#### To insert the SIM card



- 1 Remove the battery cover.
- 2 Slide the SIM card into its holder with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.

#### To insert the battery



- 1 Insert the battery with the label side up and the connectors facing each other.
- 2 Attach the battery cover.

## Turning on the phone

#### To turn on the phone



- 1 Press and hold down 🗻.
- 2 Enter your SIM card PIN (Personal Identification Number), if requested, and select **OK**.
- 3 Select a language.
- 4 Follow the instructions that appear.
- $\frac{1}{2}$  If you want to correct a mistake when you enter your PIN, press  $\bigcirc$ .

## SIM card

The SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card, which you get from your network operator, contains information about your subscription. Always turn off your phone and detach the charger before you insert or remove the SIM card.

 $\dot{\Psi}$  You can save contacts on the SIM card before you remove it from your phone.

## PIN

You may need a PIN (Personal Identification Number) to activate the services and functions in your phone. Your PIN is supplied by your network operator. Each PIN digit appears as \*, unless it starts with emergency number digits, for example, 112 or 911. You can see and call an emergency number without entering a PIN.

If you enter the wrong PIN three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked. See *SIM protection* on page 70.

#### Standby

After you have turned on your phone and entered your PIN, the name of the network operator appears. This view is called standby. Your phone is now ready for use.

### Widget Manager

You can show, hide, or add widgets using Widget Manager. A widget is a live update on a website, web page or desktop, for example, Facebook<sup>™</sup>, Twitter<sup>™</sup>. Widgets contain personalized content or applications selected by the user.

This application may not be available in all markets.

#### To manage widgets

- 1 From standby, press the navigation key up.
- 2 Select Manage. Widget icons appear.
- 3 To select a widget, press the navigation key left or right.
- 4 Select **Hide** to hide a widget or **Show** if you want the widget to appear in the standby screen.

#### To start a widget

- 1 From standby, press the navigation key up.
- 2 To select a widget, press the navigation key left or right.
- 3 Press **Select** to start the widget.

#### Using other networks

Making and receiving calls, using messaging and data transfer, for example, Internet-based services, outside your home network (roaming) may incur additional costs. Contact your operator for more information.

## Charging the battery

The phone battery is partly charged when you buy it.

#### To charge the battery



- 1 Connect the charger to the phone.
- 2 Remove the charger by tilting the plug upwards.

## Maximizing battery performance

- Charge your phone often. The battery lasts longer if you charge it frequently.
- If you're in an area with no coverage, your phone repeatedly scans for available networks. This consumes power. If you cannot move to an area with better coverage, turn off your phone temporarily.
- Turn off 3G, Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> wireless technology, any active Wi-Fi<sup>™</sup> connection, and GPS when you do not need these functions.
- Do not cover the phone antenna when you're engaged in a call.

## **Navigation**

#### To access the main menu

- When **Menu** appears on the screen, press the center selection key to select **Menu**.
- If Menu does not appear on the screen, press 
  , and then press the center selection key to select Menu.

To navigate the phone menus



• Press the navigation key upwards, downwards, left or right to move through the menus.

To select actions on the screen

• Press the left, center or right selection key.

To view options for an item

• Select **Options** to, for example, edit.

To end a function

Press 

 Press

To return to standby

• Press 杰.

#### To navigate your media

- 1 Select Menu > Media.
- 2 Scroll to a menu item and press the navigation key right.
- 3 To go back, press the navigation key left.

#### To delete items

• Press (c) to delete items such as numbers, letters, pictures and sounds.

#### Tabs

Tabs may be available. For example, **Calls** have tabs.



#### To scroll between tabs

• Press the navigation key left or right.

## Shortcuts

You can use the navigation key shortcuts to go directly to functions from standby.

#### To use navigation key shortcuts

• Press the navigation key upward, downward, left, or right to go directly to a function

#### To edit a navigation key shortcut

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > General > Shortcuts.
- 2 Scroll to an option and select **Edit**.
- 3 Scroll to a menu option and select **Shortc.**.

#### Main menu shortcuts

Menu numbering starts from the top left icon and moves across and then down row by row.

To go directly to a main menu item

- Select **Menu** and press <u>1</u> − <u>9</u>, <u>\*</u>+, <u>0</u> or <u>#±x</u>?).
- The Main menu layout must be set to Grid. See To change the main menu layout on page 68.

### Activity menu

The activity menu gives you quick access to:

- New events missed calls and new messages.
- Running apps applications that are running in the background.
- My shortcuts add your favorite functions to access them quickly.
- Internet connect conveniently to the Internet.

#### To open the activity menu

• Press 🗗.

## Memory

You can save content on a memory card, in the phone memory and on the SIM card. Photos and music are saved on the memory card, if a memory card is inserted. If not, or if the memory card is full, photos and music are saved in the phone memory. Messages and contacts are saved in the phone memory, but you can choose to save them on the SIM card.

#### Memory card

You may have to purchase a memory card separately.

Your phone supports a microSD<sup>™</sup> memory card, adding more storage space to your phone. This type of card can also be used as a portable memory card with other compatible devices.

You can move content between a memory card and the phone memory.

#### To insert a memory card



• Remove the battery cover and insert the memory card with the gold-colored contacts facing down.

#### To remove a memory card



• Remove the battery cover and slide the memory card to remove it.

## **Phone language**

You can select a language to use in your phone.

#### To change the phone language

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > General > Language > Phone language.
- 2 Select an option.

## **Entering text**

You can use multitap text input or Quick text input  $2 \le 10^{10}$  to enter text. The Quick text input method uses a dictionary application in your phone.

#### To change the writing language

• When you enter text, press and hold down (#10).

#### To change the text input method

When you enter text, press and hold down (\*+).

### To shift between upper- and lower-case letters or numbers

• When you enter text, press (# \*\*\* ?).

#### To enter numbers

- 1 When you enter text, press (#...) repeatedly until 🖪 appears at the top of the screen.
- 2 To enter a number, press o-9.

#### To enter punctuation marks and symbols

- 1 When you enter text, press ( + ) briefly.
- 2 Scroll to a symbol and select **Insert**.
- $\frac{1}{2}$  To select from the most commonly used punctuation marks, you can also press 1.

#### To enter text using Quick text input

- 1 Select, for example, **Menu** > **Messaging** > **Write new** > **Message**.
- 2 If  $\mathcal{J}_{=}$  is not displayed, press and hold down (\*) to change to Quick text input.
- 3 Press each key only once, even if the letter you want is not the first letter on the key. For example, to write the word "Jane", press (5), (2), (6), (3). Write the whole word before looking at the suggestions.
- 4 To view word suggestions, press ( + ) or press the navigation key downwards.
- 5 Press to accept a suggestion and add a space.

#### To enter text using the multitap method

- 1 Select, for example, **Menu** > **Messaging** > **Write new** > **Message**.
- 2 If  $\not \ge$  is displayed, press and hold down (+) to change to multitap text input.
- 3 Press  $\bigcirc$   $\bigcirc$  repeatedly until the desired letter appears.
- 4 Press to add a space.

#### To add words to the phone dictionary

- 1 When you enter text using Quick text input, select **Options** > **Spell word**.
- 2 Write the word using multitap input and select **Save**.

## Calling

You need to turn on your phone and be within range of a network.

## Making and answering calls

#### To make a call

- 1 Enter a phone number (with international country code and area code, if applicable).
- 2 Press 🕜.
- You can call numbers from your contacts and call list.

#### To end a call

• Press 杰.

#### To make international calls

- 1 Press and hold down (\*+) until a "+" sign appears.
- 2 Enter the country code, area code (without the first zero) and phone number.
- 3 Press 🕜.

