Etiquette for Cell Phone Use


- The cell phone always emits weak radio waves when power is on.
- Use the cell phone in an enjoyable and safe manner without forgetting to be considerate of others around you.
 - ■The use of cell phones is not allowed in some places
 - Do not use the cell phone while you are driving. Doing so is both dangerous and prohibited by law.
 - Using a cell phone in an aircraft is prohibited by law.
 Be sure to turn the cell phone off




- Radio waves from cell phones may interfere with medical electrical equipment
- Some people close to you in busy places such as crowded trains may be using a pacemaker. Turn the cell phone off in such places.
- Abide by the rules of hospitals and other medical institutions where it is forbidden to use or carry cell phones.



- Be considerate of where you use the cell phone and how loudly you talk
- Do not make calls from cinemas, theaters, museums, libraries, and other similar places. Turn power off or turn on manner mode to prevent others around you from being inconvenienced by ring tones for incoming calls or mail.
- Do not use the cell phone in places where you will be in the way of others.
- Move to areas where you will not inconvenience others on trains or in hotel lobbies.
- Take care to avoid talking in a loud voice.

Manner Mode and Voice Memo

Manner Mode

You can use manner mode to turn off the incoming call ring tone and other tones so as not to inconvenience other people.



When the standby screen is displayed, hold down • (side key 2) for at least one second.

Voice Memo

When you cannot answer calls, the cell phone can play an answering message (Japanese) and record memos.



When the standby screen is displayed, hold down ***...* for at least one second.

Checking the Power, Signal Strength, and Battery Level

Normally, you should leave the cell phone turned on



To make and receive calls, you need to turn on power.

Hold down for at least one second.



If a signal is not being received, you cannot talk on the cell phone



Even in service areas, there are some places where it is difficult to receive a signal.

indicates the signal strength.

Pay attention to the battery level



When the battery level is low, the cell phone may not function properly.

Do not use the cell phone while driving!

Holding a cell phone, talking on a cell phone, looking at a cell phone display to send mail or perform some other operation while driving is against the law in Japan.

(Revised Traffic Control Law, effective November 1, 2004)



Looking at mail on a cell phone display.



× Holding a cell phone in your hand while talking.

Turn off your cell phone or put it in Drive Mode while driving.

Drive Mode

In Drive Mode, a message that says "ただいま移動中ですので電話に出ることができません。…" is played when a call is received, and the cell phone uses voice memo to record a message.

When the standby screen is displayed, press (side key 2), use to select Drive Mode, and then press (Select).



Spam and One-ring Calls

If you receive spam:

You can set the mail filters to reject only specific mail or mail indicated by 未承諾広告※ (unsolicited advertisement), which often tends to be spam.

The following mail filters are available for rejecting spam:

- ・未承諾広告フィルター (Unsolicited advertisement filter)
- ・アドレスフィルター (Address filters)
 - 一指定拒否設定 (for not receiving specific mail)
 - 一指定受信設定 (for receiving specific mail only)

If you receive a call from an unknown phone number:

It may be an attempt to get you to return a call to a service with very high charges.





The red in the Incoming History indicates that there was a call which rang three seconds long or shorter.




Charging the Battery Pack

The battery pack is not fully charged at the time of purchase.

Be sure to charge the battery pack before using the cell phone for the first time.





- Connect the Toshiba AC adapter 02 to the desktop holder.
 - With inscription of the connector facing up, connect the Toshiba AC adapter 02 to the power terminal of the desktop holder.
- Connect the Toshiba AC adapter 02's power plug to a 100 V AC power outlet.
- While the A5509T is closed and the battery pack attached, insert it into the desktop holder as shown in the figure.
- 4 Confirm that the charge indicator lights.


Hold the desktop holder while removing the A5509T.

Built-in Antenna

The antenna of the A5509T is built into its case.

Note

 Since the antenna of the A5509T is built into the case, there is no protruding antenna. Touching or covering the area around the built-in antenna may weaken a signal. In particular, do not affix any stickers or other decorations in the area around the built-in antenna.



Warp Function Key


Use the up, down, left, and right parts of the key to select items and to move the cursor. Press the center of the key to confirm a selected item.

Soft Keys

When indications such as the following are displayed at the bottom of the display, you can press the corresponding soft keys to perform the indicated operations. The soft key indications vary depending on the screen.

Center key	Performs the operation indicated in the bottom center of the screen.
Soft key 2	Performs the operation indicated at the bottom right of the screen.



- The initial settings include changing the lock number, setting the character size, setting the Notify Call ID, and setting the call ring tone.
- You need to configure initial settings before using the cell phone for the first time only. Furthermore, you can also change each of the initial settings later.
- After configuring initial settings, you can switch the display language to English (see page 15).







- The layouts and content of screens appearing in descriptions are only examples for the purpose of explanation and contain some indicators that cannot appear at the same time.

