Care and Use

- Avoid using or placing this unit near sources of heat. Do not leave it in an automobile exposed to direct sunlight for a long period of time with the doors and windows closed, as this may deform the cabinet.
- olf the set is not used for a long period of time or is used only from an AC power supply, remove the batteries to prevent potential damage due to possible battery leakage.

Cassette tapes

Improper tape storage

You can damage tape if you store it in the following ways:

- In high temperature or high humidity areas
- In a strong magnetic field (near a speaker, on top of a TV, etc.)
- In direct sunlight

Cassette tapes of 100 minutes or longer:

These tapes are handy for their long playback and recording time but be careful about repeatedly stopping and starting, rewinding and fast forwarding these tapes in short intervals as they are thin, tend to stretch and may become entangled in the deck mechanism.

Endless tapes

Failure to operate these tapes correctly may cause the tape to wind around the revolving parts.


Maintenance

Head care

To ensure good sound quality for tape operation, be sure to clean the head after approximately every 10 hours of use.

Clean it with a cotton swab dampened with a little alcohol.

Do not bring metal articles or magnetic material such as a screwdriver, near the head assembly.



It is recommended that the head assembly be demagnetized if distortion or poor sound quality persists after cleaning the heads. Demagnetize them using a demagnetizer available from an audio store.

Main unit

Clean it with a cloth, dampened in a mild solution of soap and water.


Do not clean the cabinet with benzine or thinner.

Avoid excessive moisture.

Avoid spray aerosol type cleaner. Some cleaners contain corrosive chemicals that may cause internal damage and cabinet deformation.

Record prevention

Removing the tab(s) of the cassette (with a small screwdriver) will prevent accidental erasure.



To record again, cover the hole of the tab with adesive tape.



Listening caution





Do not play your headphones or earphones at a high volume. Hearing experts advise against continuous extended play.

If you experience a ringing in your ears, reduce volume or discontinue use.

Do not use while operating a motorized vehicle. It may create a traffic hazard and is illegal in many

You should use extreme caution or temporarily discontinue use in potentially hazardous situations.

Even if your headphones or earphones is an openair type designed to let you hear outside sounds, don't turn up the volume so high that you can't hear what's around you.

Sound can be deceiving. Over time your hearing "comfort level" adapts to higher volumes of sound. So what sounds "normal" can actually be loud and harmful to your hearing.

Guard against this by setting your equipment at a safe level BEFORE your hearing adapts.


To establish a safe level:


- Start your volume control at a low setting.
- · Slowly increase the sound until you can hear it comfortably and clearly, and without distortion.


Once you have established a comfortable sound level:

Set the dial and leave it there.

Power Source







Dry cell batteries A

Insert two "AA" size (R6/LR6, or equivalent, not included) batteries.

Batteries installed with incorrect polarities may leak and damage this unit.

Replace with fresh batteries of the same kind, observing polarity.

Battery removal

Press the ⊕ side toward the ⊝ battery terminal and lift up.

When the batteries are weak

The REC/BATT indicator will become dim or turn off during recording. (RQ-L349 only)

Also the tape speed will slow down, the sound will become distorted, and the volume will decrease.

AC power operation [3]

RQ-L349

Use the included AC adaptor/charger.

RQ-L319

Use the Panasonic AC adaptor RP-AC31 (optional).

 When not in use, disconnect the AC adaptor/ charger from the AC power outlet.

Rechargeable batteries (Only for RQ-L349)

For its initial use after purchasing or after a long time interval (more than three months), make sure to recharge the rechargeable batteries. Normally, 2 hours recharging will give approximately 4 hours 30 minutes tape playback.

Recharge the rechargeable batteries, then insert the charged batteries into the unit.


Note:

Do not recharge more than 8 hours at one time, or the rechargeable batteries life may be shortened.

Rechargeable batteries and charger

- · Use only the included charger when recharging.
- During recharging, it is normal for the charger and the rechargeable batteries to become slightly warm.
- Avoid recharging or placing the rechargeable batteries near sources of heat or humidity.
- The included rechargeable batteries can be recharged about 300 times. After that, its operation time becomes shortened. That's time for replacing the rechargeable batteries.

Recording



If you ship the product

Carefully pack and send it prepaid, adequately insured and preferably in the original carton. Attach a letter, detailing the complaint, to the outside of the carton.

Do NOT send the product to the Executive or Regional Sales offices. They are NOT equipped to make repairs.

To make a recording

Normal tapes can be used.

The sound may not be recorded properly if high-position tapes and metal tapes are used with this unit.

- 1. Insert the tape into the compartment.
- 2. Set VAS selector to "OFF" position.
- 3. Only for RQ-L349

Select the position of MIC SELECTOR.

To record the sound all around for meeting, etc.

The built-in microphone is omnidirectional, so that recording is available in every direction.

DIRECTIONAL

To record the sound of a specific direction for lecture, interview, etc.

Turn the built-in microphone of this unit to the direction which you want to record.





4. Press REC to start recording.

REC/BATT indicator lights (only RQ-L349).

Use a tape with tabs in place.

The recording level is automatically adjusted.

☑ To record with VAS (Voice Activated System) function

The sound is recorded automatically, so there is no tape waste.

To use VAS function, set VAS selector to "VAS" position in step 2 and adjust VOLUME.

- 1-3: If you wish to record only the louder sounds.
- 4-7: If you wish to record normal level sounds.
- 8-10: If you wish to record lower levels of sound than usual.

No sound is recorded at the "0" position.

■ To record through the external microphone

Plug the external microphone (not included) into the MIC jack.

Then follow steps 1, 2 and 4 as illustrated above.

■ To stop recording

Press STOP.

☐ To temporarily stop recording

Set the PAUSE selector to "PAUSE" position. To resume recording, set it to "OFF" position.

■ Follow up recording

Recording can be started during playback by simply pressing @ (REC).

□ Monitoring

The sound can be heard with an optional earphone plugged into the **MONITOR** jack. (Plug type: Monaural mini)

Note:

Do not adjust the volume during recording with the VAS function, or the VAS level would be changed.



Playback



To playback the tape

Normal tapes can be used.

Follow steps 1-4 as illustrated above.

☑ To stop play

Press E STOP.

Tape speed control (for playback only)

Using the tape speed control, the playback speed can be changed; you can make the speed slower to playback a part difficult to catch and faster to playback an unimportant part. It is useful to playback a tape which contains a conference or a lecture recording.

When TAPE SPEED is set to the center click position with white mark, the tape is played back with a standard speed.

To fast forward and rewind

Press FF/CUE (fast forward) or REW/REV (rewind).

■ Auto Stop

During playback or recording, when the tape reaches its end, the automatic stop system will release the playback and record buttons and automatically turn off the unit

Cue and review

Sound can be monitored at a high speed for as long as the **FF/CUE** (cue) or **REW/REV** (review) is held down during playback.

When the button is released, normal playback will start.

Note:

When the tape reaches the end by pressing FF/CUE or REW/REV, the automatic stop system does not function. The tape will stop, but as the motor continues to turn, do not leave the set in this condition. Be sure to press STOP.

Tape counter and reset button

The digits return to "000" when the reset button is pressed. The digits advance with the tape to provide a reference to quickly find a desired portion of tape.

Type of tape which can be used:

Normal position/TYPE I	0

This unit will not be able to do full justice to characteristics of high-position tapes and metal tapes even if they are played back.