#### To redial a number

- When **Retry?** appears, select **Yes**.
- A Do not hold your phone to your ear when waiting for the call to connect. When the call connects, your phone gives a loud signal.

#### To answer a call

#### To reject a call

• Press 🗻.

#### To change the ear speaker volume during a call

• Press the volume keys up or down.

#### To mute the microphone during a call

- 1 Press and hold down c. % appears.
- 2 Press and hold down c again to resume.

#### To turn on the loudspeaker during a call

- Select **Spkr on**. **⊲** appears.
- A Do not hold the phone to your ear when using the loudspeaker. This could damage your hearing.

#### To view missed calls from standby

## **Background music**

You can add background music to an ongoing call. When activated, background music can be heard by all participants. When the microphone is muted, the background music continues to play.

#### To start playing background music during a call

- During the call, select Music.
- See *To play music* on page 31.

#### To stop playing background music during a call

• Press the center selection key.

#### To change the background music volume during a call

- Press the volume key up or down.
- Only the music volume can be changed when the music is playing.

#### Call sound quality

The Noise Shield filters out sound around you that can make it difficult for the other party to hear your voice, while the Clear Voice function helps you hear better in a crowded environment.

To turn on the Noise Shield

#### To turn off the Noise Shield

 Select Menu > Settings > Calls > Noise shield > Off. When the Noise Shield is turned off, N appears during calls.

To turn on the Clear Voice function

• Select Menu > Settings > Calls > Clear Voice > On.

To turn off the Clear Voice function

Select Menu > Settings > Calls > Clear Voice > Off.

#### Video call

During a video call, the person you are talking to can see you on their screen.

#### Before making video calls

3G (UMTS) service is available when 3G or III appears. To make a video call, both parties on the call must have a 3G (UMTS) phone subscription that supports 3G (UMTS) service and 3G (UMTS) coverage.

#### To make a video call

- 1 Enter a phone number (with international country code and area code, if applicable).
- 2 Select **Options** > **Make video call**.

#### To use the zoom with an outgoing video call

Press the navigation key upwards or downwards.

#### To share photos and videos during a video call

- 1 During a video call, press the navigation key left to switch to the video share mode tab.
- 2 Scroll to a video clip or photo and select **Share**.

#### To view video call options

• During the call, select **Options**.

#### **Emergency calls**

Your phone supports international emergency numbers, for example, 112 or 911. You can normally use these numbers to make emergency calls in any country, with or without the SIM card inserted, if you are within range of a network.

In some countries, other emergency numbers may also be promoted. Your network operator may therefore have saved additional local emergency numbers on the SIM card.

#### To make an emergency call

• Enter 112 (the international emergency number) and press (

#### To view your local emergency numbers

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Special numbers > Emergency numbers.

### Call list

You can view information about answered 🚁 , dialed 🖬 and missed or rejected 👍 calls.

#### To call a number from the call list

- 1 Press ( ) and scroll to a tab.
- 2 Scroll to a name or a number and press 7.

## Contacts

You can save names, phone numbers and personal information in **Contacts**. Information can be saved in the phone memory or on the SIM card.

∳- You can synchronise your contacts using the Sony Ericsson PC Suite.

#### **Default contacts**

You can choose which contact information is shown by default. If **Phone contacts** is selected as the default, only contact information saved to the phone memory is listed in **Contacts**. If you select **SIM contacts** as the default, only names and numbers saved on the SIM card are shown in **Contacts**.

#### To select default contacts

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Advanced > Default contacts.
- 3 Select an option.

#### Phone contacts

Phone contacts can contain names, phone numbers and personal information. They are saved in the phone memory.

#### To add a phone contact

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Add.
- 3 Enter the name and select OK.
- 4 Scroll to **New number:** and select **Add**.
- 5 Enter the number and select **OK**.
- 6 Select a number option.
- 7 Scroll between the tabs and add information to the fields.
- 8 Select Save.

## **Calling contacts**

#### To call a contact

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to a contact and press 
  <sup>(</sup>).

#### To go directly to the contacts list

Press and hold down 2 – 9.

#### To make a call using Smart search

- Press <u>-</u> <u>-</u> to enter a sequence of (at least two) digits. All entries that match the sequence of digits, or corresponding letters, are shown in a list.
- 2 Scroll to a contact or a phone number and press (

#### To turn on or off Smart search

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Calls > Smart search.
- 2 Select an option.

#### **Editing contacts**

#### To add information to a phone contact

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to a contact and select **Options** > **Edit contact**.
- 3 Scroll between the tabs and select Add or Edit.
- 4 Select an option and an item to add or edit.
- 5 Select Save.

#### To copy names and numbers to phone contacts

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Advanced > Copy from SIM.
- 3 Select an option.

#### To copy names and numbers to the SIM card

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Advanced > Copy to SIM.
- 3 Select an option.
- When you copy all contacts from your phone to the SIM card, all existing SIM card information is replaced.

#### To automatically save names and phone numbers on the SIM card

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Advanced > Auto save on SIM.
- 3 Select an option.

#### To save contacts on a memory card

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Advanced > Back up to m. card.

#### SIM contacts

SIM contacts can contain names and numbers only. They are saved on the SIM card.

#### To add a SIM contact

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to **New contact** and select **Add**.
- 3 Enter the name and select **OK**.
- 4 Enter the number and select **OK**.
- 5 Select a number option and add more information, if available.
- 6 Select Save.

## **Deleting contacts**

#### To delete all contacts

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Advanced > Delete all contacts.
- 3 Select an option.

#### Contact memory status

The number of contacts you can save in your phone or on the SIM card depends on available memory.

#### To view contact memory status

- 1 Select **Menu** > **Contacts**.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Advanced > Memory status.

#### Myself

You can enter information about yourself and, for example, send your business card.

#### To enter information in Myself

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to Myself and select Open.
- 3 Scroll to an option and edit the information.
- 4 Select Save.

#### To add your own business card

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to Myself and select Open.
- 3 Scroll to **My contact info** and select **Add** > **Create new**.
- 4 Scroll between the tabs and add information to the fields.
- 5 Enter the information and select **Save**.

#### Groups

You can create a group of phone numbers and email addresses from **Phone contacts** to send messages to. You can also use groups (with phone numbers) when you create accepted callers lists.

#### To create a group of numbers and email addresses

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to **New contact** and select **Options** > **Groups**.
- 3 Scroll to New group and select Add.
- 4 Enter a name for the group and select **Continue**.
- 5 Scroll to New and select Add.
- 6 For each contact phone number or email address you want to mark, scroll to it and select **Mark**.
- 7 Select **Continue** > **Done**.

## **Speed dial**

Speed dialing lets you select nine contacts that you can dial quickly from standby. The contacts can be saved in positions 1-9.

#### To assign speed dial numbers to contacts

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Speed dial.
- 3 Scroll to a position number and select **Add**.
- 4 Select a contact.

#### To speed dial

### More calling features

#### Voicemail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voicemail message when you cannot answer a call.

#### To enter your voicemail number

- Select Menu > Messaging > Messages > Settings > the Message settings tab > Voicemail number.
- 2 Enter the number and select **OK**.

#### To call your voicemail service

Press and hold down 1.

#### Voice control

By creating voice commands you can:

- Voice dial call someone by saying their name
- Answer and reject calls when you use a handsfree

#### To record a voice command using voice dialing

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > General > Voice control > Voice dialing > Activate.
- 2 Select Yes > New voice command and select a contact. If the contact has more than one number, select the number to add the voice command to.
- 3 Follow the instructions that appear. Wait for the tone and say the command to record. Record a voice command such as "John mobile". The voice command is played back to you.
- 4 If the recording sounds OK, select **Yes**. If not, select **No** and repeat steps 3 and 4.
- Voice commands are saved in the phone memory only. They cannot be used in another phone.

