


Safety Precautions

This video recorder is equipped with recording functions for both conventional **VHS** and **SVHS** systems to enable users to select either mode. An **SVHS** cassette recorded in the **SVHS** mode cannot be played back with conventional **VHS** VCRs.

Important Safeguards and Precautions

FOR YOUR SAFETY, READ AND RETAIN ALL SAFETY AND OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS. HEED ALL WARNINGS IN THE MANUAL AND ON THE UNIT

INSTALLATION

1 POWER SOURCE CAUTION

Operate only from a power source indicated on the unit or in this manual. If necessary, have your Electric Utility Service Company or Video Products Dealer verify the power source in your home.

2 POLARIZED OR GROUNDING PLUG

As a safety feature, this Video product comes with either a polarized power cord plug (one blade is wider than the other), or a three-wire grounding type plug.

POLARIZED PLUG CAUTION:

This plug will only fit into an outlet one way. If you cannot fully insert the plug, try reversing it. If it still will not fit, have an electrician install the proper wall outlet. Do not defeat the safety feature by tampering with the plug.

GROUNDING PLUG CAUTION:

This plug will only fit into a three-hole grounding outlet. If necessary, have an electrician install the proper outlet. Do not defeat the safety feature by tampering with the plug.

3 POWER CORD

Make sure power cords are routed so that they are not likely to have anything rest on them, roll over them, or be in the way of walking traffic. If an extension cord is used, make sure it also has either a polarized or grounded plug and that the cords can be securely connected. Frayed cords, damaged plugs, and damaged or cracked wire insulation are hazardous and should be replaced by a qualified service technician. Overloaded outlets and extension cords are fire hazards and should be avoided.

4 DO NOT BLOCK VENTILATION HOLES

Ventilation openings in the cabinet release heat generated during operation. If they are blocked, heat build-up inside the unit can cause failures that may result in a fire hazard or heat damage to cassettes. For protection, follow these rules:

- Never cover ventilation slots or the unit while in use, or operate the unit when placed on a bed, sofa, rug, or other soft surface.
- Avoid built-in installation, such as a book case or rack, unless proper ventilation is provided.

5 AVOID EXTREMELY HOT LOCATIONS OR SUDDEN TEMPERATURE CHANGES

Do not place the unit over or near any kind of heater or regulator, in direct sunlight, inside a closed vehicle, etc.. Do not move the unit suddenly between areas of extreme temperature variation. If the unit is suddenly moved from a cold place to a warm place, moisture may condense in the unit and on the tape.

6 TO AVOID PERSONAL INJURY


- Do not place unsecured equipment on a sloping surface.
- Support for the unit should be firm, level, and adequately strong.
- An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.
- Carefully follow all operating instructions and use the manufacturer's recommended accessories when operating this unit or connecting it to any other equipment.



OUTDOOR ANTENNA INSTALLATION

1 SAFE ANTENNA AND CABLE CONNECTION

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the equipment, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against built up static charges and voltage surges. Section 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70 (in Canada, part 1 of the Canadian Electrical Code) provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for the grounding electrode.



2 KEEP ANTENNA CLEAR OF HIGH VOLTAGE POWER LINES OR CIRCUITS

An outside antenna system should be located well away from power lines, electric light or power circuits and where it will never come into contact with these power sources if it should happen to fall. When installing an outside antenna, extreme care should be taken to avoid touching power lines, circuits or other power sources as this could be fatal. Because of the hazards involved, antenna installation should be left to a professional.

USING THE VIDEO UNIT

If the unit has been in storage or moved to a new location, refer first to the INSTALLATION section of these safeguards.

1 KEEP THIS VIDEO UNIT AWAY FROM WATER OR MOISTURE OF ANY KIND.

2 IF EQUIPMENT IS EXPOSED TO RAIN, MOISTURE, OR STRONG IMPACT, unplug the unit and have it inspected by a qualified service technician before use.

3 DURING AN ELECTRICAL STORM

During a lightning storm, whether indoors or outdoors, or before leaving the unit unused for extended periods of time, disconnect all equipment from the power source as well as the antenna and cable system.

4 WHEN THE UNIT IS PLUGGED IN

- Never expose the unit to rain or water. DO NOT OPERATE if liquid has been spilled into the unit. Immediately unplug the unit, and have it inspected by a service technician. Fire and shock hazards can result from electrical shorts caused by liquid contact inside.
- Never drop or push any object through openings in the unit. Some internal parts carry hazardous voltages and contact can cause electric shock or fire hazard.
- Avoid placing the unit directly above or below your TV set as this may cause electrical interference. Keep all magnets away from electronic equipment.

5 USING ACCESSORIES

Use only accessories recommended by the manufacturer to avoid risk of fire, shock, or other hazards.

