



# SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

WARNING: TO REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE OR ELECTRIC SHOCK, DO NOT EXPOSE THIS APPLIANCE TO RAIN OR MOISTURE.

- This projector produces intense light from the projection lens. Do not stare directly into the lens as possible. Eye damage could result. Be especially careful that children do not stare directly into the beam.
- This projector should be set in the way indicated. If not, it may result in a fire hazard.
- Take appropriate space on the top, sides and rear of the projector cabinet for allowing air circulation and cooling the projector. Minimum distance should be taken. If the projector is to be built into a compartment or similarly enclosed, the minimum distances must be maintained. Do not cover the ventilation slot on the projector. Heat build-up can reduce the service life of your projector, and can also be dangerous.

# SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the projector.

For added protection to the projector during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet. This will prevent damage due to lightning and power line surges.

Do not expose this unit to rain or use near water... for example, in a wet basement, near a swimming pool, etc...

Do not use attachments not recommended by the manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

Do not place this projector on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The projector may fall, causing serious injury to a child or adult, and serious damage to the projector. Use only with a cart or stand recommended by the manufacturer, or sold with the projector. # FEATURES AND DESIGN

This Multimedia Projector is designed with the most advanced technology for portability, durability, and ease of use. The projector utilizes built-in multimedia features, a palette of 16.77 million colors, and matrix liquid crystal display (LCD) technology.

#### Compatibility

This projector widely accepts various video and computer input signals including;

#### Computers

IBM-compatible and Macintosh computers up to 1280 x 1024 resolution.

#### 6 Color Systems

NTSC, PAL, SECAM, NTSC 4.43, PAL-M or PAL-N color system can be connected.

#### Component Video

Component video signals, such as a DVD player output high definition TV signals including 480i, 480p, 575i, 575p, 720p, 1035i, 1080i-50 or 1080i-60, can be connected.

#### S-Video

S-Video signals, such as a S-VHS VCR output signals, can be connected.

#### High Resolution Image

This projector provides 1024 x 768 dots resolution for computer input and 700 horizontal TV lines. 



# **SETTING-UP THE PROJECTOR**

#### CONNECTING THE AC POWER CORD

This projector uses nominal input voltages of 100-120 V or 200-240 V AC. The projector automatically selects the correct input voltage. It is designed to work with single-phase power systems having a grounded neutral conductor. To reduce the risk of electrical shock, do not plug into any other type of power system.

Consult your authorized dealer or service station if you are not sure of the type of power supply being in use.


Connect the projector with the peripheral equipment before turning the projector on. (Refer to pages 11 ~ 14 for connection.)



#### CAUTION

For safety, unplug the AC Power Cord when the appliance is not used.

When this projector is connected to the outlet with the AC Power Cord, the appliance is in Stand-by Mode and consumes a little electric power.



Connect the AC Power Cord (supplied) to the projector.

The AC outlet must be near this equipment and must be easily accessible.





#### **LENS SHIFT ADJUSTMENT**

The projection lens can be moved up and down with the motor-driven lens shift function. This function makes it easy to provide the projected image where you want. The U/D ratio can be adjusted  $10:0 \sim 1:3$  (refer to the figure below.). Refer to P 21 for operation.




#### ADJUSTABLE FEET

Picture tilt and projection angle can be adjusted by rotating the ADJUSTABLE FEET. Projection angle can be adjusted to 9.0 degrees.

- 1 Lift the front of the projector and pull the FEET LOCK LATCHES on both sides of the projector.
- Release the FEET LOCK LATCHES to lock the ADJUSTABLE FEET and rotate the ADJUSTABLE FEET to fine tune the position and the tilt.
- To shorten the ADJUSTABLE FEET, lift the front of the projector and pull and undo the FEET LOCK LATCHES.

The position and the keystone distortion of the image can be adjusted using the Menu Operation. (Refer to P 22, 31 and 35.)




#### RESET BUTTON

This projector uses a micro processor to control the unit. Occasionally, the micro processor may malfunction and need to be reset. This can be done by pressing the RESET button with a pen, which will shut down and restart the unit. Do not use the

RESET function excessively.

#### R/C JACK

When using the Wired / Wireless Remote Control Unit as the Wired Remote Control, Connect the Wired Remote Control Unit to this jack with the Remote Control Cable (supplied). (Refer to page 21.)



#### **COMPUTER MONITOR OUTPUT** JACKS (BNC x 5)

These jacks output the signal from the COMPUTER INPUT terminals (except the digital input signal). Connect an external monitor to these jacks. (Refer to P14.)