#### To voice dial a contact

- 1 Press and hold down a volume key.
- 2 Wait for the tone and say a recorded voice command, for example "John mobile." The phone plays the command back to you and connects the call.

#### To activate voice answering and record voice answer commands

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > General > Voice control > Voice answer > Activate.
- 2 Follow the instructions that appear and select **Continue**. Wait for the tone and say "Answer", or say any other word.
- 3 Select **Yes** to accept or **No** to make a new recording.
- 4 Wait for the tone and say "Busy", or say any other word.
- 5 Select **Yes** to accept or **No** to make a new recording.
- 6 Follow the instructions that appear and select **Continue**.
- 7 Select the environments in which you want to activate voice answering.

#### To answer a call using voice commands

Say "Answer."

#### To rerecord a voice command

- Select Menu > Settings > General > Voice control > Voice dialing > Edit names.
- 2 Scroll to a command and select **Options** > **Replace voice**.
- 3 Wait for the tone and say the command.

## Forwarding calls

You can forward calls, for example, to an answering service.

When **Restrict calls** is used, some forward call options are not available.

#### To forward calls

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Calls > Forward calls.
- 2 Select a call type and a forward option.
- 3 Select Activate. 🔀 appears.
- 4 Enter the number to forward calls to and select **OK**.

### Call waiting

You will hear a beep if you receive a second call while call waiting is active.

#### To activate call waiting

• Select Menu > Settings > Calls > Manage calls > Call waiting > Activate.

#### More than one call

You can handle more than one call at a time. For example, you can put an ongoing call on hold while you make or answer a second call. You can also switch between the two calls. You can't answer a third call without ending one of the first two calls.

#### To switch between two calls

• During the call, press *C*.

#### To join two calls

• During the call, select **Options** > **Join calls**.

#### To end an ongoing call and return to the call on hold

• First press 🔊 and then 🕜.

#### To make a second call

- 1 During the call, press C. This puts the ongoing call on hold.
- 2 Select **Options** > **Add call**.
- 3 Enter the number to call and press (

#### To answer a second call

#### **Conference calls**

With a conference call, you can have a joint conversation with up to five people.

#### To add a new participant

- 2 Select **Options** > **Add call**.
- 3 Enter the number to call and press (
- 4 Select **Options** > **Join calls** to add the new participant.
- 5 Repeat this task to add more participants.

#### To release a participant

- 1 Select **Options** > **Release party**.
- 2 Select the participant to release.

#### To have a private conversation

- 1 During the call, select **Options** > **Talk to** and select the participant to talk to.
- 2 To resume the conference call, select **Options** > **Join calls**.

#### My numbers

You can view, add and edit your own phone numbers.

#### To check your phone numbers

- 1 Select Menu > Contacts.
- 2 Scroll to New contact and select Options > Special numbers > My numbers.
- 3 Select an option.

#### Accept calls

You can choose to receive calls from certain phone numbers only.

#### To add numbers to the accepted callers list

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Calls > Manage calls > Accept calls > Only from list.
- 2 Scroll to **New** and select **Add**.
- 3 Select a contact or **Groups**.

#### To accept all calls

• Select Menu > Settings > Calls > Manage calls > Accept calls > All callers.

### **Restricted dialing**

You can restrict outgoing and incoming calls. A password from your service provider is required.

If you forward incoming calls, you cannot use some restrict calls options.

#### Call time and cost

During a call, the phone shows how long you have been talking. You can also check on the duration of your last call, your outgoing calls and the total time of all your calls.

#### Showing or hiding your phone number

You can decide to show or hide the number displayed on the call recipient's phone when you make a call.



## **Face detection**

You can use face detection to bring an off-center face into focus. The camera automatically detects up to three faces, indicated by white frames. A green frame shows which face has been selected for focus. Focus is set to the face closest to the camera.

#### To set face detection

- 1 Activate the camera and press the navigation key to scroll to .
- 2 Select  $\mathbb{N} >$ Focus >Face detection.

#### Smile detection

Smile detection allows you to capture the smiles of family and friends. The camera detects up to three faces and selects one face for smile detection and auto focus. A yellow frame shows which face is selected. When the selected face smiles, the camera automatically takes a photo.

#### To set Smile detection

- 1 Activate the camera and press the navigation key to scroll to **o**.
- 2 Select Shoot mode > Smile detection.
- 3 When appears, the camera is in Smile detection mode.

#### To use Smile detection

- 1 With **Smile detection** set, point the camera at your subject.
- 2 Press fully down. When papears, smile detection is activated. A yellow frame shows the face in focus.
- 3 The camera automatically takes the photo when the subject smiles.
- 4 To take a photo, although no smile is detected, press fully down again.

### Scenes

You can use **Scenes** to quickly set up the camera for common situations using preprogramd scenes. The camera has determined a number of settings for you to fit the selected scene, ensuring the best possible photo.

#### **To use Scenes**

- 1 Activate the camera and press the navigation key to scroll to .
- 2 Select  $\mathbb{N} >$ Scenes.
- 3 Select a scene.
- 4 Select **b** to return to the viewfinder.
- 5 Take a photo.

## Photo fix

You can use Photo fix to improve photos. In a one-click operation, brightness, light and contrast are adjusted to give you the best possible photo. The improvements are saved as a copy of the photo. The original photo is not affected.

#### To improve a photo with Photo fix

- 1 Activate the camera and press the navigation key to scroll to .
- 2 Make sure **Review** is set to **On**. Select **S** > **Settings** and scroll to **Review** > **On**. Select **D** to return to the viewfinder.
- 3 Take a photo.
- 4 When you review the photo, select **Options** > **Photo fix**.
- 5 Review the improvement and select **Save** to save.
- 6 If you do not want to save the improvement, select **Back**.

## Tips on using the camera

#### Rule of thirds

Don't place your subject in the middle of the frame. By placing it a third of the way in, you achieve a better result.

#### Hold it steady

Avoid blurry photos by holding the camera steady. Try to steady your hand by leaning it against a solid object. You can also use the self-timer to make sure that the phone is steady when the photo is taken.

#### Get closer

By getting as close as possible to your subject, you can avoid relying on the zoom. Try to fill the viewfinder with your subject.

#### Stay within the flash range

Photos taken beyond the maximum flash range will be too dark. The maximum flash range is about four steps from the subject.

#### **Consider variety**

Think about different angles, and move towards the object. Take some vertical photos. Try different positions.

#### Use a plain background

A plain background helps highlight your subject.

#### Keep your lens clean

Phones are used in all kinds of weather and places, and carried in pockets and bags. This results in the camera lens becoming dirty and covered with fingerprints. Use a soft cloth to clean the lens.

## Using the video camera

#### To record a video

- 1 Activate the camera and press the navigation key to scroll to I.
- 2 Press **o** fully down to start recording.
- 3 To stop recording, press (a) fully down. The video is saved automatically.
- 4 To return to the viewfinder and to record another video, press .



## SensMe™ technology



With SensMe<sup>™</sup> technology, you can create playlists in two ways: by mood or from all the tracks in your phone. To create playlists by mood, you first need to use the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application to transfer tracks to your phone. Information such as mood, tempo, and chords is then added. The tracks are displayed as dots on a map with two axes. In the **All** view, all the tracks in your phone are placed randomly on the map.

Phone content such as pictures, videos, sounds, themes, web pages, games, and applications are saved on your phone memory or on your memory card. This content is saved in separate folders in **File manager**, which makes it easy to find what you are looking for.

