beep for adjusting Key Beep tone volume.
- 6. Adjust the volume level and press (MR).
- **Ringer Off** to set the Voice Call ringer volume to off. (Only appears in Ringer Volume Setting).
- ► Silence All to set all the ringer volume to off. (Only appears in Ringer Volume Setting). See "Silence All" on page 36.

To adjust Earpiece volume:

- **1**. Press **()** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight **Sounds** and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight **Receiver Vol.** and press
- 5. Adjust the volume level and press (MENU).

**Tip:** You can adjust the ringer volume in Standby mode by using Volume keys, and adjust earpiece volume during a call by using  $\blacktriangle/ \bigtriangledown$  of the Navigation key or Volume keys.

## **Alert Notification**

Your phone comes with several different options to keep you aware of what's going on by sounding the alert or ringer.

- Service sets alert On or Off for network services parameter changes.
- ► Voicemail sets alert to notify you of caller's message(s).
- **Messaging** sets alert to notify you of text message(s).
- Minute Beep sets a minute reminder that beeps ten seconds before the end of each minute during a call.
- Signal Fade sets alert to notify you when your phone loses a signal during a call.

To set the alerts:

- 1. Press ( to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRD).
- 3. Highlight **Sounds** and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight Alerts and press ().
- 5. Highlight your desired option and press (
- 6. If you selected Service, Minute Beep or Signal Fade, select On or Off. If you selected Voicemail or Messaging, select Once, Repeat Alert or Off.

Tip: Repeat Alert sounds every two minutes for twenty minutes.

## **Silence All**

There may be times when you need to silence your phone entirely. The phone's Silence All option allows you to mute all sounds without turning your phone off.

To activate Silence All:

- **1.** Press **MEN** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRC).
- 3. Highlight **Sounds** and press **MPD**.
- 4. Highlight Ringer/Key Vol and press (1989).
- 5. Highlight **Ringer Volume** and press **MRD**.
- 6. Press ▼ Navigation key until "Silence All" appears on the display and press ♥♥♥.
- To deactivate this feature, select a volume level you wish during step 6 above.

**Tip:** When Ringer Volume is set as Silence All, other items are changed to Off and cannot be highlighted by cursor.

# **Display Settings**

## **Changing the Greeting**

The greeting can be up to 12 characters and is displayed on the first line of your phone's display screen in Standby mode. You may choose to display a custom greeting or you may display your PCS User name on the phone's screen (the default setting).

To display or change your custom greeting:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MP).
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press (MRV).
- 4. Highlight **Greeting** and press (MRP).
- 5. Highlight **Custom** and press (MRC).
- You can customize the greeting by entering characters (Press BACK to erase single character, press and hold BACK to erase entire entry. See pages 79-83 for the entering method.)
- 6. Press Menu.

To display your PCS User name as your greeting (the default setting):

- **1.** Follow steps 1 to 4 above.
- 2. Highlight **Username** and press **EXP**.

## **Changing the Backlight Time Length**

The backlight setting lets you select how long the display screen and keypad are backlit after any key press is made.

To change the Main LCD or Sub LCD backlight setting:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press .
- 4. Highlight **Backlight** and press .
- 5. Highlight Main LCD or Sub LCD and press ().
- 6. Select Always On, Always Off or your defined time length and press ().
- Always Off always turns the backlight off.
- Always On always turns the backlight on.

Note: Always On setting returns to previous value on next power cycle.

To change Keypad backlight setting:

- 1. From step 5 above, select the menu under **Key** and press (EP).
- 2. Select Always Off or your defined time length and press ().

**Note:** Long backlight settings affect the battery's talk and standby times.

## **Changing the Display Screen**

Your new PCS Phone offers animation for what you see on the display screen when in Standby mode, Outgoing Calls or Service Search.

To change the Animation:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press .
- 4. Highlight Animation and press ( ).
- 5. Highlight Standby, Outgoing Calls, or Service Search and press ().
- ▶ Press **Preview** (right softkey) to see an example display.
- 6. Select the menu under the item and press (MRV).
- ► For Standby, also set animation starting time. Select the option under **after** and press (NRW), then highlight your desired setting time and press (NRW).
- Get New: start up a Browser and you can select an item to download. (See page 113.)
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 6 above.

## **Changing the Display for Incoming Calls**

You can set the color or downloaded image (screen saver) data to be shown on the Incoming Calls display.

Follow these steps:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (Setting).
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press (1989).
- 4. Highlight **Incoming Calls** and press .
- 5. Select the menu under **Incoming Calls** and press ().
- **6.** Highlight your desired color or downloaded image (screen saver) and press **MRP**.
- Get New: start up a Browser and you can select an item to download. (See page 113.)
- ► **Multimedia:** to set the image downloaded by Multimedia Master (see page 107 for downloading).
- ▶ **Pictures:** to set a picture in Picture Wallet (see pages 140-141).
- ► To see a display preview, press **Preview** (right softkey) during step 6 above. Then press **Sub LCD** (right softkey) or close the clamshell to confirm the image on the Sub LCD.
- To adjust the position of the image, use your Navigation key during step 6 above.

**Note:** Use PCS Connection Kit (sold separately) for downloading the data from PC.

## Changing the Display for the Standby Mode

This feature enables you to select a variety of items to display on the Standby mode.

Follow these steps:

- 1. Press ( to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRC).
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press (1989).
- 4. Highlight Standby Display and press (MRW).
- 5. Select your desired item and press (MRW).
- Screen Saver selects the screen saver to display.
- **Calendar** displays the Calendar.
- **Time (Large)** displays the local time in a large, simple format.
- ► World Clock displays the time of the selected country along with the local time. You can scroll the World Clock list and change the country by pressing the left or right Navigation key. When applicable, the <u>Summer</u> (left softkey)/<u>Standard</u> (right softkey) can be used to change between summer and standard time.

**Tip:** You can also display the World Clock from Tools/Extras menu. See "Using the World Clock" on page 106.

- **Default** sets this feature to default.
- **6.** After following each system prompt or confirming the preview display, press **EXP** to save the setting.

**Tip:** In a no-service area, Screen Saver, Calendar, Time (Large), or World Clock cannot be shown on the Standby display.

## **Changing the Screen Saver**

Your new PCS Phone offers you the option of displaying a screen saver while in Standby mode.

To assign a screen saver:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (SEP).
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press (1989).
- 4. Highlight Standby Display and press ().
- 5. Select Screen Saver and press (MRU).
- 6. Select the menu under **Screen Saver** and press .
- 7. Highlight your desired screen saver and press 🐨.
- Get New: start up a Browser and you can select an item to download. (See page 113.)
- Multimedia: to set the image downloaded by Multimedia Master (see page 107 for downloading).
- ▶ **Pictures:** to set a picture in Picture Wallet (see pages 140-141).
- ► To see a display preview, press **Preview** (right softkey) at the step 7 above. Then press **Sub LCD** (right softkey) or close the clamshell to confirm the image on the Sub LCD.
- ► To adjust the position of the image, use your Navigation key during step 7 above.
- **8**. Press **Save** (left softkey) to save the screen saver.

## Changing the Display for Mi Amigo

This feature enables you to see a funny animation for 30 seconds on the Main LCD after opening the flip.

Follow these steps:

- **1.** Press **(SEP)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press (SEP).
- 4. Highlight **Mi Amigo** and press (MRP).
- 5. Select **On** or **Off** and press (MRP).
- Press Preview (right softkey) during step 5 above to see a display preview.

## **Changing the Display Color**

To change the display's color scheme:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press (1989).

- 5. Highlight Main LCD or Sub LCD and press ().
- 6. Select your desired color and press ().

## **Changing the Font Size**

There are two font size settings for the message notification and browser. To change the font size, follow these steps:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press (1989).
- 4. Highlight Font Size and press (MRC).
- 5. Highlight either **Notifications** or **Browser** and press (SEP).
- 6. Select your desired font size.
- ▶ Press **Preview** (right softkey) to display a font size example.
- 7. Press (Meru) to set the selected font.

**Tip:** From the font example display, you can switch the Normal/Small font displays by pressing the left/right of the Navigation key.

# **Location Settings**

Your PCS Phone is equipped with a Location feature which will allow the network to detect your position, making some PCS Applications easier to use. Turning Location off will hide your location from everyone except 911.

**Note:** Even if the Location feature is enabled, no service may use your location without your expressed permission.

To enable your phone's Location feature:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (Setting).
- 3. Highlight Location and press (SR).
- 4. Press () or OK (left softkey) or wait a few seconds until the message scrolls down completely.
- 5. Select **On** and press **MEN**.
- To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 5 above.

**Tip:** These icons let you know whether information of your position is sent to the network or not. If you are in a no service or roaming area, indication is always .

- 😔 indicates the Location Service is enabled.
- $\mathscr{A}$  indicates the Location Service is disabled.

# Airplane Mode

When your phone is in Airplane mode, it cannot send or receive any calls (except for 911 dialing) or access online information. You may still use the phone's other features, such as Voice Memos, Calculator, Calendar, etc., while you are in Airplane mode.

To set your phone to Airplane mode:

- **1**. Press **()** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight Airplane Mode and press (1997).
- 4. The display shows a message. Press (If (left softkey).
- ▶ Press **Cancel** (right softkey) to return to the setting display.
- 5. Select On and press (NEW).
- ► To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 5 above.

**Note:** While in Airplane mode, your phone's standby screen will display "Phone Off."



# **TTY Use With PCS Service From Sprint**

A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone), is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate via a telephone.

Your phone is compatible with selected TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission. Your phone and TTY device will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's Headset Jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

When establishing your PCS Service, please call PCS Customer Service Solutions<sup>™</sup> via the state Telecommunications Relay Service (TRS) by first dialing **(Z) (1) (TAUR)**. Then provide the state TRS with this number: 866-727-4889.

To turn TTY mode On or Off:

1. From the Standby mode, press (#) (#) (8) (9).

- 2. Press Menu.
- 3. Highlight Save Phone# and press (1989).
- 4. Highlight Accessibility and press (SR).
- 5. Select TTY On or TTY Off and press (MEN).
- ▶ Press Info (right softkey) during step 5 above for instruction.

**Note:** When you connect TTY devices, your phone will display **m** in TTY mode.

**Note:** If TTY mode is enabled, the audio quality of non-TTY devices connected to the headset jack may be impaired.

#### IMPORTANT NOTICE: 911 Emergency Calling

Sprint recommends that TTY users make emergency calls by other means including Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS), analog cellular, and landline communications. Wireless TTY calls to 911 may be corrupted when received by public safety answering points (PSAPs) rendering some communications unintelligible. The problem encountered appears related to TTY equipment or software used by PSAPs. This matter has been brought to the attention of the FCC, and the wireless industry and PSAP community are currently working to resolve this.

## **My Shortcut**

Your phone offers you the option of assigning a shortcut key to a favorite or often-used function. Pressing the left Navigation key in standby mode will launch your user-defined shortcut.

To assign your shortcut menu:

- **3.** Highlight **Others** and press **MEND**.
- 4. Highlight **My Shortcut** and press (1987).
- 5. Select the menu under My Shortcut and press ().
- 6. Highlight your desired menu option and press 🐨
- Press Info (right softkey) during step 5 above to see the My Shortcut information.

## Auto Answer Mode

This feature sets the phone to automatically pick up after 5 or 15 seconds.

This feature works with the hands-free car kit and headset (sold separately).

To activate this feature:

- 1. Press ( to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight Others and press ().
- 4. Highlight Auto Answer and press (1989).
- 5. Select either 5 Seconds or 15 Seconds and press (1987).
- To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 5 above.

## **Setting Call Answer**

This feature enables you to answer incoming calls by opening the clamshell so that you don't have to press **TALK**.

To activate this feature:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight **Others** and press **MENU**.
- 4. Highlight **Call Answer** and press **EXP**.
- 5. Select **Open Flip** and press (MEN).
- ► To answer the call by pressing TALK, select TALK Key during step 5 above.

## **Setting Any Key Answer**

This feature allows you to answer incoming calls by pressing any key (except ENDO), BACK, WEW, Side Camera key, Volume keys and Navigation key).

To activate this feature:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight **Others** and press **MERU**.
- 4. Highlight Any Key Answer and press (1987).
- 5. Select **On** and press **MENU**.
- To deactivate this feature, select **Off** during step 5 above.

## **Setting Abbreviated Dialing**

Abbreviated Dialing is another form of Speed Dialing. If the last four digits you enter do not match any stored phone book entry, the digits are automatically prepended with the digits specified using the following steps. See "Four-Digit Dialing" on page 26.

To activate this feature:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRP).
- **3**. Highlight **Others** and press **MENU**.
- 4. Highlight Abbrev. Dial and press (1989).
- 5. Highlight **Enable** and press (MP).
- 6. Enter a six-digit number and press (If the off the
- ► To deactivate this feature, highlight **Disable** during step 5 above.

Tip: If you enter less than 6 digits, the display shows a warning message.

## Headset Mode

To set Headset mode:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRD).
- 3. Highlight **Others** and press **Mere**.
- 4. Highlight Headset Mode and press ().
- 5. Select **On** and press **MERU**.
- Press Info (right softkey) during step 5 above to see the Headset mode information.
- To deactive this feature, select **Off** during step 5 above.

## **Setting Side Key Guard**

This feature enables you to lock your side key (Side Camera key and Volume keys) while the clamshell is closed.

To activate this feature:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (Setting).
- 3. Highlight **Others** and press **MENU**.
- 4. Highlight Side Key Guard and press (SR).
- 5. Select On and press (NERV).
- Side Key Guard appears on the Sub LCD when you press any side key while the clamshell is closed.
- To deactivate this feature, select **Off** at step 5 above.

Note: This feature does not apply when the clamshell is open.

## **Sleep Mode**

This feature helps conserve your battery power by restricting the display.

To set sleep mode:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight **Display** and press (MRV).
- 4. Highlight **Sleep Mode** and press (1989).
- 5. Highlight Main LCD or Sub LCD and press (SEP).
- 6. Highlight your desired option and press (Marcon 2010).
- ► To deactivate this feature, highlight **Off** during step 6 above.

## **Setting Message Notification**

You can see message notification when you receive a text message or Voicemail while you are in PCS Vision applications or Browser mode.

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press ().
- 3. Highlight Messaging and press (1989).
- 4. Check the box next to **Games/Apps** or **Browser** and press **Save** (left softkey).
- Press Info (right softkey) during step 4 above to see the Messages information.

## Changing the Menu Language

When you first turn your phone on, the menus are displayed in English.

To change the menu language to Spanish:

- **1.** Press **Meru** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight **Others** and press .
- 4. Highlight Language and press (MRD).
- 5. Select Español and press (MRP).

**B**y adjusting the security settings on your PCS Phone, you receive peace of mind without sacrificing flexibility. With several options available, you can customize your phone to meet your personal needs.

# **Accessing the Security Menu**

You must enter your lock code to view the Security menu.

To access the Security menu:

- **1**. Press (Sector to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRC).
- 3. Highlight Security and press (1989).
- 4. Enter your lock code.

**Tip:** If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of either your Social Security number or PCS Phone Number or try 0000. If none of these work, call PCS Customer Service Solutions at 1-888-211-4PCS (4727).

# **Locking Your Phone**

When your phone is locked, you can only receive incoming calls or make calls to 911, PCS Customer Service Solutions, or special numbers.

To lock your phone:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 54), highlight Lock Phone and press (MRP).
- 2. Highlight Lock Now or On Power-up and press (
- 3. Depending on your preference, highlight either Full Lock or Except Incom.Calls and press (1999).
- ► Full Lock: All phone calls except for Emergency#, ★ 2 (PCS Customer Service Solutions) or Special #s cannot be made. No phone calls can be received except for Special #s.
- Except Incom.Calls: All phone calls except for Emergency#,
   (PCS Customer Service Solutions) or Special #s cannot be made, but all incoming calls can be received.

**Tip:** If you want to cancel the "On Power-up" setting before turning the phone off, select **Unlocked** during step 2 above.

# **Unlocking Your Phone**

- To unlock your phone:
- 1. Press Unlock (left softkey).
- **2**. Enter your lock code.

# **Changing the Lock Code**

To change your lock code:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 54), highlight **Others** and press **(BP)**.
- 2. Highlight Change Lock and press
- **3.** Enter new lock code, "1234" for example, in the box under **New Code**.
- 4. Reenter the new code in the box under **Reenter Code**.

# **Calling in Lock Mode**

You can place calls to 911 and to your special numbers when in lock mode.

To place an outgoing call in lock mode:

To call an emergency number, special number, or PCS Customer Service Solutions, enter the phone number and press TALK.

## **Restricting Calls**

You can restrict which phone numbers you can dial or receive calls from. (The Restrict Calls setting does not apply to 911 or PCS Customer Service Solutions.)

To restrict calls:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 54), highlight **Others** and press **MRP**.
- 2. Highlight Limit Use and press (1989).
- 3. Select the menu under **Outgoing Calls** or **Incoming Calls** and press **WEW**.
- 4. Highlight your desired option and press (Marcon 2010).