#### LASER POINTER FUNCTION

This remote control emits a laser beam as the Laser Pointer from the Laser Light Window. When the LASER button is pressed, the laser light goes on. And when the button is pressed more than 1 minute or the button is released, light goes off. Laser light is emitted with the RED light which tells the laser beam being emitted.


The laser emitted is a class II laser; therefore, do not look into the Laser Light Window or shine the laser beam on yourself or other people. The three marks bellow are the caution labels for the laser beam.


- Complete the peripheral connections (with Computer, VCR, etc.) before turning on the projector. (Refer to "CONNECTING TO THE PROJECTOR" on Pages 11~14 for connecting that equipment.)
- Connect the projector's AC Power Cord into a wall outlet and turn the MAIN ON / OFF SWITCH to ON. The LAMP indicator lights RED, and the READY indicator lights GREEN.
- Press the POWER ON-OFF button on the Remote Control Unit or on the Top Control to ON. The LAMP indicator dims, and the Cooling Fans start to operate. The Preparation Display appears on the screen and the count-down starts. The signal from the source appears after 30 seconds.



The Preparation Display disappears after 30 seconds.

#### TURNING OFF THE PROJECTOR

- Press the power ON-OFF button on the Remote Control Unit or on the Top Control, and the message "Power off?" appears on the screen.
- Press the power ON-OFF button again to turn off the projector. The LAMP indicator lights bright and the READY indicator turns off. The Cooling Fans operate for 2 minutes after the projector is turned off. (For first 1 minute of this "Cooling Down" period, this appliance cannot be turned on.)
- When the projector has cooled down, the READY indicator turns to green again and you can turn the projector on. After cooling down completely, turn the MAIN ON / OFF SWITCH to OFF and disconnect the AC power cord.

TO MAINTAIN THE LIFE OF THE LAMP, ONCE YOU TURN THE PROJECTOR ON, WAIT AT LEAST 5 MINUTES BEFORE TURNING IT OFF.

When the Power Management function is ON, the Projector detects the signal interruption and turns the Projection Lamp off automatically. Refer to "Power Management" on page 33.

When the TEMPERATURE WARNING indicator flashes red, the projector is automatically turned off. Wait at least 5 minutes before turning the projector on again.

When the TEMPERATURE WARNING indicator continues to flash, follow procedures below:

- 1. Turn the MAIN ON / OFF SWITCH to OFF and disconnect the AC power cord from the AC outlet.
- 2. Check the air filters for dust accumulation.
- 3. Clean the Air Filter. (See "AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING" section on page 39.)
- 4. Turn the Projector on again.




# PC ADJUSTMENT

This Projector can automatically tune to the display signals from most personal computers currently distributed. However, some computers employ special signal formats which are different from the standard ones and may not be tuned by the Multi-Scan system of this projector. If this happens, the projector cannot reproduce a proper image and the image may be recognized as a flickering picture, a non-synchronized picture, a non-centered picture or a skewed picture.

This projector has a PC ADJUSTMENT function to enable you to precisely adjust several parameters to match with those special signal formats. This projector has 8 independent memory areas to memorize those parameters manually adjusted. This enables you to recall the setting for a specific computer whenever you use it.

Note: This PC ADJUSTMENT function cannot be operated when the input signal is from the COMPUTER INPUT-1 (DIGITAL) terminal or "RGB" is selected on the SYSTEM MENU (P24 and 25).

- Press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT RIGHT/LEFT button to select PC ADJUST and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box "Where to reserve" Menu will appear.
- In this dialog box, you can store the parameter into the area from "Mode 1" to "Mode 8." When the VIDEO INPUT JACK(s) and the S-VIDEO INPUT JACK are connected at the same time, or if the projector cannot chose the proper video source, it is necessary to select a specific video source among Video, S-Video and Y, Pb/Cb, Pr/Cr.



# **SELECTING COLOR SYSTEM**

- Press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select SYSTEM and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box VIDEO SYSTEM Menu will appear.
- Press the POINT DOWN button and a red-arrow icon will appear. Move the arrow to "Auto", and then press the SELECT button.



If the projector cannot reproduce the proper video image, it is necessary to select a specific broadcast signal format among PAL, SECAM, NTSC, NTSC 4.43, PAL-M, and PAL-N.





