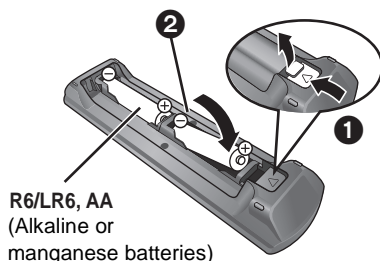

## Using the remote control

Insert so the poles (+ and -) match those in the remote control.



Point it at remote control signal sensor on this unit. (⇒ 5)

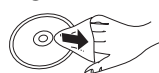

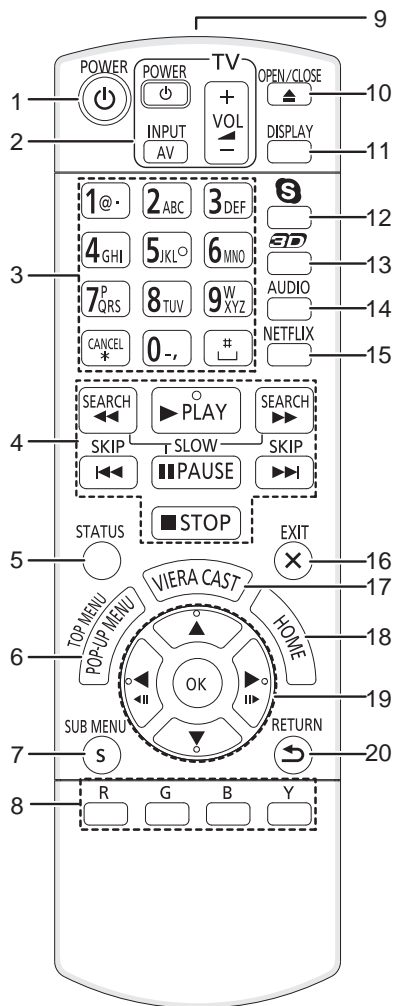

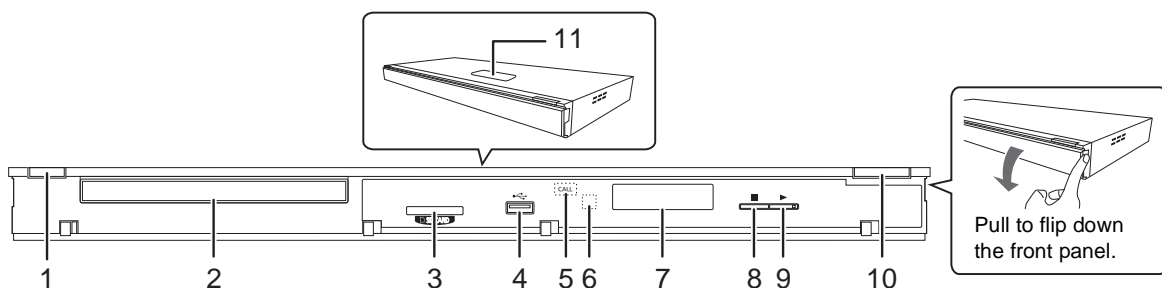

## ■ Finalize

DVD-R/RW/R DL, +R/+RW/+R DL and CD-R/RW recorded by a recorder, etc. needs to be finalized by the recorder to play on this unit. Please refer to the recorder's instructions.

## ■ BD-Video

- This unit supports high bit rate audio (Dolby Digital Plus, Dolby TrueHD, DTS-HD High Resolution Audio and DTS-HD Master Audio) adopted in BD-Video.
  - **BDT110** : If "Dolby D/Dolby D +/Dolby TrueHD" is set to "PCM", the maximum possible number of Dolby sound is 5.1ch PCM. (⇒ 30)

## ■ 3D

- 3D videos and 3D still pictures can be played back when this unit is connected to a 3D compatible TV using a High Speed HDMI Cable.