Options:

- ▶ Allow All: You can make or receive all calls.
- Phone Book Only: Only Phone Book entries, Voicemail or Special #s (see the next page) are available to make or receive calls.
- **Special #s Only:** Only three special numbers' entries are available to make or receive calls.
- ► To unrestrict all calls, select **Allow All** during step 4 above.

Note: Restricted incoming calls are forwarded to voicemail.

# **Using Special Numbers**

You can save three special numbers in addition to your Internal Phone Book entries (the same number may be in both directories). You can make and receive calls from special numbers even when your phone is locked.

To add or replace a special number:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 54), highlight **Others** and press **(BP)**.
- 2. Highlight Special #s and press ().
- **3.** Highlight the box under the entry number and press (EP).
- 4. Enter the number you wish to add and press (SR).
  - or -

Press **Options** (right softkey), then highlight **From Ph. Book** or **Voicemail** and press **MRP**.

To insert pauses into a number:

- **1.** From step 4 above, enter the phone number and press **Options** (right softkey) for the options.
- 2 Highlight Hard Pause, 2-Sec. Pause, or Hyphen and press (RP).
- 3. Finish entering the rest of the numbers and press ().

**Note:** During Speed Dial entry, there are no Speed Dial options associated with special numbers.

# **Erasing the Internal Phone Book**

To erase all the names and phone numbers in your Internal Phone Book:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 54), highlight **Erase Ph. Book** and press ().
- 2. If you're sure you want to erase your Phone Book, highlight Yes and press (RP).

### **Erasing the Downloads**

To erase all data downloaded from the Web:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 54), highlight **Erase D/L** and press (MEW).
- 2. If you're sure you want to erase all data downloaded from the Web, highlight **Yes** and press **MEW**.
- If you have assigned downloaded data, the function returns to its default setting.

### **Resetting Your Phone**

Resetting the phone restores all the factory defaults, including the ringer types and display settings. The Internal Phone Book, Call History, Scheduler, and Messaging are not affected.

To reset your phone:

- 1. From the Security Menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 54), highlight **Reset Phone** and press **(19)**.
- **2.** If you're sure you want to reset your phone, highlight **Yes** and press **(NRP)**.

### **Resetting Your Pictures Account**

You can use this feature when other people use your phone. With this feature, other people cannot use your account without your password.

To reset your Pictures Account:

- 1. From the security menu display (See "Accessing the Security Menu" on page 54), highlight **ResetPictures** and press (SP).
- **2.** If you're sure you want to reset picture account, highlight **Yes** and press **CRP**.

After resetting, you are prompted to reenter the password when you use Online Pictures.

**Note:** Your account will be locked if you enter wrong password 10 times after resetting your acount. In this case, please contact Sprint Support.

## **Resetting and Locking Your Phone through SMS**

When your phone is lost or stolen, you can erase your important personal information (such as phone book entries, call history, and messages) and lock your phone by sending a special formatted SMS message to your phone.

From your computer, log on to <u>www.sprintpcs.com</u>, and send a message in the following format:

\\RESET \*\*<Passcode>\*\* RESET

<Passcode> - your defined passcode.

Default Passcode is 11-digit ESN (Electronic Serial Number) which is written on the package or phone itself.

The locked phone will display the following message:

"If found, please call PCS Customer Solutions 1-888-211-4727."

To activate this feature, the following presetting is required:

**1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.

- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRW).
- 3. Highlight Security and press (1989).
- 4. Enter your lock code.
- 5. Highlight **Others** and press **MEND**.
- 6. Highlight **Found Me** and press (MRP).
- 7. Highlight **Reset/Lock** and press
- 8. Select **Enable** and press ().

To unlock a phone that has been locked through SMS, bring the phone to Sprint Retail Store.

#### **Changing the Passcode**

To change the passcode for the special formatted SMS messages:

**1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.

2. Highlight Settings and press (MENU).

3. Highlight Security and press .

4. Enter lock code.

5. Highlight **Others** and press **MRP**.

7. Highlight Chg Passcode and press

8. Enter new passcode in the box under New Passcode (11 digits).

9. Reenter the new passcode in the box under **Reenter Code**.

# **Controlling Your Roaming Experience**

Robust of the ability to make or receive calls when you're off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. Your new dual band/tri mode PCS Phone works anywhere on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network and allows you to roam virtually anywhere in the U.S. where compatible wireless service is available.

This section explains how roaming works as well as special features that let you manage your roaming experience.

### **Understanding Roaming**

#### **Recognizing Icons on the Display Screen**

Your phone's display screen always lets you know when you're off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network and whether your phone is operating in analog or digital mode. The following chart indicates what you'll see depending on where you're using your phone.

Main LCD	Roaming Indicator
Sprint Nationwide PCS Network	
Other/Analog Networks	R

**Tip:** Remember, when you are using your phone off the Sprint Nationwide PCS Network, always dial numbers using 11 digits (1 + area code + number).

Note: You will pay a higher per-minute rate for roaming calls.

#### **Roaming on Digital Networks**

When you're roaming on digital networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. You may not be able to access certain features, such as PCS Vision.

#### **Roaming on Analog Networks**

When you roam on analog networks, you will experience a similar quality provided by other analog carriers today. Although some features, such as PCS Vision and PCS Voice Command, will be unavailable, you can still make and receive calls and access voicemail. You will experience a few differences:

- You are more likely to experience static, cross-talk, fade-out, and dropped calls.
- Some features which are standard on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network, such as call waiting, PCS Vision, and direct international dialing, are unavailable.
- ► Though callers can leave voicemail messages while you are roaming, you may not receive notification until you return to the Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. While roaming, you can periodically check your voicemail for new messages by dialing 1+area code+your PCS Phone Number. Press when you hear your greeting and enter your pass code at the prompt.
- There are security and privacy risks (eavesdropping and cloning) that exist with conventional analog services today.
- Your battery needs recharging sooner when you use your phone for analog roaming.

**Note:** If you're on a call when you leave the Sprint Nationwide PCS Network and enter an area where roaming is available (whether digital or analog), your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think PCS Service is available, turn your phone off and on again to reconnect to the Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

**Note:** When using your phone in analog mode, the handset may feel warm. This behavior is normal for analog operation.

### **Setting Your Phone's Roam Mode**

Your PCS Phone allows you to control your ability to roam. By using the **Roaming** menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts.

#### Set Mode

Choose from three different settings on your dual band/tri mode phone to control your roaming experience:

- 1. Press (New) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press .
- 3. Highlight **Roaming** and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight Set Mode and press
- 5. To select an option, select it and press (MRP).
- ► **Sprint:** This setting allows you to access the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network only and prevents roaming on other networks.
- Automatic: This setting seeks PCS Service. When PCS Service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate system.
- **Analog:** This setting forces the phone to seek an analog roaming system. The previous setting (Sprint or Automatic) is restored the next time the phone is turned on.

# **Controlling Roaming Charges Using Call Guard**

In addition to the roaming icon, Call Guard alerts you when roaming charges apply. This feature makes it easy to manage your roaming charges by reminding you when you make or receive roaming calls. It also requires you to take an additional step before placing or answering a roaming call. This additional step is not required when you make or receive calls while on the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

#### To Turn Call Guard On or Off:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRC).
- 3. Highlight **Roaming** and press (MRW).
- 4. Highlight Call Guard and press (MRC).
- 5. Select **On** or **Off** and press **MRD**.

#### To Place Roaming Calls With Call Guard On:

- **1.** From standby mode, dial 1 + area code + the seven-digit number. (You can also initiate a call from the Internal Phone Book, Call History, or Messaging.)
- 2. Press (TALK) or press (MERU), highlight Call and press (MERU).
- **3.** A pop-up message will appear notifying you that roaming rate applies. Press **1** to proceed.

- or -

1. Press any key to erase the pop-up message, then press (NR), highlight Roam Call and press (NR).

#### To Answer Incoming Roaming Calls With Call Guard On:

- 1. Press TALK.
- **2.** A pop-up message will appear notifying you that roaming rate applies. Press **1** to proceed.

- or -

1. Press (MRW), highlight **Answer** and press (MRW).

Remember if the Call Guard feature is set to **0n**, you need to take extra steps to make and receive roaming calls, even if you have selected the **Analog** setting (see page 64).

#### **Backing Up Within a Menu**

To go to the previous menu:

Press BACK.

To return to standby mode:

Press END/0.

Left Navigation key ( $\blacktriangleleft$ ) to take a shortcut to the My Shortcut menu. (See page 47 for setting.)

Right Navigation key  $(\blacktriangleright)$  to take a shortcut to the Phone Book (Find Name).

The Call History keeps track of incoming calls, calls made from your PCS Phone, and missed calls. This section guides you through accessing and making the most of your Call History.

### **Viewing History**

You'll find the Call History feature very helpful. It is a list of the last 20 phone numbers (or Internal Phone Book entries) for each calls that you placed, accepted, or missed. Call History makes redialing a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the bottom of the list.

Each entry contains the phone number (if it is available) and Internal Phone Book entry name (if the phone number is in your Internal Phone Book). Duplicate calls (same number and type of call) may only appear once on the list.

To view a Call History entry:

- 1. Press (NEW) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Call History and press
- 3. Highlight Outgoing Calls, Incoming Calls, or Missed Calls and press (SR).

### **Call History Options**

For additional information and options on a particular call, highlight a Call History entry and press (MR).

This feature gives you the option of selecting:

- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- ► Save Phone# to save the phone number, if it is not in your Internal Phone Book (if applicable). If the caller's phone number is already stored in the Phone Book, Alternate appears instead of Save Phone#. (See "Saving a Phone Number From Call History" on pages 73-74.)
- **Prepend** to add numbers to the beginning of the phone number. (See "Prepending a Phone Number From Call History" on page 74.)
- View to view the caller's information.
- **Erase** to erase the entry.

**Tip:** You can also view the next Call History entry by pressing the right Navigation key or view the previous entry by pressing the left Navigation key.

### **Making a Call From Call History**

To place a call from Call History:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Call History and press (SR).
- 3. Highlight Outgoing Calls, Incoming Calls, or Missed Calls.
- 4. Press MENU.
- 5. Highlight the entry you want to call by scrolling through the list.
- 6. Press TALK

- or - Press (), highlight **Call** and press ().

**Note:** You cannot make calls from Call History to entries identified as No ID or Restricted.

### **Saving a Phone Number From Call History**

Your PCS Phone can store up to 300 Internal Phone Book entries. Phone Book entries can store up to a total of 500 phone numbers and each entry's name can contain sixteen characters.

To save a phone number from Call History:

- **1.** Highlight the call history entry you want to save.
- **2**. Press **(1)** to display the options.
- 3. Highlight Save Phone# and press
- **4.** Highlight appropriate label (Home, Work, Mobile, Pager, Data, Fax, or No Label) and press (1989).
- 5. Enter a Name and press ( Ye). You can also save the phone number without a name by pressing ( rom the name entry display, highlight **Yes** and then press ( Ye). If you have already stored entries in the Phone Book, you are prompted to select from the following entry modes:
- New Name to enter a name directory.
- **From Ph. Book** to select a name from Phone Book entry list.
- 6. Press Save (left softkey).

After you have saved the number, the new Internal Phone Book entry is displayed. (See "Internal Phone Book Entry Options" on page 78.)

**Note:** You cannot save phone numbers already in your Internal Phone Book or from calls identified as No ID or Restricted. If the selected entry has already been stored in the phone book, **Alternate** appears. (See "Saving a Phone Number from Call History" on the previous page.)

### **Prepending a Phone Number From Call History**

If you need to make a call from Call History and you happen to be outside your local area code, you can add the appropriate prefix by following these steps:

- 1. Highlight a call history entry and press (MEN).
- 2. Highlight **Prepend** and press .
- 3. Enter the digits you want to add to the number.
  If you want to save the number, press and select
  Save Phone# from options. If not, the changes only apply to the current call.

To select an option, highlight it and press (

- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- Save Phone# to store the phone number in your Internal Phone Book.
- ► H Hard Pause to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 25.)
- ▶ **12-Sec. Pause** to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 25.)

### **Erasing Call History**

To erase individual Call History entries, see "Call History Options" on page 72.

To erase Call History:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Call History** and press **MP**.
- 3. Highlight Erase History and press (SRP).
- 4. Highlight the category you want to erase and press ().
- 5. Highlight Yes and press MENU.
- ► You can also select **All Calls** during step 4 above to erase all entries.

### **Internal Phone Book Entry Options**

To access an Internal Phone Book Entry's options, display the entry list, highlight an entry and press (), then select a phone number and press (), tright softkey). To select an option, highlight it and press ().

- **Edit** to edit your desired label.
- ► **Call** to dial the phone number. (If you are roaming and have the Call Guard feature activated, you are required to take an extra step to proceed. See "Controlling Roaming Charges Using Call Guard" on page 65.)
- **Call Alarm** to set the call alarm to the entry (see page 99).
- **Set Speed Dial** to set the Speed Dial to the entry (see pages 92-93).
- **Set Voice Dial** to set the Voice Dial to the entry (see page 122).
- **Prepend** to alter a phone number by adding additional numbers (see page 92).

When you are in edit display, the following options are displayed:

- **Send PCS Mail** to send an Email (only Email label).
- ▶ Visit Site to go to the Web site (only Web label).
- **Edit** to edit your desired label.
- **Erase** to erase your desired label.

**Tip:** You can view the next entry by pressing the right Navigation key or view the previous entry by pressing the left Navigation key.

You can erase the selected entry from the Phone Book list.

- 1. Press the right Navigation key to display the Phone Book list.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight **Erase Entry** and press .
- 4. Highlight Yes and press .

# **Selecting a Character Input Mode**

Your PCS Phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, and numbers whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding an Internal Phone Book entry).

To change the character input mode:

- **1.** When you display a screen where you can enter text, press the right softkey button.
- 2. Select a character input mode, highlight it and press ().
- **T9 Word** to enter characters using T9 Text Input (see page 80).
- Alphabet to enter characters by tapping the keypad (see page 81).
- **SYMBOL** to enter symbols (see page 82).
- NUMBER to enter numbers (see page 82).
- CANNED SUFFIX to enter a canned suffix (see page 83).
- **SMILEYS** to enter smiley pictures (see page 83).

#### **Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input**

T9 Text Input lets you enter text in your PCS Phone by pressing keys just once per letter. (To select the **T9 Word** mode when entering text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 79.)

T9 Text Input analyzes the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) If the word you want does not display after you have entered all the letters, press **NorO** to scroll through additional word selections. To accept a word and insert a space, press **SourD**.

If you make a mistake, press **BACK** to erase a single character. Press and hold **BACK** to delete an entire entry.

#### Adding a Word to the T9 Database

If a word you want to enter does not display as an option when you are using T9 Text Input, you can add it to the database.

To add a word to the T9 Text Input database:

- **1.** Select the **Alphabet** input mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 79.)
- 2. Enter the word using multi-tap text entry. (See "Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad" on page 81.) Then press right softkey, highlight **T9Word** and press **WP**. The word will appear as an option the next time you scroll through options during T9 Text Input.

For more information about T9 Text Input, visit the Tegic Web site at <u>www.T9.com</u>.

#### **Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad**

To enter characters by tapping the keypad, select the **Alphabet** mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 79). Press the corresponding key until the desired character appears. By default, the first letter of a word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase.

After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds or when you enter a character not on the same key.

#### **Using Smart Punctuation**

"Smart punctuation" is available while using in T9 mode. It's a quick and easy way to type email domains, possessive forms and contractions. When you press **1**, T9 displays a period.

However, as you continue to type, T9 determines the appropriate mark based on your word database.

For example, to type "It's Easy."

#### Press 4 8 1 7 Space# 3 2 7 9 1.

Tip: The upper/lower case can be changed by pressing survey.

#### **Entering Numbers, Symbols, Canned Suffix and Smileys**

#### Entering NUMBER

To enter numbers, select the **NUMBER** mode and press the appropriate key (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 79).

1. In a text entry field, press the right softkey.

- 2. Highlight **NUMBER** and press (MRV).
- **3**. Press the corresponding numeric key to enter the number.

**Shortcut:** Press and hold the corresponding numeric key to enter the number directly.

#### Entering SYMBOL

To enter symbols, select the **SYMBOL** mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 79.)

- 1. In a text entry field, press the right softkey.
- 2. Highlight SYMBOL and press (SP).
- **3**. Highlight the line that includes your desired symbol.
- 4. Press the corresponding key (1~8) with each symbol.

Highlight your desired symbol by using the Navigation key, and press **NEW**.

#### Entering CANNED SUFFIX

To enter canned suffix, select the **CANNED SUFFIX** mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 79.)

- 1. In a text entry field, press the right softkey.
- 2. Highlight CANNED SUFFIX and press ().
- **3.** Highlight your desired word by using the Navigation key and press **(NRV)**.

#### Entering SMILEYS

To enter smiley pictures, select the **SMILEYS** mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 79.)