You can find File manager under **Menu** > **Organizer** > **File manager**. There are three tabs to explore:

- All files all content in the phone memory and on the memory card.
- On memory card all content on your memory card.
- **In phone** all content in the phone memory.

## **Copyright-protected content**

Items that are downloaded or received using one of the available transfer methods, may be copyright-protected by DRM (Digital Rights Management). You may not be able to copy, send, or transfer such items.

## To view copyright information for a file

- 1 Select Menu > Organizer > File manager.
- 2 Scroll to a folder and select **Open**.
- 3 Scroll to a file and select **Options** > **Information**.

# Handling content in the phone

You can use **File manager** in your phone to handle content saved in the phone memory or on a memory card. Tabs and icons in **File manager** show where the content is saved. If the memory is full, delete some content to create space.

## Sending content to another phone

You can send content using different transfer methods, for example, Messages or Bluetooth wireless technology.

## To send content

- 1 Scroll to an item and select **Options** > **Send**.
- 2 Select a transfer method.
- Make sure the receiving device supports the transfer method you select.

## Connecting your phone to a computer

There are two ways to establish a connection between your phone and a computer:

- Using a USB cable
- Using Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> wireless technology

## Connecting using a USB cable

You can connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable compatible with your phone. Before you connect your phone to a computer, you need to select **PC mode**.

## To select PC mode

Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > USB > Set default mode and then select PC mode.

## To connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable

- 1 Connect your phone to the computer using a USB cable.
- 2 Computer: If you have not already installed Sony Ericsson PC Suite, the Install Sony Ericsson PC software dialog box appears. Click Install to install the necessary software automatically.
- In the Portable Device dialog box, select Take no action. 3
- Do not disconnect the USB cable when transferring content as this may corrupt the content.

## PC Companion

PC Companion lets you:

- Explore content in your phone.
- Use your phone as a modem.
- Install PC software used to synchronise, transfer and back up phone content. For more information, including Feature guides, go to www.sonyericsson.com/support.
- ★ To download Mac® compatible software, go to www.sonyericsson.com/support.

## Required operating systems

You need one of these operating systems to use Sony Ericsson PC software:

- Microsoft® Windows® 7
- Microsoft® Windows Vista™
- Microsoft® Windows® XP, Service Pack 2 or higher

## To install PC Companion

- If the necessary USB software has not been installed on your PC, you need to install PC Companion. Also, Autoplay functionality needs to be enabled on your PC.
- Using a USB cable supported by your phone, connect the phone to a computer that 1 runs a Microsoft® Windows® operating system.
- 2 Computer: Follow the on-screen instructions.

## Dragging and dropping content

You can drag and drop content between your phone, a memory card and a computer using the Microsoft<sup>®</sup> Windows<sup>®</sup> Explorer application.

## To browse the phone memory or memory card from a computer

- . Do not disconnect the USB cable when transferring content as this may corrupt the content.
- Connect your phone to the computer. 1
- 2 **Computer:** Double-click the *My computer* icon on the desktop.
- 3 To view the Phone Memory and Memory card folders, double-click your phone icon under Devices with removable storage in the My computer window.

## To drag and drop content

- Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable supported by the phone.
- **Computer:** Wait until the phone memory and memory card appear as external disks in the Microsoft® Windows® Explorer application.
- 3 Drag and drop selected files between the phone and the computer.

## To disconnect the USB cable safely

A Do not disconnect the USB cable when transferring content as this may corrupt the content.

- Computer: Right-click the Safely Remove Hardware icon in the Microsoft<sup>®</sup> Windows<sup>®</sup> Explorer application.
- 2 Select the drives you want to disconnect. Select Stop.
- 3 Wait until you are notified that it is safe to remove the drive. Disconnect the USB cable.

## Connecting using Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> wireless technology

You can establish a wireless connection between your phone and a computer that supports Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> wireless technology. The Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function on the phone and computer must be turned on before you start to connect. A maximum range of 10 meters (33 feet), with no solid objects in between, is recommended for Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> communication.

To turn on the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function

- Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth > Turn on.
- Make sure the device you want to pair your phone with has the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function activated and is visible to other devices.

#### To turn off the Bluetooth™ function

- Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth > Turn off.
- $\dot{\Psi}$  To reduce battery consumption, turn off the Bluetooth function when not in use.

## To show or hide your phone

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth.
- 2 Select **Options** > **Visibility**.
- 3 Select an option.

#### To connect your phone to a computer using Bluetooth wireless technology

- 1 **Computer:** Double-click the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> icon on your computer.
- 2 Select Bluetooth/Search For Devices.
- 3 Right-click your phone name and select Pair device.
- 4 Choose a PIN code and click OK.
- 5 Phone: When Add to My devices? appears, select Yes.
- 6 Enter your PIN code and select **OK**.
- 7 **Computer:** Double-click your phone name.
- 8 Double-click the Serial Port icon.
- 9 Phone: When Allow? appears, select Yes.

## Transferring content to and from a computer

You can use the Media  $Go^{TM}$  application to transfer media content between your phone and a computer. The Media  $Go^{TM}$  application is available for download through PC Companion or from *www.sonyericsson.com/support*.

## Mac<sup>®</sup> compatible software is also available for download at *www.sonyericsson.com/support*.

## To transfer content using Media Go™

- 1 Connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable supported by your phone.
- 2 **Computer:** When the *Portable Device* dialog box appears, select *Transfer to or from Device using Media Go and click OK.* The Media Go™ application opens.
- 3 **Computer:** Wait until your device appears in the *Library* navigation pane on the left of the Media Go<sup>™</sup> window. You can now select and transfer files between the phone and computer.
- 4 Move files between your phone and the computer using the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application.

## Media Home

You can use **Media Home** to transfer content automatically from the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application to your phone. You can also use **Media Home** to download content from a DLNA server.

Before using **Media Home**, you must install Media  $Go^{TM}$  on your computer and enable **Media sharing**. The Media  $Go^{TM}$  application is available for download through PC Companion or from *www.sonyericsson.com/support*.

## To set up Media Home

- 1 **Computer:** Open the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application and enable *Media sharing*.
- 2 Phone: Select Menu > Organizer > Media Home > Options > Setup wizard and follow the instructions.

## To transfer content automatically to your phone using Media Home

- 1 Open the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application on your computer.
- 2 Connect your phone to the charger. **Media Home** will start an automatic download when a charger is connected.

## To start Media Home manually

- 1 **Computer:** Open the Media Go<sup>™</sup> application.
- 2 Phone: Select Menu > Organizer > Media Home and press Start

## To browse and download content from a DLNA server

- 1 Select Organizer > Media Home > Options > Browse.
- 2 Select a server and mark the content you want to download.
- 3 Press Download.

## Phone name

You can enter a name for your phone that is shown to other devices when using, for example, Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> wireless technology.

## To enter a phone name

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Phone name.
- 2 Enter the phone name and select **OK**.

## Using Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> wireless technology

Use Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> technology to wirelessly connect to other devices, free of charge. You can, for example:

- Connect to handsfree devices.
- Connect to several devices at the same time.
- Connect to computers and access the Internet.
- Exchange MP3 files, virtual business cards, photos, and more.
- Play multiplayer games.
- A range of less than 10 meters (33 feet), with no solid objects in between, is recommended for Bluetooth communication.

## Before using Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> wireless technology

You must turn on the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function to communicate with other devices. You may also have to pair your phone with other Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> devices.

## To turn on the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function

- Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth > Turn on.
- Make sure the device you want to pair your phone with has the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function activated and is visible to other devices.

## To pair the phone with another device

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth > Add new device.
- 2 Select a device.
- 3 Enter a passcode, if required.