## ■ Music CD

## ■ SD card

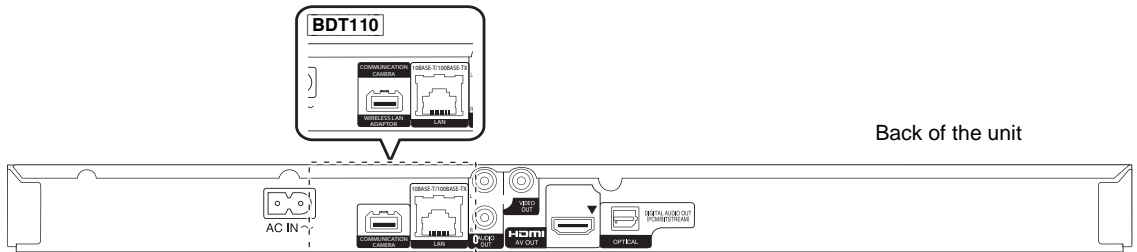

# STEP 1 : Connecting to a TV

- Do not place the unit on amplifiers/receivers or equipment that may become hot. The heat can damage the unit.
- Before making any connections we suggest you temporarily disconnect all the units from AC power.
- Do not connect video signals through a video recorder. Due to copy guard protection the picture may not be displayed properly.

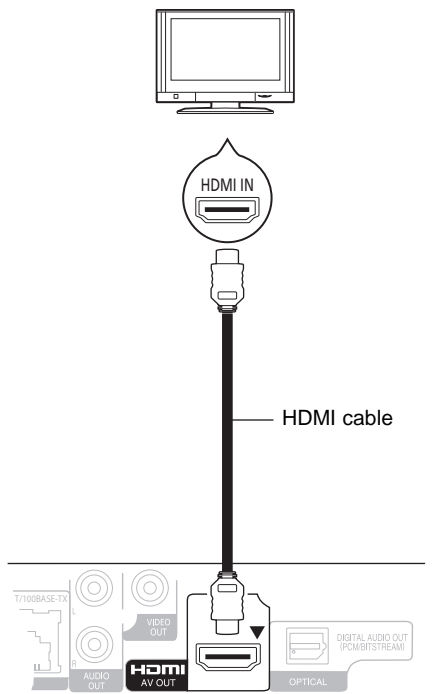
- Please use High Speed HDMI Cables that have the HDMI logo (as shown on the back cover). It is recommended that you use Panasonic's HDMI cable. When outputting 1080p signal, please use HDMI cables 5.0 meters (16.4 ft.) or less.