- **1.** In a text entry field, press the right softkey.
- 2. Highlight SMILEYS and press (SEP).
- **3.** Highlight the line that includes your desired smiley.
- 4. Press the corresponding key (1~4) with each smiley.
   or -

Highlight your desired smiley by using the Navigation key, and press (1989).

### **Adding a New Internal Phone Book Entry**

Your PCS Phone can store up to 300 Internal Phone Book entries. Phone book entries can store up to a total of 500 phone numbers and the entry's name can contain sixteen characters.

To add a new entry:

- **1.** From the Standby mode, enter the phone number you want to save.
- 2. Press () to display the menu options.
- 3. Highlight Save Phone# and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight the label you wish to add and press ().
- **5.** Enter a name, and press **C** or **O K** (left softkey). If you have already stored entries in the Phone Book, you are prompted to select the following entry mode:
- New Name to enter a name directory.
- **From Ph. Book** to select a name from Phone Book entry list.
- 6. Press Save (left softkey).
  - or -
- **1**. Press (1) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Book and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight Add New Entry and press ().
- 4. Enter a name and press (If (left softkey).
- 5. Select the box under your desired label, enter the number or address, and press ( ).
- 6. Press Save (left softkey).
- If you want to store the number without a name, press () or
   OK (left softkey) before you enter the name during step 4 above and select Yes.

After you have saved the number, the new Internal Phone Book entry is displayed. (See "Internal Phone Book Entry Options" on page 78.)

### **Finding Internal Phone Book Entries**

There are several ways to display your Internal Phone Book entries. Follow steps outlined in the sections below to display entries from the Internal Phone Book menu.

#### **Finding Names**

You can review all the entries stored in your Internal Phone Book or find an entry quickly by following these simple steps:

- 1. Press ( to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Book and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight **Find Name** and press
- **4.** To select the entry, scroll through the list using your Navigation key.
- 5. Highlight your desired entry and press (1989) to locate a specific label.
- Press Options (right softkey) for menu options. (See page 78 for options.)

The following softkeys appear when you highlight a number or address during step 5 above:

- **Call** (left softkey) to make a Call.
- **Send** (left softkey) to send an Email (only Email label).
- **Go** (left softkey) to go to the Web site (only Web label).
- Edit (right softkey) to edit the phone number or address.
   (Email and Web label only)

**Shortcut:** From the Standby mode, press the right Navigation key to display the Find Name feature.

#### **Finding Entries**

To find an Internal Phone Book entry by entering the first letters:

- **1**. Press  $\blacktriangleright$  of the Navigation key.
- **2**. Enter the first letter of the name or part of the name using multi-tap method.
- **3.** Highlight your desired entry by scrolling through the phone book entry and press **NEW**.
- If you enter a single letter, the display shows the list beginning with the letter you entered.

- or -

**1.** From the Standby mode, enter 4-digit or more.

2. Press MENU

- 3. Highlight **Find** and press .
- **4.** The phone book entry list that includes the numbers that ends with the digits you entered appears.
- **5**. Scroll through the list to select your desired entry.
- **6.** Press **TALK** to make a call.

#### **Finding Speed Dial Numbers**

To find phone numbers you have stored in Speed Dial locations:

- **1.** Press **(MRP)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Book and press 🐨.
- 3. Highlight Speed Dial #s and press (MRP).

4. The Speed Dial numbers list appears.

#### **Finding Voice Dial Numbers**

To find phone numbers you have stored in Voice Dial:

1. Press () to access the main menu.

2. Highlight Voice Service and press (MRV).

3. Highlight Voice Dial and press (MRD).

4. Highlight **Review** and press (1989).

**5**. The Voice Dial number's list appears.

### Adding a Phone Number or Address to an Internal Phone Book Entry

To add a phone number or address to an entry:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Book and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight Find Name and press ().
- ▶ Press ▶ of the Navigation key for the shortcut (steps 1 through 3).
- 4. Highlight the entry you wish to add phone numbers/email/web addresses to and press (NEW).
- **5.** Highlight a phone number, press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Edit**, and press **WP**.

- or -

Highlight an Email address or Web address, and press **Edit** (right softkey).

- 6. Highlight the box under the label you wish to add.
- 7. Enter the number or address and press ().
- 8. Press Save (left softkey).

### **Editing an Internal Phone Book Entry**

To make changes to an entry:

- **1**. Display an Internal Phone Book entry.
- 2. Highlight the entry you wish to edit and press (1989).
- Highlight a phone number, press Options (right softkey), highlight Edit, and press (R).
   or -

Highlight an Email address or Web address, and press **Edit** (right softkey).

- **4.** Highlight the box under the following labels and edit by using the Number keys.
- ► Name to change the entry's name. Enter the new name. (See "Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad" on page 81.)
- Home to change the entry's phone number. Enter the new home phone number.
- Work to change the entry's phone number. Enter the new work phone number.
- Mobile to change the entry's phone number. Enter the new mobile phone number.
- **Pager** to change the entry's pager number. Enter the new pager number.
- **Data** to change the entry's number for data. Enter the new data number.
- ► **Fax** to change the entry's fax number. Enter the new fax number.
- **No Label** to change the entry's number. Enter the new number.
- Email to change the entry's email address. Enter the new email address.
- Web to change the entry's Web address. Enter the new Web address.
- **Ringer** to assign a ringer type to the entry. (See "Selecting a Ringer/Image Type for an Entry" on page 89.)
- Image to assign an image type to the entry. (See "Selecting a Ringer/Image Type for an Entry" on page 89.)
- 5. Press Save (left softkey).

**Tip:** You can also store the phone number in the Pager, Data, or Fax category.

# Selecting a Ringer/Image Type for an Entry

You can assign a ringer/image type to an Internal Phone Book entry so you can identify the caller by the ringer or image type. (See "Ringer Types" on page 30.)

To select a ringer/image type for an entry:

- **1**. Press  $\blacktriangleright$  of the Navigation key.
- 2. Select the entry you want to set as the incoming ringer or image and press (1997).
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 4. Highlight **Edit** and press **MEN**.
- 5. Select the menu under **Ringer** or **Image** by scrolling up or down and press (SW).
- 6. Highlight your desired ringer type or image and press (RP).
- Get New: start up a Browser and you can select an item to download.
- ▶ Normal: Ringer equivalent to With Caller ID or Roaming setting (see page 30). Image equivalent to Incoming Calls setting (see page 40).
- None: the setting equivalent to off.
- 7. Press Save (left softkey).
- ► To confirm the ringer, highlight **Ringer** and press **Play** (right softkey).
- ► To see a display preview, press **Preview** (right softkey) during step 7 above, and press **SubLCD** (right softkey) to see the SubLCD preview. (You may also check the image through the external display.)
- ► To adjust the position of the image, use your Navigation key during step 7 above.
- ► If you set an Animation Ringer (indicated with ☑ icon) and an Image, your PCS Phone plays the Animation Ringer and displays the selected Image.
- You should have pictures or downloaded data to set Image.

### **Secret Internal Phone Book Entries**

You can hide an entry's phone number(s) by making them secret, which requires your lock code to edit the entry. The entry name is still displayed, but the entry's phone numbers are replaced by "(Secret)".

To make an entry secret:

- **1**. Press  $\blacktriangleright$  of the Navigation key.
- **2.** Scroll to the Internal Phone Book entry you want to tag Secret.
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the menu options.
- 4. Highlight **Set Secret** and press .
- 5. Enter the 4-digit lock code.
- 6. Select On and press (NEW).
- ► To make an entry public, select **Off** during step 6 above.

**Tip:** If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of either your Social Security number or PCS Phone Number, or try 0000. If none of these work, call PCS Customer Service Solutions at 1-888-211-4PCS (4727).

### **Dialing PCS Services**

You must be in digital mode to access PCS Services.

To dial a service:

- **1**. Press (1) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Book and press (SP).
- 3. Highlight Services and press
- 4. Highlight Cust Solutions, Dir Assist, Account Info, Sprint Oper., or VoiceCommand and press (MRP).
- 5. Press TALK

- or -

Press (Merve), highlight **Call** and press (Merve).

### **Storing Special Numbers in the Phone Book**

#### **Using the Pause Feature**

Generally, when you call an automated system like voicemail boxes or credit card companies, you are required to enter a password or calling card number. Rather than entering the numbers manually each time, you can store the numbers in your Internal Phone Book, separated by special characters called "pauses".

#### Using Two Different Types of Pauses

There are two different types of pauses that you can use when storing a number in your Internal Phone Book.

- Hard Pause causes the phone to stop dialing until you select Send Tone or press (TALK). To display Send Tone, press (TALK), highlight Send Tone and press (TALK).
- ► 2-Sec. Pause waits two seconds before sending the next string of digits.

To insert pauses into a number:

- 1. Enter the number you want to dial.
- **2**. Press **MENU** to display the menu options.
- **3.** Highlight:
- Hard Pause for a hard pause.
- ▶ **2-Sec. Pause** for a timed pause.
- **Hyphen** for a hyphen (see following section).
- 4. Press to insert a pause or manual hyphen.
- **5.** Finish entering the rest of the numbers, then dial or save the entered number. See page 24 for saving.

#### **Using Hyphens**

You can add hyphens to your Internal Phone Book numbers, however they are mainly for show. You can insert hyphens manually where you like, or choose automatic hyphenation, which inserts hyphens according to the North American Numbering Plan. Entering a manual hyphen suspends any automatic hyphenation for that number.

### **Using Different Dialing Methods**

#### **Prepend Dialing**

Prepend dialing allows you to alter a phone number in your Phone Book by adding additional numbers. For example, if your Internal Phone Book entry was entered without an area code and you are out of town, you can prepend that entry with the appropriate area code.

- **1.** Highlight the phone number stored in Phone Book entry or call history using one of the previously described methods.
- 2. Press Options (right softkey) to display the menu options.
- 3. Highlight **Prepend** and press (1989).
- 4. Enter the digits you want to prepend.
- 5. Press TALK.

- or -

Press () to display the menu options, highlight **Call**, and press ().

#### **Using Speed Dial**

With this feature you can dial Internal Phone Book entries with one key press for locations 2-9. Save your memory locations 2-9 for speed dialing or your most commonly used phone numbers. Speed Dial numbers must be stored in your Phone Book to use this feature.

To store a Speed Dial number:

- **1**. Press  $\blacktriangleright$  of the Navigation key.
- **2.** Highlight your desired entry by scrolling through the phone book list and press (NO).
- **3.** Highlight the phone number you want to set as a Speed Dial, and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 4. Highlight Set Speed Dial and press (1987).
- 5. Highlight an unassigned number and press (MRP).

- or -

- 1. Press ( to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Book and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight Speed Dial #s and press
- **4.** To select a corresponding Speed Dial number from 2-9, highlight an unassigned number and press (MR).
- 5. Highlight the entry from the list and press (1989).
- 6. Highlight the phone number you want to set as a Speed Dial and press ().

To use Speed Dial:

**1.** From the Standby mode, press and hold the appropriate key that corresponds to the memory location for approximately two seconds.

- or -

From the Standby mode, press the appropriate key and press TALK.

The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows **Connecting**.

### **My PCS Phone Number**

To display your phone number:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Book and press (SRP).
- 3. Highlight My Phone# and press (MRP).

Your PCS Phone is equipped with several personal information management features that help you manage your busy lifestyle. These features turn your phone into a time management planner that helps you keep up with your contacts, schedules, and commitments. It takes productivity to a whole new level.

### **Managing Schedules**

#### Calendar

Use the Calendar to remind you of events or important calls you need to make. You can schedule up to 100 events, 15 Call Alarms and 20 To Do Items.

#### Setting the Time/Date

In a no service area or Analog service area, it's necessary to set actual time before using the Calendar function. Set the current Time/Date by using numeric keys and/or the Navigation key ( $\triangleleft$ />: move cursor,  $\triangle$ / $\bigtriangledown$ : change value). To display the time setting display, press ( $\blacksquare$ ), then highlight **Calendar** and press ( $\blacksquare$ ).

It's available from 12:00 AM, Jan 1, 2000 to 11:59 PM, Dec 31, 2099.

#### **Setting Holidays**

You can set your personal holidays by displaying the date in red on the Calendar display. The default holidays displayed in red are Sundays and National holidays.

You can set holidays from Jan 1, 2000 to Dec 31, 2020.

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Calendar and press (SP).
- Highlight the day you want to set to the holiday by using the Navigation key (◄: previous day, ▶: next day, ▲: previous week, ♥: next week).
- **4.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight Set Date or Set Weekly, and press (1987).

Options:

- **Set Date** sets the selected date to the holiday.
- **Set Weekly** sets the weekly holidays.
- **Reset Date** resets the holiday setting for the selected date.
- ▶ **Reset Weekly** resets the weekly holiday setting.
- **Reset All** resets all the holiday settings and returns to the default settings.
- 6. If you selected **Set Weekly**, **Reset Weekly**, or **Reset All**, you'll be prompted to select **Yes** or **No**.

Tip: The current day is framed by a rectangle.

### Adding an Event to the Scheduler

Your Scheduler helps organize your time and reminds you of important events.

To add an event:

- 1. Press (Not to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Calendar** and press (MRP).
- **3.** Highlight the day you want to add an event by using the Navigation key and press **CRP**.
- **4.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.
- 5. Highlight Add Event and press ().
- 6. Highlight Sch Event and press ().
- 7. Enter the description and press () or press () without entering the description.
- 8. Select the menu under the following options and press (1997):
- **Description** Entering a description of your event (up to 14 characters).
- **From** Scheduling the start time.
- ► **To** Scheduling the end time.
- **Location** Editing the location of your event (up to 14 characters).
- Alarm Select the ringer you wish to set.
- Alarm Time Editing the alarm time (number of hours or minutes before the event starts). Default alarm time is 10 minutes.
- Repeat Repeating the event. Select None, Daily, Weekly, Monthly, or Yearly.
- **9.** Press **Save** (left softkey) to schedule the event.

**Tip:** Press the Navigation key up or down to scroll by week through the Scheduler calendar, and the Volume keys to scroll by month.

### **Event Alerts**

There are several ways your PCS Phone alerts you of scheduled events:

- By playing the alert tone (depending on the Alert and Ringer Volume setting).
- By blinking the LED.
- ▶ By displaying the event's description on the Main LCD when the clamshell is open.
- By displaying the event's description on the Sub LCD when the clamshell is closed.
- By lighting the LCD backlight (depending on the backlight setting).

### **Event Alert Menu**

When your phone is turned on and you have an event alarm scheduled, your phone alerts you and displays the event summary.

- **1.** Press () or View (left softkey) to silence the alarm and see the unchecked event list.
- 2. Highlight the unchecked event and press () to see the event details, or press () (right softkey) for following options. To select an option, highlight it and press ().
- **Snooze** to repeat the alarm in ten minutes.
- Exit to exit the options.

Note: If you press  $\boxed{\text{Exit}}$  (left softkey) during step 1 above, you are prompted to confirm the unchecked event. Select **Yes** to view or **No** to cancel.

### **Editing an Event**

- 1. From the Event list display, highlight one of the events and press (1999).
- **2**. The event details appear.
- 3. Select the box under each item you want to edit and press (See "Adding an Event to the Scheduler" on page 97 for options.)
- 4. Enter or select a new setting and press (1987).
- 5. Press Save (left softkey).

### Adding a Call Alarm to the Scheduler

To add a Call Alarm from the Scheduler:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Calendar and press ().
- **3.** Highlight the day you want to add an event by using the Navigation key and press **WR**.
- **4.** From the event list display, press **Options** (right softkey) to display the options.
- 5. Highlight Add Event and press (MRP).
- 6. Highlight Call Alarm and press
- **7.** Enter the phone number directory or press **Options** (right softkey) for the following options:
- **From Ph. Book** select the number from your phone book entry.
- ► Voicemail select the number for voicemail access.
- 8. Select the box under the following items and press ():
- **Time/Date** Editing the start time/date.
- Alarm Selecting the ringer alarm.
- ► Repeat Repeating the Call Alarm. Select None, Daily, Weekly, Monthly, or Yearly.
- 9. Press Save (left softkey).

**Tip:** You can also add a Call Alarm from the Phone Book menu (see "Internal Phone Book Entry Options" on page 78).

### **Call Alarm Alerts**

There are several ways your PCS Phone alerts you of scheduled call alarms:

- By playing the alert tone (depending on the Alert and Ringer Volume setting).
- By blinking the LED.
- By displaying the name or phone number on the Main LCD when the clamshell is open.
- By displaying the name or phone number on the Sub LCD when the clamchell is closed.
- By lighting the LCD backlight (depending on the backlight setting).

### **Call Alarm Menu**

When your phone is turned on and you have scheduled a call alarm, your phone alerts you and displays the phone number.

