
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Installation -

Connecting the AC adaptor to the charger



- USE ONLY WITH Panasonic AC ADAPTOR KX-TCA1 (Order No. KX-TCA1-G).
- The AC adaptor must remain connected at all times. (It is normal for the adaptor to feel warm during use.)

Charging the battery

Place the cordless handset on the charger and charge for **about 8 hours** before initial use. Make sure the handset faces forward as shown.

- The CHARGE indicator lights.
- If you charge the discharged battery, it will be charged quickly. In that case the handset may feel warm. This is normal.
- Recharge the battery when:
 - "Recharge" is displayed,
 - " " flashes on the display, or
 - the handset beeps intermittently while it is in use.


Handset battery information


After your Panasonic battery is fully charged:

Operation	Approx. battery life
While in use (TALK)	Up to about 8 hours
While not in use (Standby)	Up to about 4 days

• Clean the charge contacts of the handset and the charger with a soft, dry cloth once a month. Clean more often if the unit is subject to grease, dust or high humidity. Otherwise the battery may not charge properly.

Registering Cordless Handsets

Registration is necessary for cordless handsets. A handset will be assigned the number at registration. The handset number is used as the extension number (p. 4, 8). You can register up to 8 cordless handsets at the KX-TG4000B base unit.

Make sure that the base unit and cordless handset are in the standby mode. Registration must be completed within 1 minute.

Base unit: Press (FUNCTION).

- 2 Select "Registration" by pressing ∨ or ∧, and press ►.
- 3 Select "HS registration" by pressing ∨ or ∧, and press ►.
- 4 Cordless handset: Press FUNCTION.
- 5 Select "Registration" by pressing ∨ or ∧, and press ►.
- 6 Press ► to select "HS registration".

7 Base unit/Cordless handset: Wait until a beep sounds and until both of the displays show the assigned handset number. Press (EXIT).

• The handset number ([1]–[8]) is displayed in the standby mode.

If a PIN (Personal Identification Number) has been stored:

Follow steps 1 to 6, and enter the PIN. Press **ENTER**.

Making Calls

Four calls can be handled simultaneously on separate telephone lines by the base unit and 3 cordless handsets (or by 4 cordless handsets).

- Press TALK.
 - You can press a line button instead of pressing TALK.
- 2 Dial a phone number.
- **3** To hang up, press **TALK** or place the handset on the charger.
- To adjust the receiver volume, press \wedge or \checkmark while talking.

To dial after confirming the entered number:

Enter a phone number, and press (TALK).

• To redial a number from the redial list (contains the last 10 numbers dialed), press **(REDIAL)** until the desired number is displayed, and press **(TALK)**.

Answering Calls

Four calls can be handled simultaneously by the base unit and 3 cordless handsets (or by 4 cordless handsets).

Press (TALK).

- You can press the called line button instead of pressing **TALK**.
- You can also answer a call by pressing any dialing button (0) to (9), (*) or (#).

OR

If the handset is on the charger, just lift up.

What " **E**, **E**, **E**, **E**, **E**, **on the display mean:** Off (invisible): The line is free. On: The line is being used. **Flashing:** A call is on hold. The Automated Attendant System or Answering System is responding to a call. **Flashing quickly:** A call is being received.

• During a conversation, if two tones sound, an incoming call is being received on another line. To answer the second call while holding the first call, press **HOLD** and press the called line button. To return to the first call, press the line button.

Intercom –

Each number assigned to a handset at registration is the extension number (p. 3). The base unit extension number is 0.

Making intercom calls

- Press INTERCOM.
- 2 To page the base unit, enter 0.To page another handset, enter the extension number (1 to 8).
- **3** To end the intercom, press **TALK** or place the handset on the charger.
- To answer an intercom call, press TALK or lift the handset off the charger.

Transferring a Call -

- During a call, press (TRANSFER).
- 2 To page the base unit, enter (0).To page another handset, enter the extension number (1) to (8).
- 3 If required, wait for the paged party to answer, and you can announce the transfer. If not required, go to step 4.
- **4** To complete the transfer, press **TALK** or place the handset on the charger.

Storing Names and Numbers in the Directory -

You can store names and phone numbers in the directory. The cordless handset can store up to 50 items. All directory items are sorted by the first word in alphabetical order. Using the directory, you can make a call by selecting a name on the display.

Make sure that the cordless handset is in the standby mode.



- 2 Press ► to select "Save directory".
- 3 Enter a name, up to 16 characters, using the dialing buttons (see below).
 - To move the cursor, press ◀ or ►.

- **5** Enter a phone number, up to 22 digits.
- 6 Press ENTER.
 - To store other items, repeat from step 2.
- 7 Press EXIT.
- To exit the programming mode any time, press **EXIT**.

4 Press ENTER.

Selecting characters to enter names

The dialing buttons can be used to enter letters and symbols. Pressing each button selects a character as shown below.

 To enter another character using the same number key, press ► to move the cursor to the next space.

