Exposure to radio frequency energy

THIS DEVICE MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) recommended by international guidelines (ICNIRP). These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines were developed by independent scientific organisations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The quidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to assure

the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit stated in the international guidelines is 2.0 W/kg*. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR of the device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a base station, the lower the power output of the device. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public,

compliance with the European R&TTE directive must be shown. This directive includes as one essential requirement the protection of the health and the safety for the user and any other person.

The highest SAR value for this device when tested for use at the ear is 0.602 W/kg.

This device meets RF exposure guidelines when used either in the normal use position against the ear or when positioned at least 1.5 cm away from the body. When a carry case, belt clip or holder is used for body-worn operation, it should not contain metal and should position the product at least 1.5 cm away from your body. In order to transmit data files or messages, this device requires a quality connection to the network. In some cases, transmission of data files or messages may be delayed until such a connection is available. Ensure

the above separation distance instructions are followed until the transmission is completed. The highest SAR value for this device when tested for use at the body is 0.646 W/kg.

*The SAR limit for mobile devices used by the public is 2.0 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over ten grams of body tissue. The guidelines incorporate a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection for the public and to account for any variations in measurements. SAR values may vary depending on national reporting requirements and the network band.

Guidelines for safe and efficient use

FCC SAR information

Your mobile device is also designed to meet the requirements for exposure to radio waves established by the Federal Communications Commission (USA) and Industry Canada.

These requirements set a SAR limit of 1.6 W/kg averaged over 1 gram of tissue. The highest SAR value reported under this standard during product certification for use at the ear is 0.671 W/kg and when properly worn on the body is 0.791 W/kg. Additionally, this device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone kept 0.79 inches (2cm) between the users body and the back of the phone. To comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, a minimum separation distance of 0.79 inches(2cm) must be maintained between the user's body and the back of the phone.

Product care and maintenance

Only use batteries, chargers and accessories approved for use with this particular phone model. The use of any other types may invalidate any approval or warranty applying to the phone, and may be dangerous.

- Do not disassemble this unit. Take it to a qualified service technician when repair work is required.
- Keep away from electrical appliances such as TVs, radios, and personal computers.
- The unit should be kept away from heat sources such as radiators or cookers.
- Do not drop.
- Do not subject this unit to mechanical vibration or shock.
- Switch off the phone in any area where you are required by special regulations. For example, do not use your phone in hospitals as it may affect sensitive medical equipment.
- Do not handle the phone with wet hands while it is being charged. It may cause an electric shock and can seriously damage your phone.
- Do not charge a handset near flammable material as the handset can become hot and create a fire hazard.

- This handset is not recommended for blind disability person due to touch screen keypad.

Efficient phone operation Flectronic and medical devices

All mobile phones may get interference, which could affect performance.

- Do not use your mobile phone near medical equipment without requesting permission. Please consult your doctor to determine if operation of your phone may interfere with the operation of your medical device.
- Some hearing aids might be disturbed by mobile phones.

 Minor interference may affect TVs, radios, PCs, etc.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15cm be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

Hospitals

Switch off your wireless device when requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or health care facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

Road safety

Check the laws and regulations on the use of mobile phones in the area when you drive.

- Do not use a hand-held phone while driving.
- · Give full attention to driving.
- · Use a hands-free kit, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.
- RF energy may affect some electronic systems in your vehicle such as car stereos and safety equipment.
- When your vehicle is equipped with an air bag, do not obstruct with installed or portable wireless equipment. It can cause the air bag to fail or cause serious injury due to improper performance.
- If you are listening to music while out and about, please ensure that the volume is at a reasonable

level so that you are aware of your surroundings. This is particularly imperative when near roads.

Avoid damage to your hearing

Damage to your hearing can occur if you are exposed to loud sound for long periods of time. We therefore recommend that you do not turn on or off the handset close to your ear. We also recommend that music and call volumes are set to a reasonable level

Glass Parts

Some parts of your mobile device are made of glass. This glass could break if your mobile device is dropped on a hard surface or receives a substantial impact. If the glass breaks, do not touch or attempt to remove. Stop using your mobile device until the glass is replaced by an authorized service provider.