- 1. Press (View) (left softkey) to silence the alarm and see the unchecked event list.
- 2. Highlight the unchecked call alarm and press (R) to see the call alarm details, or press **Options** (right softkey) for following options. To select an option, highlight it and press (R).
- **Call** to dial the scheduled phone number.
- **Snooze** to repeat the alarm in ten minutes.
- ► Save Phone# to save the scheduled phone number, if it is not in your Internal Phone Book. If the number is already stored in the Phone Book, Alternate appears instead of Save Phone#.

**Note:** If you press  $\boxed{\text{Exit}}$  (left softkey) during step 1 above, you are prompted to confirm the unchecked event. Select **Yes** to view or **No** to cancel.

# **Editing a Call Alarm**

- 1. From the Event list display, highlight one of the call alarms and press ().
- **2**. The call alarm details appear.
- **3.** Select the box under each item you want to edit and press **(See "Adding a Call Alarm to the Scheduler" on page 99** for options.)
- 4. Enter or select a new setting and press (MRW).
- 5. Press Save (left softkey).

### Erasing a Day's Events or Call Alarms

To erase a scheduled day's events or call alarms:

- **1.** From the Event list display, highlight one of the events or call alarms and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Erase Event and press (1987).
- 3. Highlight Yes and press

### Going to Today's Scheduler Menu

If you are viewing the Scheduler menu and wish to go to the Scheduler menu for today's date:

To view your scheduled events and Call Alarms:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Calendar** and press (MRP).
- **3.** A "▶" is displayed next to the date if an event or call alarms is scheduled.
- 4. To view an individual day, highlight the day by using the Navigation key (◄: previous day, ▷: next day, ▲: previous week, ▼: next week) and press ♥.
- **5.** To display details, highlight one of the events or call alarms from the list and press (MEN). The details display appears.
- To view a future/past day's scheduled events, follow these steps:
- **1.** From the Event list display, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight **Go To Date** and press **EXP**.
- **3.** Enter the date by using numeric keys and the Navigation key and press **CRD** or **OK** (left softkey).
- 4. Press again to view the day's Event List.

### **Adding To Do Items**

Your phone can store and manage 20 To Do items.

To add an entry to your To Do List:

- **1.** From the Event list display, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight **To Do List** and press **(SP)**.
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 4. Highlight Add Item and press (1989).
- **5.** Enter the description and press (up to 14 characters).
- 6. Select the menu under **Priority** and press <sup>MERP</sup> to edit the To Do's priority. You can select from **Normal**, !**Urgent**, or √**Done**.
- 7. Press Save (left softkey).

# **Viewing To Do List**

To view your To Do List:

- **1.** From Event list display, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight **To Do List** and press **(1997)**.
- ► To see the details of each To Do item, select an item and press .

# **Editing To Do Items**

To edit your To Do item:

- **1.** From the To Do list display, highlight the item you want to edit and press **WEW**.
- **2.** Edit description or change the priority and press **Save** (right softkey).

# Adding To Do Item to Schedule

To add your To Do item to the schedule:

- **1.** From the To Do List display, highlight the item you want to add to schedule and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Add To Schedule and press ().
- **3.** Enter the description using your keypad and press (See "Adding an Event to the schedule" on page 97 for entering.)
- 4. Press Save (left softkey).
- Add To Schedule extracts the item from the To Do list and makes it a scheduled event.

# Deleting Items from the To Do List

- **1.** From To Do List display, highlight the item you want to erase and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Erase Item, Erase Selection, or Erase All and press (1989).
- **Erase Item** erases an item from the To Do List.
- Erase Selection erases the selected To Do items at one time.
   Press I to check the box next to To Do item and press
   Erase (left softkey) to erase. To check all boxes, press Options (right softkey) and highlight Check All and press III).
- **Erase All** erases the all To Do items.
- 3. Highlight **Yes** and press ().

### Viewing Event, Call Alarm or To Do List

To view their memory space and options:

**1.** From Event list display, press **Options** (right softkey).

2. Highlight **View Memory** and press **CRD**.

3. Highlight Sch Event, Call Alarm, or To Do List and press ( ).

For further options:

**4.** Press **Options** (right softkey).

5. Highlight an option and press (1989).

Options:

- **Erase Old** deletes the old events or call alarms.
- **Erase Selection** deletes the selected To Do item. (See "Deleting Items from the To Do List" on page 103.)
- **Erase Done** deletes the To Do that is done.
- **Erase All** deletes all the events, call alarms, or To Do items.
- 6. Highlight **Yes** or **No** and press (SEP).

### Purging All Events, Call Alarms or To Do List

To delete all scheduled events, call alarms or To Do List items:

- **1.** From Event list display, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Erase Memory and press (Memory).
- **3**. Highlight one Options item and press (MRV).

Options:

- **Erase Old** deletes the old events, call alarms, or completed To Do items.
- **Erase All** deletes all the events, call alarms, or To Do items.
- 4. Highlight **Yes** or **No** and press (MRC).

# **Displaying User Address**

To display the current user address you have signed in with:

- 1. Press ( to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Info and press ().
- 3. Highlight **Phone# UserID** and press (MRD).
- ► If you sign out, "Vision Disabled" appears on the display.
- Your phone number also appears on the display.

# **Getting to Know Icon Indication**

To see the explanation of icons that appear on the display:

- 1. Press (New) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Info and press (MRW).
- **3.** Highlight **Help** and press **MEND**.
- **4.** Highlight the item for which you want to see the explanation and press **(R)**.
- **5.** The icon's explanation appears and scrolls down automatically.
- 6. Press **Done** (left softkey) or **ENDRO** to end.
- Use  $\blacktriangle/\nabla$  of the Navigation key to scroll the message manually.

# **Displaying the Version Information**

To display the version number of the software, hardware, PRL (Preferred Roaming List), PRI (Product Release Instructions), etc., installed on your PCS Phone:

1. Press () to access the main menu.

- 2. Highlight Phone Info and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight Version and press

### **Using Your Phone's Tools**

In addition to features designed to help make you more efficient and organized, your new PCS Phone also offers tools for your entertainment and amusement.

#### **Using the Calculator**

Your phone comes with a built-in calculator function. To use this feature, follow these easy steps:

- **1.** Press **Meru** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press (SEP).
- 3. Highlight Calculator and press (SP).
- **4**. Enter numbers using your keypad. Press . (left softkey) to insert a decimal point.
- 5. Press the appropriate Navigation key for an arithmetic option.
   (▲ for addition, ▼ for subtraction, ◄ for multiplication, ► for division)
- 6. Enter numbers and press (Figure for the result.
- ► To clear the numbers, press **CLR** (right softkey).
- ► To end calculation, press (END/O).

#### **Using the World Clock**

This feature is available only in digital areas.

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press (SEP).
- 3. Highlight World Clock and press
- 4. World Clock display appears.
- ▶ Press  $\blacktriangleleft$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  of the Navigation key for changing city or country.

Press **Summer** (left softkey) or **Standard** (right softkey) for changing between summer and standard time, if applicable.

" $\blacksquare$  " is shown while summer time is displayed.

# **Downloading Files**

Your PCS Phone has two methods of downloading: from your PC or through the Wireless Web. To use the former, the Multimedia Master is required (sold separately). And also, the PCS Wireless Connection Kit (sold separately) is required to connect the SCP-8100 and a PC. See the following instructions for details on using these two methods for downloading.

### Downloading from Your PC with Multimedia Master

You can download images or ringers from your PC by using the Multimedia Master (sold separately). Also, the PCS Wireless Connection Kit (sold separately) is required to connect the SCP-8100 and a PC. By using the SCP-8100 PC Sync menu, you need to set the phone's status to accept the download. See the Multimedia Master User guide for detailed information. You can set the downloaded data to the Phone Book Entry (page 89), Ringer Setting (pages 30-33) or Display Setting (pages 39-40 and 42).

To download the ringer or image file via Multimedia Master:

- 1. Make sure your phone is in standby mode.
- **2.** For connecting your SCP-8100 to a PC, a USB Cable is included in the PCS Wireless Connection Kit.
- **3.** Confirm the USB port to which the SCP-8100 is attached. Then follow the Multimedia Master User guide.

To end the download

- **1.** Wait for the download to complete.
- 2. A message prompt appears on the display.
- 3. Press END/0.
- 4. Highlight **Yes** and press .
- ► See the Multimedia Master User guide for detailed information.

#### Confirming the downloaded data

The data downloaded via Multimedia Master will be automatically classified as a ringer or image file.

To confirm the downloaded ringer file:

- **1**. Press **Mer** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Tools/Extras** and press **MRP**.
- 3. Highlight **PC Sync** and press (MRV).
- 4. Highlight **Ringers** and press **MENU**.
- 5. Highlight the downloaded data you want to hear and press ().
- 6. Select **Play** from the options and press (1989).

Options:

- **Play** to play the downloaded ringer data.
- ► Assign to assign the downloaded ringer data to the Ringer Type, Start-up/Power-off Tone, or Phone Book.
- **Details** to display the data information.
- **Erase** to erase the selected downloaded ringer data. (If the selected data has already been assigned to any menu, the setting returns to default.)

To confirm the downloaded image file:

- **1**. Press **(BP)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Tools/Extras and press (SEC).
- 3. Highlight **PC Sync** and press (SP).
- 4. Highlight **Images** and press **MERU**.
- 5. Highlight the downloaded data you want to see and press .
- **6.** Select **View** from the options and press **WEW**. Options:
- **View** to view the downloaded image data.
- Assign to assign the downloaded image data to the Incoming Calls, Screen Saver, or Phone Book.
- **Details** to display the data information.
- **Erase** to erase the selected downloaded image data. (If the selected data has already been assigned to any menu, the setting returns to default.)

#### Sorting the downloaded data in alphabetical order

To store the data in reverse chronological order:

- 2. Highlight **Tools/Extras** and press (BP).
- 3. Highlight **PC Sync** and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight **Ringers** or **Images** and press (MRP).
- 5. Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 6. Highlight **Sorting** from the options and press (MRW).

Options:

- ► **Sorting** to sort the downloaded data in reverse chronological order (Time/Date) or alphabetical order (Name).
- **Erase All** to erase all downloaded data you selected during step 4 above. (If the selected data has already been assigned to any menu, the setting returns to default.)
- 7. Highlight **Time/Date** and press **MPD**.

### **Erasing All Downloaded Data**

### Downloading through Wireless Web

Your PCS Phone allows you to download images (screen savers), ringers, games, etc., from a Web site. It is also possible to download from certain menus (Phone Book, Ringer Setting, or Display Setting).

To download a file from the Web:

- **1**. Press (1) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press (1987).
- **3.** Highlight your desired data folder and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press (1989).
- **5.** Start up a Browser and connect to the download page.
- **6.** Select your desired image or ringer file, and follow the system prompts.
- 7. Press the left softkey to start downloading.

- 8. Wait for the download to complete.
- **9.** Press (NDO) to end, or press the left or right softkey for further operation.
- ► Left softkey runs the downloaded data. (See "Confirming the Downloaded Data" on pages 114-117.)
- ► **Right softkey** returns to the download homepage and you can continue to download.

To download a file from Phone Book Entry:

- **1.** Press **MERU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Phone Book and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight **Find Name** and press (1987).
- 4. Highlight the entry you want to assign the downloaded ringer or image to and press ().
- **5.** Highlight a phone number and press **Options** (right softkey). Then highlight **Edit** and press **CPU**.

Highlight an Email address or Web address, then press **Edit** (right softkey).

- 6. Select the menu under Ringer or Image and press ().

- **10**. Press the left softkey to start downloading.
- **11.** Wait for the download to complete.
- **12** Press (NOP) to end, or press the left or right softkey for further operation.
- ► Left softkey runs the downloaded data. (See "To confirm the downloaded ringers folder" on pages 114-115.)
- ▶ **Right softkey** returns to the download homepage and you can continue to download.
- To download a ringer file from the Start-up/Power-off Tone menu:

- **11.** Press **ENDIO** to end, or press the left or right softkey for further operation.
- ► Left softkey runs the downloaded data. (See "To confirm the downloaded images (screen savers) folder" on page 115.)
- ► **Right softkey** returns to the download homepage and you can continue to download.

To download an image file from the Screen Saver menu:

- 1. Highlight **Standby Display** during step 4 above and press .
- 2. Select Screen Saver and press (MRV).
- 3. Select the menu under Screen Saver and press (MRC).
- **4.** Follow the previous steps from 6 to 11.

### **Confirming the Downloaded Data**

The downloaded data will be automatically classified as games, ringers, images (screen savers) or an application folder. However, if any data has a different category, it is classified as a Dynamic folder. If data doesn't belong to any of the above categories, it is classified in the Others folder. When you have just finished downloading by pressing the left softkey (See "Options"), you can also confirm the downloaded data, as follows:

   Erase erases the selected downloaded data.
- **Exit** to return to the downloaded data list display.

#### To confirm the downloaded ringers folder:

- 3. Highlight **Ringers** and press **MRP**.
- 4. Highlight the downloaded data you want to confirm and press ().

- 4. Highlight the downloaded data you want to confirm and press ().
- 5. Select **Open** from the options and press (MRC).

   Properties shows the downloaded data property.
   Online Info shows the downloaded data information online.
   Shop allows you to continue downloading.
   Erase erases the selected downloaded data.

#### Sorting the downloaded data in memory size order

The files downloaded via Web site are stored in alphabetical order. If you want to store the data in memory size order, follow these instructions:

- 1. Press (NEW) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Downloads and press ()
- **3.** Highlight each folder that includes the downloaded data you want to sort.
- 4. Press MENU.
- 5. Press Options (right softkey).
- 6. Highlight Sorting from the options and press ().

Options:

- Sorting to sort the downloaded data in alphabetical (Name) or memory size (Size) order.
- ► **lcon/Size** to show the downloaded data list with memory size.
- Erase All to erase all downloaded files you selected during step 3. (Downloaded data that has already been assigned cannot be erased.)
- 7. Highlight Size and press (MRV).

### Viewing the Downloaded Data Size

This feature allows you to confirm each downloaded data size and the rest of the download capacity.

To view the data size:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press
- **3.** Highlight each folder that includes the downloaded data you want to confirm and press **Control**.
- 4. Press Options (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight lcon/Size and press ().
- 6. Data size is displayed at the left of the downloaded data name.
- To return the display to the icon indication, repeat steps 4 and 5 above.

#### Viewing the memory space for downloading

This feature allows you to confirm how much memory is left and used for downloading.

To view the memory space:

- 1. Press (MENU) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Downloads and press ().
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 4. Highlight View Memory and press ( ).
- 5. Used and Free memory size are displayed.

#### Erasing old downloaded data to free space for new data

If you try to download new data when the downloaded data's memory is full, the warning message appears. You will be prompted to erase some old downloaded data.

To get new download data:

- 1. When the warning message appears, press **Erase** (left softkey) to make a space for new download data. (Press right softkey to cancel the download.)
- **2.** Highlight each folder that includes the data you want to erase.
- 3. Press MENU.
- **4.** Highlight the data you want to erase and press **Erase** (left softkey).
- 5. Highlight **Yes** and press **MENU**.
- 6. You can continue to download the new file.

# Using Your Phone's Voice Services

#### In This Section

- Using Voice-Activated Dialing
- Voice Memos

This section explains the features associated with your phone's Voice Services. The easy-to-follow instructions explain how to use voice-activated dialing and how to record and manage voice memos.

### **Using Voice-Activated Dialing**

In addition to PCS Voice Command<sup>®</sup> (see pages 193-195), you can use a Voice Dial tag to automatically dial a phone number in your Internal Phone Book. Your phone can store up to 30 Voice Dial tags. (To create a Voice Dial tag, see "Programming Voice Dial Tag to Your Phone" on page 122.)

To use a Voice Dial tag to call a phone number:

- **1.** Press **TALK** shortly.
- **2.** Follow the voice prompts and recite the entry's Voice Dial tag into your phone's microphone.

**Note:** Record Voice Dial tags in a quiet environment and without the aid of an accessory (for example, a headset or hands-free car kit).

### **Programming Voice Dial Tag to Your Phone**

To program a Voice Dial tag:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press ().
- 3. Highlight Voice Dial and press (1989).
- 4. Highlight **Program** and press (MRP).
- **5.** The phone will prompt you to say the name you want to program. Wait for the beep and then say the name.
- **6.** Respond to the prompt by repeating the name after the beep.
- **7.** Enter or highlight the entry (name) in the phone book entry list, and press **NRV**.
- **8**. Select the labeled category that includes the phone number (display shows "Voice Dial Recorded").

#### **Reviewing Voice Dialing Tags**

- **1.** Press **(MRP)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press (MRW).
- 3. Highlight Voice Dial and press (MRV).
- 4. Highlight **Review** and press (1989).
- 5. Highlight the desired entry and press (SR).

Highlight the desired entry and press **Options** (right softkey). Highlight **Play** and press **MED**.

► Highlight **Erase** during step 5 above, and select **Yes** to erase Voice Dial tag.

### **Erasing All Voice Dial Tags**

To erase all Voice Dial tags:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press ().
- 3. Highlight Voice Dial and press ().
- 4. Highlight Erase All and press (MRP).
- 5. Highlight **Yes** and press (SEP).

