



The remote control

Batteries





Use

Placement of speakers

Speakers are designed identically so that no left or right channel orientation is necessary.



Notes

- Keep your speakers at least 10 mm (¹³/₃₂") away from the system for proper ventilation.
- These speakers do not have magnetic shielding. Do not place them near televisions, personal computers or other devices easily influenced by magnetism.
- To avoid damage to the speakers, do not touch the speaker cones if you have taken the nets off.






3 AC adaptor




Use only the supplied speakers.

The combination of the main unit and speakers provide the best sound. Using other speakers can damage the unit and sound quality will be negatively affected.



CD selection

Choose CDs with this mark:



Do not:


- · use irregularly shaped CDs.
- attach extra labels and stickers.
- use CDs with labels and stickers that are coming off or with adhesive exuding from under labels and stickers.
- attach scratch proof covers or any other kind of accessory.
- write anything on the CD.
- clean CDs with liquids. (Wipe with a soft, dry cloth.)
- use CDs printed with label printers available on the market.





This unit can play CD-DA (digital audio) format audio CD-R and CD-RW that have been finalized (a process that enables CD-R/CD-RW players to play audio CD-R and CD-RW) upon completion

It may not be able to play some CD-R or CD-RW due to the condition of the recording.



1 Press [■/♠] to open the CD lid.

The unit comes on.

Ensure that the whip antenna does not block the CD lid when it is opening.

2 Load a CD with the label facing outward.

Press [■/♠] to close the CD lid.

Caution:

Keep fingers away from the CD lid when it is closing to avoid possible minor injury.

3 Press [CD ►/II] to start play.

Plays to the end of the CD and stops.

4 Adjust the volume.

To stop the disc

Press $[\blacksquare/\triangle]$. (remote control: $[\blacksquare]$).

To pause play

Press [CD ►/II]. Press [CD ►/II] again to resume play.

Skipping tracks

Press $[\mathbb{A}/-]$ (backward) or $[+/\mathbb{N}]$ (forward).

Searching through tracks

During play or pause

Press and hold $[\mathbb{H}/-]$ (backward) or $[+/\mathbb{H}]$ (forward).


One touch play

When a CD is loaded and the unit is off, press [CD ►/II]. The unit comes on and starts play.

Note

- During random play (→ page 9), you cannot skip to tracks which have already been played.
- During program play or random play (→ page 9), you cannot search forward or backward over tracks.
- During program play, skipping is always in the programmed order, whether forward or backward.
- Program play cannot be used in combination with random play.

Direct access play



Direct access allows you to start normal play from a specific track to the last track of the CD.


Preparation:

Press [CD ►/II] and then [■/♠].

- 1 Press [I◄◄/-] or [+/▶▶I] to select the desired track number.
- 2 Press [CD ►/II] to start play.

Play will start with the track you select.

Repeat play and random play



Remote control only

1 Press [PLAY MODE] before play to select the desired play mode.

Every time you press the button:

To repeat just one track:

Press [PLAY MODE] to select " 1- ".

To repeat all tracks:

Press [PLAY MODE] to select " ".

To start random play:

Press [PLAY MODE] to select "RND".

All tracks on the loaded CD will be played in random order.

Playback will stop automatically when all tracks have been played.

2 Press [CD ►/II] to start play.

To cancel repeat play and random play

Press [PLAY MODE] to select "(off)" during stop, as shown in the illustration in step 1 above.

Repeat play and random play will also be cancelled by opening the CD lid.


To repeat programmed tracks

- 1) Program desired tracks (steps 1 to 5 on page 9).
- 2 Press [PLAY MODE] to display " ".
- ③ Press [CD ►/II] to begin play.

Note

- You can also turn the repeat mode on/off during CD play.
- Random play does not work when " PGM " is displayed (press and hold [PGM/–CLEAR] first).
- · Search can be done within the track in play only.

Program play



This function allows you to program up to 24 tracks.

Remote control only

Preparation: Press [CD ▶/II] and then [■].

1 (In the stop mode)

Press [PGM/-CLEAR].

- 2 Press [I◄◄/-] or [+/▶▶] to select the track you want to play in the desired sequence.
- 3 Press [PGM/-CLEAR] again.
- 4 Repeat steps 2 and 3 until you have programmed all the tracks you want.
- 5 Press [CD ►/II].

Play will start in the programmed sequence.

Play will stop automatically when all the programmed tracks have been played.

The program remains intact even if play is stopped or the unit is turned off. "P" appears when play is stopped to indicate the contents are in the memory.

To cancel program play mode

Press and hold [PGM/-CLEAR] in the stop mode until "CLEAR" is displayed.