Guidelines for safe and efficient use

Blasting area

Do not use the phone where blasting is in progress. Observe restrictions, and follow any regulations or rules.

Potentially explosive atmospheres

- Do not use the phone at a refueling point.
- Do not use near fuel or chemicals.
- Do not transport or store flammable gas, liquid, or explosives in the same compartment of your vehicle as your mobile phone and accessories.

In aircraft

Wireless devices can cause interference in aircraft

- Turn your mobile phone off before boarding any aircraft.
- Do not use it on the ground without permission from the crew.

Children

Keep the phone in a safe place out of the reach of small children It includes small parts which may cause a choking hazard if detached.

Emergency calls

Emergency calls may not be available under all mobile networks. Therefore, you should never depend solely on the phone for emergency calls. Check with your local service provider.

Battery information and care

- You do not need to completely discharge the battery before recharging. Unlike other battery systems, there is no memory effect that could compromise the battery's performance.
- Use only LG batteries and chargers.
 LG chargers are designed to maximize the battery life.
- Do not disassemble or short-circuit the battery pack.
- Keep the metal contacts of the battery pack clean.
- Replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. The battery pack maybe recharged hundreds of times until it needs replacing.
- Recharge the battery if it has not been used for a long time to maximize usability.

- Do not expose the battery charger to direct sunlight or use it in high humidity, such as in the bathroom.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places, this may deteriorate the battery performance.
- There is risk of explosion if the battery is replaced by an incorrect type.
- Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions. Please recycle when possible. Do not dispose as household waste.
- If you need to replace the battery, take it to the nearest authorized LG Electronics service point or dealer for assistance.
- Always unplug the charger from the wall socket after the phone is fully charged to save unnecessary power consumption of the charger.

 Use a hands free device. If possible, add an additional layer of convenience and safety to your wireless phone with one of the many hands free accessories available today.


- Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, ice and even heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
 Jotting down a "to do" list or flipping through your address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility, driving safely.
- If possible, place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic. Try to plan calls when you will not be driving.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that have the potential to divert your attention from the road.

Guideline

- Use your wireless phone to call emergency services for yourself or others.
 - In the case of fire, traffic accident or medical emergencies;
 - · Australia: Dial 0-0-0,
 - New Zealand: Dial 1-1-1,
 - International: Dial 1-1-2,
 - other local emergency number.
 Remember, it is a free call on your wireless phone for emergency services.
- Use your wireless phone to help others in emergencies, if you see an auto accident crime in progress or other serious emergency where lives are in danger, call the emergency number, as you would want others to do for you.

 Call roadside assistance or a special nonemergency wireless assistance number when necessary. If you see a broken down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or other special nonemergency wireless number.

Getting to know your phone

- When playing a track: controls volume continuously.



Installing the USIM and battery

1 Remove the battery cover

Press and hold down the battery release button on the top of the phone and lift off the battery cover.



WARNING: Do not remove the battery when the phone is switched on, as this may damage the phone.

MARNING: Do not remove the battery cover when using GPS, Wi-Fi or Bluetooth. The antenna is mounted on the battery cover. 01

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2 Remove the battery

Hold the top edge of the battery and lift it away from the battery compartment.



Installing the USIM and battery

3 Install the USIM card

Slide the USIM card into the USIM card holder. Make sure the gold contact area on the card is facing downwards. To remove the USIM card, pull it gently in the outwards



4 Install the battery

First insert the top of the battery into the top edge of the battery compartment. Ensure that the battery contacts align with the phone's terminals. Press the bottom of the battery down until it clips into place.



5 Charging your phone

Slide back the cover of the charger socket on the side of your KM900. Insert the charger and plug it into a mains electricity socket. Your KM900 must be charged until the "Battery full" message appears on the screen.

NOTE: The battery must be fully charged initially to improve battery lifetime. Disregard the first "Battery full" message and keep the phone on charge overnight (or for up to 14 hours).