Initializing E-mail and EZweb

To use e-mail and EZweb, you need to apply for an EZweb subscription. If you did not apply for an EZweb subscription at the time of purchase, contact an au shop or the au Customer Service Center.

Also, before use, be sure to configure initial settings. Your e-mail address is assigned automatically when you initialize e-mail and EZweb.

When the standby screen is displayed, press ▣.



• Your e-mail address will not be changed if the address you enter above is already being used. If this happens, enter a different e-mail address.

Using Extra Large Characters

Turning on extra large characters will display the names of callers and addressees on the Call Screen, the phone book list, etc.

When the standby screen is displayed, press .

Use (i) to select Function and then press (Select).





Press 3 & Display.

→The Display menu appears.





Press 45 Character Size.

→The Character Size menu appears.







Press 6 min Extra Large.

→The Extra Large setting screen appears.







Use \bigcirc to select ON and then press \bigcirc (OK).



Personal Identification Numbers and Passwords

You can use the personal identification numbers and passwords described below to restrict use of your A5509T.

Take care not to forget numbers and passwords, because they are required for performing various operations and using subscription services.

Making and Answering Calls

Making a Call

When the standby screen is displayed, use O.P to 9... to enter the phone number you want to call.

• When calling to a regular phone, you also need to enter the area code.

- When you have finished the call, press ----.





Note

- After you enter a phone number, you can add 184 or 186 to the phone number if you press (Option), press (22) Add/Off SP No···, and then press (13) 184 or (22) 186.
 - Select 1.3 184 if you do not want to inform the party you are calling of your phone number.
- Select 2 2 186 if you want to inform the party you are calling of your phone number.

Answering a Call



To answer the call, press .



· When you have finished the call, press -.



Display When a Call is Received

The phone number of the caller appears. If the caller's name is in your phone book, the name is also displayed.

When the phone number of the caller is not displayed, one of the following indicators may appear.

Indicator	Meaning
ID Unsent	The caller did not send a Caller ID.
Pay Phone	The call is from a pay phone.
Not Support	The call is from a phone that does not support Caller ID.



Missed Call Notification

If you did not answer a call, **1** and **2** Call are displayed to let you know that you missed a call.

To check the caller's phone number, use () to select \square Call and then press (\bullet) . You can then return the call (see page 28).



Redialing (Outgoing History/Incoming History)

Example: Returning a call to a phone number in the incoming history

When the standby screen is displayed, press .

- Pressing while the standby screen is displayed displays the Outgoing History screen.
- The phone numbers are displayed in order of the most recent to the oldest.





Use (a) to select the phone number you want to call and then press (a) (Info).

• The cell phone can store up to 20 phone numbers in each of the incoming history and outgoing history in order of the most to least recent.

One-ring Calls

What is a One-ring Call?

A one-ring call is a call from an unknown caller that only rings once, causing it to be stored in the incoming history. One-ring calls are often used to get the receiver to return the call, which will connect you to a dating service or some other service that charges caller at high rates.

One-ring Indicator

A red indicator on the display indicates you have received a one-ring call (the ring tone played for less than three seconds), and the call is marked with the incoming history screen. Be careful when you return a call to an unknown caller.





Turning On Manner Mode

The cell phone informs you of a call by vibrating.

When the standby screen is displayed, hold down ☐ (side key 2) for at least one second.

→This turns on manner mode, and displays ⑤ and ⑤ on the standby screen. This also turns on voice memo, which is indicated by ◙ on the standby screen.





Turning Off Manner Mode

When the standby screen is displayed, hold down • (side key 2) for at least one second.

→Turning off manner mode causes ② and ② to disappear from the standby screen. Voice memo is also turned off, which is indicated by ☑ disappearing from the standby screen.



Note

 The cell phone will continue to emit the record start/end tone and shutter sound during camera use even when manner mode is turned on.

Turning On Voice Memo

When the standby screen is displayed, hold down for at least one second.

→The answering message (Japanese) is played, then voice memo is turned on, which is indicated by on the standby screen.





Turning Off Voice Memo

When the standby screen is displayed, hold down for at least one second.

⇒Voice memo is turned off and

disappears from the standby screen.



Note

- The cell phone can record a maximum of three messages, each up to 30 seconds long.
- The cell phone can record up to a total of three call voice memos. A call voice memo is for recording the voice of the other party during a call.
- Voice memo is a function that automatically answers calls and allows callers to record messages. Use the answering service when you have the phone is turned off or when you are in a location where a signal cannot be received.

Playing a Voice Memo

If a voice memo is recorded

→ ■ Memo and the number of memos appear on the standby screen.



- Use \bigcirc to select \boxtimes *Memo* and then press \bigcirc .
 - →The Play Voice Memo list appears.





Use (to select the voice memo you want to play and then press (Play).