If you make a mistake while entering a name:

Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to move the cursor to the incorrect character. Press (CLEAR) to delete the character. Enter the correct character. To erase all characters, press and hold (CLEAR).

Dialing from the Directory

- Press \triangleleft or \blacktriangleright to enter the directory.
- **2** Press \checkmark or \land to find the desired item.

To search for a name by initial:

Press the dialing button for the first letter of the desired name until any name with the same initial is displayed. Press \checkmark until the name is displayed.

- 3 Press (TALK).
 - \bullet You can press a line button instead of pressing $\fbox{\tabular}{\mathsf{TALK}}.$

• In steps 1 and 2, you can leave the directory by pressing EXIT.

Erasing an Item in the Directory -

Make sure that the cordless handset is in the standby mode.

- **]** Press \blacktriangleleft or \blacktriangleright to enter the directory.
- **2** Press \checkmark or \land to find the directory item you want to erase.
 - To search for the item by initial, see above.
- 3 Press CLEAR).
- 4 Press ENTER, and press EXIT.

Caller ID Service -


This unit is compatible with a Caller ID service offered by your telephone company. After subscribing to a Caller ID service, the calling party's information will be displayed after the first ring.

The unit can record information of up to 30 different callers in the Caller List. The Caller List information is sorted from the most recent to the oldest call. When the 31st call is received, the oldest call is deleted.

How caller information is displayed when a call is received

The display shows the caller's name, number and the called line after the first ring.

• After you answer the call, the display will show the length of the call.



- When more than one line is receiving a call at the same time, each caller's information will be displayed alternately.
- Caller information cannot be displayed in the following cases:
 - If the caller dialed from an area which does not provide a Caller ID service, the display will show "Out of area".
 - If the caller has requested not to display his/her information, the display will show "Private caller".

Viewing the Caller List -

If you have received new calls, "Received calls" will be displayed in the standby mode. Caller List information includes the caller's name and phone number, and the time and date the call was received.

Make sure that the cordless handset is in the standby mode.

- Press \checkmark or \land to enter the list.
 - The number of new calls is displayed.
- **2** To search from the most recent call, press \checkmark . To search from the oldest call, press \land .
 - \bullet To scroll between callers, press \checkmark or \land .
- **3** To exit the list, press **EXIT**.
- If there is no name information for a caller, the display will only show the phone number.
- After viewing all of the new call entries, "Received calls" will disappear.

What " $\sqrt{}$ " means:

You have viewed a new call, answered the call or called back the caller.

If a caller calls more than once:

The number of times the same caller called is displayed (×2 to ×9). After checking, ×2 to ×9 will be replaced with " $\sqrt{}$ ".

Calling Back from the Caller List -

-] Press \checkmark or \land to enter the list.
- 2 Press ∨ or ∧ to find the desired caller.
- 3 Press TALK.
 - You can press a line button instead of pressing **TALK**.

Voice Mail System

The Voice Mail System allows you to receive and deliver voice messages using mailboxes. The unit accommodates one general delivery mailbox and a maximum of 8 personal mailboxes which are assigned to the registered cordless handsets. The mailbox numbers are the same as the handset numbers.

The Voice Mail System works fully with the Automated Attendant System, which routes incoming calls to a specified mailbox and allows a caller to leave a message. With the Answering System, all calls are routed to the general delivery mailbox.

Ex. The caller called 5 times.

You can use the Voice Mail System by accessing your mailbox. Each cordless handset user can only access his/her own mailbox. The general delivery mailbox is managed by the base unit user (operator). The cordless handset users can access this mailbox.

You can also access the Voice Mail System features remotely from a touch tone phone.

Setting the mailbox password

Assign a password to your mailbox to prevent unauthorized persons from accessing your mailbox and listening to the messages remotely from a touch tone phone. The preset password for each mailbox is a 4-digit number using the mailbox number. (Ex. "1111" for Mailbox 1, "2222" for Mailbox 2) You can stop unauthorized accesses to your personal mailbox from the cordless handset using this password. If required, turn the direct handset access mode OFF on your handset. Once you turn it OFF, no one can use the \bowtie (Voice Mail) button features and access the mailbox without entering the password. Your cordless handset comes from the factory set to ON. Make sure that the cordless handset is in the standby mode.


- 1. Press **FUNCTION**, and select "Voice mail" by pressing ∨ or ∧, and press ►.
- 2. Select "Set password" by pressing ▶.
- 3. Enter a password using a 4-digit number (0000-9999), and press **ENTER**.
- 4. To turn the direct handset access mode ON, select "On" by pressing ∨ or ∧. To turn the mode OFF, select "Off" by pressing ∨ or ∧.
- 5. Press ENTER, and press EXIT.

Automated Attendant System

The automated attendant answers incoming calls and then routes the callers to the base unit or the desired cordless handset.

The base unit plays the role of operator with the cordless handsets as the extensions. Callers can reach desired mailboxes using this system to leave messages.