### **Recording Voice Memos**

To record a memo in Standby mode:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press (SEP).
- 3. Highlight Voice Memo and press ().
- 4. Highlight **Record** and press (MRP).
- Press and hold Memo (right softkey) for the shortcut (steps 1 to 4 above).
- **5**. Start recording after the beep.
- To end the recording of your memo:
- 1. Wait for 18 seconds or press ( ) or (BACK) while recording. - or -
  - Press (ND/O) when recording in Standby mode.

To record a conversation during a phone call:

- **1**. Press **()** to see the options.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press (SP).
- 3. Highlight Voice Memo and press (1987).
- 4. Highlight **Record** and press (SEP).
- **5**. Start recording after the beep.
- To end the recording of your conversation:
- **1.** Wait for 18 seconds or press (MERU) or (BACK) while recording. - or -
- Press (NDTO) and disconnect the call when recording in Use State.
- It also stops recording when the other party hangs up the call.
- Recording Memo is disabled while you are in Analog Service area.
- ► When the recording capacity is full, highlight an old memo, and press **Options** (right softkey) and select **Erase**, and press **Options**.

Note: Your phone can store a total of four memos for 18 seconds each.

# **Voice Memo Options**

To play the Voice Memos you have recorded:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight Voice Memo and press ().
- Press Memo (right softkey) for the shortcut (steps 1 to 3 above).
- 4. Highlight **Play** and press (1989).
- **5**. Highlight one memo from the list.
  - or -Highlight **All** if you want to play all memos continuously.
- 6. Press MENU.
- You can change the message playing speed by pressing Slow (left softkey) or Fast (right softkey).
- To play the newer/older memo, press the left/right of the Navigation key.
- ► Wait for ending or press to stop playing.
- ► Highlight **Erase** during step 5 above, and select **Yes** to erase your desired memo.

**Tip:** Voice Memo is stored with the date and time stamp in reverse chronological order, except when it's recorded in no service area.

### **Erasing Voice Memos**

To erase all Voice Memos:

**1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.

2. Highlight Voice Service and press (1987).

3. Highlight Voice Memo and press (MRP).

**Shortcut:** Press Memo (right softkey) to access the Voice Memo menu.

4. Highlight **Play** and press (NEW).

- **5.** Display the memo list, highlight **All** and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 6. Highlight **Erase All** and press .
- 7. Highlight **Yes** and press **MERU**.

- or -

**1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.

2. Highlight Voice Service and press (MRW).

3. Highlight Voice Memo and press (MENU).

Shortcut: Press Memo (right softkey) to access the Voice Memo menu.

4. Highlight Erase All and press (MRC).

5. Highlight **Yes** and press .

Note: To erase individual memos, see "Voice Memo Options" on page 125.

# **Setting Up Screen Call**

This feature enables you to answer incoming calls by using prerecorded announcements, either one that is pre-recorded or one that you record. You can also record the caller's message into the Voice Memo list (See "Recording Voice Memos" on page 124). You can decide whether you answer the call immediately or not during the caller's recording.

#### **Activating Screen Call**

To start Screen Call when you have incoming calls:

- **1**. Press **(BR)** to display the options.
- 2. Highlight Screen Call and press (1987).

To set Auto Screen Call:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight Screen Call and press 🐨.
- 4. Highlight Auto and press .
- 5. Highlight **On** and press **MERU**.
- If you want to change the answer time, enter your desired number (from 1 to 16 seconds) by using numeric keys or the up/down Navigation key.
- **6.** Press **C** or **O** (left softkey). The **C** icon is displayed on the Standby display.

**Tip:** If a new caller's message is waiting, in appears on the display. The memos recorded while activating "Screen Call" are shown with " $\sqrt{"}$  or "!" icon in the list. (" $\sqrt{"}$ : once played, "!": not played yet)

Tip: While the caller is recording: Pressing (NDO) stops recording and disconnects the call. Pressing (TALK) answers the call.

#### **Selecting Announcement for Screen Call**

- **1.** Press **MEN** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press (MRW).
- 3. Highlight Screen Call and press (MRV).
- 4. Highlight Announcement and press ().
- 5. Depending on your preference, highlight **Pre-Recorded** or **Custom**, and press **CRP**.
- **Recording Name for Pre-Recorded Announcement**
- **1.** Press **(MRP)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voice Service and press (SEC).
- 3. Highlight Screen Call and press (1987).
- 4. Highlight Announcement and press (1989).
- 5. Highlight **Pre-Recorded** and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 6. Highlight **Record Name** and press (1987).
- ► If your name has already been recorded, select **Yes** or **No** for overwriting.
- 7. Press ( to start the 1st recording.
- **8.** After the 1st recording, press again to start the 2nd recording.
- 9. To stop recording, wait for 12 seconds or press ().
- ► To erase the recorded name, select **Erase Name** during step 6 above.
- ► To play the pre-recorded announcement, select **Play** during step 6 above.

#### **Recording Customized Announcement**

- **1.** Follow steps 1 to 4 on the previous page.
- **2.** Highlight **Custom** and press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight **Record** and press (MERU).
- ► If your name has already been recorded, select **Yes** or **No** for overwriting.
- 4. Press ( to start the 1st recording.
- **5.** After the 1st recording, press (Mex.) again to start the 2nd recording.
- 6. To stop recording, wait for 12 seconds or press .
- ► To erase the recorded announcement, select **Erase** during step 3 above.
- ► To play the customized announcement, select **Play** during step 3 above.

# **Using Your Phone's Camera**

Your PCS Phone gives you the ability to take full-color digital pictures, view your pictures using the phone's display, and instantly share them with your family and friends. It's fun and as easy to use as a traditional point-and-click camera – just take a picture, view it on your phone's display, and send it to up to ten people, right from your phone. Your pictures may also be uploaded to a Picture Mail Web site for storage or sent to another Web site for your personal use. Picture quality is similar to what you see on your computer screen.

This section explains the features and options of your phone's built-in PCS Camera.

# **Taking Pictures**

Taking pictures with your phone's built-in PCS Camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the lens, and pressing a key. You can activate Camera mode and take pictures whether the phone is open or closed.

## To Take a Picture With the Phone Open:

- **1.** Press **(MRP)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Pictures** and press (WP) to access the Pictures menu.
- 3. Highlight **Camera** and press (R) to activate Camera mode. (Additional user options are available through the Camera mode **Options** menu. See "Camera Mode Options" on page 134 for more information.)

**Shortcut:** To activate Camera mode, you can also press at twice or just press the Side Camera key (see diagram on page 10).

- **4.** Using the phone's Main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
- 5. Hold the camera steady. To take the picture, press (1997),
- **6.** Press **Keep** (left softkey) to save the picture. Press **Discard** (right softkey) to erase the picture and return to Camera mode.
- Once you have kept/saved a picture, you will be in Review/Share mode. You will now be able to share or upload the picture.
- ▶ To return to Camera mode to take another picture, press .

## To Take a Picture With the Phone Closed:

- **1.** Press and hold the Side Camera key to activate Camera mode.
- **2.** Point the camera lens at your subject. You can check the picture framing through the Sub LCD.

**Note:** When taking a picture with the phone closed, the subject image appears in reverse on the Sub LCD. When you take a picture, it will be saved correctly, that is, not reversed.

**3**. Press the Side Camera key to take the picture.

4. Press the Side Camera key to save the picture.

Note: The picture will be saved automatically after 30 seconds.

**Note:** While you are taking a picture, the backlight turns on even if your backlight is set to **Always Off**.

**Note:** In some cases, the screen may flicker and the stripes may appear on the display under fluorescent lighting.

## **Creating Your Picture Mail<sup>™</sup> Password**

The first time you use any of the Picture Mail management options involving the Picture Mail Web site you will need to establish a Picture Mail password through your PCS Phone. This password will also allow you to log in to the Picture Mail Web site at <u>www.picturemail.sprintpcs.com</u> to access and manage your uploaded pictures.

To create your Picture Mail password:

1. Press ( to access the main menu.

- 2. Highlight **Pictures** and press (1987).
- 3. Highlight Review/Share and press (MC).

Shortcut: Instead of steps 3 above, highlight Camera and press (). Then press Review (left softkey) to enter Review/Share mode.

- 4. Press **Options** (right softkey), highlight **Upload**, and press **ERP**.
- **5.** Highlight **Upload This** or **Upload All** and press **CR**. You will be prompted to create a Picture Mail password.

Note: To access Picture Mail Web site in another way, highlight **Online Pics** and press (RP) from step 3 above.

6. Enter a 4-digit, alpha-numeric password and press .

Tip: Write down your Picture Mail password in a secure place.

7. Please wait while the system creates your account.

Once you have received confirmation that your account has been successfully registered you may upload and share pictures and access the Picture Mail Web site.

## **Camera Mode Options**

When the phone is open and in Camera mode, several user options are available.

Review: Press Review (left softkey) to enter Review/Share mode. From there you can view the captured pictures, view a running count of stored pictures, and more. (See "Review/Share Mode" on pages 138-140.)


Pressing **Options** (right softkey) displays additional user options:

- Self-timer: Activate the camera's timer function. (See "Setting Self-timer" on page 135 for details.)
- ► **Fun Frames:** Select your favorite fun picture frame to decorate your picture and press .
- ► Color Tone: Select Normal, Sepia, Black & White or Negative. (Default setting is Normal.)
- Brightness: Select Auto or Manual brightness control. If you select Manual, press the Navigation key right (Higher) or left (Lower) to select a setting and press ( or OK (left softkey) to apply the desired setting. (Default setting is Auto.)
- Shutter Sound: Select Default, Say "Cheez" or Off. If your phone's ringer is set to Silence All, Shutter Sound is set to Off. (Default setting is Default.)

**Tip:** You can also select fun frames from Camera mode by using the left/right Navigation key.

**Note:** After taking a picture, **Self-timer** and **Fun Frames** settings return to their default settings.

**Note:** Press the up or down Navigation key to display a picture count at the bottom of the Main LCD. On the same line of the LCD display, appears if you set a **Color Tone** and appears if you set a **Brightness**.

## **Setting Self-timer**

To activate the Self-timer and get yourself in on the picture:

- **1.** With the phone open and in Camera mode, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 2. Highlight Self-timer and press (1987).
- 3. Highlight the length of delay you want the timer to use (10 seconds or 5 seconds) and press (10 seconds). To deactivate the Self-timer, highlight Off and press (10 seconds).
- 4. Press Start (left softkey) when you are ready to start the timer.and a numeric countdown appear on the lower left portion of the Main LCD during the Self-timer countdown.
- **5.** Get ready for the picture. When the timer is down to three seconds, the Self-timer icon will turn red and the phone will begin to beep.
- ► To cancel the Self-timer after it has started, press **Cancel** (right softkey).

Note: While the Self-timer is active, all keys are disabled except (BACK) (INDIO) or Cancel (right softkey).

**Tip:** To view a brief summary of Camera, Review/Share, and Picture Wallet use, press **Info** (right softkey) from the Pictures main menu.

# **Sharing Picture Mail**

Once you've taken a picture, you can use the messaging capabilities of your PCS Phone to instantly share it with family and friends. You can send a picture to up to ten people at a time using their email addresses or their Vision-enabled PCS Vision Phone numbers. (You can also share Picture Mail from your phone through your online Picture Mail account. See "Sharing Online Picture Mail" on page 143 for details.)

## Sharing Picture Mail from Review/Share Mode

- 1. From standby mode, press (MEN) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Pictures** and press (SEP) to display the Pictures menu.

Shortcut: Instead of steps 1 and 2 above, press (1)

- 3. Highlight **Review/Share** to enter Review/Share mode.
- **4.** From Review/Share mode, use the left/right Navigation key to select the picture you'd like to send and press **Share** (left softkey). Your contact list (phone book) will display.

**Note:** The first time you share Picture Mail, you will be prompted to establish a Picture Mail Web site account and password. See "Creating Your Picture Mail Password" on page 133 for information.

**5.** Use the Navigation key to select a recipient and press (1) to add the selected recipient to the Picture Mail. This will check the box next to the recipient's name.

**Note:** If there are no entries in your contact list (phone book), a blank New Entry form will display. Follow the instructions below to add a new entry.

- or -

To add someone not already in your contact list/internal phone book, select **<New Entry>** and press **CR**. Enter the recipient's Vision-enabled PCS Phone number and/or email address and a name for the entry. Press **Save** (left softkey) to save the entry. The new recipient will be added to the Picture Mail and to your internal phone book.

► To edit an entry, press Edit (right softkey) when selected. Edit the entry's PCS Phone number, email address, or name and press Save (left softkey) to save the entry.

**Note:** The <u>M</u> and <u>@</u> icons next to contact's names represent Mobile Phone and email. When entering a new contact, use the left/right Navigation key to toggle to the correct icon for the entry.

Note: Only the email address OR the phone number may be selected for a recipient. To change the default once the new entry has been added, use the Navigation key and scroll right to select either (M) (Vision-enabled PCS Phone Number) or @ (email address).

- **6.** Press **Done** (left softkey) when you are finished selecting/entering recipients (you may include up to 10 recipients per Picture Mail).
- 7. To record and include a Voice Memo with the picture you are sending, highlight **Include**, press (RP), and start recording after the beep. (Maximum recording time is 10 seconds.) Press (RP) to end the recording.

- or -

If you do not wish to attach a Voice Memo to the Picture Mail, highlight **Don't Include** and press **(BPP)**.

- 8. Use your keypad to enter a text message (or press the right softkey to select from **Canned Messages** or **Recent Messages**) and press (RC). (You may also choose to leave the message area blank; just press (RC) to continue.)
- **9.** Confirm the recipients, message, voice memo, and picture.
- ► To change a recipient, highlight the recipient, press Change (right softkey), and follow the instructions in step 5 above to select a recipient or to edit the selected recipient.
- ► To change or confirm other items, highlight the box beneath Message and press **Options** (right softkey) to display options:

Message Change to enter or change the text message.

**VoiceMemo Play** to play the attached Voice Memo (if applicable).

VoiceMemo Rec to record or re-record the Voice Memo.

**VoiceMemo Erase** to delete the Voice Memo from the Picture Mail (if applicable).

**10.** Press **Send** (left softkey) to send the Picture Mail.

## **Sharing Picture Mail from Messaging**

You can also share your pictures from your PCS Phone's Messaging menu.

- **1.** Press **(MRP)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press (1989).
- **3.** Highlight **Share Picture** and press **CRP**. (The most recent picture saved to Review/Share mode displays.)

**Shortcut:** Press the up Navigation key to enter Picture Mail Review/Share menu.

**4.** Use the left/right Navigation key to select the picture you wish to send and press **Select** (left softkey).

**Tip:** To display thumbnail pictures, press **Options** (left softkey), highlight **Thumbnail**, and press **CRP**.

**5.** To complete and send the Picture Mail, follow steps 5-10 in "Sharing Picture Mail from Review/Share Mode" on pages 136-137.

# **Storing Pictures**

Your phone can store pictures in two ways:

- Review/Share Mode (see below)
- ▶ Picture Wallet (see pages 140-141)

## **Review/Share Mode**

Your phone can store approximately 11 pictures in Review/Share mode, depending on available memory.

When a picture is taken and kept, it is saved to Review/Share mode. You can enter Review/Share mode from the Pictures menu by selecting **Review/Share**. You may also enter Review/Share mode from Camera mode by pressing **Review** (left softkey). (When you take a picture and press **Keep** (left softkey), your phone automatically enters Review/Share mode.) In Review/Share mode, you can view all the pictures you have kept, store selected images in your phone, send pictures to the Picture Mail Web site, delete pictures and access additional picture options. Press **Options** (right softkey) to display the following options:

- **Camera** to switch to Camera mode.
- Save to Wallet to save a picture to the Picture Wallet. (See "Picture Wallet" on pages 140-141.)
- ► Upload to select Upload This or Upload All to upload a single picture or all pictures saved in Review/Share mode to the Picture Mail Web site. Depending on your settings, you may be prompted to accept a PCS Vision connection.

**Note:** Saving to Wallet and Uploading each copy pictures from your phone's Review/Share mode to your Picture Wallet or your online Picture Mail account. Pictures which have been saved to your wallet or uploaded to your online account will remain available in Review/Share mode until you erase them.

**Note:** If this is the first time you have accessed the Picture Mail account, you will be prompted to create your Picture Mail password. See "Creating Your Picture Mail Password" on page 133.

• **Erase** to select **Erase This** or **Erase All** to erase a single picture or all pictures saved in Review/Share mode.


**Note:** Erasing pictures will free up memory space in your phone to enable you to take more pictures. Once erased, pictures cannot be uploaded to your online Picture Mail account or saved to the Picture Wallet.

 Color Tone to select a color tone (Sepia, Black & White, or Negative) for the picture.