#### To allow connections to the phone

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth.
- 2 Select a device from the list.
- 3 Select **Options** > **Allow connection**.
- 4 Select Always ask or Always allow.
- This is only possible with devices that require access to a secure service.

## Power saving

You can save battery power with the Power save function. In Power save mode you can only connect to a single Bluetooth device. If you want to connect to more than one Bluetooth device at the same time, you must turn off this function.

## To turn on Power save

 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth > Options > Power save > On.

## Transferring sound to and from a Bluetooth handsfree

You can transfer sound to and from a Bluetooth handsfree using the phone keypad or the appropriate key on the handsfree.

#### To transfer sound

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth > Options > Incoming call.
- 2 Select an option. **In phone** transfers sound to the phone. **In handsfree** transfers sound to the handsfree.
- If you select the option **In phone** and answer using the handsfree key, the sound transfers to the handsfree.

## To transfer sound during a call

- 1 During a call, select **Sound**.
- 2 Select from the list of available handsfree devices.

## Backing up and restoring

You can back up and restore your contacts, calendar, tasks, notes, and bookmarks using the Sony Ericsson PC Suite, which is available through PC Companion or from *www.sonyericsson.com/support*.

You can also back up and restore contacts in your phone by moving content between the memory card and the phone memory. See *Handling content in the phone* on page 37.

Back up your phone content regularly to make sure you do not lose it.

## To make a backup using the Sony Ericsson PC Suite

- 1 **Computer:** Start the Sony Ericsson PC Suite from *Start/Programs/Sony Ericsson/ Sony Ericsson PC Suite*.
- 2 Follow the instructions in the Sony Ericsson PC Suite on how to connect.
- 3 Go to the backup and restore section in the Sony Ericsson PC Suite and make a backup of your phone content.

#### To restore phone content using the Sony Ericsson PC Suite

The Sony Ericsson PC Suite overwrites all phone content during the restore process. You may damage your phone if you interrupt the process.

- 1 Computer: Start the Sony Ericsson PC Suite from *Start/Programs/Sony Ericsson/* Sony Ericsson PC Suite.
- 2 Follow the instructions in the Sony Ericsson PC Suite on how to connect.
  3 Go to the backup and restore section in the Sony Ericsson PC Suite and restore your phone content.

# Updating your phone

You can update your phone to the most recent software for optimal performance and to get the latest enhancements. You need a USB cable and an Internet-connected PC.

Remember to back up your phone content before updating. See Backing up and restoring on page 42.

# Updating your phone using Sony Ericsson PC Suite

You can update your phone using a USB cable and *Sony Ericsson PC Suite*. When the phone is connected, it will automatically check for and notify you of new updates.

## Updating your phone wirelessly

You can update your phone over the air using the Update Service application in the phone. You do not lose personal or phone information.

Update Service requires data access such as GPRS, 3G or HSDPA.

## To select settings for Update Service

Select Menu > Settings > General > Update software > Settings > Internet settings.

#### To use Update Service

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > General > Update software.
- 2 Select **Search for update** and follow the instructions that appear.

# Messaging

## Text and picture messages

Messages can contain text, pictures, sound effects, animations, and melodies.

When sending messages, the phone automatically selects the most suitable method (as a text or picture message) for sending the message.

If you cannot use picture messages, see *I cannot use Internet-based services* on page 72.

## Sending messages

You can send messages from your phone. The maximum size of a standard text message is 160 characters (including spaces) if no other items are added to the message. If you enter more than 160 characters, a second message is created. Your messages are sent as one concatenated message.

## To create and send a message

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Write new > Message.
- 2 Enter text. To add items to the message, press the navigation key downwards, scroll by pressing the navigation key left or right, and select an item.
- 3 Select Continue > Contacts lookup.
- 4 Select a recipient and select **Send**.
- If you send a message to a group, you may be charged for each member. Contact your service provider for details.

## To copy and paste text in a message

- 1 When you write the message, select **Options** > **Copy & paste**.
- 2 Select **Copy all** or **Mark & copy**. Scroll to and mark text in the message.
- 3 Select **Options** > **Copy & paste** > **Paste**.

## Receiving and saving messages

You are notified when you receive a message.  $\bowtie$  or  $\bowtie$  appears. Messages are automatically saved in the phone memory. When the phone memory is full, you can delete messages or save them on a memory card or on the SIM card.

## To save an incoming message on a memory card

Select Menu > Messaging > Messages > Settings > Save to > Memory card.

## To save a message on the SIM card

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Messages and select a folder.
- 2 Scroll to a message and select **Options** > **Save message**.

## To view a message in the inbox

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Messages > Inbox.
- 2 Scroll to the message and select View.

## To call a number contained in a message

• When you view the message, scroll to the phone number and press (

## Message options

You can set some options, such as the Message alert and default storage location, to apply to all messages. You can set other options, such as the Delivery priority and Delivery time, for each message you send.

#### To set options for all messages

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Messages > Settings.
- 2 Select an option.

#### To set options for a specific message

- 1 When the message is ready and a recipient is selected, select **Options** > **Advanced**.
- 2 Scroll to an option and select Edit.

## Conversations

You can choose whether to view your messages in **Conversations** or the **Inbox**. A messaging conversation shows all messaging communication between you and one of your contacts.

#### To view messages in Conversations

- Select Menu > Messaging > Inbox > the Conversations tab.
- Select Menu > Messaging > Conversations and select a conversation.

## To send a message from Conversations

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging.
- 2 Select **Conversations**, or select **Inbox** > the **Conversations** tab.
- 3 Select a conversation.
- 4 Write a message and select **Send**.

## **Voice messages**

You can send and receive a sound recording as a voice message.

The sender and recipient must have a subscription supporting multimedia messaging.

## To record and send a voice message

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Write new > Voice message.
- 2 Record the message and select **Stop** > **Send** > **Contacts lookup**.
- 3 Select a recipient and select **Send**.

# Email

You can get email in your phone and use all standard email functions.

<sup>7</sup> You can synchronize your email using the Microsoft<sup>®</sup> Exchange ActiveSync<sup>®</sup> application.

## Before using email

You can use the setup wizard to check if settings for your email account can be automatically downloaded. If this doesn't work, you'll be prompted to enter settings manually.

To use email, you need the correct Internet settings in your phone. If you can't use the Internet, see *I cannot use Internet-based services* on page 72.

## Entering email settings manually

You can create an email account on your phone by entering the email settings manually. Before using the setup wizard, you need the relevant account and settings information. You can contact your service provider regarding email accounts included in your phone subscription. Otherwise, you should contact your email service provider.

You need the following information:

• Email address – the address that others use to send email to you. It always includes the '@' character.

- Email username the name you use to log in to your email account. Depending on your email account, this may be the same as your email address.
- Email password the password you use to log in to your email account.
- Incoming email server (POP3 or IMAP4). This identifies the server where your incoming email messages are stored (for example, mail.example.com).

#### To create an email account for the first time

- 1 To start the email setup wizard, select **Menu > Messaging > Email**.
- 2 Follow the instructions to create the account.
- If you need to enter settings manually, you can contact your email provider for more information. An email provider could be the company that supplied your email address.

## To create a POP3 email account manually

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Email.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select an account.
- 3 Select Accounts.
- 4 Scroll to **New account** and select **Add**. The setup wizard opens.
- 5 Select the type of account.
- 6 Enter your name and select Continue.
- 7 Enter your email address and select **Continue**.
- 8 Enter your user name for the incoming server and select **Continue**.
- 9 Enter your password for the incoming server and select **Continue**.
- 10 To complete the configuration manually, select **No**.
- 11 Select **POP3** and select **Continue**.
- 12 Enter the incoming POP3 server name and select Continue.
- 13 Enter the outgoing server name (SMTP) and select **Continue**.
- Your email service provider may use additional settings in their email setup. If so, you need to edit your email account before you can use it.

