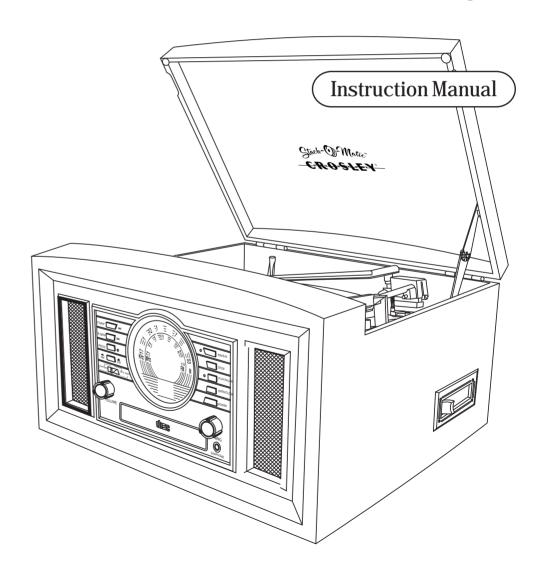

WARRANTY

Crosley Radio Products are warranted against defects in material and workmanship for a period of 90 days beginning from the date of sale to the original purchaser.

Should the unit fail under normal usage during the 90 day warranty period, a request for RETURN AUTHORIZATION (R.A.) must be made by the original customer before returning the unit. Call Crosley Radio customer service for Return Authorization at (502) 583-4246 from 9 AM to 5 PM (EST) Monday to Friday.

Upon receiving the RETURN AUTHORIZATION number from the Customer Service Department, properly pack your unit in its original packaging. Include any adapters, parts, & accessories which were originally provided with the product, along with a check or money order for \$19.95 made out to Crosley Radio to cover the handling and return postage. Display the R.A. # on the outside of the carton and ship PREPAID via standard UPS or its equivalent.

The purchaser's bill of sale is the only proof of warranty entitlement and must accompany the unit.

This warranty does not cover damage due to improper operation or maintenance, connection to improper voltage supply, or attempted repair by anyone other than a facility authorized by Crosley Radio to service the product. This warranty does not cover products sold AS IS or consumables (such as fuses or batteries). This warranty is valid only in the United States.

This warranty gives the purchaser specified legal rights in addition to any rights which may vary from state to state.

General

Troubleshooting

There is no Power

- 1 Make sure the radio is plugged in correctly.
- 2 Check to see that the power button is pushed in.

There is no Sound

- Check the volume level by turning the volume knob.
- Make sure the ext./int. switch on back of radio is on int. (unless you are using external speakers, in which case it should be on ext.)
- 3 Make sure the Line In Switch is on the OFF position if you are not using any external equipment.

Turntable will not work

- Make sure the function switch is set to phono.
- 2 Make sure the needle cover is flipped up.
- 3 Check the Turntable switch to make sure it is in the ON position.

CD does not play

- 1 Check to make sure CD is inserted correctly (label side facing up).
- 2 Check that the surface of the CD is clean
- 3 Make sure function switch is set to CD.

Connecting Optional Equipment

External Speakers

- 1 This radio is equipped with external speaker outputs.
- The speaker jacks for external speakers are located on the back of the radio. Beside the speaker jacks is a switch labeled (int./ext.) When using external speakers, this switch must be switched to the ext. position. Doing this turns off the internal speakers in the radio and redirects to power to the external speakers.
- 3 If you decide not to use the external speakers, be sure the switch is on int. or the internal speakers will not work.

Auxiliary Outputs

- 1 You can connect your radio to different sources using the auxiliary outputs.
- Plug Auxiliary cables (not supplied) into the Line Out Jack (32).
- 3 Connect the other end of the Auxiliary cables into the input on your desired component.
- 4 See the owners manual for the component for correct operation.

 Note: The Auxiliary Output only puts out a signal. External speakers by themselves must be hooked up to the External Speaker Jacks (33).

Auxiliary Inputs

- 1 You can connect external components to your unit by using the Auxiliary Inputs.
- Plug Auxiliary cables (not supplied) into the INPUT JACK (37) on the back of your unit.
- 3 Switch the LINE IN ON/OFF (36) to the ON position.
- 4 Plug the other end of the Auxililary cables into the output jack on your desired external component.
- 5 Check the volume level of your external component.
- 6 See operators manual for correct operation of the external component.