**Note:** Once you have changed a picture's color tone, it cannot be returned to its original tone.

- Edit Caption to edit the picture's caption. (Up to 14 characters. See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 79.)
- Picture Info to display information on the selected picture, such as caption, time/date, size, etc.
- ▶ **Thumbnail** to switch the display from full-screen to thumbnail view (up to four pictures per screen). (If the display is already in Thumbnail view, the option will appear as **Expand** to switch from thumbnail to full-screen view.)

**Tip:** Press the up or down Navigation key to view a picture's caption and number/count (for example 1/14 is the first of 14 stored pictures) at the bottom of the display screen. The Save to Wallet **2** and Uploaded **4** icons also appear, if applicable.



## **Picture Wallet**

Your Phone can store up to 60 pictures in the Picture Wallet, depending on available memory.

## To save a picture to the Picture Wallet:

- **1.** From Review/Share mode (see "Review/Share Mode" on pages 138-140), use the left/right Navigation key to select a picture you wish to save the Picture Wallet.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey). The Review/Share mode options will display.
- **3.** Highlight **Save to Wallet** and press **CRP**. A copy of the picture will be saved to the Picture Wallet.


## To view pictures stored in the Picture Wallet:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Pictures and press
- 3. Highlight **Picture Wallet** and press **EXP**.
- **4.** Press **Thumbnail** (left softkey). Thumbnail pictures will display (up to four pictures per screen).

- 5. Using the Navigation key, select a desired picture.
- **6.** To expand the selected picture, press **Expand** (left softkey).
- 7. Press **Options** (right softkey) to display a list of options for the selected picture. To select an option, highlight it and press **WRP**.
- **Incoming Calls** to display the selected picture for all incoming calls.
- **Screen Saver** to display the picture as an LCD screen saver.
- Phone Book to display the picture for incoming calls from a specific internal phone book entry.
- Erase select Erase This or Erase All to erase the selected picture or all pictures saved in the Picture Wallet.

Note: Pictures may be assigned to more than one task.

**Note:** Press the up/down Navigation key to view a picture's file name and picture count at the bottom of the display screen. The Assigned I icon also appears, if applicable.



# Managing Picture Mail<sup>™</sup>

## **Using the Picture Mail Web Site**

Once you have uploaded pictures from your phone to your online Picture Mail account (see "Review/Share Mode" on pages 138-140), you can use your personal computer to manage your pictures. From the Picture Mail Web site you can share pictures, edit album titles and picture captions, organize and move images, and do much more.

You will also have access to picture management tools to improve and customize your pictures. You'll be able to lighten, darken, crop, antique, add comic bubbles and cartoon effects, and use other features to transform your pictures.

## To access the Picture Mail Web site:

- 1. From your computer's Internet connection, go to www.picturemail.sprintpcs.com.
- **2.** Enter your PCS Phone number and Picture Mail password to register. (See "Creating Your Picture Mail Password" on page 133.)

## Managing Online Picture Mail From Your PCS Phone

You can use your phone to manage, edit, or share pictures you have uploaded to the Picture Mail Web site. (See "Review/Share Mode" on pages 138-140 for information about uploading.)

## To view your online Picture Mail from your PCS Phone:

- **1**. Press (1) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Pictures** and press **EXP**.
- **3.** Highlight **Online Pics** and press **E**. Depending on your settings, you may be prompted to accept a PCS Vision connection.
- 4. Your Picture Mail InBox and your albums appear. Highlight **InBox** or an album title and press (R) to display.

**5.** Thumbnail pictures appear (up to four per screen). Use your Navigation key to select a picture.

Tip: To expand a selected picture from thumbnail to full-screen, highlight it and press **Expand** (left softkey) or **Expand**.

## **Sharing Online Picture Mail**

- 1. From the online Picture Mail InBox, select a picture you wish to share and press **Share** (left softkey).
- 2. Highlight Phone Book or Online Addr. Book and press (SP).
- **3.** Select a recipient from your Internal Phone Book or Online Address Book, and press .

Options (Online Address Book only)

- **Next** to display the next 50 entries (if applicable).
- **Previous** to display the previous 50 entries (if applicable).
- **Exit** to exit the options menu.
- **4.** To complete and send the Picture Mail, follow steps 5-10 in "Sharing Picture Mail from Review/Share Mode" on pages 136-137.

## To share an album from online mode:

- 1. From the online Albums display, use the Navigation key to select an album you wish to share and press **Share** (left softkey).
- **2.** Follow steps 2-4 in "Sharing Online Picture Mail" to complete and send your Picture Mail.
- ► You cannnot attach Voice Memo when you share an album.

## Accessing Online Picture Mail Options From Your PCS Phone

- 1. Select a picture from your online Picture Mail (see "Managing Online Picture Mail From Your PCS Phone" on pages 142-143).
- **2**. Press **Options** (right softkey) to display options.
- **3.** To select an option, highlight it and press ().
- Copy/Move to copy or move pictures to a selected album:
   Copy This to copy the selected picture to the album.

**Copy All** to copy all pictures in the current album (or InBox) to the target album.

Move This to move the selected picture to the album.

**Move All** to move all pictures in the current album (or InBox) to the target album.

- ► Save to Wallet to copy the selected picture to the Picture Wallet. (See "Picture Wallet" on pages 140-141.)
- Erase to select Erase This or Erase All to erase a single picture or all pictures saved in the current album (or InBox).
- **Edit Caption** to edit the picture's caption.
- **Picture Info** to display information on the selected picture, such as caption, time/date, size, etc.
- Rotate Picture to rotate the selected picture.
- ► **Create Album** to create a new album (from the InBox only). Enter the album name and press **Save** (left softkey).
- Online Albums to switch from pictures to the album list.
- ► **Thumbnail** to switch a selected picture from thumbnail to full-screen. (If the display is already in Thumbnail view, the option will appear as **Expand**.)
- Next to display the next 20 pictures (if applicable).
- ▶ **Previous** to display the previous 20 pictures (if applicable).

## To access your online Albums options from your PCS Phone:

- 1. Display the album list in the online Picture Mail menu. (See "Managing Online Picture Mail From Your PCS Phone" on pages 142-143).
- **2**. Use your Navigation key to select an album (or InBox).
- **3.** Press **Options** (right softkey) to display options.
- 4. To select an option, highlight it and press ().
- Create Album to create a new album. Enter a new album name and press Save (left softkey).
- **Erase Album** to delete the selected album.
- ► **Rename Album** to rename the selected album. Enter a new name and press **Save** (left softkey).

Note: The InBox cannot be erased or renamed.

- Album Info to display information on the selected album; name, time/date and number of saved pictures.
- Next to display the next 20 albums (if applicable).
- ▶ **Previous** to display the previous 20 albums (if applicable).

Now that you've mastered your phone's fundamentals, it's time to explore the calling features that enhance your PCS Service.

# **Using Voicemail**

## **Setting Up Your Voicemail**

All unanswered calls to your PCS Phone are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. Therefore, you will want to set up your PCS Voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your PCS Phone is activated.

To set up voicemail:

- 1. Press and hold 🖭
- **2.** Follow the system prompts to create your pass code, record your greeting, record your name announcement, and choose whether to activate One-Touch Message Access (a feature that lets you press one key to access messages and bypasses the need for you to enter your pass code).

Note: The voicemail setup process may vary in certain Affiliate areas.

## **Voicemail Notification**

There are several ways your PCS Phone alerts you:

- By displaying a message on the screen.
- By sounding the assigned ringer type.
- ▶ By the LED blinking red.
- ► By displaying at the top of your screen for voicemail messages or for Messages.

## **New Voicemail Message Alerts**

When you receive a new voice message, your phone alerts you and prompts you to call your voicemail. To call your voicemail, press **TALK**. To display your Voicemail menu, press **CALK** (left softkey).

Important: When you are roaming off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network, you may not receive notification of new voicemail messages. It is recommended that you periodically check your voicemail by dialing 1 + area code + your PCS Phone Number. When your voicemail answers, press and enter your pass code. You will be charged roaming rates when accessing voicemail while roaming off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

**Note:** Your phone accepts messages even when it is turned off. However, you are only notified of new messages when your phone is turned on and you are in a PCS Service Area.

## **Retrieving Your Voicemail Messages**

You can review your messages directly from your PCS Phone or from any other touch-tone phone. To dial from your PCS Phone, you can either Speed Dial your voicemail or use the menu keys.

#### Using One-Touch Message Access:

▶ Press and hold 1. Follow the system prompts.

#### Using the Menu Keys on Your PCS Phone to Access Your Messages:

- **1**. Press **(MERC)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voicemail and press
- 3. Highlight Call Voicemail and press (MRC).

**Note:** You are charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voicemail from your PCS Phone.

#### Using a Phone Other Than Your PCS Phone to Access Messages:

- 1. Dial your PCS Phone Number.
- 2. When your voicemail answers, press 💌.
- **3.** Enter your pass code.

**Tip:** When you call into voicemail you first hear the header information (date, time, and sender information) for the message. To skip directly to the message, press during the header.

#### **Voicemail Button Guide**

Here's a quick guide to your keypad functions while listening to voicemail messages. For further details and menu options, see "Voicemail Menu Key" on page 155.



## **Voicemail Options**

Your PCS Phone offers several options for organizing and accessing your voicemail.

#### **Using Expert Mode**

Using the Expert mode setting for your personal voicemail box helps you navigate through the voicemail system more quickly by shortening the voice prompts you hear at each level.

To turn Expert mode on or off:

- 1. Press and hold I to access your voicemail. If your voicemail box contains any new or saved messages, press I to access the main voicemail menu.
- **2.** Following the system prompts, press **3** to change your Personal Options.
- **3.** Press **4** for Expert mode.
- 4. Press 1 to turn Expert mode on or off.

#### **Setting Up Group Distribution Lists**

Create up to 20 separate group lists, each with up to 50 customers.

- Press and hold I to access your voicemail. If your voicemail box contains any new or saved messages, press x to access the main voicemail menu.
- **2.** Following the system prompts, press **3** to change your Personal Options.
- 3. Press 2 for Administrative Options.
- 4. Press **5** for Group Distribution Lists.
- **5.** Follow the voice prompts to create, edit, rename, or delete group lists.

## **PCS Callback**

Return a call after listening to a message without disconnecting from voicemail.

- 1. After listening to a message, press (a).
- **2.** Once the call is complete, you're returned to the voicemail main menu.

## Voicemail-to-Voicemail Message

Record and send a voice message to other PCS Voicemail users.

- **1.** From the main voicemail menu, press **2** to send a message.
- 2. Follow the voice prompts to enter the phone number.
- **3.** Follow the voice prompts to record and send your voice message.

#### Voicemail-to-Voicemail Message Reply

Reply to a voice message received from any other PCS Voicemail user.

- 1. After listening to a voice message, press 2.
- 2. Follow the voice prompts to record and send your reply.

## Voicemail-to-Voicemail Message Forwarding

Forward a voice message, except those marked "Private," to other PCS Voicemail users.

- 1. After listening to a message, press 6
- 2. Follow the voice prompts to enter the phone number.
- **3.** Follow the voice prompts to record your introduction and forward the voice message.

#### Voicemail-to-Voicemail Receipt Request

Receive confirmation that your voice message has been listened to when you send, forward, or reply to other PCS users.

- 1. After you have recorded a message, press 1 to indicate you are satisfied with the message you recorded.
- **2**. Press **4** to mark receipt requested.
- 3. Press **1** to send your voicemail message.

## **Continue Recording**

 Before pressing 1 to indicate you are satisfied with the message you recorded, press 4 to continue recording.

#### **Extended Absence Greeting**

When your phone is turned off or you are off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network for an extended period, this greeting can be played instead of your normal personal greeting.

- 1. From the main voicemail menu, press 3 for Personal Options.
- **2.** Press **3** for Greetings.
- **3**. Press **3** to record an Extended Absence Greeting.

## **Clearing the Message Icon**

Your phone may temporarily continue to display the message icon after you have checked your voice and text messages.

To clear the icon from the display screen:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Voicemail and press (
- 3. Highlight **Clear Count** and press (Sec. 2014).
- 4. Highlight **Yes** and press **MRP**.

# **Using Caller ID**

Caller ID lets people know who's calling by displaying the number of the person calling.

To block your phone number from being displayed for a specific outgoing call:

1. Press 🗶 6 7.

- 2. Enter the number you want to call, and press .
- To permanently block your number, call PCS Customer Service Solutions.

# **Responding to Call Waiting**

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

- Press (or press ), highlight Flash and press ). This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.
- ► To switch back to the first caller, press ((or press ), highlight **Flash** and press () again.

**Tip:** For those calls where you don't want to be interrupted, you can temporarily disable Call Waiting by pressing **(x) (7) (o)** before placing your call. Call Waiting is automatically reactivated once you end the call.

# Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. Enter a number you wish to call and press TALK.
- 2. Once you have established the connection, press (or press (), highlight Three-Way Call and press () to put the first caller on hold.
- 3. Enter the second number you wish to call and press (or press (MRW), highlight Call and press (MRW)).
- 4. When you're connected to the second party, press (ARC), highlight **Flash** and press (MRC), to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

**Tip:** You can also begin a Three-Way Call by displaying a phone number stored in your Internal Phone Book, Call History, or Messaging. To call the third party, press **WRD** during step 3 above.

**Note:** Call Waiting and Three-Way Calling may not be available while roaming off the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network.

# **Using Call Forwarding**

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number – even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when Call Forwarding is activated.

#### **To Activate Call Forwarding**

#### 1. Press 🗶 7 🔼 .

- **2**. Enter the area code and phone number to which your future calls should be forwarded.
- **3.** Press **TALK**. You will hear a tone to confirm the activation of Call Forwarding.

#### **To Deactivate Call Forwarding**

- 1. Press 🗶 7 💈 0.
- **2**. Press **TALK**. You will hear a tone to confirm the deactivation.

Note: You are charged a higher rate for calls you have forwarded.

These features, including email, pictures, and games are easy to learn and use and the rich, colorful graphic experience is visually comparable to your home or office computer. Clearly, it's a whole new way to look at wireless.



## Web

With Web on your PCS Phone, you will be able to browse full-color graphic versions – not just text versions – of your favorite Web sites, making it easier than ever to stay informed while on the go. Check sports scores, trade stocks, and shop all on your PCS Phone.

## Launching the Web

To launch the Web:

1. Press Web (left softkey).

- or -

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Web and press (MRW).

## **Net Guard**

When you first connect to the Internet, the Net Guard will appear to confirm that you want to connect. This feature helps you avoid accidental connections. You can disable the Net Guard in the future by selecting **Always Auto-Connect** when the Net Guard is displayed.

To change your Net Guard settings:

- **1.** Press **(BP)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRC).
- 3. Highlight **Vision** and press .
- 4. Highlight Net Guard and press (SP).
- 5. Select **On** or **Off** and press **MERU**.
- **On** to make the Net Guard appear when connecting to the Internet.
- **Off** to avoid the Net Guard when connecting to the Internet.

**Note:** When enabled, the Net Guard appears only once per session. The Net Guard does not appear if the phone is merely re-connecting due to a time-out.

## Your User Name

When you use PCS Vision services, your User name is submitted to identify you to the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. The User name is also useful as an address for email as a way to personalize Internet services, and as an online virtual identity.

A User name is typically based on the customer's name and a number, followed by "@sprintpcs.com." For example, the third John Smith to sign up for PCS Vision services might have **jsmith003@sprintpcs.com** as his User name. If you want a particular User name, you can visit <u>www.sprintpcs.com</u> and get the name you want – as long as nobody else has it!

**Note:** If you already have a PCS Mail User name, that will automatically become your PCS Vision User name.

Your User name will be automatically programmed into your PCS Phone. You don't have to enter it.

## **Updating Your User Name**

When you change the programmed User name and select a new one, you have to update your User name through your PCS Phone.

To update your User name:

- **1**. Press **(MRW)** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRC).
- 3. Highlight Vision and press (MRC).
- 4. Highlight **Update Profile** and press (MP).
- **5.** After the updating processing, your new User name will appear on the display.
- ► If you want to cancel, press ( while processing.

## **Signing In and Out of PCS Vision Services**

You can sign out of PCS Vision services without turning off your phone; however, you will not have access to all PCS Vision services, including Web and messaging. Signing out will avoid any charges associated with PCS Vision services. While signed out, you can still place or receive phone calls, check voicemail, and use other voice services. You may sign in again at any time.

To sign out of PCS Vision services:

- **1.** Press **MEN** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (MRP).
- 3. Highlight Vision and press (MRP).
- 4. Highlight **Disable Vision** and press (1989).
- **5.** A message will appear. Press **Disable** (right softkey) to confirm that you want to sign out.
- To sign in to PCS Vision services:
- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Settings and press (Setting).
- 3. Highlight Vision and press Mere.
- 4. Highlight Enable Vision and press (1989).

## **Browsing the Web**

Browsing the Web is easy once you've learned a few basics. Here are some tips for browsing the Web with PCS Vision:

## Softkeys

When browsing the Web, the bottom line of your phone's display contains one or more softkeys. These keys are shortcut controls for navigating around the Web, and they correspond to the softkey buttons directly below the phone's display screen. Depending on which Web sites you visit, the labels on the softkeys may change to indicate their function.