## To create an IMAP4 email account manually

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Email.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select an account.
- 3 Select Accounts.
- 4 Scroll to **New account** and select **Add**. The setup wizard opens.
- 5 Select the type of account.
- 6 Enter your name and select **Continue**.
- 7 Enter your email address and select **Continue**.
- 8 Enter your username for the incoming server and select **Continue**.
- 9 Enter your password for the incoming server and select **Continue**.
- 10 To complete the configuration manually, select **No**.
- 11 Scroll to IMAP4 and select Continue.
- 12 Enter the incoming IMAP4 server name and select **Continue**.
- 13 Enter the outgoing server name (SMTP) and select Continue.
- Your email service provider may use additional settings in their email setup. If so, you need to edit your email account before you can use it.

## To write and send an email message

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Email.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select the account you want to send the message from.
- 3 Select Write new.
- 4 To add a recipient, scroll to **To:** and select **Add** > **Enter email address**. Enter the email address and select **OK**.
- 5 To add more recipients, scroll to **To:** and select **Edit**. Scroll to an option and select **Add**. When you are ready, select **Done**.
- 6 To enter a subject, scroll to Subject:, select Edit, enter the subject, and select OK.
- 7 To enter the message text, scroll to **Text:**, select **Edit**, enter the text, and select **OK**.
- 8 Select Add to attach a file.
- 9 Select **Continue** > **Send**.

## To receive and read an email message

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Email.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select an account.
- 3 Select Inbox > Options > Check new email.
- 4 Scroll to the message and select **View**.

## To save an email message

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Email.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select an account.
- 3 Select Inbox.
- 4 Scroll to the message and select View > Options > Save message.

#### To reply to an email message

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Email.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select an account.
- 3 Select Inbox.
- 4 Scroll to the message and select **Options** > **Reply**.
- 5 Write the reply and select **OK**.
- 6 Select Continue > Send.

#### To view an attachment in an email message

• When you view the message, select **Options** > **Attachments** > **Use** > **View**.

## Active email account

If you have several email accounts, you can change which one is active.

## To create additional email accounts

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Email.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select an account.
- 3 Select Accounts.
- 4 Scroll to **New account** and select **Add**.

## To change the active email account

- 1 Select Menu > Messaging > Email.
- 2 If you have several email accounts, select an account.
- 3 Select Accounts.
- 4 Select the account you want to activate.

## Checking for new email messages automatically

You can set your phone to check for new email messages automatically. You can use a time interval for the check, or you can let the phone stay connected to the email server (push email). The phone will only check for email messages for the active email account. When you receive a new email message, grappears on the screen.

## To set the interval for checking for new email messages

- Select Menu > Messaging > Email. 1
- If you have several email accounts, select an account.
   Select Settings > the Download tab > Check interval.
- 4 Select an option.

# Internet

#### To start browsing

- 1 Select Menu > Internet.
- 2 Enter a web address, a search phrase or the name of a bookmark.
- 3 Scroll to an item in the list and select **Go to** or **Search**.

#### To exit the browser

- 2 Select Exit browser.

## To access the web browser toolbar

When you are viewing a web page, select Z. The following options appear:

# **Internet settings**

You can receive or enter data account settings in four ways:

- Automatically by using the Settings download function on your phone.
- Automatically by using the Sony Ericsson phone settings (if supported by your service provider).
- Automatically by receiving them from your service provider.
- Manually by entering the settings on your phone.
- We recommend that you enter settings automatically, as this takes less time and effort than entering them manually.

## Entering settings manually

To enter settings manually, you need settings information from your service provider, for example, the APN (Access Point Name).

## To enter PS (Packet Switched) data account settings on the phone

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Internet settings > Connect using:
- 2 Scroll to a data account item and select **Options** > **Create new**.
- 3 Select PS data.
- 4 Select Name > Edit.
- 5 Enter a name for your data account and select **OK**.
- 6 Select **APN** > **Edit**.
- 7 Enter the APN (Access Point Name) you received from your service provider and select **OK**.
- 8 Select **Save** to save the account.
- 9 Select the data account you created and select **Save**. You are now ready to use the Internet.

#### To enter CS (Circuit Switched) data account settings on the phone

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Internet settings > Connect using:
- 2 Scroll to a data account item and select **Options** > **Create new**.
- 3 Select **CS data**.
- 4 Select Name > Edit.
- 5 Enter a name for your data account and select **OK**.
- 6 Select Phone number > Edit.
- 7 Enter the phone number you received from your service provider and select OK.
- 8 Select **Username** > **Edit**.
- 9 Enter the user name you received from your service provider and select **OK**.
- 10 Select Password > Edit.
- 11 Enter the password you received from your service provider and select OK.
- 12 Select **Save** to save the account.
- 13 Select the data account you created and select **Save**. You are now ready to use the Internet.

## Modem functionality

Your phone has a built-in modem. You can use it to connect a computer to your Internet Service Provider (ISP) to browse the Internet or manage your email messages.

You need to have Sony Ericsson PC Suite installed on your computer.

## **Before starting**

Before you set up your computer and start using the modem you need:

- A GSM phone subscription that supports EDGE, GPRS or 3G.
- A phone subscription that covers Internet browsing. If you are not sure whether you have this, please contact your service provider.

## Setting up Internet connections

You can establish an Internet connection through your phone using the following methods:

- Sony Ericsson PC Suite
- USB Internet mode on your phone
- Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> wireless technology

## Setting up an Internet connection using Sony Ericsson PC Suite

Sony Ericsson PC Suite lets you access the Internet using a cable connection between your phone and a computer. When you connect the two devices using an approved cable, the *How to connect wizard* in the PC Suite guides you through the process. An Internet connection is established automatically in one of three ways:

- If there is an Internet data account under **Internet settings** that corresponds to your current operator, the connection will be established automatically.
- If there is no Internet data account under **Internet settings** that corresponds to your current operator, the application creates a phone data account.

If there is insufficient space to save the Internet data on your phone, you will be asked to
overwrite an existing data account.

## To connect to the Internet using Sony Ericsson PC Suite

- ★ Make sure the signal strength is good enough to establish a data connection.

#### To end a connection

• Click *Disconnect* in the *Internet connection* window.

## Managing connections in Sony Ericsson PC Suite

When you are connected to the Internet using Sony Ericsson PC Suite, you can manage your connections from the *Advanced settings* menu in the *Internet connection* window. You can:

- Use another connection
- Create a new connection
- Manage your connections
- View connection logs

#### To use a connection other than the default connection

- 1 Select Manage your connections. The Manage your connections window appears.
- 2 Double-click the connection. The connection starts up.

#### To create a new connection

- 1 Select Manage your connections. The Manage your connections window appears.
- 2 Double-click Create a new connection. The Internet Connection Wizard opens.
- 3 Follow the instructions. The connection that is created becomes your default connection.

#### To manage your connections

- 1 Select Manage your connections. The Manage your connections window opens.
- 2 Right-click the icon of the connection to be changed and select *Properties*. The *Properties* window opens.
- 3 Make the changes you want in the various tabs.
- 4 Click OK.

## To delete a connection

- 1 Select Manage your connections. The Manage your connections window opens.
- 2 Select the icon of the connection to be deleted. Press the *Delete* key on your keyboard. A confirmation window opens.
- 3 Click Yes.

## Setting up a USB cable modem

You can use your phone as a modern by connecting the phone to a computer using a USB cable.