CD Operation

Repeat Playback

- 1 To repeat a single track, choose the track that you want to repeat, then press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON (14) to start the track. Press the REPEAT BUTTON (11) once to repeat this track. The REPEAT INDICATOR (10) will flash.
- 2 To repeat all tracks, press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON (14) to start the CD. Press the REPEAT BUTTON (11) twice to repeat all tracks. Once the CD ends, it will star over again from the beginning of the CD. The REPEAT INDICATOR (10) will remain on.
- To cancel the repeat function, press the REPEAT BUTTON (11) again until the REPEAT INDICATOR (10) is off.

Programmed Playback

- Press the PROGRAM BUTTON (6). " 01" will shown on the display and the PROGRAM INDICATOR (5) will flash.
- Press the FORWARD SKIP BUTTON (3) or the BACKWARD SKIP BUTTON (4) to select a track.
- 3 Press the PROGRAM BUTTON (6) again to store the selected track number.
- 4 Repeat steps 2 and 3 above to program other tracks.
- 5 Press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON (14) to start programmed playback and the PROGRAM INDICATOR (5) will be on.
- To erase the programmed sequence, press the STOP BUTTON (12) twice or until the PROGRAM INDICATOR (5) is off. Programmed tracks will also erase when the CD DRAWER (19) is opened.

NOTE: Maximum of 20 tracks can be programmed to play in any order.

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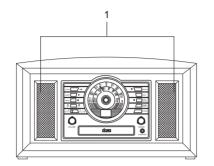
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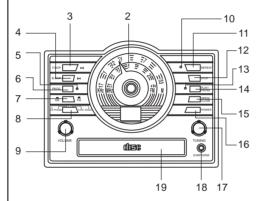

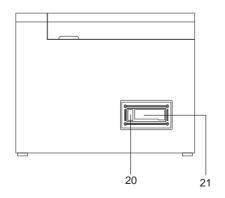

Playing A CD

- Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH (8) to the CD position.
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE BUTTON (15) to open the CD DRAWER (19). Place a disc in the tray with the labeled side of the disc facing up.
- 3 Press the OPEN/CLOSE BUTTON (15) again to close the CD DRAWER (19). The display will show (- -) for a few seconds, then the total number of tracks will be displayed. "00" will be shown when there is no disc inside the unit.
- 4 Press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON (14) to start playback. The PLAY/PAUSE INDICATOR (13) will light up.
- 5 Adjust the VOLUME KNOB (9) to the desired volume level.
- 6 To pause playback, press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON(14) . The PLAY/PAUSE INDICATOR (13) will flash. Press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON (14) again to resume playback.
- 7 To stop playback, press the STOP BUTTON (12) and the PLAY/PAUSE INDICATOR (14) will go off.

Skip Forward And Skip Reverse

- Press the FORWARD SKIP BUTTON (3) or the BACKWARD SKIP BUTTON (4) to select a track.
- Press the PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON (14) to start playing the selected track

Search Forward And Reverse During Play

PLAYBACK

- Press and hold the FORWARD SKIP BUTTON (3) or the BACKWARD SKIP BUTTON (4) to search forward or backward through the selected track.
- 2 Release the button at the desired point, playback will resume automatically.

Cassette & Radio Operation

Cassette Operation

- Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH (8) to the TAPE position.
- Insert a prerecorded tape through the CASSETTE DOOR (21). Tape will slide into the cassette mechanism and start playing.
- Adjust the volume level by turning the VOLUME KNOB (9).
- 4 For fast forwarding, press the CASSETTE EJECT/F.F (20) half way in. Pressing again, will stop the fast forwarding and return the cassette to the playing mode.
- 5 To stop and eject the cassette, press the CASSETTE EJECT/F.F (20) in completely.
- 6 When one side of the tape finishes playing, the cassette will automatically stop.

NOTE: Remove the tape from the unit when it is not in use or stopped.

Radio Operation

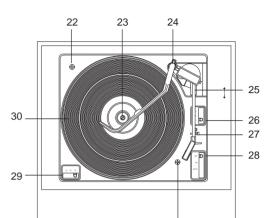
- 1 Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH (8) to the RADIO position.
- 2 Press the AM/FM BUTTON (7) to the desired tuning band (AM or FM).
- 3 Select the desired radio station by rotating TUNING KNOB (17).
- 4 Adjust the VOLUME KNOB (9) to the desired sound level

Antenna

Antenna: for FM reception, the unit is provided with a FM WIRE ANTENNA (34), move the wire until the reception is clear and with no interferences. For AM reception, the unit is provided with a directional build-in ferrite antenna. Rotate the set to find the position in which the best reception is obtained. Do not connect the FM WIRE ANTENNA (34) to any outside antenna.