Calling the automated attendant



Setting the handset answer mode

If you turn ON the answer mode of your handset, calls will be greeted with a greeting message (see on the right) and callers can leave messages in your mailbox. To take calls, leave this mode OFF (factory preset).

- While the handset is in the standby mode, press 🖂.
 - If the direct handset access mode is OFF (p. 8), enter the mailbox password and press (#).
 - If you have new messages, listen to all of them.
- 2 Press 5.
- **3** To select ON, press **1**. To select OFF, press **2**.
- 4 Press 🖂.

Recording a personal greeting message

If the handset answer mode is ON, callers will hear a pre-recorded personal greeting message. You can also record your own greeting message of up to 2 minutes.

- While the handset is in the standby mode, press 🖂.
 - If the direct handset access mode is OFF (p. 8), enter the mailbox password and press (#).
 - If you have new messages, listen to all of them.
- 2 Press 3.
- **3** Press **1**.
- **4** After the tone, talk clearly. To end, press **1**.
- **5** Press **2**, and press **\square**.

Listening to Messages

If "Dice mail" is shown on your handset display, new messages have been received in your mailbox. During playback "Displayed.

Listening to new messages

- While the handset is in the standby mode, press ⋈.
 - If the direct handset access mode is OFF (p. 8), enter the mailbox password and press (#).
 - New messages are played.
- 2 After listening to all new messages;

To listen to all messages, press 1.

To listen to messages in the general delivery mailbox, press 4.

To end the operation, press

During playback:

To adjust the handset volume, press
A or V.

To transfer a message to other mailboxes:

While the message you want to transfer is being played or before the start of the next message, press (7). Enter the destination mailbox numbers using the corresponding dialing buttons ((0), (1) to (8), and press (#).

To erase a message:

While the message you want to erase is being played or before the start of the next message, press (3) or **CLEAR**.

Delivering Your Own Message

You can send an identical message of up to 3 minutes, to several mailboxes.


- While the handset is in the standby mode, press ⊠.
 - If the direct handset access mode is OFF (p. 8), enter the mailbox password and press (#).
 - If you have new messages, listen to all of them.
- 2 Press 2.
- Enter the destination mailbox numbers using the corresponding dialing buttons (0, 1 to 8).

- **4** Press **#**.
- **5** After the tone, talk clearly. To end recording, press **1**.
- 6 Press 2), and press 🖂.

Remote Operation from a Touch Tone Phone —

You can access the Voice Mail System from any touch tone phone if the Automated Attendant System or the Answering System is on for any of lines. You can listen to recorded messages in your mailbox and the general delivery mailbox. When you access your mailbox, you are required to enter the mailbox password (p. 8).

How to access the Voice Mail System



- To end the remote operation, press (*) and hang up.
- After each message playback, you can select options by following the voice menu (guidance). After all new messages have been played, you will hear a different menu.
- Press buttons firmly.

Wall Mounting


Wall The charger can be wall Template mounted. Screws Install screws using the wall template on the right. 3 cm To Power Connect the AC adaptor. (1³/16["]) Outlet Mount the charger, then slide it down.

Using an Optional Headset -

Plugging an optional headset into the cordless handset allows a hands-free phone conversation. Please use only the Panasonic KX-TCA88 headset. To order, call the accessories telephone number on page 1.

Connecting the headset to the cordless handset

Open the headset jack cover, and connect the headset to the headset jack as shown.



When the headset is connected, make sure to use the headset to talk with the caller. If vou want to have a normal cordless phone conversation, disconnect the headset.

Canceling Handset Registration

Make sure that the base unit and cordless handset are in the standby mode.

Base unit:

- 1. Press **FUNCTION**.
- 2. Select "Registration" by pressing \checkmark or \land , and press \blacktriangleright .
- 3. Select "Deregistration" by pressing \checkmark or \land , and press \blacktriangleright .
- 4. Press ► or ◄ to move the cursor to the handset number to be canceled.
- 5. Press **ENTER**.
- Press (CLEAR), and press (EXIT).


Cordless handset:

- 1. Press **FUNCTION**.
- 2. Select "Registration" by pressing \checkmark or \land , and press \triangleright .
- 3. Select "Deregistration" by pressing \lor or \land , and press \triangleright .
- 4. Press (CLEAR), and press (EXIT).
 - [-] is displayed.

Using the Belt Clip

You can hang the cordless handset on your belt or pocket using the belt clip.

Battery Replacement

If "Recharge" is displayed and/or " T flashes on the display after being fully charged, replace the battery with a new Panasonic HHR-P506 (PQHHR150AA21) battery. To order, call the accessories telephone number on page 1.

- Remove the cover by sliding while pressing the arrow.
- 2 Replace the battery, and close the cover. Be sure to charge the new battery for about 8 hours.
- After replacing the battery or re-connecting the battery plug, be sure to place the handset on the charger until a confirmation tone sounds or the battery strength prompt displays.
- The handset battery is a Nickel-Metal Hydride battery. You cannot recycle this battery.
