

# Addendum For **MapCreate 6** Important Additional Information

Since the manual was written for MapCreate 6, some changes and new features have been added to the program. These additions are now available in MapCreate 6.1, and include:

#### Map Build Changes

• You can now generate a quick estimate of the final file size of your custom map. The new Estimator button will save you time and help you plan and organize your custom maps and data.

#### **File Saving Changes**

- MapCreate 6.1 automatically finds your connected MMC card reader and by default will save your custom maps and GPS data directly to your MMC card.
- Some other changes and fixes affect the way you load and save older custom GPS data files, as well as the way MapCreate saves untitled map border files.
- There is an important note if you ever need to format your MMC card.

#### NOTE:

Due to differences in operating systems and personal settings, sample screen shots appearing in this addendum or your product's manual may not be identical to your screen's display.

MapCreate 6.1 toolbar with new Estimate Custom Map Size button.

The Estimate Custom Map Size button is a new feature in MapCreate 6.1. As the name suggests, this feature calculates an estimate of the

final file size of your custom map based on the current map borders.

Estimating the map size is faster than a full map build. With this feature you can test several different map borders to optimize the space available on your MMC cards. Now you can more easily include as much information as possible in the space you have. (See *Important Notes About File Size* on page 5 of your manual).



When the estimator finishes, a dialogue box will reveal your custom map file size.

Using this command is simple. When you have your map borders in place, click the Estimate Custom Map Size button. (See the manual for instructions on creating map borders.) The program will take a moment to extract some necessary information. MapCreate will then display an estimated file size based on the current map borders. (For information on saving a custom map, see page 33 of your manual.)

# **File Saving Changes**

## **Default Save to MMC Card Reader**

When saving custom map files and GPS Data Files, MapCreate will now find your connected MMC card reader and default to that drive. (MapCreate 6.0 saved to your hard drive by default.)

This change affects the instructions for saving Map Border Files, Custom Map Files, and GPS Data Files (pages 33, 35 and 43 of your manual). Instead of the "data" sub-folder located within the MapCreate folder on your hard drive, these files now appear directly on the MMC card, if you follow the directions provided.

Saving directly to your MMC card will often save you time when preparing your GPS unit for a trip into the field, but sometimes you will want to save your information in a more permanent location. For those times, you can still save files directly to your hard drive from MapCreate, or copy them from the card. This change affects only the default save location - you still have all the same options for changing the final save location.

### **Other Fixes:**

**Page 3: Map Border Files**. MapCreate 6.0 automatically saved untitled Map Border Files to your hard drive as "untitled.lmp" when you closed MapCreate without first saving the border file. You could not choose a name or location for this file. In MapCreate 6.1, the problem has been fixed. Choosing to save changes will now open a standard Save As window where you can choose the name and location of the map border file.

**Page 4: Old GPS Data Files (GDM or \*.low)**. Although MapCreate 6 is designed to load and read older GPS Data Files in the \*.low format, MapCreate 6.0 also allowed users to choose to save new files in the older format (though the program could not actually save them). This has been corrected. You can still open files in either format, but you can now only save GPS Data Files in the new \*.usr format.

**MMC Card Format**. If you ever have to format your MMC card, you should know that MapCreate, as well as Lowrance and Eagle GPS products, will only read cards that are FAT formatted. MMC cards formatted using FAT 32 or NTFS will not work with our products. (Although it was true for MapCreate 6.0 as well, this information does not appear in the manual.)

#### WARNING:

You should never format an MMC containing a Navionics chart. Formatting the MMC will permanently erase the chart from the card.

#### NOTE:

This addendum supplements the manual MapCreate 6, part number 988-0147-38. The following modified Quick Reference replaces the one on page 17 of the manual.

# Working With MapCreate A Quick Start Reference With Changes for MapCreate 6.1

If you're *really* in a hurry, and you have some computer experience, the following 10-step command summary may be all you need to get started. For more detailed explanations, read through the lessons in this section.

#### How to make and save a rectangle map

1. Start MapCreate by clicking the Windows **Start** button and choosing **MapCreate** from the menu.

2. Maneuver the Master Map so you can see the area you want to include in your map. Use the **PAN ARROW** buttons to move north, south, east or west. Use the Zoom-In and Zoom-Out (**Z-IN** or **Z-OUT**) buttons as needed to close in on or back away from the area you're viewing.

3. Click the **CREATE MAP BORDERS** button in the toolbar. Move the mouse pointer above and to the left of the desired area.

4. Click, hold down the mouse button and drag diagonally down and to the right until the desired area is enclosed with the green border box.

5. Release the mouse button.

6. Click the **Save Map Borders** button. In the Save As dialog box, type a *name* for your Map Border File, then click **Save**. (MapCreate saves the Map Border File to your MMC card or Secure Digital Card.)

7. With the Map Border File still open, click the **ESTIMATE CUSTOM MAP Size** button. After a moment it will tell you your map's file size. If your map file is too large for your card, redraw your custom map or turn off some Map Categories.

8. When your file is the right size, click the **CREATE CUSTOM MAP** button. When the map is built, click **OK** to save the file. In the Save As dialog box, type a *name* for your Custom Map File, then click **Save**. (The same name used for the Map Border File is automatically entered. If you want to use the same name, just click **Save**.)

9. After the program has saved the map, close MapCreate.

10. Follow the instructions in your GPS manual for loading the MMC into your unit.

**NOTE:** The Map Border File that you created can now be deleted or archived by copying it to the "data" sub-folder located in the MapCreate folder on your hard drive.