Memory card

Installing a memory card

You can expand the available memory space available on your phone by using a memory card. KM900 will support up to 32Gb memory card.

NOTE: A memory card is an optional accessory.


1 Slide the memory card into the slot at the top, until it clicks into place. Make sure the gold contact area is facing downwards.

WARNING: Slide the memory card fully into the slot, otherwise, the card can be damaged.









Formatting the memory card

Your memory card may already be formatted. If it isn't, you will need to format it before you can start to use it

NOTE: All files get deleted while formatting.

- 1 From the home screen select and choose **Phone settings** from the Settings tab.
- 2 Scroll and touch Memory manager then scroll and select External memory.
- 3 Touch Format and then confirm your choice.
- 4 Enter the password, if there is one. The card will then be formatted and ready to use. The security code is "0000".

NOTE: If there is existing content on your memory card, the folder structure may be different after formatting since all files will have been deleted.

Transferring your contacts

To transfer your contacts from your USIM to your phone:

- 1 From the Communication tab, scroll through **Contacts** and select **Change location**.
- 2 Touch Copy to handset.
- 3 Choose Select all or select names one by one and touch Copy to handset.

Touch screen tips

The home screen is also a great place to get used to using the touch screen.

To select an item, touch the centre of the icon.

- Do not to press too hard; the touchscreen is sensitive enough to pick up on a light, firm touch.
- Use the tip of your finger to touch the option you require. Be careful not to touch any other keys.
- When the screen light is off, either press the power key then press and hold the "Press & hold to unlock" button on the touch screen to restore the home screen.



Using the Multi-tasking function

- 4 Touch Voice call or Video call.

Answering and rejecting a call



To adjust the volume during a call, use the up and down button on the right side of the phone.

Speed dialling

You can assign a frequently-called contact to a speed dial number.

- 1 From the home screen touch to open your Contacts.
- 2 Touch and select Speed dials
- 3 Your voicemail is already set to speed dial 1. You cannot change this. Touch any other number to assign it to a speed dial contact.
- 4 Your contacts list will open. Select the contact you want to assign to that number by touching the phone number once.

To call a speed dial number, touch on the home screen then press and hold the assigned number until the contact appears on the screen.

The call will initiate automatically. without having to touch Voice call.

Making a second call

- 1 During your initial call, touch Dialogd and select the number you want to call.
- 2 Call the number or search your contacts (see Making a call on page 35 for details).
- 3 Touch to connect the call.
- 4 Both calls will be displayed on the call screen. Your initial call will be locked and put on hold.
- 5 To end one call touch the held call and press end to end both calls press select End then select all calls from the expanded menu.



NOTE: You will be charged for every call you make.

Turning off DTMF

DTMF lets you use numerical commands to navigate within automated calls. DTMF default is set to on.

To turn it off during a call (to make a note of a number) touch and select **Disable DTMF**.

Viewing your call logs

From the home screen, touch :, then touch **Recent history** in the Communication tab.

Choose from the following:

All history - View a complete list of all dialled, received and missed calls, voice calls only, video calls and messages.

Missed calls - View a list of all calls you have missed.

Calls only - View a list of all calls you have made and missed.

Message only - View a list of all numbers that have received or sent the texts and multimedia messages.

VT only- View a list of all video calls.

TIP! From any call log touch

and Delete all to delete all the recorded items.

TIP! Touch any single call log entry to view the date, time and duration of the call.

Using call divert

- 1 Touch and choose Call settings in the Settings tab.
- 2 Touch Call divert and select Voice call and/or Video call.
- 3 Choose whether to divert all calls, when the line is busy, when there is no answer, or when you cannot be contacted.
- 4 Enter the number to divert to.
- 5 Touch Activate to activate.

NOTE: Diverting calls will incur charges. Please contact your network operator for details.

TIP! To turn off all call diverts, choose **Deactivate all** from the **Call divert** menu.

