Basic Operation

LOW BATTERY ALERT

1. When the battery needs to be replaced:




- An alert tone sounds for eight seconds or until you press any button.
- Replace battery as shown.
 - One (1) AA battery is required. (1.5V, AA alkaline battery)
 - Turn off pager before replacing the battery. (Pager memory is maintained for a short period during replacement, but removing the battery for extended periods may cause the memory to return to initial settings.)*

NOTE:

 If you will not be using your pager for at least one month, remove the battery.

REPLACING BATTERY



- 1. Slide cover lock in direction of arrow (1).
- 2. Slide battery cover in direction of arrow (2).
- Remove by pulling up on the positive end of the battery (3).



TURNING ON PAGER

- 1. Press and hold [].
 - The pager vibrates or beeps and the backlight turns on.
 - Press any button to stop the alert, or the alert will stop after four seconds.
- The time and date are displayed (standby display).

TURNING OFF PAGER

From standby, press and hold [] until the display shows:

TURN PAGER OFF ? PLEASE PUSH SET-SW

Press ((set) to turn off the pager. Press any other button to return to standby. B A

RECEIVING MESSAGES

Personal messages are sent to your pager by an individual. Data service messages contain information sent from various agencies via your pager service provider. Examples of data service messages include news, weather, sports, etc.

- Leave your pager on to receive messages.
 - When receiving, your pager vibrates or beeps and the backlight turns on. Press any button to stop the alert.
 - The message is displayed.
 For example:

- The time and date shown indicates when the message was received.
- If an incoming page has no message, TONE ONLY or (end of message) is displayed.
- To return to standby, press [].

Note:

If an error occurs when receiving a message, individual letters may appear as checkered squares.

- From standby, press
 or
 ...
 - If unread personal messages are stored, an alert will sound (or vibrate) and the messages will be displayed. (Unread messages can also be displayed by pressing [] or [].)
 - If you have both personal and data service messages, the display shows:
 - PERSONAL MESSAGE DATA SERVICE
 - When the arrow points to PERSONAL MESSAGE, press ③ (You can select DATA SERVICE by pressing ② .)
 - The newest message will be displayed.

 The newest message is displayed (if you have only one type of message).

REVIEWING DATA SERVICE MESSAGES

- From standby, press
 or
 .
 - If unread personal messages are stored, an alert will sound (or vibrate) and the messages will be displayed.

 - If you have both personal and data service messages, the display shows:

→ PERSONAL MESSAGE DATA SERVICE

- Press ② to select DATA SERVICE.
- When the arrow points to DATA SERVICE, press . The newest message will be displayed.

OR

 The newest message is displayed (if you have only one type of message).

 If your pager does not have any messages, NO MESSAGE is displayed.

- Press and hold (a) to scroll through the entire message.
 - To scroll back through a message, press pressip within one second after pressing and holding .

OR

- Press
 to view the next older message.
- Press and hold
 <u>n</u> to view the first screen of each message. (To scroll back through the first screen of each message, press and hold
 <u>n</u>, then press
 <u>n</u>.)
- 3. After scrolling through all messages:

END OF DATA SERVICE

 To return to standby from each page, press [].

OR

 To delete all messages, press ∋. (See Deleting All Messages, page 13.)

LOCKING (SAVING) MESSAGES

When the memory in your pager is full, the oldest message is deleted when a new message is received. To avoid losing a message, you can lock up 25 personal and 4 data service messages.

- With the desired message displayed, press D.
 - The lock icon flashes and LOCK MESSAGE? is displayed:

- Y7 indicates the message remains locked for seven days. The counter decreases daily and unlocks the message after the last day.
- If LOCK FULL is displayed, it means the memory is full. Unlock a message before locking another one.

UNLOCKING MESSAGES

Locked messages must be unlocked before they can be deleted.

- Display the locked message and press .
 - The lock icon flashes and UNLOCK MESSAGE? is displayed;

Data service messages are updated regularly. You may set a marker to select which line displays across the top of your pager each time the data service message is updated.

- Display the desired data service message.
- 2. Press until the desired line is displayed across the top. For example:

Deny 89/56 MSunny *
Detr 90/70 Sunny
Hart 90/63 PSunny
Hono 86/74 PCloudy *

 Press Duntil the marker icon flashes and SET MARKER? is displayed. For example:

SET MARKER ?

- Press to set the marker.
 - Once a marker is set, data service message updates are displayed with the marked line at the top of the pager.