To use softkeys, simply press the desired softkey button. If an additional pop-up menu appears when you press the softkey button, select the menu items using either the up or down of the Navigation key or by highlighting the option and pressing INT.

## Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to scroll up and down to see everything on some Web sites.

Press the Navigation key up and down to scroll line by line or press the Volume keys on the side of the phone to scroll one page at a time.

#### Selecting

Once you've learned how to use softkeys, you can start navigating Web sites.

Select on-screen items by using the Navigation key to highlight the desired item, then press the desired softkey button.

You'll find that the left softkey is used primarily for selecting items. This softkey is often labeled "OK." You can also press **(RP)** for selecting items.

► If the items on a page are numbered, you can use your keypad (number keys) to select an item.

Links, allow you to jump to different Web pages, select special functions, or even place phone calls.

Select links by highlighting the link and then selecting the appropriate softkey.

**Tip:** The tenth item in a numbered list may be selected by pressing the the way on your phone's keypad, even though the number 0 doesn't appear on the screen.

## **Going Back**

► To go back one page, press (BACK) on your phone. Note that (BACK) is also used for deleting text when you are entering text.

## **Going Home**

► To return to the Home Page from any other Web page, highlight **Home** and press **OK** (left softkey).

#### Going to a Specific Web Site

To go to a particular Web site by entering a URL (Web site address):

- **1**. Launch the Web and press the right softkey.
- 2. Select Go to URL and press the left softkey.
- **3.** Select **Address** and press the left softkey.
- **4.** Press the right softkey, use your keypad to enter the URL of the Web site you wish to go to, and press the left softkey.
- **5**. Press the left softkey to go to the Web site.

Note: Not all Web sites are viewable on your phone.

#### **Creating a Bookmark**

Bookmarks allow you to store the address of your favorite Web sites for easy access at a later time.

To create a bookmark:

- 1. Launch the Web page you want to mark.
- **2**. Press the right softkey to go to the Browser menu.
- 3. Select Mark this page and press the left softkey.

**Note:** Bookmarking a page does not store the page contents, just its address.

**Note:** Some pages cannot be bookmarked. Whether a particular Web page may be marked is controlled by its creator.

## Accessing a Bookmark

To access a bookmark:

- **1**. Launch the Web and press the right softkey.
- 2. Select Browser Menu and press the left softkey.
- 3. Select View Bookmarks and press the left softkey.
- 4. Highlight the bookmark you'd like to access and press the left softkey button or www to go to the Web site.
- > You may skip step 2, depending on the page you select.

## Editing a Bookmark

- **1.** Launch the Web and press the right softkey.
- 2. Select View Bookmarks and press the left softkey.
- **3.** Select the bookmark you wish to edit and press the right softkey.
- 4. Select Edit Address or Edit Title, and press the left softkey.
- **5.** Press the right softkey, use your keypad to edit the address or title, and press the left softkey.
- 6. To save the bookmark, press the left softkey.

## **Deleting a Bookmark**

- **1.** Access the **View Bookmarks** menu as outlined above in steps 1–2.
- **2.** Highlight the bookmark you wish to erase and press the right softkey.
- 3. Select **Delete** and press the left softkey.
- 4. Press the right softkey.
- ► If you want to delete all bookmarks, select **Delete All** during step 3 above.

## **Reloading a Web Page**

- 1. Launch the Web.
- 2. To reload (refresh) the current Web page, press the right softkey.
- **3**. Select **Browser Menu** and press the left softkey.
- 4. Select **Refresh this page** and press the left softkey.
- > You may skip step 3, depending on the page you select.

## **Restarting the Web Browser**

If the Web browser appears to be malfunctioning or stops responding, you can usually fix the problem by simply restarting the browser.

- 1. Launch the Web.
- **2**. To restart the Web browser, press the right softkey.
- 3. Select Browser Menu and press the left softkey.
- 4. Select Restart Browser and press the left softkey.
- > You may skip step 3, depending on the page you select.

## **Setting Up a Web Connection**

#### **Getting Started**

Your PCS Phone can connect to a laptop PC to send and receive email, access the Internet or your company's network, and more – without searching for a wall-mounted telephone jack. In just three steps, you can use your connectivity:

- **1.** First, you'll need a PCS Connection Kit<sup>™</sup> (sold separately).
- **2.** Connect your laptop PC to your PCS Phone using a USB port.
- 3. Finally, take a few minutes to install the PCS Connection Manager<sup>™</sup> Software onto your computer using the CD.
- For complete details on how to install and use the software, refer to the user guide in the PCS Connection Kit<sup>™</sup> you purchased.

#### **Placing a Data Call**

To place a data call when you're connected to the Web:

- 1. First, make sure the cable is connected properly.
- 2. Open the PCS Connection Manager<sup>™</sup> Software on your computer and place the call.
- Once the call successfully connects, your phone displays information on the status of the data call.

## Using Special Features During a Web Call

Your phone gives you the ability to use special features while you're on a Web call. They are outlined below:

- ► Call Waiting: If someone tries to reach you while you're connected to the Web, your phone behaves like it is turned OFE Depending on your service, callers may get your voicemail. Call Waiting is automatically deactivated whenever you place or receive a Web connection call.
- Accessing Features: You can still access most of your phone's features while you're connected on a Web connection call. You can navigate the phone's menu system to change or view your phone's features or Internal Phone Book entries. You can also read messages or view the Caller ID records that you received before placing the call.

## **Ending a Web Call**

It's important to note that some of the normal ways to end a call won't work with Web connection calls. You should always close the connection through the application on your computer. Your phone will then return to standby mode.

# Messaging

Now you can chat and send and receive email on select PCS Phones. When you chat, you can have a conversation without talking. Join in a Web-based chat room to exchange information on a specific topic or read conversations that others have posted – you can even launch a one-on-one chat for a more in-depth conversation.

## **Message Types**

There are many types of Text Messaging available on your phone. (PCS Voicemail provides voicemail-to-mailbox messaging. For information on using your phone's voicemail feature, see "Using Voicemail" on pages 150-155.)

## **Messages**

These appear on your screen as **Notifications** and include numeric messages (pages), Messages, Updates, and Mail.

## **New Messages**

When you receive a new Message, your phone alerts you. Press View (left softkey) to display the message details.

- Press Call (left softkey) to dial the phone number.
- Press Go (left softkey) to go to the Web site.
- ▶ Press **Cancel** (right softkey) to return to the message folder list.

## **Message Storage**

Your PCS Phone can store up to 200 Messages. When the message memory is 90% full, a warning message prompts you to erase messages to obtain additional memory space.

**Note:** Unread messages will not be automatically deleted when message capacity has been reached. If your phone has 200 messages, any new text messages will be returned.

## **Displaying Messages**

To display a Message from the message notification alert, see "New Messages" on page 168.

To display a Message from the main menu:

- 1. Press (Not to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press
- **3.** Highlight **Notifications** and press (1990) (the folder list appears).
- 4. Highlight **Unfiled** or your defined folder and press .
- 5. Highlight the header of the message you want to see and press (MEN).

An icon appears at the left side of each message header. The icons are as follows.

- 🖂 New message
- 🕅 Urgent message

Read message

Read Urgent message

If the sender's information has already been stored in the phone book, the corresponding name or phone number appears as the header of the message. If nothing has been stored, the phone number or text that was included in the message appears as a header of the message.

To read other messages:

- Press the left Navigation key to read the previous message.
- Press the right Navigation key to read the next message.

## Changing the Displaying Font Size of a Message

After you display a Message, press ( to display message options.

To adjust the displaying font size:

1. Highlight **Font Size** by scrolling and press (MRW).

2. Highlight your desired font size and press ().

## **Message Options**

After you display a Message, press () to display message options. To select an option, highlight it and press ().

- **Call Back** to dial the phone number of the sender (if applicable).
- ► **Save Phone#** to save the sender's phone number, if it is not already in your Internal Phone Book (if applicable). If the sender's phone number has already been stored in any Phone Book entry, **Alternate** appears instead of **Save Phone#**.
- **Prepend** to add numbers to the beginning of the phone number (if applicable). (See "Prepending a Phone Number From a Message" on pages 170-171.)
- **Extract Info** to extract phone numbers, email or web addresses (if there are numbers or addresses contained in the text message). (See pages 171-172.)
- **Erase** to erase the message.
- Add Folder to add a folder. (See "Adding a Folder for Messages" on page 174.)
- **Move Message** to move the message into the other folder. (See "Moving a Message Into the Other Folder" on page 174.)
- ► Font Size to adjust the font size depending on your preference. (See "Changing the Displaying Font Size of a Message" on page 169.)

**Note:** If the incoming message does not have a call back number, "Call Back", "Alternate/Save Phone#", and "Prepend" are not shown.

## Prepending a Phone Number From a Message

After you display a Message, press 🐨 to display message options.

If you happen to be outside your local area code and need to add a prefix to a phone number:

- 1. Highlight **Prepend** and press (1).
- 2. Enter the digits or pauses (see below) you want to add to the number. If you want to save the number, press and select the **Save Phone#** option. If not, the changes only apply to the current call.

- 3. To select an option, highlight it and press ().
- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- Save Phone# to store the phone number in your Internal Phone Book.
- ► Hard Pause to insert a hard pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 25.)
- ► **12-Sec. Pause** to insert a 2-second pause. (See "Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses" on page 25.)

## **Extracting Phone Numbers From a Message**

After you display a Message, press (MRP) to display message options.

To extract a phone number contained in the message:

- 1. Highlight **Extract Info** and press **MENU**.
- 2. Highlight Phone# and press (SEP).

All the phone numbers contained in the message are displayed. (If there are no phone numbers to extract from the message, the numbers are not displayed.)

- **3.** Highlight the number you wish to extract.
- 4. Press to display the options.
- 5. To select an option, highlight it and press (MRP).
- **Call** to dial the phone number.
- Save Phone# to save the phone number, if it is not already in your Internal Phone Book. If the phone number has already stored in the Phone Book entry, Alternate appears instead of Save Phone#.
- **Display Phone#** to display the phone number.
- **Prepend** to add numbers to the beginning of the phone number.

## **Extracting E-Mail Addresses From a Message**

To extract an email address contained in a message:

- **1.** When the Message options are displayed, highlight **Extract Info** and press **CRP**.
- 2. Highlight Email Address and press (MRW).

All the email addresses contained in the message are displayed. (If there are no appropriate email addresses to extract from the message, the addresses are not displayed.)

- **3.** Highlight the address you wish to extract.
- **4**. Press **(1)** to display the options.
- 5. To select an option, highlight it and press (1990).
- **Send PCS Mail** to send email.
- **Display Address** to display the email address.
- Save Address to save the email address, if it is not already in your Internal Phone Book. If the email address is already stored in the Phone Book entry, Alternate appears instead of Save Address.

## **Extracting URLs From a Message**

To extract a site address contained in a message:

- 1. When the Message options are displayed, highlight **Extract Info** and press **CER**.
- 2. Highlight **Web Address** and press **MEV**.

All the Web addresses contained in the message are displayed. (If there are no appropriate Web addresses to extract from the message, the addresses are not displayed.)

- **3**. Highlight the URL you wish to extract.
- **4**. Press **(1)** to display the options.
- 5. To select an option, highlight it and press ().
- Visit Site to visit the Web site (if applicable).
- **Display Address** to display the Web address.
- ► Save Address to save the Web address, if it is not already in your Internal Phone Book. If the Web address is already stored in the Phone Book entry, Alternate appears instead of Save Address.

## **Creating Folders for Messages**

You can create up to ten folders to store your Messages. If 10 user defined folders exist, "Create Folder" menu diappears.

- 1. Press ( to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Messaging and press ().
- **3.** Highlight **Notifications** and press (1990) (the folder list appears).
- **4.** From the folder list display, press **Options** (right softkey).
- 5. Highlight Create Folder and press ().
- 6. Enter a folder name from 3 to 13 letters and press (R) or (K) (left softkey). See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on pages 79-83.
- Pressing Save (left softkey) allows you to save the folder name.
- 7. If you want messages to be filed into the folder automatically, select the menu under **Auto Filing** and press ().
- 8. Highlight **On** and press **MERU**.
- 9. Select the box under **Keyword** by scrolling down and press **CRU**.
- **10.** Enter a keyword from 3 to 14 letters and press **CR** or **DK** (left softkey), and press **Save** (left softkey).

If you want to set optional features to the added folder:

- 1. From step 9 above, scroll down to select other menu options. Highlight the menu under each item and press ().
- **Notify** to select displaying the notification to on or off, when you have a message matching the defined folder.
- **Envelope lcon** to select displaying the envelope icon to on or off, when you have a message matching the defined folder.
- **2.** After selecting each setting, press **Save** (left softkey).

## **Adding a Folder for Messages**

When the message contains any word of 3 to 14 letters, you can classify the message to your defined folder. If 10 user defined folders exist, the "Add Folder" menu disappears.

- 1. After you display a message, press (SK) to display message options.
- 2. Highlight Add Folder by scrolling and press ().
- **3.** Enter a folder name from 3 to 13 letters and press (B) or **D**K (left softkey). See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on pages 79-83.
- 4. If you want the message to be filed into the folder automatically, select the menu under **Auto Filing** and press **CRP**.
- 5. Highlight **On** and press **MEN**.
- 6. Select the box under **Keyword** by scrolling down and press **WEW**.
- 7. Enter a keyword and press (MRW).

- or -

Go to **Keyword Match** and press (Select a keyword from the Keyword Match list.

8. Press Save (left softkey).

If you want to set optional features to the added folder:

- 1. From step 7 above, scroll down to select other menu options. Highlight the menu under each item and press ().
- **Notify** to select displaying the notification to on or off when you have a message matching the defined folder.
- **Envelope lcon** to select displaying the envelope icon to on or off when you have a message matching the defined folder.
- **2.** After selecting each setting, press **Save** (left softkey).

## Moving a Message Into the Other Folder

After you display a message, press 🐨 to display message options. You need at least one defined folder.

If you want to move a message into the other folder:

- **1.** Highlight **Move Message** by scrolling and press .
- **2**. Highlight your desired folder and press (MRP).

## **Editing Folders**

To edit a folder:

- **1.** From the folder list display, highlight your desired folder except for **Unfiled**.
- 2. Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight Edit Folder and press
- **4.** Select the box under your desired option to edit, and press **(R)**.
- **Folder Name** to edit the folder name.
- Auto Filing to set auto filing to on or off.
- **Keyword** to change the folder's keyword. Incoming messages are automatically filtered into the folder if they contain the Keyword you enter.
- Notify to change the notification setting to on or off.
- Envelope lcon to change the icon setting to on or off.
- 5. Enter or select a new folder name/setting.
- 6. Press ( or **OK** (left softkey).
- 7. Press Save (left softkey).

## **Erasing a Folder Including Messages**

- **1.** From the folder list display, highlight the folder you want to erase.
- **2.** Press **Options** (right softkey).
- 3. Highlight Erase Folder and press ().
- 4. Highlight **Yes** and press .

**Note:** The messages within the folder are also erased. If the folder contains a new message, you are prompted to select **Erase** or **Don't Erase**.

## **Erasing All Messages**

To erase all messages:

- **1**. From the folder list display, press **Options** (right softkey) to display the menu options.
- 2. Highlight Erase All Msqs and press (Merce).
- 3. Highlight In This Folder or In All Folders and press
- 4. Highlight Yes and press (MEN).
- To erase all Messages already read:
- **1.** From the folder list display, press **Options** (right softkey) to display the menu options.
- 2. Highlight Erase Old Msgs and press (MR).
- 3. Highlight In This Folder or In All Folders and press
- 4. Highlight Yes and press (MENU).

**Note:** If the folder contains a new message, you are prompted to select Erase or Don't Erase.

Note: To erase an individual message, see "Message Options" on page 170.

## **Signing Up for Updates**

With Updates, you can have news and information sent directly to your PCS Phone at the times you choose.

To select the information you want to send to your PCS Phone:

- **1.** From your computer, log on to the Internet.
- 2. Go to the site from which you want to receive information. A few of the sites you can visit are America Online<sup>\*</sup>, Yahoo!<sup>\*</sup>, MSN\* and eBay\*. (The location where you request updates within each site will vary.)
- 3. Where indicated on the site, input your 10-digit PCS Phone Number followed by "@messaging.sprintpcs.com." For example: 5551234567@messaging.sprintpcs.com.

Upon completing the registration process, you should begin receiving updates on your PCS Phone as requested.



## **Using Short Mail**

With Short Mail, you can use a person's wireless phone number to send instant text messages from your Vision-enabled PCS Phone to their messaging-ready phone - and they can send messages to you. When you receive a new message, you'll automatically be notified with a one-way text message.

In addition, Short Mail includes a variety of pre-set messages, such as "I'm running late, I'm on my way," that make composing messages fast and easy. You can also customize your own pre-set messages, up to 100 characters, from your PCS Phone or at www.sprintpcs.com.

