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## What is Agilent CytoGenomics?

Using Agilent CytoGenomics software is a rapid way for cytogenetics laboratories to set up, analyze and view CGH and CGH + SNP microarray data for researching cytogenetic changes in research samples.

On the next page is a diagram that shows the process underlying the Agilent CytoGenomics workflow (Figure 1). This automatic process takes a microarray image through Feature Extraction, and extracted data through filtering and DNA analysis, to produce aberration results whose calls can be added or suppressed and to generate a variety of reports, including editable Cyto Reports.







With Agilent CytoGenomics, the cytogenetics laboratory sets up and runs workflows fundamentally described in Figure 1 but specifically created to analyze its own samples and answer research questions.

To help the laboratory organize its work, Agilent has built tasks around three roles: Technician, Scientist and Administrator.

Role	Tasks Users Can Do with Agilent CytoGenomics
Technician	Run workflows, manage workflow jobs, view results, check out samples and add or suppress calls (no signoff capability)
Scientist	Technician tasks, plus set up samples, workflow components and workflows; sign off results; evaluate and chart results
Administrator	Everything! Technician and Scientist tasks, plus add users and roles, and manage the database

## **Learning Roles and Responsibilities**

This section assumes Agilent CytoGenomics has already been installed. If you are the Administrator for this system, see "If your role is to install the software and manage the system (Administrator)" on page 7.

Before you can understand your role and its responsibilities within Agilent CytoGenomics, you must start the program. How you start the program depends on its location.

#### To start the program

#### If an icon for the program is on the desktop

- 1 Click
- 2 In the Login Window enter your User Name and Password and click Ok.

This is usually the user name and password you use to log onto the computer or the corporate network. If you do not have or cannot remember one or both, please see your Administrator.

**3** If another message appears indicating a domain error, and your computer is part of a network, please see your Administrator.

If your computer is a local machine, click OK.

The main window for your role appears.

#### If there is no icon for the program on the desktop

- 1 Click Start.
- **2** If you see **Agilent CytoGenomics Edition X**, where X is the version number, double-click the name.

If you do not see the name in the list, click **All Programs > Agilent CytoGenomics Edition X**.

**3** Follow the instructions in step 2 of "If an icon for the program is on the desktop".

## If your role is to run analyses and review data (Technician)

#### Here's what you can do

- Run workflows with CGH or CGH + SNP samples to analyze for aberrations
- Display and manage workflow jobs
- View the graphic results and reports to assess if you need to re-run any sample
- Review results check out samples and add or suppress calls

The person given the role of Scientist has already set up workflows you will use to run the analyses. That person is also likely to check results in and out and add or suppress calls, even though you also have the capability.