Note:

To remove a marker, set a marker at the beginning (time and date line) of the marked message.

DELETING ONE MESSAGE

- Display the desired message.
- Press D until the delete icon flashes and DELETE MESSAGE? is displayed. For example (personal message):

DELETE MESSAGE ? 4:55PM AUGO8 98 Bob will arrive at

3. Press • to delete the message and display the next older message.

OR

Press D to cancel and return to step 1.

OR

Press [] to cancel and return to standby.

 If the last message is deleted, END OF MESSAGE (END OF DATA SERVICE) is displayed.

DELETING ALL MESSAGES

- From standby, display a personal message. (Refer to Reviewing Personal Messages, page 5.)
- Press ② until you scroll through all personal messages. For example:

END OF MESSAGE USED MEMORY 30%

Press .

DELETE ALL MESSAGES? ARE YOU SURE?

 Press to delete all personal messages and return to standby.

OR

Press [] to cancel and return to standby.

Note:

Locked and data service messages are not deleted.



Advanced Operation

To access advanced operations, press \boxdot from the standby display. You may also scroll back through the features by pressing \varOmega after you have pressed \boxdot once.

SETTING ALERT TYPE

- - An arrow points to SET AUDIBLE (if your pager is currently set to vibrate) or SET SILENT (if your pager is currently set to beep). For example:



- Press to save and return to standby.
 - The alert icon displays (either m for vibrate or p for beep).

OR

From standby, press puntil the arrow points to SET VOLUME. For example:



- Press to display the current setting.
- Press to review available settings:
 - LOW VOLUME
 - MEDIUM VOLUME
 - HIGH VOLUME
 - ESCALATE VOLUME
- When the desired setting is displayed, press to save and return to standby.

OR

Press

to cancel and return to step 1.

OR

D

 From standby, press ⊕ until the arrow points to SET ALARM. For example:


SET AUDIBLE
SET VOLUME

SET ALARM
SET AUTO OFF/ON

- Press to display the current setting.
- Press to select the desired setting:
 ALARM ON
 - ALARM OFF
- When the arrow points to the desired setting, press (1) to save.
- If you selected ALARM OFF, the pager returns to standby.

OR

If you selected **ALARM ON**, the previous alarm time displays. The hour digits and AM or PM flash. For example:



Setting the alarm time:

- Press to set the hour.*
- 2 Press 2; the minutes flash.
- Press ?; the entire time flashes.
- Press to save and return to standby.

OR

Press 🗹 to return to step 0.

OR

Press \bigcirc to cancel and return to step 1 (on the previous page).

OR

Press [] to cancel and return to standby.

Note:

The alarm occurs only when the pager is at standby. The pager beeps or vibrates (depending on your current setting) for eight seconds, the backlight turns on, and **ALARM** is displayed. Press any button to stop the alarm.

Press and hold to change figures quickly.

SETTING AUTOMATIC OFF/ON

 From standby, press D until the arrow points to SET AUTO OFF/ON.
 For example:

SET AUDIBLE
SET VOLUME
SET ALARM
+ SET AUTO OFF/ON

- 2. Press ② to display the current setting.
- 3. Press 1 to select the desired setting:
 - OFF/ON TIMER ON OFF/ON TIMER OFF
- When the arrow points to the desired setting, press

 to save.
- If you selected OFF/ON TIMER OFF, the pager returns to standby.
 OR

If you selected OFF/ON TIMER ON, the previous OFF and ON times display; the OFF time hour flashes. For example:

@SET AUTO OFF/ON @

OFF ON 6:45PM

Setting the automatic off/on times:

- Press (•) to set the OFF time hour.*
- Press : the minutes flash.
- വ Press (1) to set the OFF time minutes.*
- Press ?: the ON time hour flashes.
- 0 Repeat steps 0 to 0 to set the ON time.
- O Press (to save and return to standby.

OR

Press To return to step 1.

OR

Press D to cancel and return to step 1 (on the previous page). OR

Press Tto cancel and return to standby.


Note:

If the OFF time and the ON time are set for the same time, the pager returns to step **0**.

Press and hold to change figures quickly.

Automatic Off Operation:

When the OFF time arrives, the pager turns off. The ON time displays. For example:



Automatic On Operation:

When the **ON** time arrives, the pager turns on. The **OFF** time displays. For example:

 For automatic ON to occur, the pager must be turned off using the automatic OFF feature.