# **PICTURE IMAGE ADJUSTMENT**

- Press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select IMAGE and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box PICTURE IMAGE ADJUSTMENT Menu will appear.
- Press the POINT DOWN button and a red-arrow icon will appear. Move the arrow to the function that you want to select and then press SELECT button.

#### Standard

Normal picture level preset on this projector. This picture level can be set by pressing the NORMAL button.

#### Cinema

Picture level adjusted for the picture with fine tone.

#### Custom

Picture level adjusted manually in the custom setting dialog box.

When selecting "▼," the custom setting dialog box will appear. Move the arrow to the item that you want to change by pressing the POINT UP/DOWN button, and adjust each value or change the setting On or Off by pressing the SELECT button to match with the image.

#### Color

Point to ▼ button to lighten the image, and select ▲ to deepen the image. (From 0 to 63.)

#### Tint

Point to ▼ button to increase purple, and select ▲ to increase green. (From 0 to 63.)

#### White balance (Red / Green / Blue)

Move the arrow to the color that you want to adjust. Point to ▼ to lighten the color and select ▲ to deepen the color. (From 0 to 63.)

#### Contrast

Point to ♥ button to decrease contrast, and select ▲ to increase contrast. (From 0 to 63.)

#### <sup>®</sup>Brightness

Point to  $\nabla$  button to darken the image, and select  $\triangle$  to brighten the image. (From 0 to 63.)

#### Sharpness

Point to  $\nabla$  button to soften the image, and select  $\triangle$  to sharpen the image. (From 0 to 31.)

#### Noise reduction

Set "On" to reduce the noise (rough parts) of the image.




Each of the keys operates as follow.

Reset .... Recalls the data previously adjusted.

Stored .... Stores the data in the memory.

NOTE: The Noise Reduction cannot be operated when the video signal is from the Y, Pb/Cb, Pr/Cr jacks.

#### NORMAL FUNCTION

The normal picture level is preset on this projector at the factory and can be restored anytime you press the NORMAL button (located on the Top Control or on the Remote Control Unit). The "Standard" display will be displayed on the screen for a few seconds



# PICTURE SCREEN ADJUSTMENT

This projector has a picture screen resize function, which enables you to display the desirable image size.

- Press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select SCREEN and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box PICTURE SCREEN ADJUSTMENT DISPLAY will appear.
- Press the POINT DOWN button and a red-arrow icon will appear. Move the arrow to the screen size that you want to set, and then press the SELECT button.

#### Regular


Normal Video Image size with 4 x 3 aspect ratio.

#### Wide

Resizes the image for wide screen size with 16 x 9 aspect ratio.

#### Keystone

When the image is distorted vertically, select Keystone in the dialog box. Correct the Keystone distortion by pressing KEYSTONE ▲/▼ button or POINT UP/DOWN button(s). Refer to KEYSTONE ADJUSTMENT on page 20.



Move the pointer to the function and press the SELECT button.

NOTE: The Regular and the Wide cannot be operated when "720p," "1035i," "1080i-50" or "1080i-60" is selected on the SYSTEM MENU (P33).

# **SETTING MENU**

- Press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select SETTING and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box SETTING Menu will appear.
- Press the POINT DOWN button and a red-arrow icon will appear. Move the arrow to the item that you want to set, and then press the SELECT button to set it "On" or "Off" or press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT button to adjust the value.

#### Blue back

When this function is "On," this projector will produce a blue image instead of the video noise on the screen when the input source is unplugged or turned off.

#### Display

This function decides whether to display the On-Screen Displays.

- On1 ... shows all the On-Screen Displays.
- On2 --- shows the On-Screen Displays except the Preparation Display (Our Logo).

Off .... sets the On-Screen Displays disappeared except;

- ON SCREEN MENU
- "Power off?" message
- P-TIMER

#### Power management

This function turns the Projection Lamp off when the projector detects signal interruption and the projector is not used for a certain period in order to reduce power consumption and maintain the Lamp-life. (This projector is shipped with this function ON.)

Power Management function operates to turn the Projection Lamp off when the input signal is interrupted and the projector is not operated over 5 minutes. This function operates as follows;


- 1. When the signal is interrupted, "No signal" and the counting down (5 minutes) display appears.
- When the Projection Lamp turned off, the READY indicator turns off. The Cooling Fans operate for 90 seconds after the Projection Lamp is turned off. (During this "Cooling Down" period, the Lamp cannot be turned on.)
- When the Lamp has cooled down, the READY indicator flashes and the Lamp can be turned on again (Power Management mode).