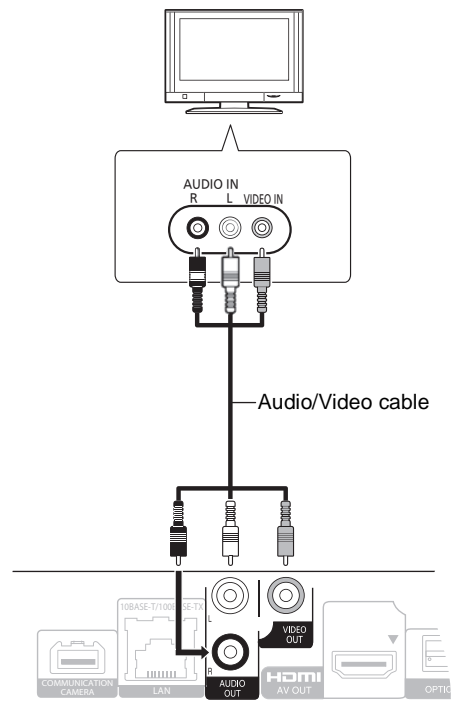

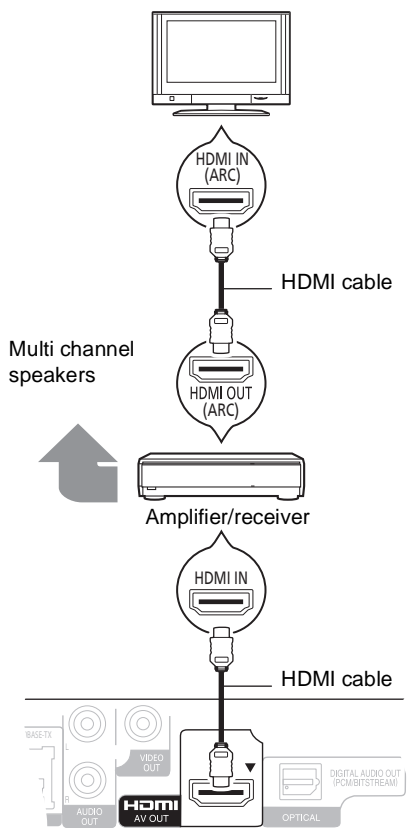

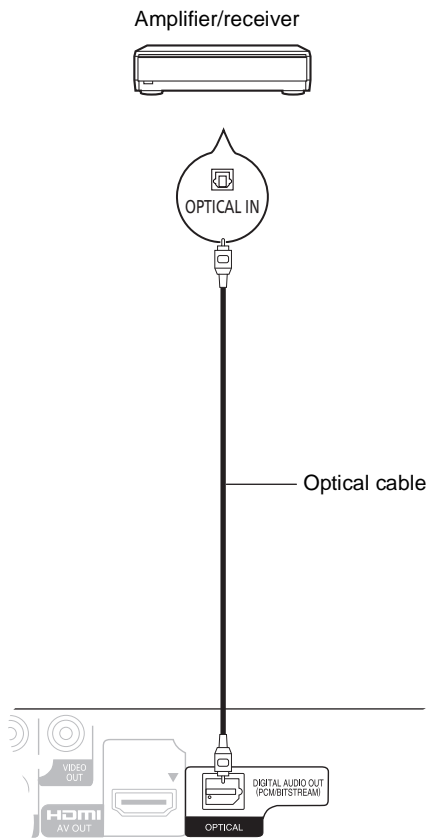
## ■ Via an HDMI AV OUT terminal

- It is possible to play back 3D videos and 3D still pictures when the connected TV and amplifier/receiver are 3D compatible.



- Set "HDMI Audio Output" to "On" (⇒ 32).
- Set "Digital Audio Output" depending on the connected amplifier/receiver (⇒ 30).
- The HDMI connection supports VIERA Link "HDAVI Control" (⇒ 26).
- When connecting to a non-3D compatible amplifier/receiver, connect this unit to a TV via HDMI AV OUT, then connect the TV and the amplifier/receiver, using HDMI cables for the respective connections.
  - Please note, however, that the audio can only be up to 5.1ch.
- When using the TV or amplifier/receiver that does not have the indication of "(ARC)" (non-ARC-compatible) on the HDMI terminal, in order to enjoy TV's sound by amplifier it is also required to connect the amplifier/receiver and TV using an optical digital cable.

- 5 Operate the DMC compatible equipment.**

**To exit from Media Renderer screen**

Press [HOME].



- Ensure that the router for your home network has adequate security system to prevent unauthorized access.
- Menu structure will be different depending on the equipment connected to this unit. Select the contents by repeating the operation.
- Depending on the contents and the connected equipment, playback may not be possible.
- Items displayed in gray on the display cannot be played back by this unit.

**Also when the connection or settings are changed, repeat this procedure.**

## Automatic input switching Power on link

When the following operations are performed, the television will automatically switch the input channel and display the corresponding action. When the television is off, the television will automatically turn on.

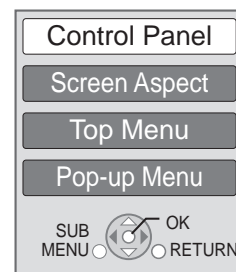

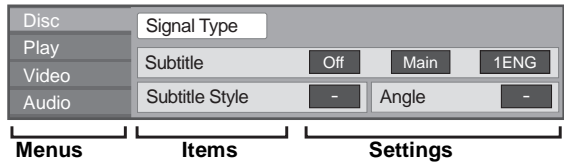

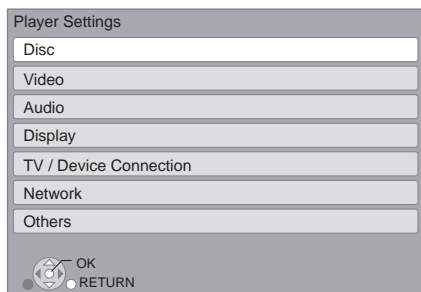

### Seamless Play

The chapter segments in playlists are played seamlessly.

- Select "On", when the picture freezes for a moment at the chapters segment in playlists.

### Black Level Control

Select lighter or darker for adjusting the black level control to the desired setting for picture enhancement.

## Audio

### Dynamic Range Compression

You can listen at low volumes but still hear dialog clearly. (Dolby Digital, Dolby Digital Plus and Dolby TrueHD only)

- "Auto" is effective only when playing Dolby TrueHD.

### Digital Audio Output

Press [OK] to show the following settings:

#### Dolby D/Dolby D +/Dolby TrueHD DTS/DTS-HD

Select the audio signal to output.