Deleting a Voice Memo

On the Play Voice Memo list, use () to select the voice memo you want to delete.

- →Press (Option) and then press (I.*) Delete.
- →Use ② to select *Delete One* and then press (Select).
- \rightarrow Use \bigcirc to select Yes and then press \bigcirc (OK).

Changing the Incoming Ring Tone

- When the standby screen is displayed, press •.
 - →The Launcher menu appears.





Use (i) to select *Function* and then press (Select).





- Press 2. Sound/Vibrator.
 - →The Sound/Vibrator menu appears.





- Press 1.3 Incoming Call.
 - →The Incoming Call menu appears.





- Press 2. Melody.
 - →The Melody menu appears.





Changing the Incoming Ring Tone (continued)



Use (5) to select *Fixed Pattern* and then press (6) (Select).

⇒The Fixed Pattern menu appears.

Use (2) to select *Pattern 3* and then press (a) (Play).

 If you press (a) (Back) or (support), the tone stops playing and you can select another tone.







Press () (OK).

→The incoming ring tone is set.



Note

- You can select from among fixed patterns, fixed melodies, effect sounds, data folder contents, and EZweb search for your ring tone.
- The initial default setting is the *Pattern 1* fixed pattern.

Adjusting the Incoming Ring Tone Volume

- When the standby screen is displayed, press •.
 - →The Launcher menu appears.





Use to select Function and then press (Select).





- Press 2. Sound/Vibrator.
 - →The Sound/Vibrator menu appears.





- Press 1.3 Incoming Call.
 - →The Incoming Call menu appears.





- Press !! Volume.
 - →The screen for adjusting the incoming call ring tone appears.

Adjusting the Earpiece Volume during a Call

During a call, you can use Loud Volume or adjust the earpiece volume to one of five levels (1 to 5).



During a call, press (2).



→The Speaker Volume screen appears.

(5): Increases the volume.

(2): Decreases the volume.

Turning on I (Loud Volume) will increase the volume of the earpiece output to make it easier to hear.



Press () (OK).



Speaker Volume

Note

· Loud Volume can be used only during a call.



Character Entry Modes

When a character entry screen is displayed, you can select the character entry mode if you press .

Menu Items

Kanji: Kanji conversion mode

a A : Double-byte alphanumeric mode
abAB : Single-byte alphanumeric mode
1 2 : Double-byte number mode
1234 : Single-byte number mode

Use (2) to select a character entry mode and then press (Select).



Entering Single-byte Alphanumeric Characters

You can use the keys 1.8 to 0.2 to enter characters. More than one character is assigned to each key.

For example, each press of $2 \stackrel{?}{=} c$ changes the displayed character to the next character assigned to the key in the order of $a \Rightarrow b \Rightarrow c \Rightarrow A \Rightarrow B \Rightarrow C \Rightarrow 2$. The following table shows the key assignment for entering characters.

Using C-mail

C-mail is a service that makes it possible to exchange text messages between two au cell phones that support c-mail. A c-mail message can contain up to 50 double-byte (or 100 single-byte) characters. Subscribers in the Kanto and Chubu areas do not need a separate subscription to use c-mail. For subscribers located outside of these areas, a separate subscription is required.

Limit Mode allows parents or superiors to impose limits on the how much each function can be used. This helps to prevent overuse of the cell phone by offspring or subordinates. Restrictions can be placed on incoming and outgoing calls, incoming and outgoing e-mail and c-mail, EZweb use, and EZ application (including EZnaviWalk) use.


Displaying the Limit Mode Screen



Changing the Limit Mode Password

The Limit Mode password protects against unauthorized modification of Limit Mode settings.

On the Limit Mode screen (above), press 4.5 Limit Mode Setup.

Setting the Use Limit

You can configure the cell phone to prohibit outgoing calls and mail send if a monthly use limit amount is exceeded.

In addition to the functions covered in this Basic Manual, the A5509T also has the following features.

Only Mail

You can send a message with a movie or photo attachment to a specific recipient without opening the A5509T.

Cuckoo Clock

A movie is played on the sub display to inform you of the time, every hour on the hour.

EZ Chaku-Uta(TM)

You can specify the actual song of a particular artist as an incoming ring tone.

Movie Setting

You can specify a movie you recorded as an incoming ring tone or incoming screen.

Edit Movie

You can add subtitles (two lines of 10 characters each) and record a voiceover after recording a movie.

EZ Applications (BREW®)

You can enjoy using various applications including large-volume games that are rich in expressive content, and standby applications.

Photo Mixer

You can use an animation template with melody to create your own original animation from a mixture of photos and text. You can attach animations to e-mail messages.

Voice Recorder

You can record voice memos while the cell phone is in standby. This feature comes in handy for recording during a meeting of seven or eight people, when having a discussion with few people, etc.