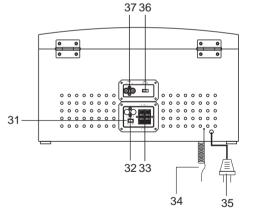

Getting Started

Unpacking

- Remove packing materials from unit.
 Note: Save all packing materials.
- 2 Remove plastic bag covering unit.
- 3 Remove plastic safety cover from A/C POWER CORD.
- 4 Remove tie from A/C Cord and untie ANTENNA WIRE (34) on the back of Radio.
- 5 Open lid and remove shipping material from turntable.
- 6 Remove black tie-wrap from under the tone arm.
- 7 Using you fingers, turn the Turntable Suspension Screws(22) clockwise until they are all the way down. Do not force them. This allows the turntable to float on its shock absorbers.

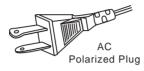


8 Remove the protecting rubber spacers from the turntable.



Power Source

- 1 Unwind the AC POWER CORD (35) at the back of the unit and connect it to a power outlet.
- 2 Plug A/C cord into appropriate outlet.



3 This product is equipped with a polarized alternating current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature, If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact you electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the purpose of the polarized plug.

Turntable Features

- 1 Selectable 33/45/78 rpm speeds.
- 2 Load up to 6 records at a time.
- 3 Plays 7", 10", and 12" records.
- 4 Record changer is fully automatic or can be operated manually.

Turntable Instructions

- 1 Turn power on by pressing POWER BUTTON(16).
- 2 Slide the FUNCTION SWITCH (8) to PHONO position.
- 3 Lift TENSION ARM (24) and rotate counterclockwise over the TONE ARM (25).
- 4 Load desired records on the CENTER SPINDLE (23). Records should be loaded one at a time.
- 5 Lift TENSION ARM (24) and rotate it clockwise over the records and release. TENSION ARM (24) will automatically pull down onto the records.
- 6 Set the SIZE SELECT SWITCH (26) to the correct size of your records.
- 7 Set the SPEED SELECT SWITCH (29) to the correct speed of your records.
- 8 Move the TURNTABLE SWITCH (28) to the "ON" position. Turntable will begin to turn.
- 9 Flip the needle cover up.



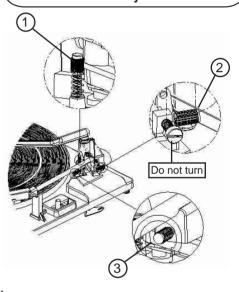
- 10 Move the TURNTABLE SWITCH (28) to "AUTO". The switch will automatically return back to the "ON" position and the first record will drop. The TONE ARM (25) will automatically lift and move to the beginning of the record. Once the first record is finished, the TONE ARM (25) will move back to the TONE ARM REST (27) and the next record will drop. The TONE ARM (25) will move back to the beginning of the record. This will repeat until the last record is finished. When the last record is finished, the TONE ARM (25) will return to its rest and the turntable will shut off.
- 11 To manually switch to the next record during playback, move the TURNTABLE SWITCH (28) to the "AUTO" position. The next record will drop and begin to play.

12 To stop playback manually, move the TURNTABLE SWITCH (28) to the "OFF" position. Gently lift the TONE ARM (25) from the record and return it to the TONE ARM REST (27).

Turntable Operation

13 To remove the records from the turntable, lift the TENSION ARM (24) up and rotate it counterclockwise over the TONE ARM (25). Grab the edges of the bottom record and lift straight up.

Tone Arm Adjustment



- 1 Adjust this screw if the TONE ARM(25) is not raising high enough to clear to the TONE ARM REST(27). Turn the screw counter-clockwise to raise the height. Turn the screw clockwise to lower the height.
- Adjust this screw if the TONE ARM(25) drops on the record too early or too late. Turn the screw counter-clockwise to start at a later point. Turn the screw clockwise to start at an earlier point.
- 3 Adjust the screw if you feel there is not enough tone arm pressure on the record. Turn the screw counter-clockwise to increase pressure. Turn the screw clockwise to descrease the pressure.

Note: Adjust the screws one turn at a time and check the adjustment after each turn.