- Select "PCM", when the connected equipment cannot decode the respective audio format. This unit decodes the audio format and transmits to the connected equipment.
- Not making the proper settings may result in noise.

#### BD-Video Secondary Audio

Select whether to mix or not mix the primary audio and secondary audio (including the button click sound). (⇒ 19)

- If "Off" is selected, the unit outputs the primary audio only.

### PCM Down Conversion

Select how to output audio with a sampling frequency of 96 kHz for the PCM output from the DIGITAL AUDIO OUT.

- If "On" is selected, the signals that are converted to 48 kHz are output.
- If "Off" is selected, and the connected equipment does not support 96 kHz, the sound will not be output normally.
- Signals are converted to 48 kHz despite the settings in the following cases:
  - when the signals have a sampling frequency of 192 kHz

### Downmix

### Screen Saver Function

This is to prevent burn-in on the screen.

  - If there is no operation for 10 minutes or more, Direct Navigator screen switches to HOME menu automatically.
- While playing and pausing, etc., this function is not available.
- As for Music [CD-DA] or MP3, regardless of the setting, if there is no operation for a while, Direct Navigator screen switches to the other states automatically.

### Front Panel Display

<b>16:9</b>	Video is displayed as a 4:3 ratio image in the center of the screen.
<b>16:9 Full</b>	Video is displayed as a horizontally stretched 16:9 image.

### HDMI Connection

Press [OK] to show the following settings:

#### HDMI Resolution

The items supported by the connected devices are indicated on the screen as "\*". When any item without "\*" is selected, the images may be distorted.

- If "Auto" is selected, automatically selects the output resolution best suited to the connected television.

#### IP Address/DNS Settings

This is for checking the state of the network connection and setting the IP address and DNS-related.

Press [OK] to show the respective setting.

- “Connection Speed Setting” is enabled only when “Auto Detect Connection Speed” is turned “Off”.

## Proxy Server Settings

This is for checking the state of connection with the Proxy server and performing settings.

Press [OK] to show the respective setting.

## Internet Content Settings (⇒ 23) (VIERA CAST)

Press [OK] to show the following settings:

### Lock

You can restrict the usage of VIERA CAST.

- Follow the on-screen instructions. Enter a 4-digit password with the number buttons when the password screen is shown.

### Audio Auto Gain Control

Volume that is different depending on the contents is adjusted automatically to the standard volume while using the VIERA CAST.

- Depending on contents, this function effect will not work.
- Select “Off” when the audio is warped.

### Time Zone

By selecting the time zone, it is possible to set the unit's time to match your location.

- Some VIERA CAST contents require the time zone to be set. Set the time zone if necessary.

### DST

Select “On” when using Daylight Saving time.

## Network Drive Connection

It is possible to access the shared folder of equipment not compatible with DLNA, such as the Windows XP operating system, and play back video, still pictures, and music on this unit.

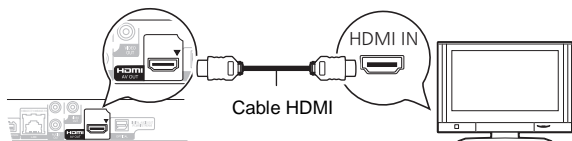

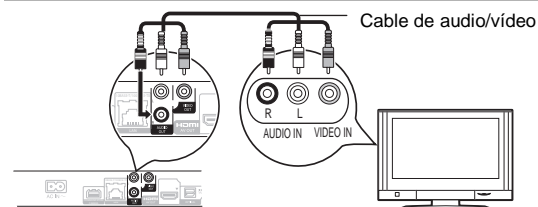

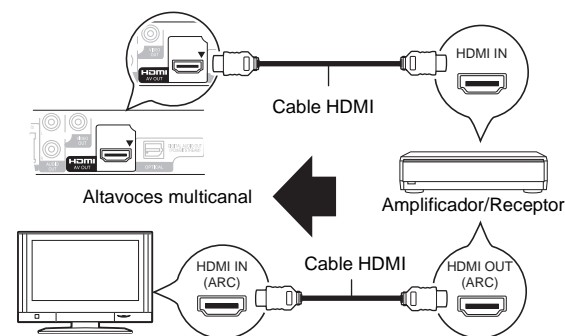