The mode is also canceled if the CD tray is opened.

This will also erase the entire program.

▲ When "--:--" is displayed

Total play time of the programmed tracks equals, or exceeds 250 minutes.

Tracks can still be programmed and played.

■ When "PGM FULL" appears

The number of programmed tracks is limited to 24. No further tracks can be programmed.

Check program contents

- Press [■].
 - "P" is displayed.
- ② Press [PGM/-CLEAR], then press either [I◄◄/-] or [+/▶►I]. Every time you press one of the buttons, the track and program No. are shown on the display.


Add to the program

In the stop mode, repeat steps 2 and 3.

Note

- Program play does not work when "RND" is displayed (press [PLAY MODE] to clear it) (→ page 9).
- Search can be done within tracks only.

The radio: manual tuning



1 Press [TUNER/BAND] to select "FM" or "AM".

The unit comes on.

Every time you press the button:

 $FM \leftrightarrow AM$

2 Press [TUNING MODE] to select "MANUAL".

Every time you press the button:

 $MANUAL \leftrightarrow PRESET$

- 3 Press [I◄◄/-] or [+/▶▶I] to select the frequency of the required station.
- 4 Adjust the volume.

Auto tuning

Press and hold $[\mathbb{A}/-]$ or $[+/\mathbb{A}]$ for a moment until the frquency starts changing rapidly. The unit begins auto tuning, stopping when it finds a station.

- Auto tuning may not function when there is excessive interference.
- To cancel auto tuning, press [I◄◄/-] or [+/▶►I] once again.

To improve reception

Extend the whip antenna and adjust its direction.

If noise is excessive in FM

Remote control only

Press [PLAY MODE] to display "MONO".

This mode improves sound quality if reception is weak, but broadcasts will be heard in monaural.

Press [PLAY MODE] again to cancel the mode.

"MONO" goes out. MONO is also cancelled if the frequency is changed. Turn off "MONO" for normal listening. Stereo and monaural broadcasts are automatically played as they are received.

FM allocation setting

Main unit only

By adjusting the allocation, you can enable this tuner to receive FM broadcasts allocated in 0.1 MHz steps.

Preparation:

Press [TUNER/BAND] to select "AM".

Press and hold [TUNER/BAND]. After a few seconds, the display will change to a flashing display of the current minimum FM frequency. If you continue to hold the button down, the minimum frequency will change. Release the button at this time.

To return to the original frequency indication, repeat above.


Note

After changing the "allocation" setting, the frequencies you previously
preset in the memory will be cleared.

The radio: preset tuning

Up to 12 stations each can be set in the FM and AM bands. **Preparation:**

Press [TUNER/BAND] to select "FM" or "AM".



Manual pre-setting

Remote control only

Pre-set the stations one at a time.


- ① Press [PGM/–CLEAR] then press [I◄◄/–] or [+/▶►I] to tune to the required station.
- ② Press [PGM/–CLEAR] then press [I◄◄/–] or [+/▶►I] to select a channel.
- 3 Press [PGM/-CLEAR].

The station occupying a channel is erased if another station is preset in that channel.

Selecting channels

- 1 Press [TUNING MODE] to select "PRESET".
- 2 Press [I◄◄/-] or [+/▶►I] to select the channel.
- 3 Adjust the volume.

Sound quality



Using the built-in sound quality

You can choose one of four types of sound quality.

D.BASS: Adds punch to rock CLEAR: Clarifies higher sounds SOFT: For background music VOCAL: Adds gloss to vocal

Remote control only

Press [EQ] to select a setting.

Every time you press the button:

D.BASS → CLEAR → SOFT → VOCAL

 EQ-OFF (cancelled) —

3-D sound with the Live Virtualizer

Remote control only

You can create a three-dimensional sound field when listening to stereo sound.


Press [LIVE VIRTUALIZER].

Press again to cancel.

Note


The actual effect depends on the source played.

External unit connections



- An analog player with a built-in phono equalizer can be connected.

Using an external unit



Listening to an external source

(See above for external unit connection)

- 1. Press [AUX].
 - The unit comes on.
- Start playback from the external source. (For details, refer to the external unit's instruction manual.)

Using an external unit

You can boost up the "AUX" output level.

Press and hold [AUX].

Every time you press and hold the button:

 $NORMAL \leftrightarrow HIGH$

NORMAL: Normal output signal level


(Use when external source's signal level is normal).

HIGH: To boost up to a higher output signal level

(Use when external source's signal level is low, for example

portable CD/MD player).

Using headphones (not included)




Reduce the volume level and connect the headphones to the [PHONES] jack.