To send a Short Mail message:

- 1. Press (New to access the main menu.
- 2. Select Messaging and press MERU.
- 3. Select Short Mail and press (1987). The browser will launch and go to the Short Mail page.
- 4. Select Compose and press left softkey.
- 5. Select To, enter the wireless phone number of the person to whom you wish to send a message (you can also scroll down to select an existing recipient), and select Add.

**Note:** You must use the right softkey to select the **NUMBER** mode input mode to enter the addressee's phone number.

- 6. Select Done (or add additional recipients and select Done).
- 7. Compose a message or use the pre-set messages or icons.
- To type a message, highlight the Message box and use your keypad to type a message. Use the right softkey to select a character input mode.
- ▶ To use a pre-set message or "emoticon," highlight **insert** and select **Pre-set Msgs** or **lcons**. Select **Go**, then select the message or emoticon you'd like to insert and select **OK**.
- 8. Review your message and select **SEND** (left softkey).

To read a Short Mail message:

- 1. When you receive a short mail message, you will see "New" on your display screen. Press View (right softkey).
- **2.** You will then see "New Short Mail. Select "Go" to read it." on your display screen. Press **Go** (left softkey). The browser will launch.
- **3.** Scroll to the new short mail message and press left softkey. Unread short mail messages will be marked with an asterisk (\*).

**Note:** The last four digits from the PCS Phone Number of the person who sent you a short mail message appear before the message text.

To reply to a Short Mail message:

- 1. While the message is open, select **Reply**.
- **2.** Compose your reply or use the pre-set messages or icons.
- To type a reply, highlight the Message box and use your keypad to type a message. Use the right softkey to select a character input mode.
- ► To use a pre-set message or "emoticon," highlight **Insert** and select **Pre-set Msgs** or **Icons**. Select **Go**, then select the message or emoticon you'd like to insert and select **OK**.
- **3**. Review your reply and select **SEND** (left softkey).

To add and/or edit Pre-Set Messages:

- **1**. Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Select Messaging and press (MENU).
- 3. Select Short Mail and press (MR).
- 4. Select **Setting** and press the left softkey.
- 5. Select Pre-set Messages and press the left softkey.
- **6.** From the Pre-set Messages menu, select **(Add New)** or the message you wish to edit.
- **7.** Enter your new message or changes and select **Save** (left softkey).

**Note:** You may also add or edit Pre-Set Messages in the "Manage My Account" area at <u>www.sprintpcs.com</u>.



## **Using PCS Mail**

With PCS Mail, you can set up an account at no additional charge and perform many of the typical email functions from your PCS Phone that you can from your personal computer.

You can manage your PCS Mail Account from your PCS Phone or from your personal computer at <u>www.sprintpcs.com</u>. You can also access other select email providers from the Web.

## **Accessing PCS Mail Messages**

To access PCS Mail Messages:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Select Messaging and press ().
- **3.** Select **PCS Mail** and press **C**. If you're a first-time user, your phone will prompt you to set up your email account by establishing a User name and password.
- **4.** To view your messages, select **Inbox** and press **OK** (left softkey).
- **5.** Scroll to select the message you wish to read and press the left softkey.
- **6.** Once you've read a message, use the quick actions at the end of each message (**Erase**, **Reply**, **Reply All**, or **Next Message**) or select **Menu** for a full list of options.

## **Composing PCS Mail Messages**

To compose PCS Mail Message:

- 1. From the PCS Mail menu (see steps 1-3 above), select **Compose**.
- **2.** Select **Add Name** to enter the address of the person to whom you're sending a message and press the left softkey.
- **3.** Select **Next** to enter the subject and your message.
- 4. Select **Send** when your message is ready to be sent.



PCS Vision gives you the ability to join wireless chatrooms from your PCS Phone. Send text messages and icons to chatroom participants or launch a one-on-one (private) chatroom. To access a chatroom from the browser:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Web** and press .
- 3. Select Messaging.
- 4. Select CHAT.
- 5. Select Enter. You will see a disclaimer for Wireless Chat. Select | Agree to enter the Chat menu.
- **6.** Select a chat room from the menu (for example, "Friends" or "Singles").
- **7.** Use your keypad to enter a nickname and select **Enter**. Once in the chatroom, you may scroll through the postings to read messages from other chatroom participants.

**Note:** To avoid inadvertent data usage charges, you should log out of chatrooms when you are ready to exit.

To post a message:

1. Select Add text.

- 2. Enter your message.
- 3. Select Send.
- To set up a private chatroom:
- 1. Select 1->1.
- **2.** Select a chatter with whom you'd like to launch a private chatroom.

To exit a chatroom:

Select Leave Room.



Your phone gives you the ability to capture images, view images using the phone's display, and instantly send images to your friends and family. It's as easy to use as a traditional point-andclick camera. Besides sending your pictures to friends and family, you can also send them to a Pictures Web site for storage, upload them to a personal Web site. Cameras can take and store images. This service requires a special camera phone. See your PCS Representative for further details.

#### **Taking and Viewing Pictures**

- 1. Use your camera phone to take a picture.
- **2.** View pictures on your phone. Select the pictures you would like to share and transfer to the Pictures Web site.
- 3. Upload your images to your Pictures vault for future reference.

#### Sending Pictures to Others From Your PCS Phone

- 1. Press (NEW) to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Pictures and press ().
- **3.** Highlight **Online Pics** and press **CRP**. The first time you go to the site, you will need to register.
- 4. Select InBox and scroll to select the desired picture.
- **5.** Type in the email address and add your personal message, then press **MER**.

#### Accessing the Site From Your Desktop Computer

From your computer, log on to <u>www.pictures.sprintpcs.com</u>.
 (You will need to register through your PCS Phone to view the Pictures Web site.)

From the Web site, you can share pictures, edit album titles and picture captions, organize and move images, and much more.

Picture management tools are also available to improve or customize your pictures. You'll be able to lighten, darken, crop, antique, add comic bubbles and cartoon effects, and use other features to transform your pictures.

# Downloading Games, Ringers, and Screen Savers

With PCS Vision and your new PCS Phone, you have access to a wide variety of downloadable ringers, screen savers, and games. While each type of download involves a different file type, the basic method for accessing and downloading files is the same.

#### Accessing the Download Menus

To access the PCS Vision download menus:

- **1.** Press **MENU** to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight Downloads and press (MRC).
- **3.** Highlight the type of file you wish to download (**Games**, **Ringers**, or **Screen Savers**) and press **CER**.
- 4. Highlight **Get New** and press (CRP). The browser will launch and take you to the corresponding download menu.

To access the PCS Vision download menus from the Web browser:

From the home page, select Games, Ringers, or Screen Savers to go to the corresponding download menu. (For more information on navigating the Web, see "Browsing the Web" on pages 162-165.)

## Selecting an Item to Download

From the download menus, items available for download may be selected from three folders:

- **Today** displays a rotating selection of featured items.
- ► All displays all of the currently available downloads arranged in alphabetical order. (There may be several pages of downloads in the list; select **Next10** to see additional listings.)
- ► **Genre** displays a list of download themes, such as "Movie/TV Themes" for Ringers and "College Logos" for Screen Savers, along with the number of items available within each genre. Select a genre to view the items.

You may also search for an item by selecting the Q (search) icon and using the keypad to enter your search criteria (for example, enter "Mi" to find Michigan).

## Downloading an Item

Once you've decided on an item to download, highlight it and press or **OK** (left softkey). You will see a summary page for the item including its title, the vendor, the download detail, the file size, and the cost. Links allow you to view the **License Details** page, which outlines the price, license type, and length of license for the download, and the **Terms of Use** page, which details the Premium Services Terms of Use and your responsibility for payment.

To download a selected item:

- 1. From the information page, select **Buy** (or **Get It** in the case of a free item). If you have not previously purchased an item, you will be prompted to enter your account password and create your purchasing profile.
- **2.** You will see a **Confirmation** screen confirming your purchase and informing you that the charge will be added to your next PCS Invoice. You will also be informed that the downloaded item has been stored in the **My Vault** page.
- **3**. Select **Download** to initiate the download of the item.
- You will see a series of browser screens, ending with the Download screen. This screen lists the item name, vendor, version, size, and type. Press Next (right softkey) to download the item.
- **5.** You will see another series of screens detailing the download initiation, progress (in kilobytes), and saving process. When the **Completed** screen appears, the item has been successfully downloaded to your phone.
- Press Use (left softkey) to assign the downloaded item (or to play, in the case of a game).
- Press Shop (right softkey) to look for other items to download.
- ▶ Press ( to quit the browser and return to standby mode.



You can play a variety of entertaining and graphically-rich games on your PCS Phone. New games are easy to download and play.

- **5.** If applicable, a prompt will display the days remaining on the game license and ask if you want to continue. Select **Yes**.
- 6. Follow the onscreen instructions to play the game. When you are finished, select Exit (or Quit) or press (1000).
- 7. A prompt will display: "Resume the Application?" Select **Yes** to continue playing or **No** to exit.

To assign a downloaded ringer from the Downloads menu:

- 1. Press () to access the main menu.
- 2. Highlight **Downloads** and press (1989).
- 3. Highlight **Ringers** and press
- 4. Highlight the downloaded data you want to confirm and press ().
- 5. Select Assign from the options and press (MRC).
- 6. Highlight Voice Calls, Voicemail, Messaging, Calendar, Start-up Tone, Power-off Tone, or Phone Book, and press (). The following two items require an extra step:
- ► Voice Calls: highlight With Caller ID or No Caller ID, and press (\*\*\*).
- ▶ Phone Book: highlight your desired entry and press .
- 7. A message appears confirming the data has been assigned.

- **4.** Highlight the downloaded data you want to confirm and press **MEW**.
- 5. Select Assign from the options and press ().
- 6. Highlight one of Incoming Calls, Screen Saver or Phone Book, Standby, Outgoing Calls, or Service Search, and press (). The following item needs an extra step:
- 7. A message appears confirming the data has been assigned.

PCS Business Connection<sup>54</sup> Personal Edition is designed to offer secure wireless access to both Microsoft<sup>\*</sup> Outlook<sup>\*</sup> and Lotus Notes<sup>\*</sup>.

PCS Business Connection Personal Edition delivers the following features:

- **Business email access:** Read, reply to, forward, delete, and compose your company email.
- Company directory and contacts: Search, view, call, and email contacts from your company's directory. Do all this and add/edit your personal contacts.
- ► Work calendar: Accept and decline meetings, view daily summaries and details, and navigate to various dates.
- Files/information on your PC: Browse folders, download, and view documents from any device using a PC browser or Pocket Internet Explorer.

To use PCS Business Connection Personal Edition, install PCS Business Connection Personal Edition software on your work PC. This allows data to be securely retrieved in real-time by your wireless device when connected to the enhanced Sprint Nationwide PCS Network. There is a monthly charge for PCS Business Connection and usage charges will also apply.

When your work PC isn't on, you can share connections with your co-workers so that you always have access to your email, calendar, and contacts. Your data remains secure behind the corporate firewall and any changes you make on your wireless device are instantly updated on your company server without the need to synchronize.

# **PCS Vision FAQs**

#### How will I know when my phone is ready for PCS Vision service?

Your User name (for example, bsmith001@sprintpcs.com) will display on your phone's display screen.

#### How do I sign-in for the first time?

You are automatically signed in to access PCS Vision services when you turn on your phone.

#### How do I know when my phone is connected to PCS Vision services?

Your phone automatically connects when PCS Vision Service is used or an incoming message arrives. Your phone will also display the **1** icon. (Connecting takes about 10-12 seconds.)

#### Can I make calls and use PCS Vision services at the same time?

You cannot use voice and PCS Vision services simultaneously. If you receive a call while PCS Vision service is active, the call will be forwarded to voicemail.

#### When is my data connection active?

Your connection is active when data is being transferred. Incoming calls go directly to voicemail. When active, the **1** (Sending) or **b** (Receiving) indicator flashes on your phone's display screen.

#### When is my data connection dormant?

If no data is received for 10 seconds, the connection goes dormant. When the connection is dormant, voice calls are allowed. (The connection may become active again quickly.) If no data is received for an extended period of time, the connection will terminate.

## Can I sign out of data services?

You can sign out without turning off your phone, however you will not be able to browse the Web or use other PCS Vision services. While signed out, you can still place or receive phone calls, check voicemail, and use other voice services. You may sign in again at any time. To sign out, go to **Settings > Vision > Disable Vision** in your phone's menu.

# **Safety**

Part of getting the most out of your PCS Phone is learning how the phone works and how to care for it. This section outlines performance and safety guidelines that help you understand the basic features of your phone's operation.

# **Getting the Most Out of Your Reception**

#### **Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength**

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

#### **Understanding the Power Save Feature**

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your phone is active, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check it yourself by pressing any key. Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your phone returns to standby mode.

#### **Understanding How Your Phone Operates**

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radiofrequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from  $0.01\mu$ watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

#### **Knowing Radiofrequency Safety**

The design of your PCS Phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below.

In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted a hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

#### Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

There are several simple guidelines to operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- Hold the phone with the antenna raised, fully-extended, and over your shoulder.
- Try not to hold, bend, or twist the phone's antenna.
- ▶ Don't use the phone if the antenna is damaged.
- Speak directly into the mouthpiece.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a SprintStore or call PCS Customer Service Solutions<sup>w</sup> for service.

**Note:** For the best care of your phone, only Sprint authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

## Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

#### **Using Your Phone While Driving**

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

When using your phone in the car:

- Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and redial.
- ▶ When available, use a hands-free device.
- Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.

- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.
- Dial 9 1 1 TALK to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

**Tip:** Purchase an optional hands-free car kit at your local Sprint Store. You may also call the PCS Accessory Hotline at 1-800-974-2221 or by dialing **# 2 2 0** or your PCS Phone.

#### **Following Safety Guidelines**

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

#### **Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices**

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radiofrequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

**Note:** Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

## Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

#### **Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas**

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn off your phone when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- ▶ Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

**Note:** Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid, or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

#### **Restricting Children's Access to your Phone**

Your PCS Phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your phone bill.

# **Caring for the Battery**

#### **Protecting Your Battery**

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Sprint-approved batteries and desktop chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- ► In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- ▶ Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- ▶ Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- > Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. It can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:

Less than one month: 4° F to 140° F (-20° C to 60° C) More than one month: 4° F to 113° F (-20° C to 45° C)

#### **Disposal of Lithium Ion (Lilon) Batteries**

For safe disposal options of your LiIon batteries, contact your nearest Sprint-authorized service center.

**Special Note:** Be sure to dispose of your battery properly. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

**Note:** For safety, do not handle a damaged or leaking Lilon battery.

# Acknowledging Special Precautions and the FCC Notice

#### FCC Notice

The phone may cause TV or radio interference if used in close proximity to receiving equipment. The FCC can require you to stop using the phone if such interference cannot be eliminated.

This equipment generates, uses, and can radiate radio frequency energy and, if not installed and used in accordance with the instructions, may cause harmful interference to radio communications.

However, there is no guarantee that interference will not occur in a particular installation. If this equipment does cause harmful interference to radio or television reception, which can be determined by turning the equipment off and on, the user is encouraged to try to correct the interference by one or more of the following measures:

- Reorient or relocate the receiving antenna.
- ► Increase the separation between the equipment and receiver.
- Connect the equipment into an outlet on a circuit different from that to which the receiver is connected.
- Consult the dealer or an experienced radio/TV technician for help.

#### Cautions

Any changes or modifications to your phone not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment, and void your authority to operate this equipment. Although your phone is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending or sitting on it.

#### **Body-Worn Operation**

To maintain compliance with FCC RF exposure requirements, Body-worn operations are restricted to belt-clips, holsters or similar accessories that have no metallic component in the assembly and that provide at least 0.7 inch (1.8 cm) separation between the device, including its antenna whether extended or retracted, and the user's body. Use of non-Sprint approved accessories may violate FCC RF exposure requirements.

#### Specific Absorption Rates (SAR) for Wireless Phones

The SAR is a value that corresponds to the relative amount of RF energy absorbed in the head of a user of a wireless handset.

The SAR value of a phone is the result of an extensive testing, measuring and calculation process. It does not represent how much RF the phone emits. All phone models are tested at their highest value in strict laboratory settings. But when in operation, the SAR of a phone can be substantially less than the level reported to the FCC. This is because of a variety of factors including its proximity to a base station antenna, phone design and other factors. What is important to remember is that each phone meets strict federal guidelines. Variations in SARs do not represent a variation in safety.

All phones must meet the federal standard, which incorporates a substantial margin of safety. As stated above, variations in SAR values between different model phones do not mean variations in safety. #### SUBSCRIBER UNIT:

A. SPRINT ONE (1) YEAR LIMITED WARRANTY: For a period of one (1) year from the date of purchase, Sprint will, at its option, either pay the parts and labor charges to any authorized PCS® Phone service facility to repair or replace a defective product (with new or rebuilt parts/replacements). After this one (1) year period, you must pay all parts, shipping and labor charges. B.