Using call barring

- 1 Touch and choose Call settings in the Settings tab.
- 2 Touch Call barring and select Voice call and/or Video call.
- 3 Choose any or all of the five options:

All outgoing
Outgoing international
Outgoing international calls
except home country
All incoming
Incoming when abroad

4 Enter the call barring password. Please check with your network operator about this service.

TIP! Select Fixed dial number to turn on and compile a list of numbers which can be called from your phone. You'll need your PIN2 code, available from your operator. Only numbers within the fixed dial list can be called from your phone.

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Calls

Changing the common call setting

- 1 Touch and choose Call settings in the Settings tab.
- 2 Touch Common settings. This lets you amend the following settings:

Call reject - Slide the switch left to highlight the Reject list. You can touch the text box to choose all calls, specific contacts or groups, or those from unregistered numbers (i.e. not in your contacts). Touch Save to change this setting.

Send my number - Choose whether to display your number on an outgoing call.

Auto redial - Slide the switch left for **On** or right for **Off**.

Minute minder - Slide the switch left to **On** to hear a tone every minute during a call.

BT answer mode - Select Handsfree to be able to answer a call using a Bluetooth headset, or select Handset to press a the handset key to answer a call.

Save new number - Select **On** to save a new number.

Select line- Use your phone over a two line service, such as line 1 or line 2

Changing your video call settings

- 1 From the home screen, touch and scroll through Video call settings in the Settings tab.
- 2 Select the settings for your video calls. Determine whether to use still image, then choose one, and/ or switch the mirror on to see yourself on screen when making a video call.

The basics

Searching for a contact

There are two ways to search for a contact:

From the home screen

- to open your Contacts. Touch and enter the contact name using the key pad.
- Touch Video call or Voice call or the key to place the call.

TIP! You can search by group by touching the Contacts tab on the top of the screen and selecting Groups. This will bring up a list of all your groups.

From the main menu

- 1 Touch : touch Contacts on the Communication tab.
- 2 Touch and Search.

Adding a new contact

1 From the home screen touch then touch New contact button



2 Choose whether to save the contact to Handset or USIM.



3 If you want to add a picture to each contact, touch Add picture. 03

4 Enter the first and last name of your new contact. You do not have to enter both, but you must enter at least one

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- 5 Enter up to five different numbers and assign a type to each of them, choosing between Mobile, Home, Office, Pager, Fax, VT and General
- 6 Add up to 2 email addresses.
- 7 Assign the contact to one or more groups, choosing between No group, Family, Friends, Colleagues, School or VIP.

Contacts

- 8 You can also add a Ringtone, Homepage, Home address, Company name, Job title, Company address, Birthday, Anniversary and a Memo.
- 9 Touch To save the contact.

TIP! You can create customised groups for your contacts, see **Creating a group**.

Creating a group

- 1 From the home screen then touch : and touch Contacts in the Communication tab.
- 2 Touch **Groups** and select new group.
- **3** Enter a name for the new group.
- 4 Touch to save the group.

NOTE: If you delete a group, the contacts assigned to that group will not be lost. They will remain in your contacts.

TIP! You can edit an existing group by touching the selected group once. Choose to View members, Edit the group, Send message, Send businesscard or Delete group.

Changing your contact settings

You can adapt your contact settings to suit your own preferences.

Access point - Choose your Internet access point.

Advanced settings - Choose whether to use the advanced settings.

Message folders

You will recognise the folder structure in your KM900, which is fairly self-explanatory. If you set up an email account, you can have folders for each account.

Inbox - All messages you receive are stored in your inbox. From here you can view them and delete them, amongst other functions.

Sent - Messages you send are stored in this folder.

Outbox - This is a temporary storage folder while messages are being sent.

Drafts - If you don't finish writing a message, you can save what you've done in this folder.

Threaded box - Messages (SMS) exchanged with another party via messenger. You can save the image and message (SMS) simultaneously. **My Folders** - Create folders to store your messages.

Using templates

Create templates for the SMS and MMS messages you send most often. There are already some templates on the phone, which you can edit.

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

Getting to know the viewfinder



TIP! You can close all the shortcut options to give a clearer viewfinder screen. Just touch the centre of the viewfinder once. To recall the options, touch the screen again.

The default flash setting is auto, but there are other options.