In this Power Management mode, the Projection Lamp is automatically turned on when the input signal connected or the projector is operated with any button on the Top Control or the Remote Control.

#### On start

When this function is "On," the projector is automatically turned on just by switching the MAIN ON / OFF SWITCH on.

Note: Be sure to turn the projector off properly (refer to the section "TURNING OFF THE PROJECTOR" on page 20.). If the projector is turned off in the wrong steps, the On Start function does not operate properly.



Set the Pointer to the item and press the SELECT button.



Time left until Lamp off.

#### Ceiling

When this function is "On," the top / bottom and the left / right reversed picture is provided to project the image from a ceiling mounted projector.

#### Rear

When this function is "On," the left / right reversed picture is provided to project the image to a rear projection screen.

#### Split wipe

Turn this function "On" in the SETTING menu. The picture will change into next one by sliding black image side ways like drawing the black curtains when the input source is turned into another one.

#### Remote control

This projector has two different remote transmit codes; the factory-set normal code (Mode 1) and the secondary code (Mode 2). This switching function prevents the remote control operation mixture (jam) when operating several projectors or video equipment together. When operating the projector in "Mode 2," both projector and Remote Control must be switched to "Mode 2."

#### To change the code of the projector;

Set the Remote control in the SETTING menu to "Mode 2."

#### To change the code of the Remote Control:

Press both the MENU and the NORMAL buttons on the Remote Control together for over 10 seconds.

After changing the code, make sure the Remote Control operates properly.


To return to the normal code (Mode 1), operate both projector and Remote Control in the ways above again.





# **SELECTING LANGUAGE**

The language used in the ON-SCREEN MENU is selectable from among English, German, French, Italian, Spanish and Japanese.

- Press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear Press POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select LANGU. DE and press the SELECT button. Another dialog box LANGUAGE Menu will appear.
- Press the POINT DOWN button and a red-arrow icon will appear. Move the arrow to the language that you want to set, and then press the SELECT button.



Move the Pointer to the language that you want to set, and then press the SELECT button.

# **OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE**

The Wireless Remote Control Unit is not only able to operate the projector but also usable as a wireless mouse for most Personal Computers. The POINT buttons and the two CLICK buttons are used for the wireless mouse operation.

The wireless mouse is available only when PC mouse pointer is displayed on the screen. When the menu or the indicator of the projector is displayed on the screen instead of the PC mouse pointer, the wireless mouse cannot be used.

#### INSTALLATION

To use the Wireless Remote Control Unit as the Wireless Mouse for a Personal Computer, installation of the mouse driver (not supplied) is required. Make sure that the mouse driver is properly installed in your computer. And make sure that the mouse port of the computer connected to Control Port is activated.

- Connect the mouse port of your computer to the Control Port of the projector with the Control Cable. (Refer to page 11 to 14 for connection.)
- Turn the projector on first, and then turn on your computer. When the computer is switched on first, the Wireless Mouse may not work properly.

Note: When the computer has no mouse port, connect the Serial Port of the computer to Control Port of the projector with the Control Cable for Serial Port.

## OPERATING WIRELESS MOUSE

When controlling the pointer of the computer, operate the Wireless Mouse with POINT button, SELECT button, and RIGHT CLICK button on the Wireless Remote Control Unit.

#### POINT button

Used to move the pointer. The pointer is moved corresponding with the direction you are pressing.


#### SELECT (LEFT CLICK) button

This button has the same function as the left button in a PC mouse.

#### RIGHT CLICK button

This button has the same function as the right button in a PC mouse. Pressing this button does not affect any operation when in Menu mode.

# **MAINTENANCE**

## TEMPERATURE WARNING INDICATOR

The TEMPERATURE WARNING indicator flashes red when the internal temperature of the projector exceeds the normal temperature. The indicator stops flashing when the temperature of the projector returns to normal. When the TEMPERATURE WARNING indicator continues to flash, check the items listed below.

- The Ventilation slots of the projector may be blocked. In such an event, reposition the appliance so that the ventilation slots are not obstructed.
- 2 Air filters may be clogged with dust particles. Clean the air filters by following the section AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING below.
- 3 If the TEMPERATURE WARNING Indicator remains on after performing the above checks, the Cooling Fans or the Internal Circuits may be malfunctioning. Contact service a personnel from an authorized dealer or service station.