6 CLEANING THE UNIT

Unplug the unit. Then, use a clean, dry, chemically untreated cloth to gently remove dust or debris. DO NOT USE cleaning fluids, aerosols, or forced air that could over-spray, or seep into the unit and cause electrical shock. Any substance such as wax, adhesive tape, etc. may mar the cabinet surface. Exposure to greasy, humid, or dusty areas may adversely affect internal parts.

SERVICE

1 DO NOT SERVICE THIS PRODUCT YOURSELF

If, after carefully following the detailed operating instructions, this Video product does not operate properly, do not attempt to open or remove covers, or make any adjustments not described in the manual. Unplug the unit and contact a qualified service technician.

2 IF REPLACEMENT PARTS ARE REQUIRED

Make sure the service technician uses only parts specified by the manufacturer, or those having the same safety characteristics as the original parts. The use of unauthorized substitutes may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards.

3 HAVE THE SERVICE TECHNICIAN PERFORM A SAFETY CHECK



Loading the Batteries


1 Lift off the lid after pressing in and up on the latch with your thumb nail or other narrow object.



2 Install three batteries as indicated inside the Battery Compartment.



3 Fit the lid's hinge piece into the indent on the case, and snap the lid into place.

VCR and Cassette Information

Erase Protection (Record Tab)

Cassettes have a record tab to ensure that recordings are not accidentally erased.

To prevent accidental erasure, break off the tab with a screwdriver.



To record again, cover the hole with cellophane tape.



Reset all VCR Memory Functions

Use when moving the VCR to a new location, or if a mistake was made in the One Time VCR Setup section.

- Make sure a tape is not inserted in the VCR.
- 1) Turn VCR Power on.
 - 2) Push and hold both PLAY and Rewind buttons on the VCR for more than 5 seconds.
 - The power will shut off.
 - 3) Perform the One Time VCR Setup section on page 14.

Build-in Head Cleaner

A clean video head helps produce a clear picture. So, we have equipped your VCR with a built-in, non chemical head cleaning system that helps prevent clogging of the video heads. Cleaning is performed each time you load or unload a video cassette.

Note: This feature is preventative only. If your video heads are seriously clogged, consider the use of a chemical nonabrasive head cleaning kit or take your VCR to a Service Center.

While your VCR will not normally require head cleaning, however the heads may become clogged when playing an old or damaged tape. If the image on your screen resembles the illustration on the left or the screen becomes solid blue when playing back a pre-recorded signal on the tape, the heads probably require cleaning.

Cleaning the Heads

It is recommended that head cleaning be performed by a qualified service technician. Please contact your nearest Panasonic Service Center. An alternate solution is to obtain a head cleaning cassette. Be sure to follow the cleaning instructions carefully. Excessive use of a cleaning cassette could shorten head life. Use this cassette only when symptoms occur.




Case 1: Twin Lead Cable Only










Case 3: Double Screw Type Terminal



Audio/Video Connections

If your TV has AUDIO IN and VIDEO IN terminals, you can connect your VCR to them to receive a higher quality picture and sound. The antenna-VCR and VCR-TV connection is as shown.


- 1 Connect the VIDEO OUT terminal on the VCR to the VIDEO IN terminal of your TV.
- 2 Connect the "L" and "R" AUDIO OUT terminals on the VCR to the "L" and "R" AUDIO IN terminals of your TV.
- 3 Set the VIDEO/TV selector of your TV (Monitor/Receiver) to "VIDEO."

NOTE: To use your TV as a VCR monitor, set the VIDEO/TV selector on the TV (Monitor/Receiver) to "VIDEO."

Stereo Amplifier Connections

When you connect your VCR to a Stereo Component System, you can view the picture from the VCR while enjoying stereo from your audio system.




Note to CATV system installer:







One Time VCR Setup

The setup on pages 14 through 16 is vital for proper VCR operation. Please read the instructions carefully and in the order presented.

NOTE: These first two pages contain reference material needed for setup on pages 14 ~16. Please look over the information before you begin setup procedure.

Setup Overview

You will be performing the following tasks:

- Telling the VCR what kind of equipment you are using to receive channels and how it is connected.
- Entering pertinent cable box or DSS receiver information if used.
- Entering a local PBS channel so that the VCR can receive auto clock set data. (Not available in all areas.)
- Placing channels in memory and setting the clock.









ONE TIME SETUP IMPORTANT NOTES:

- For detailed DSS receiver connection instruction, please see your DSS operating manual.
- The DSS receiver must be turned off to view programs from the cable box or antenna.
- If you use a DSS receiver, it must be turned off for auto clock set.
- If your cable box is not remote controllable, it must be tuned to your PBS channel.
- If you use Audio/Video Jack connection between the VCR and cable box or DSS receiver, you must also connect the RF coaxial cable in order to use the auto clock set and channel auto set features.