- 1 Select from the left side of the viewfinder to enter the flash sub-menu.
- 2 There are three flash options: Auto - Your camera will assess the light available for a good picture and use the flash as necessary.

Always off - The camera will never flash. This is useful if you want to save battery power.

Always on - The camera will always flash.

- 3 When you touch the option you want, the flash menu will automatically close, allowing you to take a picture immediately.
- 4 The flash status icon in the viewfinder will change based on the new flash mode.

Adjusting the exposure

The exposure defines the control of the amount of sunlight entering the image. A low contrast image will appear darker, whereas a high contrast image will appear much brighter.

- 1 Touch .
- 2 Slide the contrast indicator along the bar, towards for a lower exposure, darker image or towards for a higher exposure, brighter image.

Using the advanced settings

From the viewfinder, touch to open all advanced settings options. You can change the camera setting by scrolling the wheel. After selecting the option, touch the **OK** button.

Switch to - For self portraits, switch to the LG KM900's inner camera. You can also switch between camera mode and video camera mode.

Image size - Change the photo size to save memory space or to take a picture of the correct size for a contact. See **Changing the image size** on page 58.

Colour Effect - Choose a colour tone to use on your new photo. See **Choosing a colour effect** on page 58.

ISO - The ISO rating determines the sensitivity of the camera's light sensor. The higher the ISO, the more sensitive the camera will be. This is useful in darker conditions when you can't use the flash. Select the ISO value from **Auto**, **100**, **200**, **400** and **800**.

Image quality - Choose between Super fine, Fine and Normal. The finer the quality the sharper the photo. However, the file size will increase as a result, which means you'll be able to store fewer photos in your memory.

Hide icons - Choose the icons of camera settings manually or automatically.

Image stabilization - Enables you to take a photo without the camera wobbling or shaking.

Auto focus - Select the way the camera will focus. Choose between Spot, Manual and Face tracking.

Shutter sound - Select one of the four shutter sounds

Grid view - Choose between Off. 2X2 grid, 3X3 grid

Reset - Restore all the camera settings.

Geo-tagging - On/Off

TIP! When you exit the camera

all your settings will return to default, except image size and image quality. Any non-default settings vou require will need to be reset, for example colour tone and ISO. Check them before you shoot your next photo.

TIP! The settings menu is superimposed over the viewfinder, so when you change elements of the image colour or quality you'll be able to see the image change in preview behind the settings menu.



You can store multimedia files in your phone's memory so you have easy access to all your pictures, sounds, videos and games. You can also save your files to a memory card. The advantage of using a memory card is that you can free up space on your phone's memory. To access the Multimedia menu, touch select My Files from Multimedia Tab. You can open a list of folders storing all of your multimedia files.

Pictures

My images contains a list of pictures including default images pre-loaded onto your phone, images you have downloaded and those taken on your phone's camera.

My images options menu

The options which are available to you in **My images** depend on what type of image you have selected. All of the options will be available for pictures you have taken on the phone's camera, but only the **Use as, Print, Sort by** and **Memory manager** options are available for default images.

Sending a photo

- 1 To send a photo just select the picture you want.
- 2 Touch Send. Choose from Message, Email, Bluetooth.
- 3 If you choose Message or Email, your photo will be attached to a message and you can write and send the message as normal. If you choose Bluetooth, your phone will search for a device to send the picture to.

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Multimedia

You can choose images to use as a wallpaper contact picture start up or shut down image or your out going or incoming call image.

TV out - Choose **PAL** or **NTSC** for connecting your KM900 to a TV.

DivX VOD registration - This menu is for generating a DivX VOD registration code. Please visit http://vod.divx.com to register and for technical support.

Packet data conn. - Set the packet data connection. Chose between When available or When needed.

Browser setting - Edit your browser settings. The available options are Profiles, Appearance settings, Cache/Cookies, Security, Reset settings.

Streaming settings - Edit your streaming settings.

Java settings - View your certificates list or change your Java profile.

Your KM900 has three available memories: the phone itself, the USIM Card and an external memory card (which you may need to purchase separately).