### AIR FILTER CARE AND CLEANING

The Removable Air Filter prevents dust from accumulating on the surface of the Projection Lens and the Projection Mirror. Should the Air Filter become clogged with dust particles, it will reduce the Cooling Fans' effectiveness and may result in internal heat build up and adversely affect the life of the projector. Clean the Air Filter following the steps below:

- ${\it 1}$  Turn the power off, and disconnect the AC power cord from the AC outlet.
- Turn the projector upside down and remove the Air Filter Cover by pressing four latches sideways and pulling up. Remove three Air Filters by pulling up the latches.
- 3 Clean the Air Filters with brush or wash out the dust and particles. Be sure to dry them out.
- 4 Replace the Air Filters and Air Filter Cover properly. Make sure that they are fully set.



#### **CAUTION**

Do not operate the projector with the Air Filter removed. Dust may accumulate on the LCD Panel and the Mirror degrading picture quality.


Do not put small parts into the Air Intake Vents. It may result in malfunction of the projector.


#### RECOMMENDATION

We recommend avoiding dusty/smoky environments when operating the projector. Usage in these environments may cause poor image quality.

When using under dusty or smoky conditions, dust may accumulate on the liquid crystal panel, lens, or optical elements inside it. This condition may degrade the quality of the projected image.

When the above symptoms are noticed, contact your authorized dealer or service station for proper cleaning.





## LAMP REPLACEMENT

When the life of the Lamp of this projector draws to an end, the LAMP REPLACEMENT indicator lights yellow. When the image becomes dark or the color of the image becomes unnatural, replacement of the Lamp is required.




#### CAUTION

- For continued safety, replace with a lamp assembly of the same type.
- Allow the projector to cool for at least 45 minutes before you open the lamp cover. The inside of the projector can become very hot.
- Do not drop the lamp assembly or touch the glass bulb! The glass can shatter and may cause injury.

Follow these steps to replace the lamp assembly.

- Turn off the projector and disconnect the AC plug. Allow the projector to cool for at least 45 minutes.
- Remove the screw with a screwdriver and remove the Lamp Cover.
- 3 Remove the two screws with a screwdriver and pull out the Lamp Assembly by grasping the handle.
- 4 Replace the Lamp Assembly with a new one and tighten the two screws. Make sure that the Lamp Assembly is set properly. Replace the Lamp Cover and tighten the screw.
- 5 Connect the AC Power Cord to the projector and turn the projector on.
- 6 Reset the Lamp Replacement Monitor Timer (refer to the section "Lamp Replacement Monitor Timer" below).

**NOTE:** Do not reset the LAMP REPLACEMENT MONITOR TIMER when the lamp is not replaced.

## LAMP REPLACEMENT MONITOR TIMER

Be sure to reset the Lamp Replacement Monitor Timer when the Lamp Assembly is replaced. When the Lamp Replacement Monitor Timer is reset, the LAMP REPLACEMENT indicator stops lighting.

- Turn the projector on, and press the MENU button and the ON-SCREEN MENU will appear. Press the POINT LEFT/RIGHT buttons to select SETTING and press the SELECT button (refer to the page 36, 37). Another dialog box SETTING MENU will appear.
- Press the POINT DOWN button and a red-arrow icon will appear. Move the arrow to "Lamp age," and then press the SELECT button. The message "Lamp replace monitor Reset?" is displayed.
- 2 Select [Yes] to reset the Timer.

Do not reset the Lamp Replacement Monitor Timer, except after the lamp is replaced.

# CLEANING THE PROJECTION LENS

Follow these steps to clean the projection lens:

- Apply a non-abrasive camera lens cleaner to a soft, dry cleaning cloth. Avoid using an excessive amount of cleaner. Abrasive cleaners, solvents or other harsh chemicals might scratch the lens.
- 2 Lightly wipe the cleaning cloth over the lens.
- 3 When the projector is not in use, replace the lens cover.

# TROUBLESHOOTING

Before calling your dealer or service center for assistance, check the matters below once again.

- 1. Make sure you have connected the projector to your equipment as described in the section "CONNECTING THE PROJECTOR" on pages 11 ~ 14.
- 2. Check cable connection. Verify that all computer, video and power cords are properly connected.
- 3. Verify that all power is switched on.
- 4. If the projector still does not produce an image, re-start the computer.
- 5. If the image sill does not appear, unplug the projector from the computer and check the computer monitor's display. The problem may be with your graphics controller rather than with the projector. (When you reconnect the projector, remember to turn the computer and monitor off before you power up the projector. Power the equipment back on in order of: Projector and computer.)
- 6. If the problem still exists, check the following chart.