## To set up a USB cable modem

- 1 Connect a USB cable to your phone and the computer.
- 2 Phone: Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > USB > Advanced > Internet access > Internet via phone.
- 3 **Computer:** The new connection appears in your *Network connections* folder.

## Setting up a Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> modem

If your computer supports Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> wireless technology, you can connect and use your phone as a modem. The connection appears in the *Network connections* folder on the computer. The Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> function on the phone and computer must be turned on before you start setting up the modem. A maximum range of 10 meters (33 feet), with no solid objects in between, is recommended for Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> communication.

## To set up a Bluetooth modem

- 1 **Computer:** Double-click the Bluetooth<sup>™</sup> icon.
- 2 Click *View devices in range*. If your phone is not displayed, click *Search For Devices in range*.
- 3 Right-click your phone name and select Pair device.
- 4 Choose a PIN code and click OK.
- 5 Phone: When Add to My devices? appears, select Yes.
- 6 Enter the PIN code (same as before) and select **OK**.
- 7 **Computer:** Double-click your phone name in the *Bluetooth devices* window.
- 8 Double-click the serial port icon.
- 9 Phone: When Allow? appears, select Yes.

## Internet security and certificates

Your phone supports secure browsing. Certain Internet services, such as banking, require certificates in your phone. Your phone may already contain certificates when you buy it or you can download new certificates.

## To view certificates in the phone

• Select Menu > Settings > General > Security > Certificates.

## **File transfers**

The File transfer manager keeps track of the files you download from the Internet, for example, media files, podcasts, and games, and helps you access the files. It also tracks your photo uploads to websites, such as web albums and blogs. In the File transfer manager, you can also install downloaded Java applications, and to pause, resume, or cancel downloads.

## To access a file using File transfer

- 1 Select Menu > Organizer > File transfer.
- 2 Scroll to the file.
- 3 Press the center selection key to access the file, or select **Options** for other actions.

## Web feeds

Using web feeds, you can subscribe to and download frequently updated content, such as news, podcasts or photos.

## To add new feeds from a web page

- 1 When you browse a page on the Internet that provides web feeds, indicated by S, select 
  ✓ and then 
  .
- 2 For each feed you want to add, scroll to the feed and select Add > Yes.
- 3 Select an update frequency.

## To search for web feeds

- 1 Select Menu > Media > Web feeds.
- 2 Select New feed and enter a web address.

#### To download content via web feeds

- 1 Select Menu > Media > Web feeds.
- 2 Select Options >Update feed.
- 3 Scroll to an updated feed and select View.
- 4 Scroll to a heading by pressing the navigation key left or right.
- 5 Scroll to the item you want to download by pressing the navigation key downward, then select **Options** > **Download file**.
- You can access downloaded files from the File transfer manager. See *File transfers* on page 54.
- You can also subscribe to and download web feed content to a computer using the Media Go™ application. See *To transfer content using Media* Go™ on page 40.

## Updating web feeds

You can manually update your feeds, or schedule updates. When updates arrive, stappears on the screen.

#### To schedule web feed updates

- 1 Select Menu > Media > Web feeds.
- 2 Scroll to a feed and select **Options** > **Schedule update**.
- 3 Select an option.
- Frequent updates may be costly.

## Web feeds in standby

You can show news updates on the standby screen using the ticker application.

This application may not be available in all markets.

#### To show web feeds in standby

- 1 Select Menu > Media > Web feeds.
- 2 Scroll to a feed and select Options > Settings > Standby ticker > Show in standby.

#### To access web feeds from standby

- 1 From standby, select **Ticker**.
- 2 To read more about a feed, press the navigation key upwards or downwards to scroll to a headline, then select **View**.

## Podcasts

Podcasts are files, for example, radio programs or video content, that you can download and play. You subscribe to and download podcasts using web feeds.

To access audio podcasts

• Select Menu > Media > Music > Music feeds.

To access video podcasts

Select Menu > Media > Video > Video feeds.

## Photo feeds

You can subscribe to photo feeds and download photos.

#### To access photo feeds

Select Menu > Media > Photo > Photo feeds.

# Twitter<sup>™</sup> application

Twitter™ is a social networking and micro-blogging service that lets you communicate with friends, family and web communities via tweets. Tweets are text-based posts of up to 140 characters.

## To access Twitter from Widget Manager

- From standby, press the navigation key up.
   To select the Twitter<sup>™</sup> application, press the navigation key left or right.
   Press Select to start the application.
- 4 Enter your Twitter<sup>™</sup> username and password.

# **Connected home**

The Connected home concept makes your phone a part of everyday living in terms of music and media handling in your home environment. It connects Hi-Fi, TV, movies, gaming, etc., on your home network.

## Wi-Fi™

Using a Wi-Fi<sup>™</sup> connection, you can access the Internet wirelessly with your phone. You can browse the Internet using personal (home) networks and hotspots (public access zones).

Personal networks are usually protected by a passphrase or key. Hotspots are usually not protected, but often require you to log on to an operator's service before you get Internet access.

## Using Wi-Fi™

To be able to browse the Internet using Wi-Fi, you need to search for and connect to an available network and then open the Internet browser.

## To turn on Wi-Fi™

Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Wi-Fi > Turn on.

## To connect to a network

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Wi-Fi.
- 2 Scroll to a network and select **Connect**.

## To start browsing using Wi-Fi™

- 1 Make sure (a) is showing in the status bar.
- 2 Select Menu > Internet.
- Often used networks can be saved as favorites. If you turn on **Auto connect** for one of these networks, your phone will connect automatically to that network when it is within range.

## DLNA™

Your phone has built-in DLNA<sup>™</sup> (Digital Living Network Alliance) functionality that uses Wi-Fi<sup>™</sup> technology to connect to your home network. Other DLNA devices connected to the same home network can access, view, and play images and music saved in your phone. A compatible DLNA device can be, for example, a computer, camera, TV, PLAYSTATION<sup>®</sup>3 console, or another phone with DLNA functionality.

Wi-Fi must be turned on and the phone must be connected to a favorite network.

## To set the phone as a DLNA server

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Content sharing.
- 2 Select a favorite network from the list.
- 3 Select On > Save.
- ✤ A DLNA server exposes music, images and videos on the network. Other DLNA units play media from the media servers on the network.

#### To view photos saved in your phone on another DLNA device

## 1 Select Menu > Media > Photo > Camera album.

- 2 Select a month.
- 3 Scroll to a photo and select **Options** > **View on**.
- 4 Select a DLNA device from the list.

## To play music stored in your phone on another DLNA device

- 1 Select Menu > Media > Music.
- 2 Browse by category using the navigation key.
- 3 Scroll to and select a title.
- 4 Select **Options** > **Play on**.
- 5 Select a DLNA device from the list.

## To play music stored on another DLNA device in your phone

- 1 Select Menu > Media > Music > Media servers.
- 2 Select a Media server from the list.
- 3 Browse by category using the navigation key.
- 4 Scroll to a title and select **Play**.

# GPS

Your phone has a GPS receiver that uses satellite signals to calculate your location. Some GPS features use the Internet. Data rates and charges may apply.

If you cannot use some GPS features, see *I cannot use Internet-based services* on page 72.

# **Using GPS**

Your location can be found when you have a clear view of the sky. If your location is not found after a few minutes, move to another location. To help the search, stand still and do not cover the GPS antenna.

The first time you use the GPS it may take up to 10 minutes before your location is found.



## Assisted start

Assisted start helps calculate your location more quickly. If not turned off, Assisted start will automatically be used to find your location when Assisted GPS (A-GPS) technology is available.

## To set when to use Assisted start

- 1 Select Menu > Location services > Settings > Assisted start.
- 2 Select an option.

