



1 Getting started


Attaching the strap


- 1 Thread the short end of the strap through the Strap strap eyelet evelet
- **2** Thread the long end of the strap through the loop that has already gone through the evelet.
- **3** Pull the strap tight, making sure that it is securely fastened and does not come loose.

Loading the batteries




- **2** Slide the battery compartment cover in the direction of A (the direction indicated by the mark on the cover), and lift it up in the direction of (B).
- **3** Insert the batteries, making sure that they are correctly oriented as shown in the illustration.

Recording movies

- 1 Press (a), with the lens barrier open. The top menu in the shooting mode is displayed.
- 2 Press (to select DRIVE.
- 3 Press O O to select $\overset{O}{\rightarrowtail}$, then press
- Record the movie while observing your subject on the monitor Press the shutter button fully to start recording. Press the shutter button fully again to stop

Playing back movies

- Press i with the lens barrier closed. The monitor turns on
- **2** Press $\bigotimes \bigotimes$ to display the desired picture with a \bigotimes indicator, then

The top menu is displayed.


- **3** Press (a) to select MOVIE PLAYBACK. The movie is played back after the orange lamp on the right of the viewfinder blinks and the movie data is downloaded to the camera. When the movie reaches the end, the display returns automatically to the beginning of the movie
- 4 Press , to display the MOVIE PLAYBACK menu. Then select the desired operation and press , Plays back the entire movie again. FRAME BY FRAME: Plays back the movie

4 Erasing pictures


Single-frame erase 1 Press (i) with the lens barrier closed. The monitor turns on **2** Press (a) (c) (a) (b) to select the picture you want to erase. 3 Press 🗐 . The top menu is displayed **4** Press ⊚ to select [™] ERASE. INFO MODE MENU) ERASE **5** Press (a) (c) to select YES, then ERASE press 🔍 The picture is erased and the menu is closed. YES SELECT 🔿 🖡 GO+ OK Erasure is not possible if the picture you want to erase is protected or a write-protect seal is attached to the card. Before erasing, unprotect the picture or remove the write-protect seal from the card. Once erased, pictures cannot be restored. Check each picture before erasing to avoid accidentally erasing pictures you want to keep.




5 Protecting pictures (Protect)

You are recommended to protect important pictures to avoid accidentally erasing them.
Press (a) with the lens barrier closed. The monitor turns on.
2 Press \textcircled{O} \textcircled{O} \textcircled{O} \textcircled{O} to select the picture you want to protect.
3 Press (a), then press (b). The mode menu is displayed.
4 Press \textcircled{O} \textcircled{O} to select the PLAY tab, then press \textcircled{O} .
5 Press (a) (b) to select Om, then press (b).
6 Press ② ③ to select ON. The selected picture is protected. To close the menu, press ⓐ _a twice.
Note • The On indicator is displayed at the top right of the protected picture. • Protection on each picture remains even when the camera is turned off.
 Protected pictures cannot be erased by the single-frame/all-frame erase function, but they can be all erased with the format function. Protection cannot be applied to pictures stored on a card with a write-protect seal.



Mode menus

Mode menu functions are categorized into 4 tabs. Use O to select a tab and display the respective functions.

	Adjusts the brightness of the image (Exposure compensation).
DIGITAL ZOOM	Extends the maximum optical zoom, making possible up to approximately 5x zoom shooting with the digital zoom function.
METERING	Selects the area of the image that will be used to determine exposure or image brightness from the two available settings: ESP or () (spot metering).
PICTURE tab	
WB	Sets the appropriate white balance according to the light source.
CARD tab	
CARD SETUP	Formats a card.
SETUP tab	
ALL RESET	Selects whether to save the current camera settings when you turn off the power.

REC VIEW	Selects whether to display pictures on the monitor while saving them.