SELECTING A CALL PATTERN

The call pattern controls the pattern of the selected beep pattern. (Please see the next page for more information on the beep pattern.)

 From standby, press puntil the arrow points to SET CALL PATTERN. For example:



- 2. Press .
 - The current setting flashes and a sample call pattern sounds (using the current beep pattern). For example:

- 3. Press 2 to review the available settings.
- When the desired setting flashes, press to save and return to standby.

 OR

UK

Press

to cancel and return to step 1.

OR

SELECTING A BEEP PATTERN

The beep pattern is the frequency pattern emitted by the pager during an audible alert.

From standby, press

until the arrow points to SET BEEP PATTERN. For example:



- 2. Press (1).
 - The current setting flashes and a sample beep pattern/tone sounds (using the currently selected call pattern). For example:

- Press 2 to review the available settings.
- When the desired setting flashes, press
 to save and return to standby.

OR

Press

to cancel and return to step 1.

OR



SETTING LONG PERIOD ALERT (LPA)

When this feature is set, a new page causes an intermittent alert (up to 12 hours) until you press any button on the pager. After 12 hours, the message will be stored as an unread message.

 From standby, press D until the arrow points to SET LPA ON (if LPA is currently off) or SET LPA OFF (if LPA is currently on). For example:



- Press
 to change and return to standby.
 - If you set SET LPA ON, the icon displays.

OR

SETTING SCROLL TYPE

 From standby, press puntil the arrow points to SET SCROLL. For example:



- Press to display the current setting.
 - Press 🗈 to select the desired setting:
 - LINE-BY-LINE
 - PAGE-BY-PAGE
- Press to select the desired setting:
 - SLOW SCROLL
 - MEDIUM SCROLL
 - FAST SCROLL
- When the arrow points to the desired setting, press to save and return to standby.
 - OR

Press to cancel and return to step 1.


OR

SETTING TIME/DATE

 From standby, press Duntil the arrow points to SET TIME. For example:



Press (*): the hour flashes.



- 3. Press @ to set the hour.*
- 4. Press 2; the minutes flash.
- 5. Press @ to set the minutes.*
- Press ♠: the month flashes.
- 7. Press @ to set the month.*
- 8. Press 🗈; the day flashes.
- Press to set the day.
- Press ; the year flashes.
- Press to set the year.*



- Press ♠; the time/date/year flash.
 - Press to save and return to standby.

OR

Press 🗈 to return to step 3.

OR

Press to cancel and return to step 1.

OR

Press [] to cancel and return to standby.

Note:

Your pager is capable of Time/Date settings ranging from the year 1997 to 2016.

* Press and hold (a) to change figures quickly.

SETTING THE DISPLAY'S CONTRAST

 From standby, press puntil the arrow points to SET CONTRAST. For example:



- 2. Press to display the current setting.
- Press

 to adjust the contrast setting level.
- When the desired contrast level displays, press to save and return to standby.

OR

Press \boxdot to cancel and return to step 1.

OR

SETTING DATA SERVICE ALERT

This feature allows you to set whether or not you will be alerted (vibration or beep) when data service messages are received and/or updated.

From standby, press
 □ until the arrow
 points to SET DATA SERVICE ALERT
 ON (if data service alert is currently off) or
 SET DATA SERVICE ALERT OFF (if data
 service alert is currently on). For example:



Press to change and return to standby. OR

TURNING PAGER ON/OFF:

ON: Press and hold [].

OFF: From standby, press and hold until TURN PAGER OFF? PLEASE PUSH SET-SW displays. Press (1).

RECEIVING MESSAGES:

Pager must be on to receive messages. Incoming messages display and an alert occurs.

REVIEWING MESSAGES:

From the standby display, press ① or ② . (If you need to select the message type, press ② to select, and ② to view first message.) Press ② to view entire message; press ② to view other messages. Press ③ to exit.

LOCKING/UNLOCKING MESSAGES:

Display message. Press 🗩 🗷 .

SETTING A MARKER:

Display data service message with desired line across top of display. Press ⊃ ⊙ .

DELETING ONE (1) MESSAGE:

Personal: Display message, press □ □ ◑. Data Service: Display message, press □ □ □ ◑.

From standby, press ⋽ . Press ⋽ or ঐ to scroll through features. When arrow points to desired feature, press ② . Press ঐ to view available settings. Press ② to save.