Plug type: 3.5 mm (1/8") stereo

Note

Avoid listening for prolonged periods of time to prevent hearing damage.

Setting the time



Remote control only

This is a 12-hour clock.

- 1 Press [the long to turn the unit on.
- 2 Press [CLOCK/TIMER ADJ] to select "CLOCK".
- 3 Within 10 seconds

Press $[\leftarrow /-]$ or $[+/\rightarrow]$ to set the time.

Press and hold to change the time faster.

4 Press [CLOCK/TIMER ADJ].

The time is set and the original display is restored.

To switch to clock display

Press [DISPLAY].

Every time you press the button:

Clock display ↔ Current display

Displaying the clock when the unit is ON:


Press [CLOCK/TIMER ADJ].

The clock is shown for about 10 seconds.

Note

The clock is accurate to within ±60 seconds a month. Readjust if necessary.

Using the timers



Using the play timer

Remote control only

The play timer can be set to on at a certain time to wake you up.

Preparations:

- Turn the unit on and set the clock (→ page 11).
- Prepare the music source you want to listen to: CD, radio or aux, and set the volume.

1 Press [CLOCK/TIMER ADJ] to select the timer function.

Every time you press the button:

ON TIME: to set the start time OFF TIME: to set the finish time

Setting the start and finish times

2 During "ON TIME" display

(within 10 seconds or so)

- ① Press [$\blacktriangleleft -$] or [$+/\triangleright \triangleright$] to select the start time.
- 2 Press [CLOCK/TIMER ADJ].
- 3 During "OFF TIME" display
 - 1) Press [-] or [+/] to select the finish time.
 - 2 Press [CLOCK/TIMER ADJ].

The start and finish times are now set.

Turning the timer on

4 Press [TIMER ON/OFF] to display "OPLAY"

The settings are shown in the following order: start time \rightarrow finish time

(The indicator doesn't appear if the clock hasn't been set.)

5 Press [0] to turn the unit off.

The unit must be off for the timer to operate.

Play will start in the set condition at the set time with volume increasing gradually to the set level.

To cancel the timer

Press [TIMER ON/OFF] to clear the timer indicator from the display. The timer comes on at the set time everyday if the timer is on.

To change the settings (when the unit is on)

To change the play times

Do steps 1, 2, 3 and 5.

To change the source or volume

- 1. Press [TIMER ON/OFF] to clear the timer indicator from the display.
- 2. Make changes to the source or volume.
- 3. Do steps 4 to 5.

To check the settings (when the unit is off)

Press [CLOCK/TIMER ADJ].

The settings are shown in the following order: start time—finish time—source—volume—current time

You can enjoy other sources after you have set the timer.

Turn the unit off before the timer's start time.

Note

- If you turn the unit off and on again while a timer is functioning, the finish time setting will not be activated.
- If the unit is on, the timer will not function. The unit must be in the standby mode.
- If AUX is selected as the source, when the timer comes on, the system turns on and engages AUX as the source. If you want to playback from a connected unit, set that unit's timer to the same time. (See the connected unit's instruction manual.)

Using the sleep timer

Remote control only

Set the unit to stop and turn off after a certain time.

While enjoying the desired source:

Press [SLEEP] to select the desired time.

Every time you press the button:

SLEEP 30
$$\rightarrow$$
 SLEEP 60 \rightarrow SLEEP 90 \rightarrow SLEEP 120 \rightarrow OFF -

To cancel the sleep timer

Press [SLEEP] to select "OFF".

To confirm the remaining time

(only while unit is ON)

Press [SLEEP].

The remaining time is shown for about 5 seconds.

To change the setting

Press [SLEEP] to select the new setting.

Note

The play and sleep timer can be used together.

The sleep timer always has priority. Be sure not to overlap timer settings.

Common Problems

No sound. Sound stops.	Turn the volume up. Switch off the unit, determine and correct the cause, then switch the unit on. Causes include shorting of the positive and negative speaker wires, straining of the speakers through excessive volume or power, and using the unit in a hot environment.
Sound is unfixed, reversed or comes from one speaker only.	Check the speaker connections. 6
Humming heard during play.	An AC power supply cord or fluorescent light is near the cables. Keep other appliances and cords away from this unit's cables.
"ERROR" is displayed.	Incorrect operation performed. Read the instructions and try again.
":" appears on the display at standby mode.	You plugged the AC adaptor in for the first time or there was a power failure recently. Set the time. 1
"F76" is displayed.	There is a power supply problem. Consult the dealer.

Listening to the radio

A beat sound is heard.	Turn the TV off or separate it from the unit.