## Saving locations

You can find all saved locations in My favorites.

#### To save your current location

- 1 Select Menu > Location services > My favorites > Add new place.
- 2 Select Edit and enter the title. Select OK.
- 3 Scroll to **Description:** and select **Add**.
- 4 Enter the description and select **OK**.
- 5 Scroll to **Position:** and select **Add** > **Current position**.
- 6 When the position is found, select **Save**.

## To view a saved location on a map

- 1 Select Menu > Location services > My favorites.
- 2 Scroll to a location and select Go to.

## Location requests

External services may ask for your location. You can allow external services to use information about your location, as well as restrict them from doing so.

## To change access for external services

- 1 Select Menu > Location services > Settings > Privacy.
- 2 Select an option.

## **Turning off GPS**

The GPS receiver turns off automatically when it is not in use. You can also turn the GPS receiver off manually. This saves battery power when you use features that do not require the GPS receiver to find your location.

#### To turn on or off GPS manually

- 1 Select Menu > Location services > Settings.
- 2 Select **Enable GPS** or **Disable GPS**.

## Google Maps<sup>™</sup> for mobile

The Google Maps<sup>™</sup> application lets you view your current location, find other locations, and calculate routes.

When you start the Google Maps<sup>™</sup> application, your approximate location is shown using information from nearby mobile towers. Your location is updated with a more precise position when the GPS receiver finds your location.

#### To use the Google Maps™application

Select Menu > Location services > Google Maps.

#### To access favorites from the Google Maps™ application

• After opening Google Maps<sup>™</sup>, press (¥+).

## To learn more about the Google Maps<sup>™</sup> application

• When you use the Google Maps<sup>™</sup> application, select **Options** > **Help**.

## Tracker

Tracker is a GPS-based sports application which allows you to keep track of your speed, distance, route and energy consumption during training. You can base the training on how long time you want to train or on what distance you want to cover. You can also base it on a previous training route which has GPS data.

Information provided by use of the Tracker application is approximate. Sony Ericsson makes no warranty of any kind with respect to the accuracy of the Tracker application. Any serious health and fitness concerns should be referred to a health care professional.

## To start a training session

- 1 Select Menu > Location services > Tracker > Start training.
- 2 Select a training type.
- 3 Scroll to an item, select **Edit** and enter the data.
- 4 To save, select **Done**.
- 5 To start training, select **Start**.

#### To switch between training views

• During a training session, press the navigation key left or right to view information on training duration, progress and live comparison with a previous session.

#### To compare results during training

- 3 Scroll to a date and select **View**.
- 4 Select a training result. If you have used laps, press the navigation key left or right to view result per lap.

## To compare results

- 1 Select Menu > Location services > Tracker > Results.
- 2 Scroll to a result and select **Options** > **Compare**.
- 3 Select a result to compare with.
- A GPS location is required before results can be compared.

## **Energy consumption**

To calculate and view the energy consumption for a session you must first set your personal profile in **Settings** in Tracker. You view the energy consumption in the result view.

## To set the personal profile

- 1 Select Menu > Location services > Tracker > Settings > Personal profile.
- 2 Select an item, enter data and select **OK**.
- 3 When finished, select **Options** > **Save profile**.

## To turn on energy consumption

 Select Menu > Location services > Tracker > Settings > Energy consumption > On.

# Synchronizing

You can synchronize your phone in two different ways: using a computer program, or using an Internet service.

# Synchronization options in Sony Ericsson PC Suite

## To set synchronization options in Sony Ericsson PC Suite

- 1 **Computer:** Start Sony Ericsson PC Suite.

- 3 In the *Synchronization* window of Sony Ericsson PC Suite, click *Settings* and choose your options.

#### To solve installation problems

- 1 Check that the cable is connected properly to the phone and to the computer.

- 3 Restart the computer without disconnecting the cable or turning off the phone.
- 4 Try to synchronize again.
- 5 If the problem persists, reinstall Sony Ericsson PC Suite.

## COM port speed

If you experience problems synchronizing with a USB cable, check the COM port speed is correctly set.

- 2 Select the *Port settings* and set the speed to no higher than 115 200 bps.

## Contacts, calendar items, tasks, notes, and bookmarks

In the *Settings* window of Sony Ericsson PC Suite, you can choose synchronization settings for your contacts, calendar items, tasks, notes, and bookmarks. For contacts, calendar items, tasks, and notes, you can use the drop-down list to select your Personal Information Manager (PIM). The drop-down list includes all applications that have been detected on your computer. In the *Properties* window, you can set which folders you want to synchronize with.

## **Bookmarks**

When installing Sony Ericsson PC Suite, a subfolder for My Sony Ericsson bookmarks is created in the Internet Explorer bookmarks folder. This becomes the default folder for synchronization.

If Internet Explorer is not installed or is not the default web browser, the default folder for the bookmarks is *My Documents/Sony Ericsson PC Suite/Bookmarks*.

## Rules

In the *Rules* window, you can set rules for what happens when conflicts are found between your phone and computer during synchronization.

## Schedule

You can activate the *Automatic synchronization* feature in the *Schedule* window. This lets you set how often the phone will synchronize with the computer.

## **Flight mode**

In **Flight mode** the network and radio transceivers are turned off to prevent disturbance to sensitive equipment.

When the flight mode menu is activated you are asked to select a mode the next time you turn on your phone:

- Normal mode full functionality
- Flight mode limited functionality

## To activate the flight mode menu

 Select Menu > Settings > General > Flight mode > Continue > Show at startup.

## To select flight mode

- 1 When the flight mode menu is activated, turn off your phone.
- 2 Turn on your phone and select Flight mode. O appears.

## Alarms

You can set a sound or the radio as an alarm signal. The alarm sounds even if the phone is turned off. When the alarm sounds, you can silence it or turn it off.

- 3 Scroll to **Time:** and select **Edit**.

## To set the alarm signal

- 2 Scroll to an alarm and select Edit.
- 3 Scroll to the 🎝 tab.
- 4 Scroll to Alarm signal: and select Edit.
- 5 Find and select an alarm signal. Select **Save**.

## To silence the alarm

- When the alarm sounds, press any key.
- To repeat the alarm, select **Snooze**.

## To turn off the alarm

• When the alarm sounds, press any key, then select **Turn off**.

#### To cancel the alarm

- 1 Select Menu > Organizer > Alarms.
- 2 Scroll to an alarm and select Turn off.

#### To set the snooze duration

- 1 Select Menu > Organizer > Alarms.
- 2 Scroll to an alarm and select **Edit**.

## The alarm in silent mode

You can set the alarm not to sound when the phone is in silent mode.

- 2 Scroll to the note shown in standby. This is marked with the icon ". Select **Options** > **Hide in standby**.

## Tasks

You can add new tasks or reuse existing tasks.

#### To add a task

- 3 Select an option.
- 4 Enter details and confirm each entry.

#### To set when reminders should sound

- 1 Select Menu > Organizer > Tasks.

- A reminders option set in Tasks affects a reminders option set in Calendar.

## **Profiles**

You can change settings such as the ring volume and vibrating alert to suit different locations. You can reset all profiles to the phone's original settings.

#### To view and edit a profile

#### To set the time zone

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > General > Time & date > My time zone.
- 2 Select the time zone you are in.
- If you select a city, **My time zone** also updates the time when daylight saving time changes.

#### To change the clock size displayed on the standby screen

- 1 Select Menu > Settings > Display > Clock size.
- 2 Select an option.
- This application may not be available in all markets.

## Themes

You can change the appearance of the screen using options such as different colors and wallpaper. You can also create new themes and download them. For more information, go to *www.sonyericsson.com/fun*.

#### To set a theme