Positioning Your Cable Box or DSS Receiver

If your cable box or DSS receiver is remote controllable, place it on or near the VCR as shown in the example below. The VCR transmits an infrared signal from two locations. Be sure not to cover the transmitter windows.






S-VHS tape playback is superior to VHS, even when using a conventional TV. And, your S-VHS VCR can also play back VHS format tapes.


S-VHS and VHS Tapes

Both Super-VHS and VHS recordings can be made on an S-VHS tape. Tapes recorded in VHS may be played back on either an S-VHS or VHS type VCR. Tapes recorded in S-VHS cannot be played back on a conventional VHS VCR.

- When a VHS recorded tape is played back on your S-VHS VCR, the VHS mode is automatically selected.
- Playback and Recording operations are described on pages 19 and 20.
- When making an S-VHS recording, SP or SLP tape speed must be used.



Compatibility



When the S-VHS Selector switch is set to on, the recording mode is automatically set according to the type of cassette tape used, S-VHS or VHS. When the S-VHS Selector switch is set to off, recording is done in the normal VHS mode, regardless of the type of cassette tape inserted. Use the off position when recording on an S-VHS tape in VHS mode to be played back on a VHS VCR.

- A conventional VCR will not be able to play back your S-VHS recordings. To make recordings that are compatible with conventional VHS VCR's, use your S-VHS VCR with the S-VHS Selector switch set to "OFF".




Operaciones básicas para la reproducción



Introducir una cinta

- La videogradora se enciende automáticamente.



Esta indicación aparece en la pantalla multifuncional.



Oprimir PLAY para comenzar a reproducir.

- Si la cinta no tiene la lengüeta para evitar borrado la videogradora comienza a reproducir automáticamente.


(Videogradora o Control Remoto)



Oprimir REW o FF para localizar rápidamente una escena.


- La velocidad de búsqueda en el modo SP es a 9 veces más rápida que la velocidad normal y en el modo SLP es a 27 veces más rápida.
- Durante la búsqueda aparece alguna barras de ruido.

(Videogradora o Control Remoto)



Oprimir STOP para parar la reproducción.

(Videogradora o Control Remoto)




Oprimir EJECT para expulsar la cinta.

- Este botón se encuentra solamente en la videogradora.


Operaciones básicas para la grabación

1 Introducir una cinta con la lengüeta.




- La videograbadora se enciende automáticamente.

2 Oprimir VCR CH ▲/▼ para elegir el canal.



- U oprimir CHANNEL ▲/▼ en la videograbadora.
- Para grabar desde una fuente externa, oprimir VCR CH ▲/▼ para elegir LINEA1 ou LINEA2.

3 Oprimir SPEED para cambiar la velocidad de la cinta.



- SP = Reproducción estándar,
- LP = Larga duración,
- SLP = Superlarga duración.

4 Oprimir REC/TIME con el control remoto para empezar a grabar.




- U oprimir PLAY y REC/TIME en la videograbadora.

Grabación de un toque (OTR)


La videograbadora termina la grabación a una hora programada.

Oprima sucesivamente REC/TIME para fijar el tiempo de la grabación. Cada presión cambiará la hora de parada como demuestra al siguiente.



- La indicación TIMER aparece en la pantalla multifuncional.

5 Oprimir STOP para parar la grabación.




- U oprimir STOP en la videograbadora.

- Si mantiene oprimiendo el botón de VCR CH ▲/▼ aumentará la velocidad del cambio del canal.
- Oprimir PAUSE para hacer una pausa en la grabación en progreso.



Programación fácil para la grabación con temporizador

1 Oprimir PROG para que aparezca la pantalla de la programación.




- Si ya existe una programación, elija usando la rueda un número sin programación.

2 Girar y oprimir la rueda para elegir y fijar la fecha.




Grabación diaria y semanal

Si ud. desea programar una grabación diaria (lunes a viernes), elija DAILY (Diario) en vez de la fecha en el paso 2. Si desea una grabación semanal, elija WEEKLY MAN (Semanal Lun), TUE (Mar), etc.



3 Girar y oprimir la rueda para elegir y fijar las fijaciones que sobran.





Fijaciones:

- Hora de inicio
- Hora de parada
- Canal o LINEA para una fuente externa.
- Velocidad de la cinta (SP, LP, SLP).

Para hacer correcciones

Oprimir la rueda sucesivamente para avanzar u oprimir CLEAR para retroceder hasta el paso que desea corregir.

4 Oprimir PROG para terminar la programación.




- Si desea hacer más programaciones, elija un número de programación en blanco con la rueda y repita los pasos 2 y 3.

5 Oprimir PROG para salir desde este modo.



6 Oprimir POWER y apague el aparato para la grabación con temporizador.



Pantalla multifuncional



- Si la fuente de la grabación es una caja de TV por cable, asegúrese de que la caja de TV por cable esté encendida y esté sintonizado al canal que desea grabar.
